Charlie Parker Chief Executive 10 July 2015 In considering applications for premises licences under the Licensing Act 2003, the subcommittee is advised of the following:

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The City of Westminster statement of licensing policy applies to all applications where relevant representations have been made. The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the City of Westminster statement of Licensing Policy and the guidance issued by the Secretary of state under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

PERMITTED TEMPORARY ACTIVITIES

The licensee of any premises is entitled under the Licensing Act 2003 to apply for permission to hold temporary events, authorising licensable activities instead of or in addition to any activities that may be authorised by a premises licence, subject to the following restrictions:

- 1) No more than 12 events over a total of 21 days may be held at any one premises in any year
- 2) Each event must last for no more than 168 hours
- 3) There must be 24 hours between each event
- 4) The number of people at each event must be less than 500.

A Temporary Event Notice for each event (a TEN) is required to be given to the licensing authority, the police and environmental health service no later than 10 working days before the event for a 'standard' TEN or 5 to 9 working days before the event is due to begin for a 'late' TEN. The licensing authority is required to send an acknowledgement by the next working day.

Once a Temporary Event Notice is given the police and environmental health service have a right to object to the event if they are satisfied that the event will undermine any of the licensing objectives of preventing crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, protection of children from harm and promotion of public safety. They must serve an objection notice stating their reasons as to why the objectives would be undermined to the licensing authority and the premises user within 3 working days of receiving a copy of the TEN. The licensing authority is required to hold a hearing and may issue a counter notice which will prevent the event taking place.

LIVE MUSIC ACT 2012

The Live Music Act amends the Licensing Act 2003 by:

- removing the licensing requirement for amplified live music taking place between 8am and 11pm before audiences of no more than 200 persons on premises authorised by a premises licence or club premises certificate to supply alcohol for consumption on the premises (at a time when those premises are open for the purposes of being used for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises), subject to the right of a licensing authority to impose conditions about live music following a review of a premises licence or club premises certificate
- removing the licensing requirement for amplified live music taking place between 8am and 11pm before audiences of no more than 200 persons in workplaces not otherwise licensed under the 2003 Act (or licensed only for the provision of late night refreshment)
- removing the licensing requirement for unamplified live music taking place between 8am and 11pm in any place, subject to the right of a licensing authority to impose conditions about live music following a review of a premises licence or club premises certificate relating to premises authorised to supply alcohol for consumption on the premises
- removing the licensing requirement for the provision of entertainment facilities
- widens the licensing exemption for live music that is integral to a performance of Morris dancing or dancing of a similar type, so that the exemption applies to both live or recorded music instead of just unamplified live music in that instance.

1. Relevant representations

ļ

- 1.1 The Environmental Health Service make an adverse representation against this application stating that the removal of conditions 13, 14 and 29 may increase public nuisance and impact adversely on public safety, they have suggested conditions, which are included in Appendix B. Additionally they have supplied a history of licensing enforcement visits to the premises, included with their representation.
- 1.2 The Metropolitan Police service has withdrawn their representation against this application, following the applicant agreeing that condition 14 will stay on the licence.
- 1.3 There are five resident that have made representation against this application on the grounds of public nuisance and promotion of public safety and say inter alia,
 - That the existing café is causing problems of public nuisance, and undermining public safety by straying on to the narrow council pavement with their signboards, and sometimes tables and chairs and ice cream vending machine, causing the public to walk in the road.
 - That the licence conditions regarding no consumption of alcohol on the outside tables is being breached regularly.
 - That the consumption of alcohol outside will add to noise and public nuisance that the residents suffer and add to the congestion on the pavement on a busy intersection and a street with heavy traffic.
 - And one has provided photographs from 2013 showing the premises allowing the consumption of alcohol on the outside tables in various styles of glassware.

2. Policies Applicable

2.1 The following policies within the City Of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy apply:

Applications will only be granted if it can be demonstrated that the proposal meets the relevant criteria in Policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.

3. Summary

- 3.1 The Licensing Sub-committee may refuse, grant in full or grant in part this proposal, having taken into account the representations received and Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy. The decision taken should promote the licensing objectives of:
 - prevention of public nuisance,
 - prevention of crime & disorder,
 - public safety and
 - protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 Where the committee is minded to grant the licence it will be granted subject to the mandatory conditions and conditions consistent with the operating schedule modified to such extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives detailed in Appendix B to this report.

4. Current Licensing Position

These premises currently hold a Premises Licence 11/09338/LIPN. Full licence history can be found in **Appendix A.**

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

<u>Conditions: On Current Licence - (This application suggest removal and changes to some of the existing licence conditions and these are detailed and highlighted in bold and underlined)</u>

Mandatory:

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: $\frac{1}{2}$ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -(b)

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- P is the permitted price, (i)
- D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were (ii) charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the (iii) value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a (c) premises licence
 - the holder of the premises licence, (i)
 - the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (ii)
 - the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol (iii) under such a licence;
- "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a (d) club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added (e) Tax Act 1994.
- Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) 8(iii). not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(iv). (1)8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of (2) alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- A suitably worded sign will be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and at the point of 9. sale advising that proof of age may be required.
- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum 10. requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system 11. shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff

member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received regards crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 13. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking substantial food there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to food.
 (<u>This application proposes the removal of this condition and the Metropolitan Police</u>
 Service have agreed this removal, their representation is withdrawn)
- 14. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only. <u>(This application initially proposes the removal of this condition and the Metropolitan Police Service disagreed so the applicant accepted their commentsl, their representation is withdrawn)</u>
- 15. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 16. There shall be no self service of alcohol.
- 17. There shall be no supply of draught beer.
- 18. No beer or cider above 5.5% ABV to be sold from the premises.
- 19. A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge (21), shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
- 20. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time shall not exceed 46 persons excluding staff.
- 21. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 22. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 23. No entertainment, performance, service, or exhibition involving nudity or sexual stimulation which would come within the definition of a sex establishment in Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended by the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1986 (whether or not locally adopted), shall be provided.
- 24. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times.
- 25. The entrance door shall be kept closed after 21:00 hours, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.





- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children;
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on;
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 8. The responsible person shall ensure that;
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures;
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.


Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 9. A suitably worded sign will be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and at the point of sale advising that proof of age may be required.
- 10. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 11. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received regards crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 13. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking substantial food there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to food.
- 14. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.
- 15. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 16. There shall be no self service of alcohol.
- 17. There shall be no supply of draught beer.
- 18. No beer or cider above 5.5% ABV to be sold from the premises.
- 19. A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge (21), shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
- 20. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time shall not exceed 46 persons excluding staff.
- 21. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 22. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

- 23. No entertainment, performance, service, or exhibition involving nudity or sexual stimulation which would come within the definition of a sex establishment in Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended by the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1986 (whether or not locally adopted), shall be provided.
- 24. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times.
- 25. The entrance door shall be kept closed after 21:00 hours, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
- 26. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
- 27. No rubbish, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 2300 hours and 0800 hours.
- 28. Licensable activities are restricted to the ground floor only.
- 29. No alcohol purchased at the premises shall be consumed outside the premises including at the tables and chairs outside the premises.
- 30. Tables and chairs shall not be placed outside the premises before 0730 hours each day.
- 31. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 2200 hours each day.

I refer to the application for variation of the Premises Licence.

Listed is the history of enforcement visits to the premises.

Saturday 23rd May 2015. Unlicensed Street trading - ice-cream trolley on private forecourt less than 7m from highway. Premises visited and saw a person selling ice-cream from a stationary trolley on private forecourt less than 7m from public highway outside 88 Wigmore Street. Spoke to owner of business - Ms Anisoara Olariu - who said that they had been doing this for two years and that they had permission from the Council. She could not tell me who had given this permission and a search of Uniform records did not show that any such permission had been given. To get further advice regarding 7m rule and to refer back to Ms Olariu.

No further action to be taken as this issue is classed as forecourt trading and as icecream is being sold inside the premises will be treated as an extension of the business. Case closed.

Friday 18th July 2014. Premises inspector visit.

Premises has conditions on licence stating alcohol must be served with food and that it cannot be consumed at table and chairs outside. The officer in charge of the premises requested that we conduct a test purchase to see if the premises would breach these conditions. Sat outside the premises and were brought menus. Orders made for alcohol and no food. Alcohol brought to us, at no point did staff ask us to move or require us to eat. Whilst we were there 2 men sat at a nearby table and ordered a bottle of wine. They did not order food either. We paid the bill at the table and got a receipt. At the time of our leaving the other 2 customers still had not consumed any food.

Thursday 5th June 2014 @ 16.58 hours. Complaint that cafe serving alcohol outside without a licence to customer using the existing licenced tables and chairs. Not investigated.

Friday 23rd August 2013 @ 19.16 hours. Complaint of live music outside and serving alcohol outside. Visited complainant @ 20.00 hours and music audible in bedroom of flat (window open) - went to restaurant - singer in doorway with speakers facing into the street - spoke to owner Camelia Olariu - business is operated by Carmina & Lancelot Ltd. Advised that speakers should be removed from the doorway and the music turned down. This was done and the level of the music was deemed to be satisfactory. Advised that any future problems may result in notice service.

Monday 22nd July 2013 office meeting held at the request of Ms Olariu, premises owner and Mr Fahmy, Licensing Enforcement and Ian Watson, Environmental Health to discuss recent complaints.

- She accepted that licence condition 29 (which prohibits alcohol purchased at the premises being consumed outside, including at the tables and chairs outside the premises) is sometimes breached. She was advised that this is a criminal offence which (if repeated) could result in prosecution and/or a formal review of the licence). Ms Olariu said she understood, but queried why this condition was in place. She was reminded that the condition was imposed at a public hearing which she attended, and that she did not appeal the decision, as was her right (see below). She said that she may apply to vary the licence (full variation application required) to relax or remove this condition. It was suggested that a suitable application may be to add the words "After 8pm" to the start of condition 19, but that any application may be opposed and ultimately may be refused.
- She confirmed that live musicians do play amplified music at the venue once a month and that for part of the evening they are outside the venue, on the private forecourt. It was stated that she was taking advantage of the recent relaxation of licensing requirements which arose from the Live Music Act 2012. I said that I agreed, from what she said, that such a benefit extended to her up to 11pm for performances INSIDE the venue, but if they perform outside this may well give rise to complaints of noise nuisance and (possibly) a formal review of the premises licence. The licensee agreed to keep the performers inside from now on.

Friday 5th July 2013 @ 22.09 hours. Complaint about band outside premises. Very loud music. Also serving alcohol, caller thinks they don't have licence. Premises visited @ 22.29 hours and band had loud speakers set up on pavement, advertised on website. Very loud, now stopped. E-mail to licensing to make them aware of alcohol and outside tables issue. Licensing emailed premises license holder to ask for explanation re allegations.

Friday 21st June 2013 @ 22.02 hours. Complaint of loud music. Premises visited @ 22.50 hours and no noise witnessed. Complainant did not want feedback.

I am resident at 90 Wigmore St, Flat 3 and I am writing to you to object to the proposed application by the above to serve alcohol at the tables on the street front. I have occupied this flat since 1990 and am very much aware of the situation outside this building and below my windows.

General comments

1. I find the wording of the application very difficult to understand and suggest that it is re submitted in language that makes it absolutely clear what is being requested.

2. Wigmore Street is very busy with traffic. At the crossroads with Mandeville Place and Wigmore Street the pavement is extremely narrow and dangerous (there have been fatalities in the past).

3. The tables, chairs and signs for Carmina Cafe are regularly placed on the Council pavement and from time to time alcohol is served at these tables in contravention of the existing licence. You will have records of previous complaints from local residents accompanied by photographs.

4. There is now a large ice cream vending machine on the pavement immediately outside Carmina Cafe adding to the congestion. Is Council permission required for this?

5. I understood that the existing permission for sale of food is for cold food only. As you will see fish and chips is now widely advertised as being available and the smell can be noticed from the flats above. You will know from your records that the cafe was closed for a week last year for a mouse infestation.

To whom it may concern,

I am writing to object to the premises licence variation application 15/03502/LIPV (submitted by Carmina Cafe) on the basis of Prevention of Public Nuisance.

I write as a local resident and neighbour of Carmina Cafe, who lives directly across the street from the outside tables on the Mandeville Place side of Carmina's corner site. Our main bedroom is directly opposite these tables. Allowing alcohol to be served at these outside tables will inevitably mean louder and much more animated conversations which will make it harder for us to sleep, and to have peaceful enjoyment of our main residence. Moreover Carmina's outside space is actually very narrow, and tables and chairs often encroach on the public right of way. The area is already very well served by licensed premises serving outside (notably James Street). Records will show that over the years many noise complaints were made to the Westminster Noise Team relating to patrons of establishments very near Carmina (Levant, Ayoush, etc). The proposed variation to Carmina's license will only make it harder for local residents to have peaceful enjoyment of their dwellings. North of Wigmore Street the character of the neighbourhood is much more residential and rights of residents should be defended in the face of encroaching commercial concerns. The site currently occupied by Carmina was originally a kitchen showroom, which then became a cafe, then Carmina came as a cosmetic salon that served food, but then got rid of the salon and began operating only as food and beverage establishment, and now wants to serve alcohol outside. You can see how the use of the site has been allowed to morph from its original intent to a point where commercial interests are allowed to impinge on the rights of residents.

I write on account of 90 Wigmore St, Flat 4 and I am writing to you to object to the proposed application by the above cafe to serve alcohol at the tables on the street front.

It would be an absolute disaster if you were to grant Carmina Cafe a licence to serve alcohol. Wigmore Street is very busy with traffic and Carmina Cafe is at the crossroads with Mandeville Place and Wigmore Street where the pavement is extremely narrow and dangerous.
 The tables, chairs and signs for Carmina Cafe are regularly placed on the pavement and obstruct pedestrians. I believe you already have records of previous complaints from local residents accompanied by photographs and also of previous breaches by Carmina Cafe of its licence terms. In addition, I also believe you have records that the cafe was closed for a week last year for a mouse infestation.

1. If alcohol is allowed to be served on the pavement tables this will inevitably add to extra congestion on this dangerous crossing. I very much doubt if the management of Carmina Cafe would be able to control customers standing up drinking on the pavement if the chairs were fully occupied.

2. I also draw to your attention occasional unruly behaviour from street drinking outside Black and Blue restaurant (92 Wigmore Street) together with extra noise and cigarette smoke immediately below our windows.

Street drinking will result in this narrow pavement becoming an outside bar with particular danger to pedestrians trying to cross Wigmore St at the traffic lights and facing heavy traffic.
 There are already enough drinking establishments nearby and Carmina Cafe would be an extremely dangerous place to grant an additional licence.

I am pleading strongly to the Council NOT to grant this application which would have a serious detrimental effect on the lives of local residents and would be a considerable danger to pedestrians and others.

I am resident at <u>90 Wigmore St</u>, Flat 2. I am writing to you to appeal against the application for serving alcohol outside the premises that the Carmina Café has made. I am worried on a number of fronts if this application is granted:

1) THREAT OF UNRULY BEHAVIOUR - Since the granting of a license to Black and Blue for alcohol, we have, on several occasions, had to deal with unruly behaviour on the pavement outside <u>90 Wigmore St.</u> There is a real danger that the "feel" of Wigmore St is being slowly eroded as these licenses are approved. This is starting to create a second Soho. That is not the reason why people choose to live in Marylebone and certainly not the reason why I bought my flat 10 years ago. In simple terms, I fear that Wigmore Street could start seeing more drunkards. Clearly Carmina Café doesn't want to attract such types directly but do we have to trust their judgment by allowing a license to be granted...especially in the light of numerous license breaches already (see point 3).

2) NOISE POLLUTION - Carmina has a number of tables outside the restaurant. A late licence would certainly increase the noise coming from the place. During the summer, this would be very disruptive since opening windows would mean hearing a lot of noise from the people sitting outside and smelling smoke.

3) CARMINA CAFÉ HAS A HISTORY OF BREACHING ITS ALCOHOL LICENSE WITH IMPUNITY; GRANTING A LICENSE NOW WOULD SEEM TO REWARD SUCH DISDAIN FOR THE COUNCIL - Carmina has a documented history of breaching its license already, ie, serving alcohol liberally OUTSIDE on many occasions. These have been reported to and investigated by Gavin Venamore. IT WOULD SEEM STRANGE TO GRANT A LICENCE TO A BUSINESS THAT HAS BEEN BREACHING ITS CURRENT LICENCE NUMEROUS TIMES ALREADY. It would set a poor precedent for how other businesses should deal with the council on issues where they 'want' what they can't have.

Overall, my fear is that once the slippery slope of outside drinking starts on a street, the ability to control a number of very negative externalities rapidly declines.

Once Carmina cafe noticed I am taking Photos of bridging their license, they started to serve alcohol in a water glasses, see it on a photos enclosed.


They have also bridge the license they hold, by having life music every Friday inside the cafe.

EH Conditions:

In addition to the conditions that have been agreed with the Police and the conditions offered in the application operating schedule Environmental Health proposes the following additional conditions for this application:

- 1. No more than 15% of the sales area shall be used at any one time for the sale, exposure for sale, or display of alcohol.
- 2. The licence holder shall ensure that outside of the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol and whilst the premises are open to the public, all alcohol within the trading area is to be secured behind locked grills, locked screens or locked cabinet doors so as to prevent access to the alcohol by both customers and staff.
- 3. No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises except for premium product in glass bottles.

- 4. There shall be no self- service of spirits on the premises, save for spirit mixtures less than 5.5% ABV.
- 5. Prominent signage indicating the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol shall be displayed so as to be visible before entering the premises, where alcohol is on public display, and at the point of sale.
- 6. The number of persons permitted at the premises at any one time (excluding staff and persons shopping) shall not exceed 15 persons.
- 7. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 8. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 9. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 10. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited (no ref. dated 29.06.2015) will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction, new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

11. The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.

These conditions are based on there being no clarity as to the principal operation of the premises – is it a bar or delicatessen/café where the alcohol will be ancillary to food or both etc.

The following further comments are also made:

Sanitary accommodation:

- Please note the capacity condition 6 above is based on this being a completely new build premises. In such cases where the provision of alcohol is for capacities of more than 15 patrons Environmental Health policy, in order to prevent Public Nuisance issues arising, is that for new build premises the provision of sanitary accommodations must be in compliance with the minimum provision as stated in *British Standard* 6465 -1:2006 + A1:2009; Sanitary installations Part 1: Code of practice for the design of sanitary facilities and scale of provision of sanitary and associated appliances.
 - For capacities of up to 15 patrons one unisex WC is considered acceptable.
 - In addition, for food and drink premises, facilities for staff should be separate from that for the public in accordance with guidance to food hygiene legislation

Nuisance from cooking odour/smell – planning status:

 I understand that the current planning designation of the premises is as an A1 Use premises. The applicant is advised to contact the Council's Planning Department to ascertain whether if the style of operation also requires a change of use to an A3/A4 Sui Generis Use premises.

- Should such a change of use be necessary the applicant is advised that it is Westminster Environmental Health's and Planning Department's policy for the prevention of Public Nuisance arising from cooking fumes that all new planning applications for change of Use to A3 Use premises will require <u>full height</u> discharge of any kitchen extract ventilation systems no matter the amount of cooking involved.
- Nevertheless the applicant is further advised that the planning status of the premises is generally not considered to be a material consideration as to whether any Premises Licence will be granted. Conversely, under planning legislation, the approval of a Premises Licence does not provide automatic grounds for the planning status to also be changed.

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula page 114

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.


Conditions proposed by EH and agreed by the applicant

- 9. Regulated Entertainment shall not commence until 5 minutes after the vessel has left a pier, and shall cease 5 minutes before the vessel returns to a pier.
- 10. No noise shall emanate from the vessel which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 11. The number of persons permitted in the vessel at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 45 persons.
- 12. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 13. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Conditions proposed by Police

- 15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 16. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 17. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula page 163

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.


Conditions proposed by EH and agreed by the applicant

- 9. Regulated Entertainment shall not commence until 5 minutes after the vessel has left a pier, and shall cease 5 minutes before the vessel returns to a pier.
- 10. No noise shall emanate from the vessel which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 11. The number of persons permitted in the vessel at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 120 persons.
- 12. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 13. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Conditions proposed by Police

- 15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 16. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 17. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.

I would ask the Licensing Board to consider that is a quiet residential area and therefore clearly not suitable for late night entertainment with alcohol and music, and to reject the applications.

APPENDIX B

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above page 214

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.



- The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time excluding staff shall not exceed: Ground Floor - 16 persons First Floor - 24 persons with an overall capacity of 40 persons at any one time.
- 10. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises shall only be to persons who are seated at tables.
- 11. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises shall only be to persons taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal

with the exception that there may be up to 15 people in the premises at any one time who are permitted to consume alcohol although not taking a table meal.

- 12. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.
- 13. Alcohol consumed outside the premises building shall only be consumed by patrons seated at tables.
- 14. The availability of alcohol without food shall not be promoted or advertised otherwise than on menus and price lists within the premises.
- 15. Alcohol shall not be supplied for consumption on the premises after 22:30 to persons who are not taking a table meal.
- 16. Sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be supplied with, and ancillary to a take-away meal.
- 17.All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 18. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them (except to persons seated at tables).
- 19. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 20. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times unless the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue Licence.
- 21. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 22.A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 23. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises is open.

- 24. A challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 25. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 23.00 hours each day.
- 26. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to 15 persons at any one time.
- 27. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 28. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly
- 29. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
- 30.All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 31.No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 32. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
- 33.No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
- 34. During the hours of operation ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that the aforementioned area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 35.A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity
- 36. The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.

I am writing to you in response to your letter of 26th May 2015. I wish to protest against the request for the granting of a license to sell alcohol at 38 Groom Place. This is a residential area which is being blighted by the very increased noise and rowdy behaviour of the people who use the Horse and Groom Public House (due to the closure of two other premises near by) to add another premises within a few feet would bring the number of people and noise level to even more unacceptable levels. We have people drinking outside on the street both standing and seated at tables. This leads to glasses, rubbish, drunken behaviour and people vomiting on our front step, which is unacceptable. My twelve year old son's sleep is disturbed by the noise in the evenings by these open air drinkers. I highlight this existing problem to emphasize the fact that this neighbourhood cannot face or cope with the increase in the number of people, noise and cars that a 38 Groom Place license would inevitably bring.

The license applied for is for seven days a week according to planning office I spoke to and until 11pm, our already over stretched residents parking will come under even more strain.

The use of these premises in the past has had far shorter opening hours and the proposal is for vastly extended opening hours (until 11pm) this is incompatible with residential homes in such close proximity. The application for a roof terrace will also mean an increase in noise and smell from people dining outside.

The council has granted planning permission for the change of use of 'The Grouse and Claret' Public House in Wilton Mews which is now a private house and for 'The Talbot Bar' in Little Chester Street which is due to be demolished to make way for private flats. This has meant that the custom in Groom Place has

swelled to unacceptable levels, it cannot cope with another premises with similar opening hours in such close proximity.

As regards road safety, the road is blocked by people standing or sitting at tables during opening hours. There is surely a safety issue to be considered.

I very much urge you to consider the effect on a very lovely grade II listed street. There are a great many licensed restaurants nearby in more commercial and suitable locations. Victoria is very near by with all its facilities. Please do not over commercialise this lovely mews and ruin its character as well as subject the residents to a very increased number of people and noise that this restaurant will bring.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone,

encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Consistent with the operating schedule

- 9. The area hatched black on the deposited plans shall only operate as a restaurant,
 - i) In which customers are shown to their table,
 - ii) Where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - iii) Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - iv) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - v) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23:00, and
 - vi) Where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.



- 10. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 11. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 12. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 13. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 14. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 08:00 hours on the following day.
- 15. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises and that this area shall be swept and or washed and litter and sweeping collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 16. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a sexual entertainment Venue Licence.
- 17. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 18. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 19. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 20. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

- 21. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 140 (or such other limit agreed with the Environmental Health Consultation Team).
- 22. The application will have no effect until the Licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the district surveyor's association technical standards for spaces of entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Westminster environmental health consultation team, at which time this condition will be removed from the licence.





1 - 8 Mandatory Conditions;

9. The area hatched black on the deposited plans shall only operate as a restaurant,

- i) In which customers are shown to their table,
- ii) Where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
- iii) Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
- iv) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
- v) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23:00, and
- vi) Where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 10. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 11. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 12. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 13. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

- 9. In the area hatched black on the deposited plan intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to his meal.
- 10. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 11. The maximum number of persons, including staff, to be present in the licensed premises shall not exceed the number specified from time to time by the proper officer of the London Fire and Civil Defence Authority. The number specified are:
 - (a) as to the ground floor in Porters Bar (no. 16) 100 persons.

- (f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 to 22:30

- (g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- (ii). Alcohol may be sold or supplied for one hour following the hours set out above (other than Christmas Day and New Year's Eve), and on Christmas Day, between 15.00 and 19.00, to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.
- NOTE The above restrictions do not prohibit:
- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking table meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 13. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.

(d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.





- 1. To permit the playing of recorded Music (indoors) on Monday on Saturday from 23:00 to 00:30, Sunday from 23:00 to 00:00 and from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.
- 2. To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment (Indoors) on Monday to Saturday from 23:00 to 00:30, Sunday from 23:00 to 00:00 and from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.
- 3. To permit the Supply of Alcohol (Off & On) on Monday to Saturday from 10:00 to 00:00, Sunday from 12:00 to 23:30 and from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

I wish to make Representations on the following grounds:

- 1. The Licensable Activity and hours requested for recorded Music (Indoors) will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the West End Stress Area.
- 2. The Licensable Activity and hours requested for Late Night Refreshment (Indoors) will have the likely effect of causing an increase within the West End Stress Area.

3. The Licensable and hours requested for the Supply of Alcohol (On & Off) will have the likely effect of causing an increase in the West End Stress Area.

The granting of the application as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Stress area.

The applicant has provided additional information along with proposed conditions with the application which is being considered but do not fully address the concerns of Environmental Health

We live at 14/17-19 Bedford Street Covent Garden WC2E 9HE almost directly opposite this premises.

We write to object to this application on the grounds that the likely effect will be to harm the licensing objective of 'prevention of public nuisance'. I also object on the grounds of cumulative impact in what is a designated 'stress area' under Westminster City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2011.

Background

We live opposite the premises and our two bedrooms, living room and kitchen windows look directly on it.

We are aware that this application is one of two (the other being 15/03907/LIPV) which have the combined effect of seeking to create two licences from one licence. We believe that the premises has previously been licensed under ref: 09/02377/LIPDPS. We are advised that the licence is a 'converted' licence from the previous legislation, and therefore contains no modern conditions which are commonly proposed/agreed to promote the licensing objectives.

This application seeks a new licence which seems to be broadly in similar terms to the existing licence. However, due to the points made below about the public nuisance already experienced by us and other residents, We do not think that the application should be granted on the terms applied for; the hours granted should comply with the Council's 'core hours' policy, and the licence granted should be restricted to restaurant use only. Although the applicant has proposed some additional conditions, they do not cover all our concerns by any means.

Prevention of public nuisance, and Cumulative impact

The application raises a number of issues. We fear that the whole area is losing its heart and community and theatre land in favour of late night drinking culture and all that comes with it. Both the applications for this site propose a later terminal hour, beyond the Council's 'core hours' Policy, and neither are restricted to full 'restaurant' conditions. The streets surrounding are already inundated with eateries theatre pubs bars and restaurants do making the establishments bigger and longer hours will set a precedence for all the other bars and clubs. Resident life is being squeezed out as closing hours lengthen, bottle collection and refuse collection mounts up, revellers roam the streets and early deliveries make living in the area harder and harder. All these issues are explicitly recognised in the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, and get worse with late licences being granted. Creating two licences from the existing licence could increase these current issues. We do not know who the proposed operators are, or how they intend to operate the premises.

These are very real problems, and have a day-to-day effect on residents' lives. However, in this case, we appreciate that a licence already exists, which reduces the prospect of these two applications being refused entirely. We appreciate that the current licence requires 'restaurant' conditions in only part of the premises. However, given the problems that residents in this area experience with increasing noise and nuisance as more and more applications are granted, we think it is appropriate that the full restaurant condition (Model Condition 66) applies to this licence throughout the premises. Ideally, we would also like the licence to be restricted to core hours. The licence applied for is to a terminal hour of 12.30am. This is a time when residents really should be able to expect to sleep, not to be woken up by customers leaving this premises.

Other conditions could be agreed (or, if not, imposed by Licensing Sub-Committee), such as limits on the times when deliveries take place, and when rubbish, including glass bottles, is collected. We think that servicing of this type should only be carried out between 8am and 9pm Mon-Fri, 9am to 8pm Saturday and Sunday.

We would like outside drinking to be forbidden, so at least noise is restricted inside

the premises apart from when people leave, which is a concern. Does the applicant have an operator in mind for this premises? Do they have robust policies, procedures and training to ensure that customers are directed away from residential areas? Given the proximity to residential accommodation, a limit on the number of smokers permitted outside at any one time should be imposed, to alleviate noise nuisance.

We should be grateful if the applicant confirm a couple of points for clarification:

- Is the overall licensable area increasing as a result of these two applications?
- Is the overall capacity increasing as a result of these two applications?

If the answer to either or both of these questions is 'yes', then this directly on the cumulative impact policies which the City Council has in place.

Conclusion

We look forward to being kept informed of any developments and would like to attend or be represented at any subsequent hearing in this matter.



This application proposes no changes to the existing licensable activities or hours.

1. Relevant representations

- 1.1 On 16 June 2015, the Environmental Health Service made a representation against the removal of condition 11 from the premises licence under the prevention of public nuisance and public safety licensing objectives. It states that conditions offered by the applicant in the operating schedule do not fully satisfy the concerns of Environmental Health. No representation is made against the removal of number 16 Henrietta Street from the licensed area, nor to the change of layout to accommodate this.
- 1.2 On 16 June 2015, a representation against this application was made by Philip and Caroline McIntyre, local residents living in close proximity to the premises, on the grounds of public nuisance and cumulative impact within the designated stress area. Mr & Mrs McIntyre request measures to be imposed on the licence regarding the following:
 - The full restaurant condition (model condition 66) to apply;
 - That the licence be restricted to core hours;
 - Limiting the times for deliveries and collections of rubbish and bottles between 08:00 and 21:00 Monday to Friday and 09:00 to 20:00 on Saturday and Sunday;
 - Outside drinking to be forbidden;
 - Limits to the number of smokers permitted outside at any one time.
- 1.3 On 29 June 2015, the applicant wrote to Mr & Mrs McIntyre to further explain the application and to offer a schedule of Model Conditions which would apply to both licences, if granted (see **Appendix B**).
- 1.4 Following receipt of the letter referred to in 1.3 above, Mrs McIntyre emailed the Licensing Service on 2 July 2015, in which she restated the concern regarding drinking in the street, late night hours and refuse on the street.

2. Policies Applicable

2.1 The following policy within the City of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy applies:

Policy RNT2:

Applications will be granted subject to other policies in this Statement and subject to the relevant criteria in Policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1, provided it can be demonstrated that they will not add to cumulative impact in the Stress Areas.

Policy STR1

- (i) It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Stress Areas for: pubs and bars, fast food premises, and premises offering facilities for music and dancing; other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1.
- (ii) Applications for other licensable activities in the Stress Areas will be subject to other policies, and must demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact in the Stress Areas.

3. Summary

- 3.1 The Licensing Sub-committee may refuse, grant in full or grant in part this proposal, having taken into account the representations received and Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy. The decision taken should promote the licensing objectives of:
 - prevention of public nuisance,
 - prevention of crime & disorder,
 - public safety and

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Conditions: On Current Licence -

Mandatory:

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that -
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: $\frac{1}{2}$ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

- 9. In the area hatched black on the deposited plan intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to his meal.
- 10. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 11. The maximum number of persons, including staff, to be present in the licensed premises shall not exceed the number specified from time to time by the proper officer of the London Fire and Civil Defence Authority. The number specified are:

 - (c) On Good Friday, 12:00 to 22:30
 - (d) On Christmas Day, 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22.30
 - (e) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10:00 to
 - (f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 to 22:30
 - (g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
 - (ii). Alcohol may be sold or supplied for one hour following the hours set out above (other than Christmas Day and New Year's Eve), and on Christmas Day, between 15.00 and 19.00, to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking table meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor

so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 13. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
 - (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

14. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.



- 15. The area hatched black on the deposited plans shall only operate as a restaurant,
 - i) In which customers are shown to their table,
 - ii) Where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - iii) Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - iv) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - v) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23:00, and
 - vi) Where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

16. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

- 17. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 18. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 19. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 20. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 08:00 hours on the following day.
- 21. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises and that this area shall be swept and or washed and litter and sweeping collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 22. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a sexual entertainment Venue Licence.
- 23. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 24. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 25. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 26. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:(a) all crimes reported to the venue (b) all ejections of patrons (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder (d) any incidents of disorder (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 27. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 220 (or such other limit agreed with the Environmental Health Consultation Team).
- 28. The application will have no effect until the Licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the district surveyor's association technical standards for spaces of entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Westminster environmental health consultation team, at which time this condition will be removed from the licence.
- 29. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between (**23.00**) and (**08.00**) on the following day.





1 - 8 Mandatory Conditions;

9. The area hatched black on the deposited plans shall only operate as a restaurant,

- i) In which customers are shown to their table,
- ii) Where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
- iii) Which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
- iv) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
- v) Which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23:00, and
- vi) Where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 10. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ¹/₂ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

- 9. In the area hatched black on the deposited plan intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied on the premises otherwise than to persons taking table meals there and for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to his meal.
- 10. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.

- (f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 to 22:30

- (g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- (ii). Alcohol may be sold or supplied for one hour following the hours set out above (other than Christmas Day and New Year's Eve), and on Christmas Day, between 15.00 and 19.00, to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.
- NOTE The above restrictions do not prohibit:
- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking table meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 13. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.

(d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. 



This representation is based on the plans and the operating schedule submitted.

The premises are located within the West End Stress Area.

The applicant is seeking the following:

- 1. To vary the current Premises Licence to remove No.16 from the licensed area and to change the layout to accommodate this.
- 2. To remove condition 6 from the Premises Licence which reads 'The maximum number of persons, including staff, to be present in the licensed premises shall not exceed the number specified from time to time by the proper officer of the London Fire and Civil defence Authority. The number specified are:
 - (a) As to the ground floor in Porters Bar (no 16) 100 persons
 - (b) As to the basement in Porters Bar (No.16) 40 persons.

I wish to make Representations on the following grounds:

- 1. No representation the applicant has offered a works conditions within the operating schedule which satisfies the Licensing Objectives.
- 2. Representation is made to the removal of Condition 6 under the Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety, Licensing Objectives. The applicant has offered conditions within the Operating Schedule but these do not fully satisfy the concerns of Environmental Health

We live at 14/17-19 Bedford Street Covent Garden WC2, almost directly opposite this premises.

We write to object to this application on the grounds that the likely effect will be to harm the licensing objective of 'prevention of public nuisance'. We also object on the grounds of cumulative impact in what is a designated 'stress area' under Westminster City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2011.

Background

We live opposite the premises and our two bedrooms, living room and kitchen windows look directly upon it.

We are aware that this application is one of two (the other being 15/03912/LIPN) which have the combined effect of seeking to create two licences from one licence. We believe that the premises has previously been licensed under ref: 09/02377/LIPDPS. We are advised that the licence is a 'converted' licence from the previous legislation, and therefore contains no modern conditions which are commonly proposed/agreed to promote the licensing objectives.

This application seeks to remove no16 from the ambit of the premises licence, and to make various changes to the layout. One of the changes in layout is to provide a 'central restaurant bar area with counter seating' in the basement. As far as we are aware, the premises has always been a restaurant and should remain so, with

no bar use except for those waiting to dine.

Prevention of public nuisance, and Cumulative impact

The application raises a number of issues. We fear that the whole area is losing its heart and community and theatre land in favour of late night drinking culture and all that comes with it. Both the applications for this site propose a later terminal hour, beyond the Council's 'core hours' Policy, and neither are restricted to full 'restaurant' conditions. The streets surrounding are already inundated with eateries theatre pubs bars and restaurants do making the establishments bigger and longer hours will set a precedence for all the other bars and clubs. Resident life is being squeezed out as closing hours lengthen, bottle collection and refuse collection mounts up, revellers roam the streets and early deliveries make living in the area harder and harder. All these issues are explicitly recognised in the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, and get worse with late licences being granted. Creating two licences from the existing licence could increase these current issues. We do not know who the proposed operators are, or how they intend to operate the premises.

These are very real problems, and have a day-to-day effect on residents' lives. However, in this case, We appreciate that a licence already exists, which reduces the prospect of these two applications being refused entirely. We appreciate that the current licence requires 'restaurant' conditions in only part of the premises. However, given the problems that residents in this area experience with increasing noise and nuisance as more and more applications are granted, We think it is appropriate that the full restaurant condition (Model Condition 66) applies to this licence throughout the premises. Ideally, we would also like the licence to be restricted to core hours.

Other conditions could be agreed (or, if not, imposed by Licensing Sub-Committee), such as limits on the times when deliveries take place, and when rubbish, including glass bottles, is collected. I think that servicing of this type should only be carried out between 8am and 9pm Mon-Fri, 9am to 8pm Saturday and Sunday.

We would like outside drinking to be forbidden, so at least noise is restricted inside the premises apart from when people leave, which is a concern. Does the applicant have an operator in mind for this premises? Do they have robust policies, procedures and training to ensure that customers are directed away from residential areas? Given the proximity to residential accommodation, a limit on the number of smokers permitted outside at any one time should be imposed, to alleviate noise nuisance.

We should be grateful if the applicant could confirm a couple of points for clarification:

- Is the overall licensable area increasing as a result of these two applications?
- Is the overall capacity increasing as a result of these two applications?

If the answer to either or both of these questions is 'yes', then this directly on the cumulative impact policies which the City Council has in place.

Conclusion

We look forward to being kept informed of any developments and would like to attend or be represented at any subsequent hearing in this matter.
