1. Executive Summary

This report to the Adults, Health and Public Protection Policy & Scrutiny Committee from Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust ('the Trust') sets out the case for change and the proposals developed by Trust clinicians for improving the current acute medicine and chest pain patient pathways.

The Trust wishes to engage as widely as possible on the proposals during a planned engagement period and is seeking feedback from the Committee as part of this process.
