Westminster's City Plan (July 2016) – Adoption Statement

This Adoption Statement gives notice that Westminster City Council resolved to adopt Westminster's City Plan (July 2016) which incorporates its Basement and Mixed Use Revisions to Westminster's City Plan: Strategic Policies on the **13th July 2016**. The Westminster City Plan (July 2016) provides the vision, objectives, spatial policies and some detailed policies to guide development in the Borough over the next fifteen to twenty years.

The Plan was the subject of an independent examination conducted by an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. The Inspector's Report was published in June 2016 and the recommended main modifications have been included in the adopted plan.

In accordance with the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulation 2012, Westminster's City Plan (July 2016) which incorporates the Basement and Mixed Use Revisions to Westminster's City Plan, and the associated documents (including this Adoption Statement, Inspector's Reports, Integrated Impact Assessment (which comprises the sustainability appraisal report for the Basement and Mixed use revisions to Westminster's City Plan: Strategic Policies) and addendum, and Habitats Regulations Assessment Screening Assessment are available for public inspection at Westminster City Hall, 64 Victoria Street, London, SW1E 6QP (Monday-Friday 9am - 5pm) and can be viewed at Libraries located in Westminster during normal opening hours of those libraries.

Any person aggrieved by Westminster's City Plan (July 2016) may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power and / or that a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made within six weeks from the date of adoption of Westminster's City Plan.
