1. Executive Summary

- 1.1 West London CCG is an active partner in the North West London Health & Care Partnership and works with organisations, including other CCG and Local Authorities, to develop the North West London Health & Care Partnership.
- 1.2 The Health & Wellbeing Board is asked to discuss the summary report, and note that through the North West London Health & Care Partnership, Local Authorities have opportunity to influence the partnership's commissioning priorities.
- 1.3 CCGs commission services from acute, mental health and community hospitals/trusts, voluntary/ third sector organisations, and from GP practices via delegated arrangements from NHS England.
- 1.4 West London CCG's commissioning intentions are summarised in this report.

2. Key Matters for the Board

- 2.1 The North West London Health & Care Partnership forms CCGs' commissioning intentions.
- 2.2 West London CCG is the lead commissioner for Chelsea & Westminster Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, and works closely with Hounslow CCG to support the commissioning and contracting relationship with the Trust.
- 2.3 West London CCG commissions a number of integrated care programmes, including My Care My Way and Community Living Well. Elements of these programmes are commissioned from third sector organisations, and others may be commissioned by Local Authorities.

2.4 Further to this, CCGs across England are working with NHS England in delegated primary care commissioning arrangements, and West London CCG entered into delegated commissioning in April 2017.

3. Background

3.1 The North West London Health & Care Partnership is made up of over 30 NHS and local authority organisations. They plan, buy and provide health and care services for more than two million local residents across North West London's eight boroughs (around £4bn per year): www.healthiernorthwestlondon.nhs.uk

3.2 Each year commissioners set out their priorities for the coming year and how they will improve the health of the communities they serve. Commissioning intentions are where those priorities are set out by showing what kind of services commissioners would like to purchase in the coming year.

4. Options / Considerations

4.1 Local Authorities and The Health & Wellbeing Board, through the North West London Health & Care Partnership, have opportunity to influence the partnership's commissioning priorities.

4.2 Local Authorities and Public Health are also represented on the CCG's Governing Body and Primary Care Commissioning Committee.

West London CCG Commissioning intentions

Introduction

West London CCG is an active partner in the North West London Health & Care Partnership and works with organisations, including other CCG and Local Authorities, to develop the sector-wide plan for the North West London Health & Care Partnership.

CCGs commission services from acute, mental health and community hospitals/ trusts, voluntary/ third sector organisations, and from GP practices through delegated arrangements from NHS England.

West London CCG: acute hospitals



Chelsea & Westminster Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

- Top ten national Trusts in terms of all types of A&E attendances
- Care Quality Commission: rated 'good', outstanding practice recognised in a range of services – a huge achievement for the Trust
- Compared with other CCGs in NW London, West London CCG has relatively low acute expenditure

Priority areas

- **NW London Urgent Care Programme:** underpins national planning guidance and aligning care pathways across NW London
- **NW London Outpatient Programme:** streamlining pathways to reduce variation, improve patient experience, and release of costs for providers and commissioners
- **NW London Integrated Diabetes Service:** continuing specification with a view to developing outcomes-based approach to commissioning and provision
- Shadowing **NW London Integrated Care System**, bringing together primary care and community services in a coordinated way. Ensures NW London patients can expect a uniformly high level of care with pathways aligned to our large acute Trusts

West London CCG: Primary Care

We have worked with the West London GP Federation to develop new ways of working, including extended access at evenings and weekends

If you already receive any of these treatments in a hospital, you can now get the care you need in a nearby GP surgery or hub:

- Ambulatory Blood Pressure Monitoring
- Phlebotomy (blood tests)
- Case Finding, Care Planning and Case Management
- Coordinate My Care
- Diabetes
- ECG (Electrocardiogram)
- Homeless people specialist services
- Mental health
- Near Patient Monitoring
- Ring Pessary
- Spirometry testing
- Warfarin Monitoring
- Warfarin Advanced Monitoring
- Wound care



West London CCG: mental health and wellbeing

Kensington and Chelsea and Westminster have comparatively high levels of mental health need

We plan to:

- Further develop Community Living Well to support people with mental health needs to manage own health
- Continue investing to step-up psychological therapies team capacity
- Develop the community pathway, ensuring that everyone on caseloads receives the active input they need
- Work with My Care My Way to embed changes to dementia pathways
- Design, with Social Care, a rehabilitation offer as an alternative to inpatient units in Epsom, Surrey
- Continue prioritising Children's services, including mobilising trailblazer projects in schools



West London CCG: Integrated care and community services

- A range of service areas – many provided by Central London Community Healthcare NHS Trust (CLCH)
- Historically, West London CCG has invested in community services, contributing to our relatively low reliance on acute hospital services

We plan to:

- Build on My Care My Way to enhance joined up care for people aged over 65
- Expand our integrated care offer to a wider range of services, including End of Life Care and diabetes
- Retain focus on self care through close working with third sector and supporting social prescribing
