STATEMENT OF DECISION

SUBJECT: INCREASE IN LITTERING PENALTIES

Notice is hereby given that , Cabinet Member for Public Protection and Licensing, has made the following executive decision on the above mentioned subject for the reasons set out below.

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member for Public Protection and Licensing approved the proposed increase in penalties issued for littering to £150 with a reduced early payment rate of \pounds 95.

Reasons for Decision

- The penalty range from 1st April 2018 cannot be lower than £50 and cannot be higher than £150. If the Local Authority does not specify the rate, it defaults to £100. From 1st April 2019, the lower rate increases from £50 to £65. There is also an opportunity to offer a lower rate for payment within a specified time frame
- The current penalty for littering is £80. This is set at the highest level that the legislation allows.
- Currently the level for all fixed penalties relating to environmental crime in Westminster is set at the highest level that the legislation allows.
- To encourage early and increased level of payment for Environment crime Fixed Penalty Notices, Westminster currently offer a reduced early payment rate. This is set at approx.35%-40% lower than the higher rate if the Fixed Penalty is paid within 10 days
