Financial summary:

Churchill: From 2014-15 there has been a carry forward of £13,997.88. In 2015-16 a new pot of £46,000 is available.

The proposed expenditure of £4,787 from the Ward Budget and the £9,720 already allocated leaves £45,490.88 remaining for allocation in the current financial year

Tachbrook: From 2014-15 there has been a carry forward of £9,992.22. In 2015-16 a new pot of £46,000 is available.

The proposed expenditure of £4,786.50 from the Ward Budget and the £11,773.20 already allocated leaves £39,432.52 remaining for allocation in the current financial year.

Warwick: From 2014-15 there has been a carry forward of £11,212.43. In 2015-16 a new pot of £46,000 is available.

The proposed expenditure of £4,786.50 from the Ward Budget and the £17,352.10 already allocated leaves £35,073.83 remaining for allocation in the current financial year.

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#### 1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007. The extension to the ward budget programme was agreed in March 2010 for continuation until March 2014.
- 1.2 The renewal of the ward budget programme for the years 2014-2018 was agreed in June 2014; with a provision of £46,000 per ward.
- 1.3 Budget provision of £46,000 for the financial year 2015/16 exists to fund ward based projects; alongside any underspend from last year.

#### 2. Proposed Projects

2.1 £14,360 will fund the Upperdeckers programme at Westminster Boating Base for another year.

### 3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 Expenditure and approvals in process from Churchill Ward budget to date total £9,720 leaving £45,490.88 to be allocated.
- 3.2 Expenditure and approvals in process from Tachbrook Ward budget to date total £11,773.20 leaving £39,432.52 to be allocated.
- 3.3 Expenditure and approvals in process from Warwick Ward budget to date total £17,352.10 leaving £35,073.83 to be allocated.

## 4. Legal Implications

4.1 The proposals accordingly involve expenditure which is within the City Council's general power of competence, confirmed in Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 and within the guidelines for the use of Ward Budgets.

# 5. Outstanding Issues

5.1 Cllr Aiken has not played a part in the decision making on this funding as her daughter uses the Boating Base.

#### 6. Consultation

- 6.1 The proposals have been agreed by all three ward members please see above in regards to Warwick ward.
- 6.2 The proposal for the Upperdeckers programme has been drawn up and verified following consultation with Westminster Boating Base and the Council's Finance Department.
