Summary 1.

- 1.1 This report seeks approval for the expenditure of £31,639.50 from the Marylebone High Street Ward Budget in order to commission:
 - 237 550mm diameter Summer and Winter hanging baskets, including full (a) maintenance from June 2018 till May 2019 in Marylebone High Street Ward.

1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007.
- 1.2 Budget provision of £46,000 per ward for the financial year 2018/19 exists to fund ward-based projects.

2. Proposed Projects

2.1 £31,639,50 will fund 237 550mm diameter summer and winter hanging baskets in Marylebone High Street ward, including full maintenance from June 2018 to May 2019.

3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Marylebone High Street budget to date total £31,639.50 leaving £14,360.50 to be allocated.
- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £31,639.50 and leaves £14,360.50 available for future allocation.

4. Legal Implications

4.1 Section 1 of the Localism Act, aka "the general power of competence" enables authorities "to do anything that individuals generally may do". The proposals within this report are consistent with the Council exercising this power.
