Condition 18

The registered door supervisors and/or management shall patrol, supervise and monitor (would be) patrons' conduct on the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises and wherever there is any action involving the registered door supervisors and /or management and patrons or would be patrons either side of the building including any queues forming outside the premises for the purposes of patrons gaining entry to the premises from 9pm until 30 minutes after the terminal hour of the premises licence

Condition 19

To cooperate and continue to co operate with the Licensing Authorities in pursuit of the common objective of preventing public disorder and promoting public safety and to include the management and the registered door supervisors at the premises participating in a location training program with the Police, without expense to the operators and at a time to be agreed with the licensee.

Condition 20

The licensee shall forward a copy of any letter of delegated authority under Rule of Management 7(b) to the Police using their best endeavours to do so within 24 hours.

Condition 24

a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall commence at 10.00 and extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that -

- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and
- (ii) on any day that music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight and 03.00, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end;

(b) In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (a) of this condition shall have effect-

- (i) with the substitution of references to 04.00 for references to 03.00.

(c) Except on Sundays immediately before bank holidays (apart from Easter Sunday), the permitted hours on Sundays shall extend until 00.30 on the morning following, except that-

- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight;
- (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 00.30, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.

(d) On Sundays immediately before bank holidays (other than Easter Sunday), the permitted hours shall extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that-

- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and

dancing is not provided after 00.00 midnight;

(ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 03.00, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.

(iii) the terminal hour for late night refreshment shall extend to 30 minutes after the end of permitted hour for the sale of alcohol mentioned above in d (i) and (ii)

(e) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.

(f) The permitted hours on New Year's Eve will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day 00.00 on 31st December.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

(a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;

(b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

(c) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;

(d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

(e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;

(f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

(g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;

(h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;

(i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

All door security employed at the entrance to the venue shall wear high visibility jackets.

I write in relation to the application submitted to vary the premises licence

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011 the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact and as such a number of policy points must be considered.

We are concerned that the additional hours sought on the Sunday will undermine the licensing objectives as well as being contrary to the Core Hours Policy (HRS1) as stated in the Westminster City Council Licensing Policy. Additional information must be submitted as to why this application should be granted contrary to the policy MD2, which states It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas, other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours, under Policy HRS1. Other parts of the application also raise concerns that we will address in further correspondence.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where there is traditionally high crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

An officer from this unit will be in contact with you shortly to discuss the application. However it is for the applicant to prove that this application will not add to the cumulative impact problems already experienced in this area.

It is for these reasons that we are objecting to the application.

<p>5:39 PM on 02 Aug 2017 Our association strongly objects to the extension of hours for alcohol sales on a Sunday. The current hours are late enough for a Sunday night / Monday morning. We also object to any other extension of licensed activity. With regard to the change of conditions, we welcome some clarification but would like additional conditions to prevent noise and other nuisance to residents living north of the premises. In this respect we hope the licensee will agree to conditions to ensure mini-cabs collect from outside the premises and not in streets to the north and that all patrons leaving are directed towards Oxford Street and Oxford Circus as these are the nearest places to seek transport home.</p> <p>We will further review the suggested conditions and seek advice.</p>

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The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to :

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it, and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Conditions: On Current Licence -

Mandatory:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D+(D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect

Conditions relating to regulated entertainment

10. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
11. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until midnight on New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes place on New Year's Day).
12. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule of Management No 6 the premises may remain open for the purposes of this licence from 11pm on each of the days Monday to Saturday to 6am on the day following and from 11pm on Sunday to 4am on the day following.
13. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time it is in use.
14. The existing sound system shall not be altered or modified without the approval of the Environmental Health Officer.
15. A sound limiter device shall be fitted to the sound system and shall be set to the levels agreed with the Environmental Health Officer to the intent that such levels comply with the Terms and Reference set down by the Council. The operational panel shall then be secured and will not be altered without the approval of the Environmental Health Officer.

16. No additional sound generation equipment shall be used on the premises, without being routed through the sound limiter device.
17. The licensee shall ensure that all staff are satisfactorily trained, instructed and managed to prevent intoxicating liquor being sold to any drunken person.
18. The registered door supervisors and/or management shall patrol, supervise and monitor (would be) patrons' conduct on the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises and wherever there is any action involving the registered door supervisors and /or management and patrons or would be patrons either side of the building including any queues forming outside the premises for the purposes of patrons gaining entry to the premises from 9pm until 30 minutes after the terminal hour of the premises licence.
19. To cooperate and continue to co operate with the Licensing Authorities in pursuit of the common objective of preventing public disorder and promoting public safety and to include the management and the registered door supervisors at the premises participating in a location training program with the Police, without expense to the operators and at a time to be agreed with the licensee.
20. The licensee shall forward a copy of any letter of delegated authority under Rule of Management 7(b) to the Police using their best endeavours to do so within 24 hours.

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

21. No direct access from the street to any bar.
22. No external advertisement of the licensed facilities.
23. Suitable beverages, other than intoxicating liquor including drinking water, shall be equally available for consumption with or otherwise as an ancillary to food supplied in the premises.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments

Permitted hours for the sale of alcohol

24. (a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall commence at 10.00 and extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that -
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and
 - (ii) on any day that music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight and 03.00, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end;
- (b) In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (a) of this condition shall have effect-
 - (i) with the substitution of references to 04.00 for references to 03.00.
- (c) Except on Sundays immediately before bank holidays (apart from Easter Sunday), the permitted hours on Sundays shall extend until 00.30 on the morning following, except that-
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 00.30, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.

- (d) On Sundays immediately before bank holidays (other than Easter Sunday), the permitted hours shall extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that-
- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after 00.00 midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 03.00, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.
 - (iii) the terminal hour for late night refreshment shall extend to 30 minutes after the end of permitted hour for the sale of alcohol mentioned above in d (i) and (ii)
- (e) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
- (f) The permitted hours on New Year's Eve will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day 00.00 on 31st December.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

25. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

26. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 330.
27. The venue shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the venue is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of the Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
28. The premises shall not be used for the purposes of providing regulated entertainment under this licence or for the testing or rehearsal of discothèque equipment between the hours of 9am and 6:30pm on each of the days Monday to Friday without prior agreement of the British Universities Film and Video Council (whilst they continue in legal occupation of 77 Wells Street).
29. All door security employed at the entrance to the venue shall wear high visibility jackets.
30. Persons under 18 will only be permitted entry into the premises under the supervision of an adult as part of a pre-booked private function being held at the premises.
31. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff members shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the minimum of delay when requested.
32. A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge 21, shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification for example diving licence or Passport.
33. There shall be no striptease or nudity and all persons shall be decently attired at all times.
34. There shall be no loud speakers located in the entrance lobby.
35. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
36. No rubbish including bottles will be moved, removed or placed outside the building between 23.00 and 08.00 the day following.
37. Any queue for entry to the premises shall be managed to ensure that there is a clear path along the highway.
38. Any queue for entry to the premises shall be managed to ensure that the highway remains clear and unobstructed, and that any such queue of patrons is conducted in a quiet and orderly manner so as not to cause nuisance.
(proposed amendment by Applicant):
Any queue for entry to the premises shall be managed to ensure that the highway remains clear and unobstructed, and that any such queue of patrons is conducted in a quiet and orderly manner so as not to cause nuisance, from 9pm until 30 minutes after the terminal hour of the premises licence
39. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption immediately outside the premises; and any sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only.

40. All drinking containers used within the venue shall be polycarbonate. All glass bottles to be decanted into polycarbonate glassware or polycarbonate carafes, with the exception of champagne or bottles of spirits with a minimum size of 70cl supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff will clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles promptly.
41. A personal licence holder shall be on duty from 23:00hrs until 30 minutes after the premises close to the public.
42. A search policy shall be implemented as agreed with Westminster Police Licensing Team and documented in writing. In accordance with the search policy, searching will be supplemented by the use of two functional metal detecting wands, and the use of a security arch, either until the end of permitted hours or until there are no further admissions.
43. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or Police which will record the following:-
 - a. Any complaints received regarding crime and disorder.
 - b. Any faults in the CCTV system.
 - c. Any visits by a relevant authority or emergency service.
 - d. Full details of door staff on duty including full name, date of birth, SIA licence number.
 - e. All incidents of violence/drug related incidents/collapses/ejections.
 - f. All refusals of sale of alcohol (to include the date and time of refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale).
 - g. The capacity limit for the premises to be recorded hourly.
44. Whenever the premises are open for licensable activities under the licence, unless otherwise agreed with the Westminster Police Licensing Team in writing (and a copy of any agreement to be held at reception), there shall be a minimum of six registered security staff on duty at the premises. 6. There shall be a minimum of two registered security staff remaining on duty for a further 30 minutes (or until such time as patrons are dispersed) after the premises close to the public to aid in dispersal outside the premises.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

45. The licensee will adopt a street management plan to be agreed with the EHO in writing.
46. The licensee will employ a dedicated traffic marshal to assist with traffic management of Wells Street between Eastcastle Street and Oxford Street during operational hours and 30 minutes after closing. The Traffic Marshal to wear a high visibility jacket when on duty.
47. The smoking area shall be supervised by an SIA registered door supervisor at all times the area is in operation and shall be limited to 33 people or as agreed with the Council's Environmental Health Officer.
48. Two registered door supervisors will be employed to manage any queues outside the premises. A further registered door supervisor will be employed to manage any queue of more than ten persons. He will be primarily stationed at the rear of the queue. This door supervisor's duties will include making sure that the queues do not spill on to the pavement and to manage would-be patrons expectations of admission.
49. All other door staff shall wear distinctive clothing, so that they can be readily identified at the venue. All exterior door staff shall wear high visibility jackets.
50. There shall be one door supervisor for every thirty customers, with a minimum number of four door supervisors at all times the premises is trading to members of the public.
51. Notices shall be displayed at the premises near the exit asking customers to respect the venue's neighbours and leave quickly and quietly.
52. Customers departing the venue on foot shall be encouraged to leave via Oxford Street.
53. The dedicated hot line telephone 07563 136636 for anyone wishing to comment on the operation of the premises, will be held by the head doorman whenever the premises are operational. Details of the number will be given to the Fitzrovia Residents Association and displayed on the premises.
54. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - (a) The Police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;
 - (b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
 - (c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
 - (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the

62. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
63. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
64. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes (other than foyers), entertainment areas or function rooms, shall be non-combustible.
65. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties, save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime.

66. A noise limiter must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service, so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured by key or password to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental Health Service and access shall only be by persons authorised by the Premises Licence holder. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Service. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.

3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect

Conditions relating to regulated entertainment

10. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
11. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until midnight on New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes place on New Year's Day).
12. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule of Management No 6 the premises may remain open for the purposes of this licence from 11pm on each of the days Monday to Saturday to 6am on the day following and from 11pm on Sunday to 4am on the day following.
13. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time it is in use.
14. The existing sound system shall not be altered or modified without the approval of the Environmental Health Officer.
15. A sound limiter device shall be fitted to the sound system and shall be set to the levels agreed with the Environmental Health Officer to the intent that such levels comply with the Terms and Reference set down by the Council. The operational panel shall then be secured and will not be altered without the approval of the Environmental Health Officer.

16. No additional sound generation equipment shall be used on the premises, without being routed through the sound limiter device.
17. The licensee shall ensure that all staff are satisfactorily trained, instructed and managed to prevent intoxicating liquor being sold to any drunken person.
18. The registered door supervisors and/or management shall patrol, supervise and monitor (would be) patrons' conduct on the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises and wherever there is any action involving the registered door supervisors and /or management and patrons or would be patrons either side of the building including any queues forming outside the premises for the purposes of patrons gaining entry to the premises from 9pm until 30 minutes after the terminal hour of the premises licence.
19. To cooperate and continue to co operate with the Licensing Authorities in pursuit of the common objective of preventing public disorder and promoting public safety and to include the management and the registered door supervisors at the premises participating in a location training program with the Police, without expense to the operators and at a time to be agreed with the licensee.
20. The licensee shall forward a copy of any letter of delegated authority under Rule of Management 7(b) to the Police using their best endeavours to do so within 24 hours.

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

21. No direct access from the street to any bar.
22. No external advertisement of the licensed facilities.
23. Suitable beverages, other than intoxicating liquor including drinking water, shall be equally available for consumption with or otherwise as an ancillary to food supplied in the premises.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments

Permitted hours for the sale of alcohol

24. (a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall commence at 10.00 and extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that -
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and
 - (ii) on any day that music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight and 03.00, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end;
- (b) In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (a) of this condition shall have effect-
 - (i) with the substitution of references to 04.00 for references to 03.00.
- (c) Except on Sundays immediately before bank holidays (apart from Easter Sunday), the permitted hours on Sundays shall extend until 00.30 on the morning following, except that-
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 00.30, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.

- (d) On Sundays immediately before bank holidays (other than Easter Sunday), the permitted hours shall extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that-
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after 00.00 midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 03.00, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.
 - (iii) the terminal hour for late night refreshment shall extend to 30 minutes after the end of permitted hour for the sale of alcohol mentioned above in d (i) and (ii)
- (e) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
- (f) The permitted hours on New Year's Eve will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day 00.00 on 31st December.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 25. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

26. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 330.
27. The venue shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the venue is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of the Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
28. The premises shall not be used for the purposes of providing regulated entertainment under this licence or for the testing or rehearsal of discothèque equipment between the hours of 9am and 6:30pm on each of the days Monday to Friday without prior agreement of the British Universities Film and Video Council (whilst they continue in legal occupation of 77 Wells Street).
29. All door security employed at the entrance to the venue shall wear high visibility jackets.
30. Persons under 18 will only be permitted entry into the premises under the supervision of an adult as part of a pre-booked private function being held at the premises.
31. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff members shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the minimum of delay when requested.
32. A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge 21, shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification for example diving licence or Passport.
33. There shall be no striptease or nudity and all persons shall be decently attired at all times.
34. There shall be no loud speakers located in the entrance lobby.
35. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
36. No rubbish including bottles will be moved, removed or placed outside the building between 23.00 and 08.00 the day following.
37. Any queue for entry to the premises shall be managed to ensure that there is a clear path along the highway.
38. Any queue for entry to the premises shall be managed to ensure that the highway remains clear and unobstructed, and that any such queue of patrons is conducted in a quiet and orderly manner so as not to cause nuisance.
39. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption immediately outside the premises; and any sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only.

40. All drinking containers used within the venue shall be polycarbonate. All glass bottles to be decanted into polycarbonate glassware or polycarbonate carafes, with the exception of champagne or bottles of spirits with a minimum size of 70cl supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff will clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles promptly.
41. A personal licence holder shall be on duty from 23:00hrs until 30 minutes after the premises close to the public.
42. A search policy shall be implemented as agreed with Westminster Police Licensing Team and documented in writing. In accordance with the search policy, searching will be supplemented by the use of two functional metal detecting wands, and the use of a security arch, either until the end of permitted hours or until there are no further admissions.
43. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or Police which will record the following:-
 - a. Any complaints received regarding crime and disorder.
 - b. Any faults in the CCTV system.
 - c. Any visits by a relevant authority or emergency service.
 - d. Full details of door staff on duty including full name, date of birth, SIA licence number.
 - e. All incidents of violence/drug related incidents/collapses/ejections.
 - f. All refusals of sale of alcohol (to include the date and time of refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale).
 - g. The capacity limit for the premises to be recorded hourly.
44. Whenever the premises are open for licensable activities under the licence, unless otherwise agreed with the Westminster Police Licensing Team in writing (and a copy of any agreement to be held at reception), there shall be a minimum of six registered security staff on duty at the premises. 6. There shall be a minimum of two registered security staff remaining on duty for a further 30 minutes (or until such time as patrons are dispersed) after the premises close to the public to aid in dispersal outside the premises.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

45. The licensee will adopt a street management plan to be agreed with the EHO in writing.
46. The licensee will employ a dedicated traffic marshal to assist with traffic management of Wells Street between Eastcastle Street and Oxford Street during operational hours and 30 minutes after closing. The Traffic Marshall to wear a high visibility jacket when on duty.
47. The smoking area shall be supervised by an SIA registered door supervisor at all times the area is in operation and shall be limited to 33 people or as agreed with the Council's Environmental Health Officer.
48. Two registered door supervisors will be employed to manage any queues outside the premises. A further registered door supervisor will be employed to manage any queue of more than ten persons. He will be primarily stationed at the rear of the queue. This door supervisor's duties will include making sure that the queues do not spill on to the pavement and to manage would-be patrons expectations of admission.
49. All other door staff shall wear distinctive clothing, so that they can be readily identified at the venue. All exterior door staff shall wear high visibility jackets.
50. There shall be one door supervisor for every thirty customers, with a minimum number of four door supervisors at all times the premises is trading to members of the public.
51. Notices shall be displayed at the premises near the exit asking customers to respect the venue's neighbours and leave quickly and quietly.
52. Customers departing the venue on foot shall be encouraged to leave via Oxford Street.
53. The dedicated hot line telephone 07563 136636 for anyone wishing to comment on the operation of the premises, will be held by the head doorman whenever the premises are operational. Details of the number will be given to the Fitzrovia Residents Association and displayed on the premises.
54. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - (a) The Police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;
 - (b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
 - (c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
 - (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.

STRAWBERRY MOONS INTO TANK AND PADDLE - EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Application relates to the Premises currently known as Strawberry Moons, 15 - 17 Heddon Street, London W1B 4BF. The Premises are operated by A3D2 Limited (Novus Leisure) who are one of the leading operators of licensed premises in Westminster and the City of London.

Strawberry Moons has been operating in its current form for many years and operates as a high energy DJ led venue with a dancefloor available to customers. Whilst the Premises opens during the day, it principally attracts a younger audience seeking out an environment of this kind. The conditions on the current licence reflect the style of operation of the Premises. The Application is to replace a high energy, late night alcohol and dance led venue with an earlier closing, lower capacity, food and drink operation.

A sister operation has traded in the City of London since November 2016 without any incidents and a second sister operation has also opened in Bishopsgate.

Novus Leisure propose to convert Strawberry Moons into a Tank and Paddle concept and a brochure setting out some details of the concept is attached to this Explanatory Note. Two Tank and Paddle venues have recently been opened by Novus Leisure in the City of London with a simple concept to provide customers with great food and fresh beer in a relaxed environment. Following the success in the opening in the City of London, it is estimated that the sales mix at the proposed premises in Heddon Street will be 30% food sales compared to 3% of food sales at present. There will never be a DJ or dancefloor at the Premises and music will be provided through a computer based music system to provide an eclectic mix ranging from 60s classic through to present indie tunes.

A pizza oven will be constructed to replace the existing dancefloor and to enable the operator to deliver freshly cooked stone baked pizzas. Other fresh food and salads will also be available.

The drink speciality is the Brewery Fresh Tank Beer pumped directly from beer tanks. The draught range is changed weekly offering customers new beers from local brewers and craft beers from all over the world. Different tankards and glasses are provided to reflect the beer sold to the customer

There is a mixture of low and high seating and service is via the counter which helps reflect the relaxed atmosphere. The visuals within the brochure show the concept and fit out.

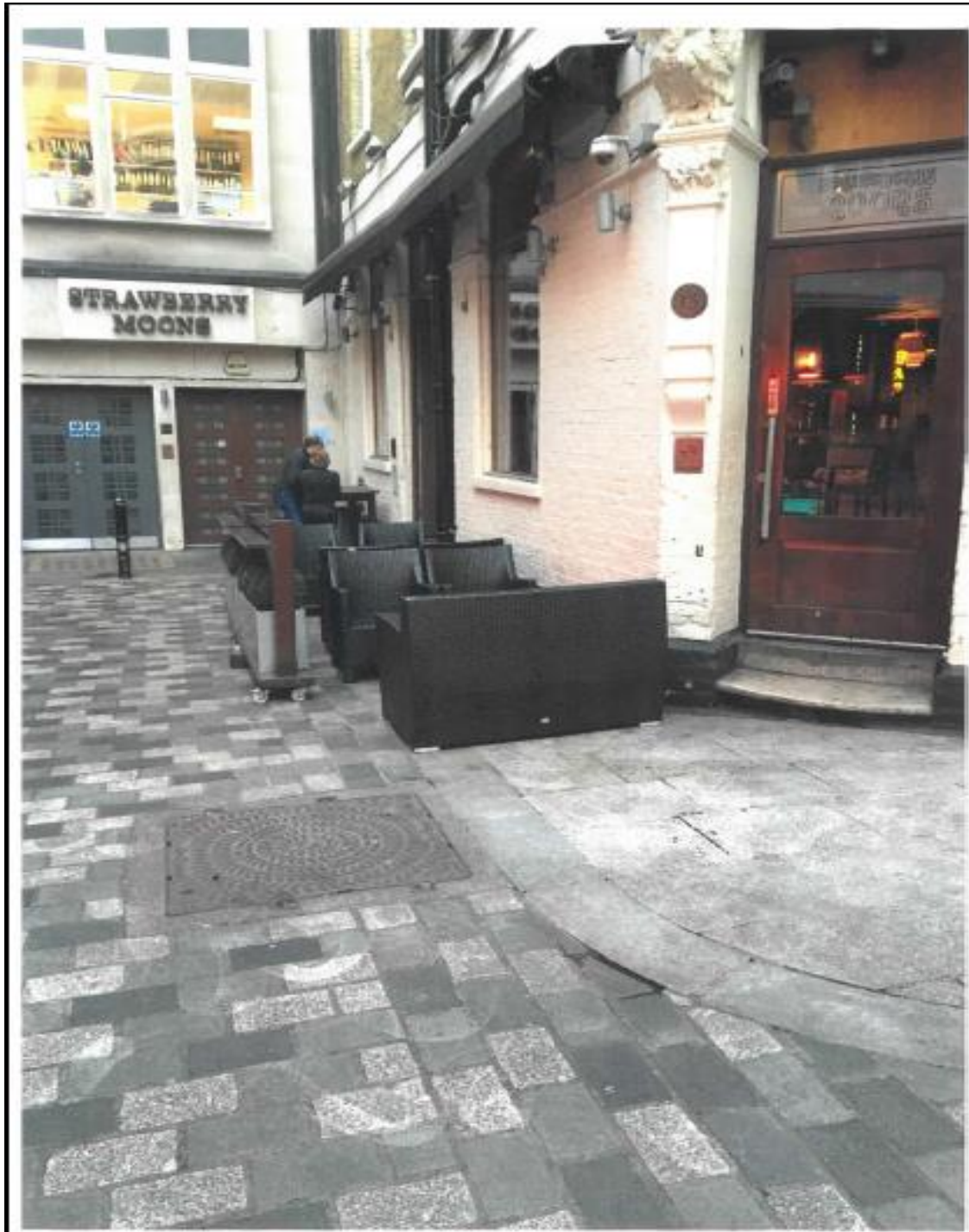
The City of London Police have confirmed in an email to Novus Leisure that there has not been a single incident at the Premises in the City since the Premises opened.

This new Application proposes a reduction in occupancy of a **140 customers** which is in excess of a **25%** reduction in occupancy from 500 to 360 on the ground floor.

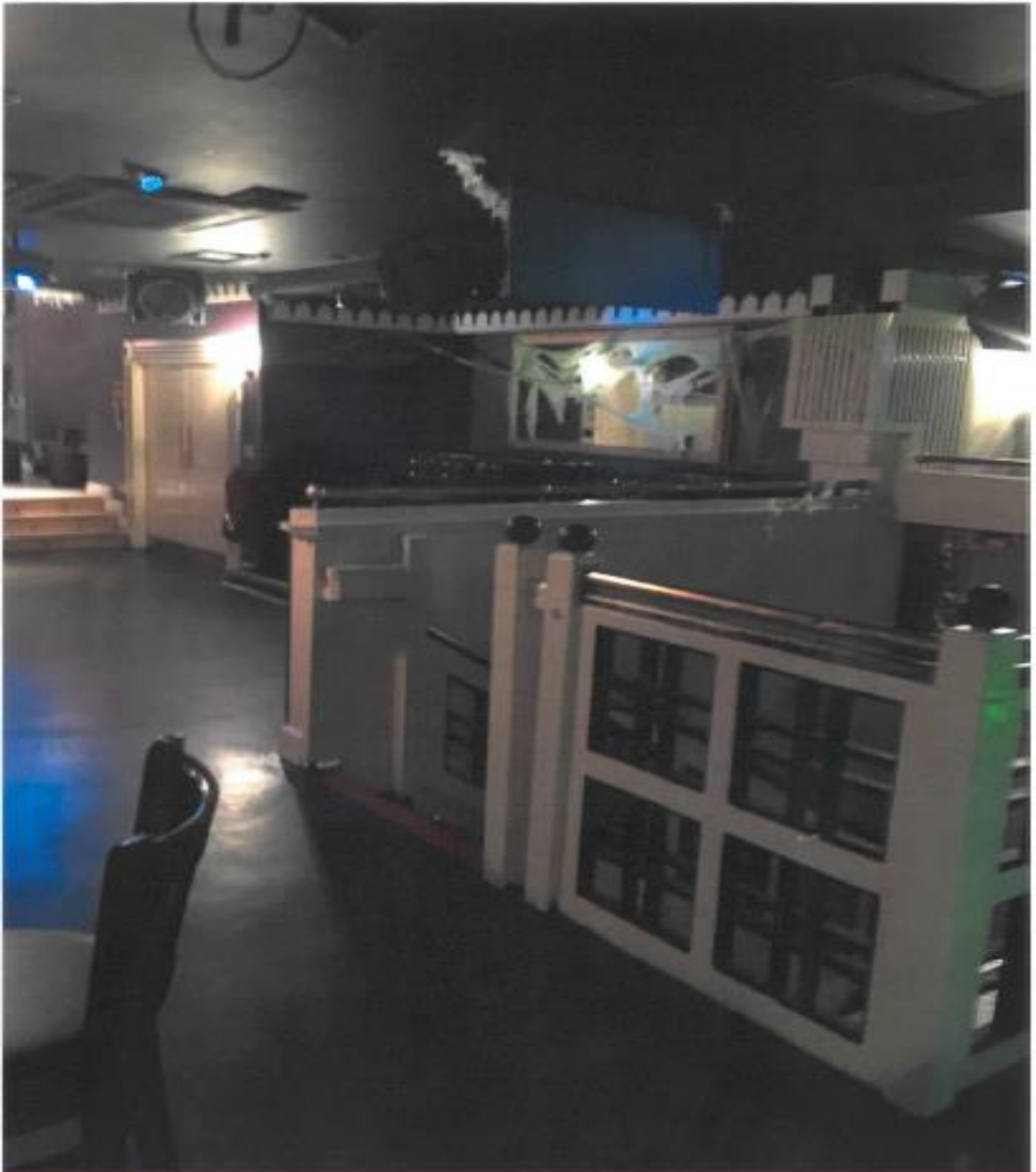
The new Application proposes a one hour reduction in the terminal hour for licensable activities, Monday to Saturday.

New conditions are proposed which ensure that a minimum of 120 covers are available for the customers on the ground floor at all times. The covers / seating cannot be removed. A further condition confirms that there will be no DJ or dancefloor at the Premises.

The pizza oven and substantial food will be available at all times. Novus Leisure have undertaken their own research into facilities in Westminster and are satisfied that this business model will be a success with customers still requiring pizza and alcohol after 11:00pm in a relaxed environment and without having to attend a casino or high energy nightclub style operation.

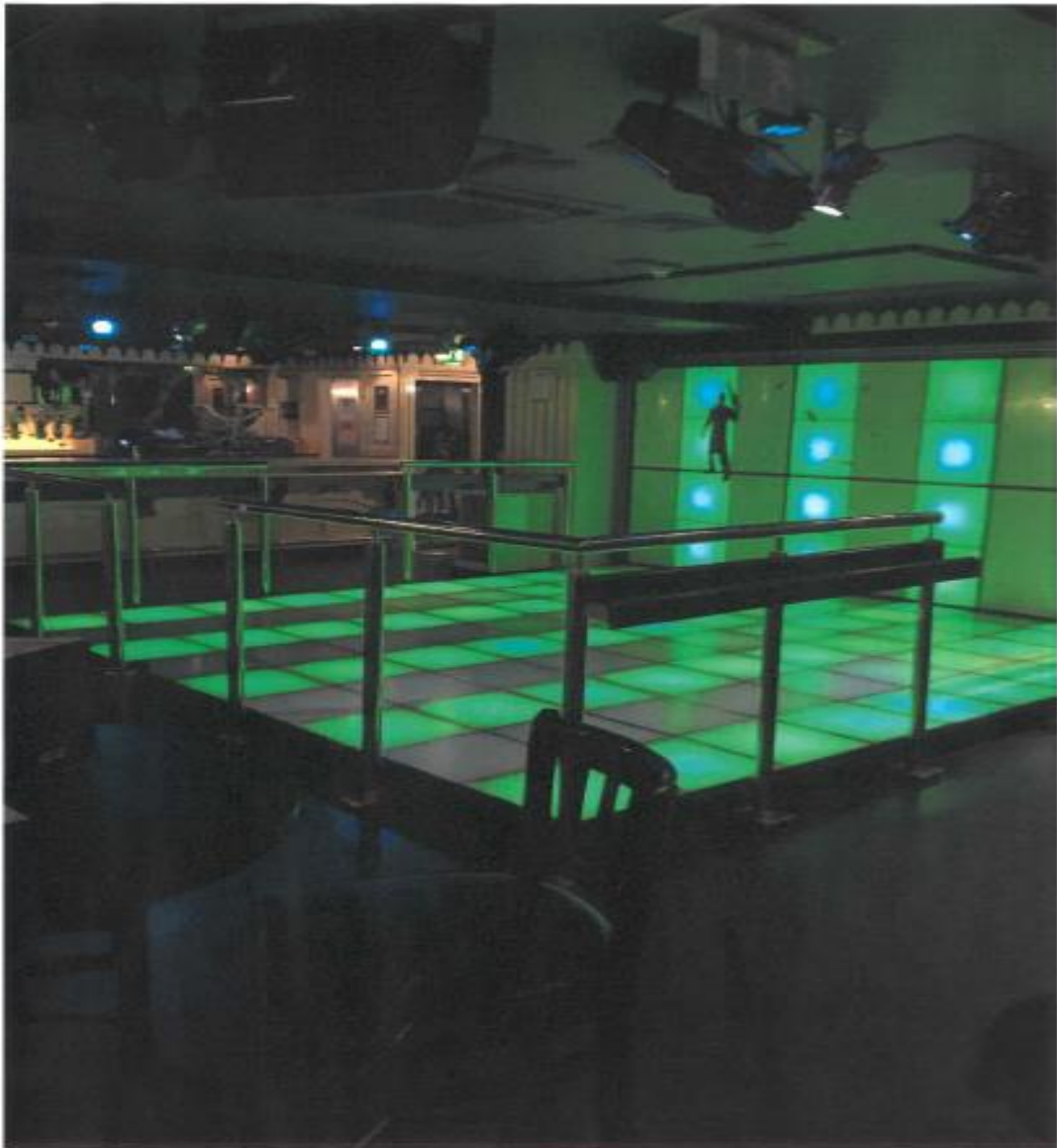

PROVIDED THAT in any calendar year, there have been no applications for a Temporary Event Notice, on no more than 15 occasions in that calendar year, the terminal hour on Sundays to be 3 am for the purposes of private pre-booked functions to which the general public are not admitted, following 10 working days notice to the Police and the Licensing Authority and subject to the written consent of the Police.
2. AND where this condition applies for less than a whole calendar year, the maximum number of such functions allowed in that calendar year shall be calculated pro rata.

3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

9. The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day.
10. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.
11. On Fridays and Saturdays from 21:00 hours there shall be a personal licence holder on duty at the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
12. There shall be no admittance or re-admittance to the premises after 01:30am.
13. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.

Proposed EH Amendment:

Save for alcohol consumed in an area appropriately authorised for the use of tables and chairs on the highway, all sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in deal containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises .

14. There will at all times be a minimum of 120 covers available for customers on the ground floor of the premises, such covers not to be removed at any time.
15. There will be no DJ or DJ led entertainment at the premises.
16. There will be no dance floor at the premises.

20. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry

and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

21. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
22. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - a) all crimes reported to the venue;
 - b) all ejections of patrons;
 - c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder;
 - d) any incidents of disorder;
 - e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons;
 - f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment;
 - g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol; and
 - h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
23. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a) The police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;
 - b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the police;
 - c) The crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and
 - d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.
24. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
25. The premises licence holder will risk assess at all times the need to employ SIA door supervisors and the number of SIA door supervisors but will in any event employ a minimum of two SIA door supervisors Sunday to Thursday from 21:00 hours and three SIA door supervisors from 21:00 on Friday and Saturday.

49. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided
50. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means
51. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device
52. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous
53. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the Licensing Authority

14. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licensees to any person for bringing customers to the premises.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments

Conditions related to the Sale of Alcohol

15. (a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall commence at 10.00 (12:00 on Christmas Day and Good Friday) and extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that -
- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and
 - (ii) on any day that music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight and 03.00, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end;
- (b) In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (a) of this condition shall have effect-
- (i) with the substitution of references to 04.00 for references to 03.00.
- (c) Except on Sundays immediately before bank holidays (including Easter Sunday), the permitted hours on Sundays shall commence at 12:00 and extend until 00.30 on the morning following, except that-
- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 00.30, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.
- (d) On Sundays immediately before bank holidays (excluding Easter Sunday), the permitted hours shall commence at 12:00 and extend until 03.00 on the morning following, except that-
- (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any Sunday on which music and dancing is not provided after 00.00 midnight;
 - (ii) where music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight on any Sunday and 03.00, the permitted hours on that Sunday shall end when the music and dancing end.
 - (iii) The terminal hour for late night refreshment shall extend to 30 minutes after the end of permitted hours for the sale of alcohol set out in d(i) and (ii) above.
- (e) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
- (f) The permitted hours on New Year's Eve will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day, or if there are no permitted hours on 1 January, to 00.00 on New Year's Eve.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;

- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

16. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

17. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

18. On Friday and Saturday nights and on any promoted nights after 2200hrs all staff engaged O/S the premises or supervising or controlling queues, shall wear high visibility jackets or vests.
19. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
20. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
21. On Fridays and Saturdays from 2100 hours there shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
22. A minimum of 6 SIA door supervisors shall on duty from 2100 hours with two permanently placed on the entrance and one permanently placed in the outside smoking area.
23. All persons entering or re-entering the premises shall be searched by an SIA trained member of staff and monitored by the premises CCTV system.
24. All staff engaged outside the entrance to the premises, supervising and controlling queues, and the outside smoking area shall wear high visibility yellow jackets or vests.
25. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
26. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
27. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
28. There shall be no admittance or re-admittance to the premises after 01:30am
29. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
30. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

31. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises after midnight e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to (25) persons at any one time.
32. The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.
33. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
34. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
35. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
36. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
37. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises are open.
38. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
39. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.
NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
40. After 23:00 hours patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, eg to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 41a. From 2100 hours, all drinking vessels used in the venue shall be polycarbonate. All alcohol in glass bottles are to be decanted into polycarbonate containers or polycarbonate carafes prior to being served, with the exception of champagne, wine or bottles of spirits with a minimum size of 70cl supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff shall clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles promptly from the

tables. Customers shall not be permitted to leave their table carrying any such glass bottles or drink directly from the bottle.

- b. Notwithstanding a) above, with the written agreement of the Westminster Licensing Police, a copy of which will be held at the premises reception, glass drinking vessels may be used for private or pre-booked events within the lounge/club area.
- 42. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 43. On Fridays and Saturdays from 21:00 hours on entry all customers shall have their ID scanned, save for when a biometric scanning system is in place (when fingerprint scanning will be required for all customers who have previously supplied and shown identification at the premises.) This is with the exception of a maximum of 25 guests per night who may be admitted with the manager's discretion. A legible record of those people's full names, dates of birth shall be retained at the premises for inspection for a period of not less than 31 days together with the manager authorising the admittance. The details recorded by the ID scanner shall be made available to the police upon reasonable request.
- 44. Notwithstanding the above, patrons who are attending a pre-booked private event will not be required on entry to have their ID scanned. This will be substituted with a written guest list to be held at reception for the event and will be retained for a period of 31 day post event for inspection by police and other such responsible authorities.
- 45. In the event that a serious assault is committed on or immediately outside the premises (or appears to have been committed) to the management's knowledge, the management will immediately ensure that
 - (a) The police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance service) are called without delay, using telephone number 999;
 - (b) All measures that are reasonable practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
 - (c) As is reasonably practicable, the crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
 - (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises.

Serious assault includes (but is not limited to) any assault in which emergency medical treatment is required and any assault in which a weapon is used.

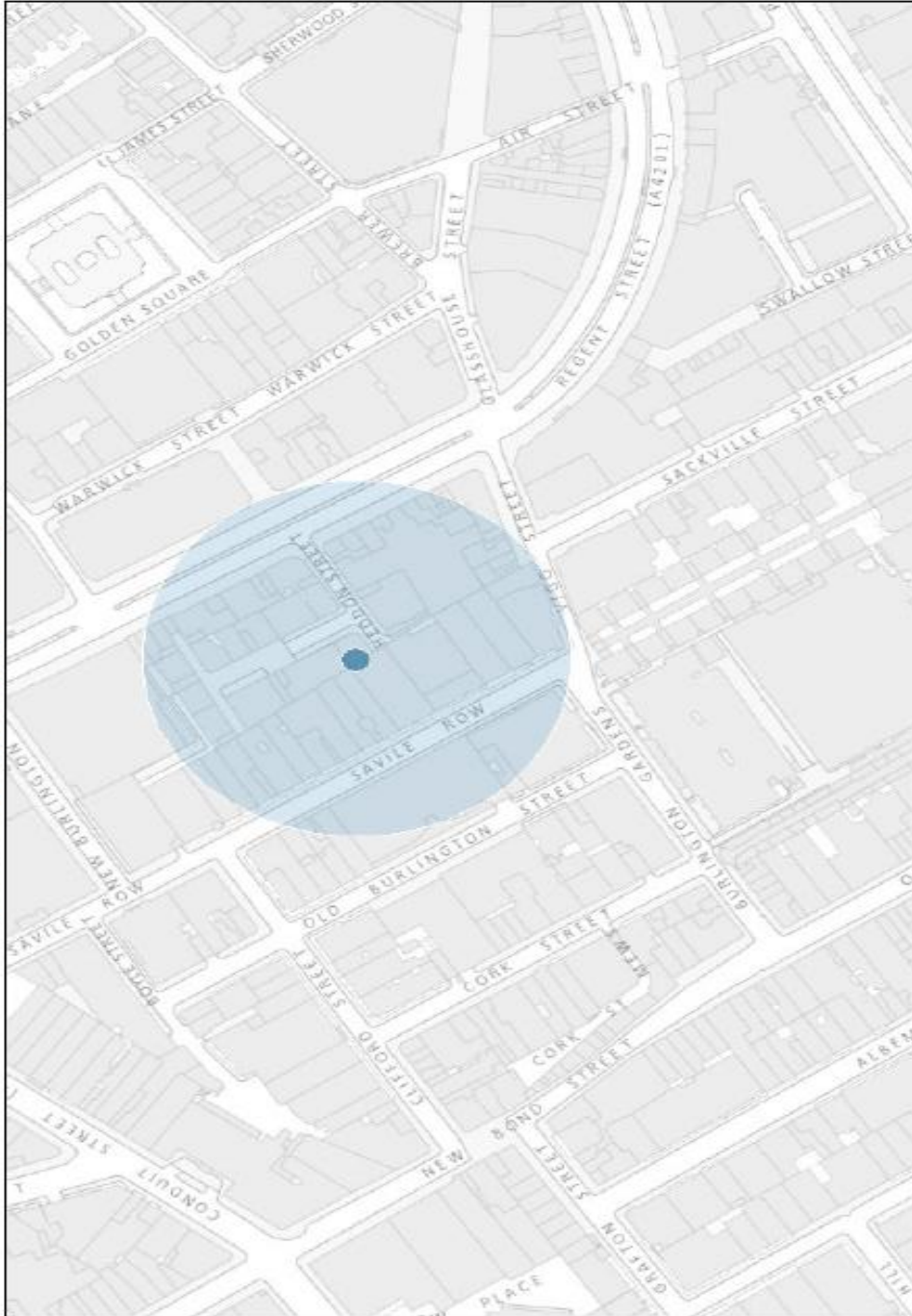

It is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the licensing objectives in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder as there are insufficient conditions within the operating schedule.

The venue is situated in the West End cumulative impact area, a locality where there is traditionally high crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

The conditions offered by you do address some of our concerns in relation to crime and disorder. However Police would like to add the following:

An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system.
- (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

I will be maintaining my representation as the current application is against Policy as set out by Westminster City Council, paragraph 2.4.21 relates to premises that do not sell alcohol beyond 2000 hours. If the applicant is happy to reduce the hours to 2000 hours to bring it in line with policy or propose additional conditions that restrict the sale of alcohol then Police will consider withdrawing our representation.

All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
11. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
12. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
13. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
14. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
15. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours.
16. Off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers only.
17. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours.
18. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises are open.
19. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence.

Appendix 3

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of

24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of

the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

9. The sale of alcohol on the premises shall at all times be ancillary to the main function of the premises as a patisserie.
10. The sale of alcohol on the premises shall be ancillary to the provision of cake.

All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises are open.
27. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence.

Conditions proposed by the Police

28. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) any faults in the CCTV system.
 - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Conditions proposed by the Licensing Authority

29. Off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers only and shall only be sold as ancillary to cake.

Whilst this is not unlawful it is poor practice due to staff working in this area leading to potential accidents from possible slippery floors etc. It is not advisable for members of the public to pass through food</p>

For such a small premises it is advisable to relocate the wash up area to behind the servery area with a deep sink and dishwasher machine. This would free up the corridor to allow safe access for the public.

Licensing Policy:

The premises are located within the West End Cumulative Impact area and as such policy CIP1, PB2 and HRS1 would apply if core hours are required with any application stating how it would not add to cumulative impact.

However policy recognises that some premises that are neither bars nor restaurants as defined by policy may wish to sell alcohol ancillary to their main use, policy 2.4.17.

The council therefore considers that where applications for licenses to sell alcohol for consumption 'On' the premises are made they are unlikely to add to cumulative impact if they are appropriately conditioned and the licensing times restricted to 20.00 hours, policy 2.4.21.

It is therefore advisable to restrict the operating times to;
Monday to Saturday 10.00 to 20.00 hours.
Sunday 12.00 to 20.00 hours.

Licensable activities can be provided from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

It is advisable to restrict 'Off' sales to these hours.

It is likely that any application beyond these hours would attract a representation from the licensing authority who are guardians of the licensing policy with potential representations from responsible authorities and residents.

Licensing Position:

It is proposed that a new application be submitted with conditions to address the four licensing objectives to minimise the impact of the operation on the CIA.

To address the licensing objective of Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm the following model conditions are proposed.

Conclusions

The proposed application should be applied for in line with the hours stated above to align with policy. The conditions proposed are in line with model conditions and suitably address the licensing objectives. Conditions have also been proposed to address Prevention of Crime and Disorder in line with police concerns. The new operation should not impact on the area if the conditions proposed are observed.

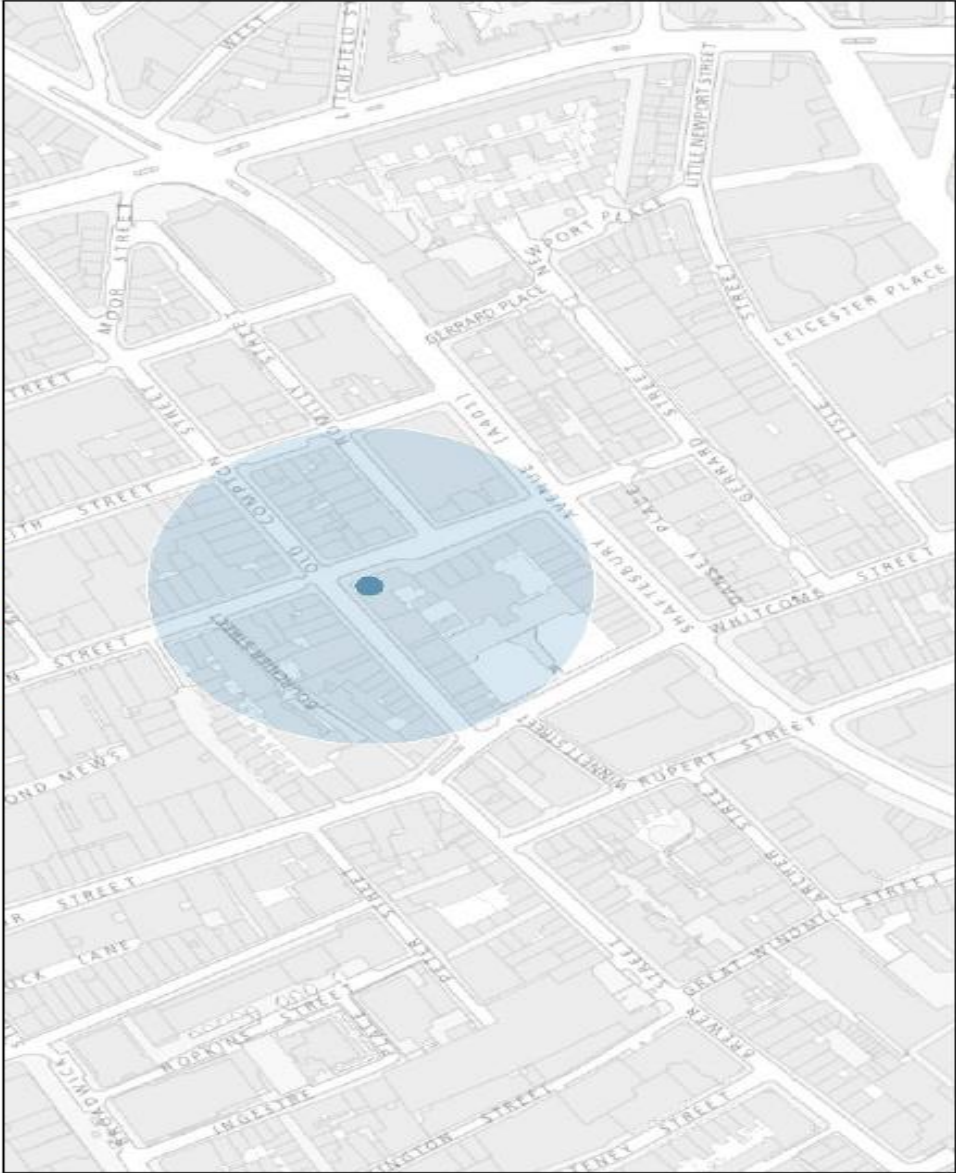
