<p>Summary</p> <p>An application was made by the Metropolitan Police Service on 4th January 2017 to review the premises licence for Rah Rah Rooms, 215-217 Piccadilly, London, W1J 9HF under the Section 53A(1)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003 (premises associated with serious crime or disorder).</p> <p>A Licensing Sub-Committee was convened on 6th January 2017 to consider whether it was necessary to take any interim steps pending the determination of the Review applied for. The Sub-Committee decided to suspend the premises licence.</p> <p>On 10th January 2017 a representation was received from the Licence Holder against the interim steps to suspend the premises licence as they did not believe them to be appropriate or necessary to promote the licensing objectives,</p> <p>A further Licensing Sub-Committee was held on 12th January 2017. The Sub-Committee upheld the decision to suspend the Premises Licence.</p>		

Options

The Sub-Committee, after considering this report and the evidence present at the hearing, may take such steps (if any) it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The options are:

- (a) modification of the conditions of the premises licence (modify, delete or add conditions);
- (b) the exclusion of a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- (e) to revoke the licence

Where the Sub-Committee can take a step within (a) or (b) above, it may decide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for a specified period not exceeding 3 months.

Interim steps were taken on 6th January 2017 to suspend the premises licence. The purpose of this Licensing Sub-Committee is to carry out a full review of the premises licence pursuant to Section 53C of the Licensing Act 2003.

1. Summary of review application

- 1.1 On Sunday 1st January 2017, New Year's Day, at approximately 00:33 hours, serious crime and disorder took place at the Rah Rah Room, whereby three males sustained serious stab wounds.
- 1.2 Disorder broke out when two males began to dance with a female on the dance floor. Another male, who was in a group with this female punched one of these males.
- 1.3 CCTV shows for the next two minutes people from both groups moving around and interacting with each other. At 00:36 hours, another fight begins between the two groups. The groups are seen using bottles to assault each other.
- 1.4 Security arrive and manage to separate two groups from one end of the club to the other.
- 1.5 Approximately ten minutes later two unknown males approached one of the groups and another fight starts. These two males use bottles to assault the group. Both groups disperse all over the venue with people running to escape and with others fighting back. The males fighting back are seen on CCTV using bottles, tables and other items of furniture to throw. This fighting continues up the stairs as people are trying to escape.
- 1.6 It is at this point that the first male who threw the punch in the initial altercation is seen clutching his abdomen. He sits down in the seating area where some females assist him. He lifts his shirt and takes it off to reveal blood on his back and his shirt.
- 1.7 The two unknown males that attacked the group in the second incident are seen on CCTV running up the stairs and into the fire escape. They then leave the club via the back door onto Jermyn Street, W1.
- 1.8 Approximately seven minutes later, the male with blood on his back is seen with security being led out the back exit onto Jermyn Street where he is treated by paramedics who arrive. Another male is also led out to be seen by paramedics.
- 1.9 Many Police units soon arrive and it is confirmed that both these males received stab wounds to their abdomens.
- 1.10 There was a third male who was injured and his injuries were treated by staff at the venue.

- 1.11 No arrests were made at the time as security did not detain anyone long enough. Police were called at 00:50 hours. The first incident happened 17 minutes previous. This was sufficient time for Police to arrive on scene, which could have prevented the serious disorder and injuries that were sustained.
- 1.12 One of the males injured was 17 years old and therefore should not have been inside the venue.
- 1.13 On the 3rd September 2016 Rah Rah Room there was more serious crime and disorder at the venue, whereby a male was stabbed in his leg. There were failings by the venue in terms of searching, detaining people and crime scene preservation. CCTV footage showed staff cleaning the scene and mopping up blood.
- 1.14 Police Licensing engaged with the venue and took a stepped approach to work with them in order to prevent further incidents. This resulted in Police Licensing offering a number of conditions to go on their premises licence.
- 1.15 The venue refused to accept some of the conditions asked for, namely an ID scan system and search arches. Had this measure been accepted, it could have prevented this disorder from happening.
- 1.16 Since this incident occurred Police Licensing have had no contact with the DPS, Tony Flynn. On New Years Eve when Police arrived on scene, there was no sign of the DPS and the Operations Director, Arran Curtis was the point of contact.
- 1.17 The nature of this crime and disorder is so serious that it represents significant failings in upholding and promoting the Licensing objectives. This incident posed great risk to members of the public within the venue and its members of staff. CCTV shows staff jumping over the bar to hide and protect themselves.
- 1.18 Copies of the application and evidence have been served on responsible authorities, the licensee and their representatives.
- 1.19 CCTV of the incident will be made available at the Committee Hearing.

2. Submissions from Licensee

- 2.1 The submissions from the Licence Holder in support of the representations against the interim steps and which were considered at the Sub-Committee on 12th January 2017. These are attached to the report at **Appendix 3**.
- 2.2 At the date of publication of this report no further submissions have been received.

3. Response to Consultation

- 3.1 No representations have been received in relation to the review application.

4. Interim Steps

- 4.1 Under the provisions of section 53A(2)(a) of the Act the Licensing Authority must within 48 hours of receiving the review application consider whether it is necessary to take interim steps pending the determination of a full review of the premises licence.
- 4.2 The Licensing Authority held a Licensing Sub-Committee on 6th January 2017 to consider whether it was necessary to take any interim steps pending the determination of the full review. The Licensing Sub-Committee decided that it was necessary to suspend the Premises licence. Please see the decision attached **Appendix 4**.
- 4.4 A representation was received from the Licence Holder against the Interim Steps imposed at the Licensing Sub-Committee. Please see the email attached at **Appendix 5**.
- 4.5 A Licensing Sub-Committee convened on 12th January 2017 to consider the representation. They considered the application and heard evidence and submissions from the applicant and Licensee. The Licensing Sub-Committee decided that it was appropriate to uphold the decision to suspend the Premises Licence. Please see the decision attached **Appendix 6**.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premises licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

10. From 21:00 until 30 minutes after close of business, a minimum of 2 SIA licensed door staff to be stationed at the entrance on Piccadilly whose tasks will include:
 - Reminding customers that this is a residential area and to respect the needs of neighbours
 - To maintain an orderly queue where necessary
 - To ask customers leaving the premises to do so quickly and quietly
11. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
12. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed the following:

Mezzanine - 100
Basement Auditorium - 300.

With a maximum capacity of 400.
13. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) any complaints received regarding crime and disorder
 - (c) any incidents of disorder
 - (d) any faults in the CCTV system
 - (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
16. After 23.00hrs all persons entering or re-entering the premises shall be searched by an SIA-trained member of staff and monitored and recorded by the premises CCTV system. The searching will be supplemented by the use of two functional metal detecting wands.
17. After 23.00hrs all security employed at the premises shall wear high viz jackets or tabards
18. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.

19. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:
- (a) The Police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay, using emergency telephone number 999;
 - (b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
 - (c) As is reasonably practicable, the crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
 - (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises."
- 'Serious assault' includes (but is not limited to) any assault in which emergency medical treatment is required and any assault in which a weapon is used.

Annex 3 -- Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

20. There shall be no admissions to the premises after 02:30 hours.
21. No children under the age of 16 shall be permitted on the premises after 21:00 hours.
22. No children under the age of 14 shall be admitted on the premises.
23. No striptease, no nudity and all persons to be decently attired at all times.
24. The highway in the vicinity of the premises shall be swept at regular intervals and also at the close of business. Litter and sweepings collected shall be stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangement.
25. No unauthorised advertisements of any kind shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree or any other property, or is distributed to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises or any of its events, facilities, goods and services.
26. No payment shall be made by or on behalf of the premises for distribution of flyers or tickets within public areas in the Licensing District of Westminster.
27. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.
28. A daily log is to be maintained to ensure that any capacity limit set for the various floors and the overall capacity of the premises is recorded hourly and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.
29. On any evening where the premises or part of the premises are open for public music, dance and entertainment, alcohol may not be sold or supplied to persons admitted after 23:00 other than to:
 - (a) Persons taking a table meal; or
 - (b) Persons who have paid a minimum admission fee of at least £5 for music, dancing and entertainment (not to be credited against consumables)
 - (c) Persons who have paid a minimum annual membership fee of at least £150 payable in advance for music, dancing and entertainment (not to be credited against consumables) and their bona fide guests. A list of all people who have paid an annual membership fee and their guests will be held at reception for inspection by relevant authority; or
 - (d) Persons given free membership and their bona fide guests where there has been an interval of at least 24 hours between application for membership. A list of all persons who have free membership will be held at reception for inspection by the relevant authority; or
 - (e) Persons who are bona fide guests of the license holder or management, a list of whom shall be kept at reception for inspection by the relevant authorities; or
 - (f) Artists and persons employed by the premises; or
 - (g) Persons attending at private function; the function organiser's name and address to be kept at reception for inspection by the relevant authorities
30. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including water, shall be available throughout the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold and supplied for consumption on the premises.
31. The sale of intoxicating liquor must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.

32. No payment shall be made by or on behalf of the licensees to any persons bringing customers into the premises.
33. A noise limiter located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents or businesses. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the applicant only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
34. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Service.
35. Any additional sound generating equipment shall not be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
36. All entrance doors to be kept closed except for people's immediate access and egress.
37. No speakers shall be located in the entrance area.
38. All refuse will be paid, properly presented and placed on the street 30 minutes before any agreed collection time. Every endeavour will be made to prevent refuse being left on the street for more than 2.5 hours.
39. No bottles will be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 08:00.
40. No persons shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.

NOTE: This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
41. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, fire warning and fire fighting equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
42. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority annually.
 - (a) Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - (b) Any electrical installation
 - (c) Any fire alarm system
43. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
44. All exit doors shall be available at all times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
45. All fire doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not half open other than by an approved device.

46. Fire doors to ducts, service shafts and cupboards shall be kept locked shut.
47. The edges of the treads and steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
48. Only hanging, curtains, upholstery and temporary decorations, complying with the relevant British Standard shall be used. Where necessary these shall be periodically tested for flame resistance and re-treated as necessary.
49. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct fire safety signs, fire extinguishers or other fire fighting equipment.
50. Staff with specific responsibilities in the event of fire or other emergency, together with deputies, shall receive training and written instruction appropriate to their role.
51. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and sorted so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and generators
 - pyrotechnics and fog generators
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances
 - real flame
 - strobe lighting
52. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises will not be permitted to cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention or crime).
53. After 23:00, at least one Personal License Holder shall be on duty on the premises while intoxicating liquor is being sold or supplied.

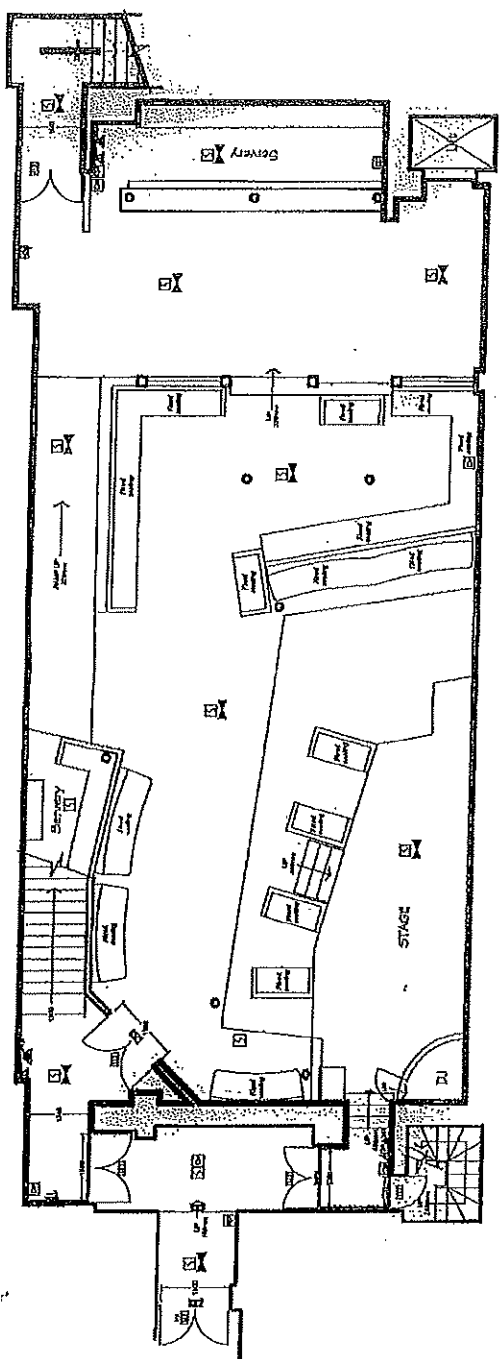

CCTV shows for the next two minutes people from both groups moving around and interacting with each other. At 00:36 hours, another fight begins between the two groups. The groups are seen using bottles to assault each other.

Security arrive and manage to separate two groups from one end of the club to the other.

Approximately ten minutes later two unknown males approached one of the groups and another fight starts. These two males use bottles to assault the group. Both groups disperse all over the venue with people running to escape and with others fighting back. The males fighting back are seen on CCTV using bottles, tables and other items of furniture to throw. This fighting continues up the stairs as people are trying to escape.

It is at this point that the first male who threw the punch in the initial altercation is seen clutching his abdomen. He sits down in the seating area where some females assist him. He lifts his shirt and takes it off to reveal blood on his back and his shirt.

The two unknown males that attacked the group in the second incident are seen on CCTV running up the stairs and into the fire escape. They then leave the club via the back door onto Jermyn Street, W1.

Approximately seven minutes later, the male with blood on his back is seen with security being led out the back exit onto Jermyn Street where he is treated by paramedics who arrive. Another male is also led out to be seen by paramedics.

Many Police units soon arrive and it is confirmed that both these males received stab wounds to their abdomens.

There was a third male who was injured and his injuries were treated by staff at the venue.

No arrests were made at the time as security did not detain anyone long enough. Police were called at 00:50 hours. The first incident happened 17 minutes previous. This was sufficient time for Police to arrive on scene, which could have prevented the serious disorder and injuries that were sustained.

One of the males injured was 17 years old and therefore should not have been inside the venue.

On the 3rd September 2016 Rah Rah Room there was more serious crime and disorder at the venue, whereby a male was stabbed in his leg. There were failings by the venue in terms of searching, detaining people and crime scene preservation. CCTV footage showed staff cleaning the scene and mopping up blood.

Police Licensing engaged with the venue and took a stepped approach to work with them in order to prevent further incidents. This resulted in Police Licensing offering a number of conditions to go on their premises licence.

The venue refused to accept some of the conditions asked for, namely an ID scan system and search arches. Had these measures been accepted, it could have prevented this disorder from happening.

Since this incident occurred Police Licensing have had no contact with the DPS, Tony Flynn. On New Years Eve when Police arrived on scene, there was no sign of the DPS and the Operations Director, Arron Curtis was the point of contact.

The nature of this crime and disorder is so serious that it represents significant failings in upholding and promoting the Licensing objectives. This incident posed great risk to members of the public within the venue and its members of staff. CCTV shows staff jumping over the bar to hide and protect themselves.

The Metropolitan Police request the Licensing Sub Committee consider immediate suspension of the premises licence pending a full hearing where the police will seek full revocation of the premises licence.

VIW1 is the victim Ryan BEERY.

Above officers attended the RAH RAH ROOM CLUB at 217 PICADILLY W1 at 0345 hours on SATURDAY 30th APRIL 2016 in response to an alleged assault on VIW1 outside the club.

Upon arrival to the club, there was approximately 15-20 people outside the venue in the smoking area. When officers spoke to the security staff at the club, they stated that there had been 2 or 3 ejections from the club due to drunk and disorderly behaviour. One of these males, pointed out by the security staff was VIW1.

When officers spoke with VIW1, he stated that he had been punched in the face by a male outside the club. VIW1 was rude, confrontational and uncooperative with police at the scene. He was also unable to provide a description of any SUS and exact place of offence due to his attitude and level of intoxication.

VIW1 was asked time and time again to accompany police to Charing Cross police station to take a report of the matter however VIW1 stated his friend was inside the club and he was adamant that he was going to wait outside for her. When given CAD reference number and advised to go CX front office to report the matter once he found his friend, VIW1 became even more confrontational stating "NOBODY IS DOING FUCK ALL TO HELP ME". Despite this, VIW1 was still very uncooperative with police and stated he wanted to go home.

staff at the club because they would not let him back into the venue to find his friend, due to his earlier
drunken behaviour. VIW1 came very close to being arrested for drunk and disorderly conduct and
following strong words of advice from police, VIW1 left the area with his friend who by this point had
left the venue.

My name is Adam Deweltz and I am a Police Constable for the Metropolitan Police Service. I have been a Police officer for 15 years and I am an experienced licensing officer currently working in the Westminster Police Licensing Unit. I have been in this role since November 2014. Since then I have dealt with a wide range of licensing matters including applications for new premises licences, licence committee hearings, licence review hearings and a large number of licensing visits to a variety of licensed premises within the City Of Westminster. My unit is responsible for approximately 3,500 licensed premises in Westminster. When visiting these licensed premises the aim is to work in partnership with them by making improvements and offering advice to ensure the licensing objectives are achieved.

Summary

I submit the below information in regard to an application by the Westminster Police Licensing Unit, on behalf of the Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police, to review the premises Licence of Rah Rah Room Piccadilly, W1J 9HF. Premises licence number 16/12870/LIPVM. I exhibit the review application (form 693) as ASD/1.

The Westminster Police Licensing Unit seeks revocation of the premises licence on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. On Sunday 1st January 2017, New Years Eve, at approximately 00:30 hours, serious crime and disorder took place at Rah Rah Room, Piccadilly, W1J 9HF. This resulted in three males being stabbed and sustaining serious injuries. Police have no faith or confidence in the operators of the premises and I will explain this throughout my statement.

Brief history of the venue

Rah Rah Room is a night club. Although the licence has been transferred to different licensees over the years, it was named as Rah Rah Room on the 20th July 2016. The DPS, Mr Tony Flynn became the licensee on the 5th August 2016. It currently has a premises licence, which I exhibit as ASD/2. The venue is situated in a busy part of the West End. It is in the middle of Piccadilly Circus, an area frequented by millions of people. The venue is just outside the Cumulative Impact Area. There is no doubt in my mind that when people leave the venue they enter the Cumulative Impact Area to get food and look for ways to get home.

The venue has two floors - a basement floor level, which has a stage and bar, and a sub mezzanine floor, which has a bar and kitchen area. From this level it is possible to look over the balcony to see the stage below.

The venue has different acts, which perform on stage. Rah Rah Room refer to these acts as Cabaret. Once the Cabaret has finished, the night club starts. It closes at 04:00 hours, which is four (4) hours after core hours defined in the Westminster City Council's Licensing Policy.

The operators were at another venue prior to Rah Rah Room. This venue was called Penthouse. Its address was 1 Leicester Square, WC2. This venue is now closed.



This is an indication that Penthouse was not incident free and during this time frame, there were a series of assaults.

Police Incident - 1st January 2017

As mentioned above serious crime and disorder took place at Rah Rah Room on the 1st January 2017, which has lead to the Metropolitan Police bringing an expedited review before the Licensing Sub Committee.

For clarity purposes I will explain that there are three different groups involved in the serious disorder.

Group 1: These are the males that initially dance with a female on the dance floor and where the entire incident begins.

Group 2: This is the mixed group of males and females. Within this group, two males are stabbed; the black male with dreadlocks and the black male with a beard and white t-shirt.

Group 3: This group consists of the males with a puffer jacket with a fur lined hood and a white top with black sleeves. This is the group that had a table booking on the basement floor level in the 'L' shaped seating area.

CCTV has been viewed. I will briefly detail what it shows. The times listed below are the times taken from the cameras:

00:33:21 Main Dance Floor - The incident starts when a male and his friend begin to dance with a female on the dance floor in the basement level. The female is in a group of males and females. Within this group is a black male with dark dread lock hair wearing a shirt with a coloured pattern on it. This male is one of the victims that sustains stab wounds to his abdomen and his back.

The female in the group moves away from the male dancing. The female is with another white male, believed to be her brother and he says something to the dancing male. A conversation occurs and a few seconds later the black male with the dreadlocks is seen punching the dancing male in the face.

For the next two (2) minutes people are moving around the floor and interacting with one another. It is difficult to ascertain who is in what group at this stage.

00:36:27 Main dance floor - The fight starts again and another tall black male is seen using a bottle to assault a male. This black male is seen holding a bottle throughout the course of the night. Security arrive on scene and attempt to separate the groups involved in the fight. They push people apart from one end of the room to the other.

The Police have still not been called by this point. For approximately ten (10) minutes the security and management are trying to ascertain what has happened.

00:43:54 Main Dance Floor - the two males from group 3 (puffa jacket and black sleeves) are seen on camera to approach the group with the male with dread locks and attack them with bottles. Another fight ensues and the two males that instigated this attack run upstairs, knocking people over and leave via the fire exit onto Jermyn Street unchecked by SIA Security.

00:43:08 Bottom Of Stairs - While these two males are escaping, the fighting continues downstairs with people picking up various items such as bottles, tables, a mop and a mop bucket accessory to use as weapons to inflict injury. As customers are fleeing the scene they are being hit with these items. Customers are seen to run for the stairs leading up to the exit onto Piccadilly.

00:44:00 Ramp - it is revealed a black male with a beard, wearing a white t-shirt has been stabbed, with what police believe to be a knife or bladed article. No knife is seen but CCTV shows the male lifting his top up to show his friends a stab wound. Another camera shows the black male with dreadlocks taking off his shirt to reveal blood on it. We now know he was also stabbed. In this group is the tall black male still armed with a bottle.

00:44:02 Bar Front - CCTV shows staff climbing over the bar to hide. The fact that staff felt the need to hide demonstrates they were in fear for their safety.

00:44:09 Bar Front - Door staff are seen to have no urgency about them when this is happening. There appears to be no communication and no leadership.

00:44:52 Main Dance Floor - The black male with the dread locks is seen holding himself and being seen to by his friends.

00:46:10 Main Dance Floor - CCTV reveals blood on the victim's shirt and an injury to his back. His friends are compressing the injury to his back and abdomen.

00:47:32 Mezzanine By Fire Doors - CCTV shows a third black male talking to the head doorman. He is led out of the fire exit holding his side.


00:48:51 Rear Stairs Bottom - the same injured male is lead towards the exit with door staff still holding his side. It is believed he is the third male to be stabbed in this disorder.

All these males are later led towards the fire exit on Jermyn Street and later joined by paramedics who treat them. Police arrive on scene at 01:11 and once they liaise with the London Ambulance Service, it is confirmed all three (3) males were stabbed.

23:01:30 - 23:05:59 Reception Entrance - Searching of customers was not done adequately enough. In this time, females are not searched. This is a breach of condition 16 on their premises licence.

Police were eventually called by a staff member at 00:50 hours. There is a delay in calling Police to the scene and this is a clear breach of Condition 19A on the venues premises licence. Further Police units respond and arrive on scene to implement a crime scene on Jermyn Street at the junction with Regent Street, W1. By this point there are no suspects identified or detained on scene for Police to arrest.

Police licensing officers were on duty this night and once we were notified of the incident, we made our way to the scene. I was with PC Day, PC Heaton and PC Churchill. We were met at scene with the Operations director Mr Arron Curtis. The DPS, Tony Flynn was not present. This was a surprise for us considering it was New Year's Eve - essentially one of the busiest nights of the year. The owner of Rah Rah Room is Alan Dugard. He was not at the scene.

There were still lots of people standing around the entrance trying to get bags and coats. At the time everything seemed very unorganised and chaotic. Once inside we went to the top bar and I took notes from Mr Curtis on what happened. From looking over the balcony, I could see the crime scene. There were lots of people still down stairs and at this time I was unaware if they were staff, door supervisors or customers.

We then viewed some CCTV footage of the incident and tried to piece together what had happened. While watching the footage, PC Heaton and PC Churchill went to check on the condition of the casualties and liaised with Inspector Ramsay who was in charge of the crime scene on Jermyn Street, W1. When they returned they updated me that the casualties had been stabbed and were being placed in Ambulances to go to Hospital.


We were then joined by DC Graham Hillsdon from the Major Crime Unit and other detectives who attended to investigate the offence.

Once we were satisfied what had happened I asked Mr Curtis to put aside all footage from all cameras so we could watch it ourselves to ascertain the sequence of events. Given the time of night, I told Mr Curtis I would pick up the footage either Monday or Tuesday and then we would decide what action would be taken.

It has already been confirmed by the Westminster Gangs Unit that two members from the Mozart Gang were involved in the violence and received stab wounds. I exhibit PC Lakhani's statement as ASD/10 and PC Lewars statement as ASD/12. This also presents an opportunity for gang reprisals, which must be avoided at all costs. The suspects who committed these stabbings are still outstanding. This investigation is still live and ongoing but presently the suspects, who tried to murder the victims, are still out there in the community. With the venue refusing to have an ID scan system the Police are unable to identify the suspects with a view to arrest and prosecute.

Police Incident - 3rd September 2016

On Saturday 3rd September 2016 at approximately 03:30 hours a fight occurred at the venue between two groups whereby a male received an injury to his upper right leg. Police believe his injury was caused by a knife or bladed article. The victim had to attend hospital and he received stitches. When Police spoke to the victim he stated that he saw the suspect crouch down in front of him and made a forward movement with his hand towards

thigh level. He also stated that the security did not check any guests for weapons.

Once again there were huge failings by the venue. This was almost an identical incident to the 1st January 2017 stabbings. People were not adequately searched, suspects were not detained, a crime scene was not put in place and vital evidence was destroyed when blood was mopped up by staff.

The venue did not engage with Police and therefore this lead to the crime report being closed. There was a delay in getting CCTV to Detective Roberts, the officer investigating the offence. He stated on the Crime report (CRIS 6539297/16) that the club staff had begun cleaning up immediately after the fight prior to Police arrival. There were multiple foot prints through blood on the floor.

A Scenes Of Crime Officer (SOCO) attended and due to the cross contamination and cleaning up, no forensics opportunity could be found. As stated on the Crime Report DC Roberts tells the venue to provide the CCTV as soon as possible or Police Licensing will be informed.

CCTV was collected by me and a separate copy given to DC Roberts. Once this was viewed by Police Licensing, PC Guerra and I visited Rah Rah room to discuss what had happened. We sat down with the operators to ascertain the facts and agree what action could be taken to prevent an incident like this happening again.

The operators tried to convince us that they did everything they could have and stated they believed the red liquid on the club floor, which was mopped up, was cranberry juice. We were clear to the operators that this was blood given the nature of the victim's injuries.

Outcome

It was decided to take a stepped approach and work with the venue so further incidents like this would never happen again. 14 conditions were put forward by PC Guerra for the venue to accept. Out of the 14, only 7 were accepted. A copy of an email from PC Guerra to Mr Alan Dugard is exhibited as RGG/05. Key conditions such as Polycarbonate drinking vessels, an ID scan entry system, search arches and Body Worn Video Cameras were not accepted. If these conditions had been put on the premises licence, they could have prevented the incident on New Years Eve from happening. Police Sergeant Hoppe completed a statement outlining his disappointment at

the venue for not taking the situation seriously. I exhibit his statement as ASD/9.

The operators clearly demonstrated they were not safeguarding its customers and its staff. It was explained to them that if there was a repeat of this incident, the Police would be left with little option than to consider taking review proceedings.

As part of the process to improve how Rah Rah Room dealt with assaults and serious disorder, it was arranged by them to have Crime Scene Preservation Training. They arranged this themselves using an external company and PC Sandy Russell Police Licensing attended the training. I exhibit her statement as ASD/8.

Expedited review

On Friday 6th January 2017, the Licensing Sub Committee took interim steps to suspend Rah Rah Room's Premises Licence. It was felt that there was no confidence in the way the management dealt with the two incidents on the 3rd September 2016 and on the 1st January 2017 and as a result the Licensing Objectives were not promoted. Several failings had been identified such as lack of urgency from security, failing to accept conditions originally asked for following the September incident, failure to learn from that incident, failure to preserve the crime scene on the 1st January and failure to control the incident as a whole. I exhibit the Licensing Sub Committee minutes as ASD/6.

On Thursday 12th January 2017, a second hearing took place. After hearing six (6) and a half hours of evidence a new Licensing Sub Committee suspended the premises licence for the second time.

I have also attached some online reviews, which I exhibit as ASD/11. These reviews were found online and completed by independent people who had experienced the serious disorder on the 1st January 2017. These reviews were written on Rah Rah Room's Facebook page, Trip Advisor and a website called Design my night.com. Each review was written by a different person but they all refer to how the venue lost control. It is mentioned that someone was stabbed and how suspects used bottles as weapons to cause injury.

Conclusion

The nature of this crime and disorder is so serious that it represents significant failings in upholding and

promoting the Licensing Objectives. The venue has already shown that they breached licence conditions and therefore alternative action and other steps would not address Police concerns in regards to the prevention of Crime and Disorder. The Police have no confidence in any of the operators or senior management at Rah Rah Room.

Had it not been for the London Ambulance Service attending when they did, someone could have died. The Police view this with such severity that the Premises Licence must be revoked to protect the public.

The Metropolitan Police are recommending full revocation of the premises licence at Rah Rah Room, 215 - 217 Piccadilly, W1J 9HF.

On Thursday 19th January 2017 at 12:25 hours, Police licensing received a phone call from Mr Mark Halton. He is a licensing consultant and working on behalf of the operators at Rah Rag Room. He spoke to PS Hoppe and I was present for the entire phone call. I could hear PS Hoppe telling Mr Halton that we will not be meeting with him or anyone else from the venue to discuss the review proceedings. PS Hoppe stated that PC Guerra had already engaged with the venue for the September incident and PC Deweltz and PC Day had already engaged with them for the New Year's Eve incident. At this point any further contact would happen at the review on Friday 27th January 2017.

I am the person named above. I am currently employed as a Licensing Sergeant for City of Westminster Police based at City Hall 64 Victoria Road London SW1, responsible for supervising the Police Licensing Function in Westminster. I have been this role since July 2015 and previous to this I was a licensing officer on Islington Borough. I am qualified to BHAB Level 2 Practitioner and before joining the Metropolitan Police I completed door supervisors courses and have considerable experience as a nightclub doorman. I am also qualified to BTEC National Diploma in Hotel Catering and Institutional Operations (full catering/ food and beverage management course).

This statement is made to assist the Court to rebut comments made by Mr Alan Dugard during the Licensing sub-Committee meeting of the expedited review of Rah Rah Room Nightclub 215-217 Piccadilly London W1 on Friday 6th January 2017.

I am aware of the reasons behind this review application made by PC Deweltz and shall not repeat the details of the incident which led to this review. During the review meeting I have been informed by the Licensing officers who attended that Mr Dugard, the owner/ operator of Rah Rah Room made a comment regarding Police negotiations of a previous incident on 3rd September 2016 where a male was stabbed in the venue. Mr Dugard apparently said something along the lines of 'During negotiations PS Hoppe told me that Police suggested a wish-list of conditions and they didn't expect the premises to accept them all'. This statement is to clarify what was said and my position. I shall also exhibit the email chain where I clearly explain in writing to Mr Dugard that he has completely mis-understood my conversation with him during an unexpected meeting at the end of September 2016.

After the reported stabbing at Rah Rah Room 215-217 Piccadilly W1, I tasked PC Guerra to carry out a proportionate licensing investigation and consider whether any Police action was required. As part of this investigation he requested a considerable amount of CCTV, which I agree to collect during routine licensing visits in the West End area of Westminster. I do not recall the exact day, but while waiting for the CCTV to be supplied


to me, I met, for the first time, Mr Alan Dugard. I spoke to him in general about Westminster Police Licensing and how our transparent investigations were carried out. I explained that Police engage with venue operators very quickly after incidents, and as required by the Westminster Licensing policy, we point out the issues of concern and make suggestions on how the issues raised may be resolved. This may include premises license conditions which are taken from the Westminster City Council 'basket of model conditions', but as every condition must be proportionate and appropriate to the incident, the wording may be adapted and the venue may of course chose not to take Police advice. It appears from this conversation, Mr Dugard felt that he didn't have to take police advice and refused to consider some of the key premises license conditions PC Guerra was suggesting. I exhibit ten (10) pages of emails which refer to this conversational piece as PEH/1. They start with an email from PC Guerra on 29th September 2016 to both Mr Alan Dugard and Mr Arron Curtis where PC Guerra is very clear what he is asking for by way of premises license conditions after this stabbing incident. Mr Dugard replies six (6) days later on 5th October 2016, with the 'wish list' comment. I reply to Mr Dugard on 6th October 2016 rebutting this 'wish list' comment stating that he (Mr Dugard) should contact PC Guerra to understand which conditions PC Guerra feels are important to resolve the issues around the stabbing at this venue on 3rd September 2016. Mr Dugard then replies to me on 7th October 2016; apologising for his mis-understanding. I re-iterate my position later the same day on 7th October 2016 and Mr Dugard again apologises at 1539 hours the same day.

It can therefore be seen quite clearly that Mr Dugard understands my position and I cannot understand why he felt the need to repeat in a Licensing Committee meeting that he feels the list of suggested conditions from Police after a serious incident were a 'wish list'. It is also very important to note that the venue took a considerable amount of time to make an application to vary the premises license after this stabbing. I am very sure that the venue will say that there was no evidence a male was stabbed during this incident, and this is why they took time to make an application to vary the premises license. As I oversaw PC Guerra's licensing investigation, I can state the following:

- 1) The victim (who was known to Police) did not wish to substantiate an allegation.
- 2) The CCTV was in a poor position and Police could not identify who was fighting at the time of the male being stabbed. Therefore the suspect remains at large.
- 3) There were two groups involved on the night and there were three (3) altercations between the two groups before the male was stabbed. At no point did security attempt to eject either group until when the victim was stabbed.
- 4) Bottles were thrown during the incident.
- 5) There was very poor crime scene management.
- 6) Security struggled to eject the fighting parties.
- 7) No suspects were identified.

All the above points are very similar to the incident on New Years Eve which triggered this expedited review.

8) Staff at the venue tried to convince Police that the large amount of blood clearly seen on the floor of the venue was 'Cranberry juice'. This was clearly not true.

9) The venue also tried to convince Police that the male was injured by some sharp implement in his pocket and no actual stabbing took place. Considering the amount of blood, the violent nature of the two warring groups and the fact that the victim did state to the initial investigating officer that a male from the other group made a thrusting move towards his thigh (where the wound was found), it is very likely that a knife or other intended offensive weapon was used.

10) The investigating officer states on page four (4) of the Crime Report (6539297/16) "The victim was treated at St Marys hospital for a puncture wound to his upper right thigh."

11) The initial investigating officer writes on the Crime Report that the victim stated "He also stated that none of the security checked any guests for potential weapons."

Despite a thorough licensing investigation, Police could not find visual evidence on the CCTV supplied by the venue of the victim being stabbed or a suspect leaving the venue with a knife. Due to comments made by the victim, the initial investigating officer and continuity officer, I am convinced that the victim was stabbed in the venue, but I could not provide evidence on CCTV to evidence it. The victim was not prepared to assist police and neither would his friends. It is only for this reason that the venue was not reviewed for this incident to enforce the conditions suggested by PC Guerra.

The incident on 31st December 2016 is very similar to the one on 3rd September 2016 and is now the second incident where customers of the venue were stabbed. There have now been four (4) stabbings in this venue in less than three (3) months. The venue appears to be in denial that there is a violence problem and it is for the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety that Police are requesting the premises license at this venue is revoked. I shall attend the full Licensing sub-Committee meeting on Friday 27th January 2017 to answer any questions the Committee may have in relation to the contents of this statement.

I am Police Constable Reaz Guerra, currently employed in the Westminster Police Licensing Unit.
 I joined the Metropolitan Police Service in 2002 and was posted to the Borough of Westminster in 2003, working in numerous operational roles. I moved to the Westminster Licensing Unit in April 2011.
 Since my appointment in the Licensing Unit I have dealt with a wide range of licensing matters including applications for new premises licences, variations to existing premises licenses, licensing committee hearings, licensing reviews and a large number of licensing visits to licensed premises within Westminster.


This statement is provided in relation the application for a review of the premises licence for Rah Rah Room, 215-217 Piccadilly, London, W1J 9HF

Following an incident at this premises on 3rd September 2016, as recorded on Crime report number 6539297/16, PC Deweltz arranged to visit the premises to meet with them to discuss the incident. We attended the venue on Tuesday 6th September 2016 at 1200pm and met with Mr Alan Dugard, Aaron Curtis, Tony Flynn, Alessandro Andolina.

Alan Dugard provided an account of the incident, stating:-

- The incident only lasted 40 secs,
- There was no visible injury
- There was no build up to the incident, no crime scene to preserve
- Liquid on the floor was cranberry juice

Mr Dugard showed us footage of incident, however he only showed us footage of a small part of the incident, again claiming the incident only last for 40 seconds.

From the information that was provided to us, Mr Dugard, stated that the venue operated a polycarbonate policy, however from the footage viewed customers could be seen drinking from beer bottles, this was pointed out to Mr Dugard who stated that this was due to staff error.

Following this meeting at the premises, Mr Flynn provided police with the following by email (dated 7th September 2016

- A typed incident report dated 3rd September completed by Tony Flynn and Arron Curtis
- A Hand written Accident and Incident form completed by a person named Sunny (VIP Manager), dated 3rd September 2016
- A handwritten TSS Security incident log completed by Lawrence Serrano, (head Doorman), dated 3rd September 2016
- An Accident and Incident form completed by persons unknown as the handwriting is illegible, dated 3rd September 2016
- Accident and Incident form completed by a person named Allesandro Andolina (Manager) dated 3rd September 2016

The email and associated attachments are produced as exhibits RGG/01, RGG/01/a, RGG/01/b, RGG/01/c, RGG/01/d, and RGG/01/e respectively. A Further email was received from Tony Flynn detail the CCTV was ready for collection and that the premises would be carrying out a CCTV suvery. Email produced as exhibit RGG01/f.


The incident report was broken down into three main sections,

- (1) Details of incident,
- (2) Actions & recommendations, and
- (3) Police/Council Licensing Recommendations & Requests

This incident report gave the following description :-

A fracas broke out between 2 groups of males on the ground floor. From reviewing the CCTV and discussing with management and security it is mainly pushing and shoving but whilst this is occurring one of the gentlemen falls to the ground onto a VIP Ice bucket containing a bottle of spirits. Management and Security are very quickly on the scene and the disagreement is quickly dealt with. The two groups are separated and on removing the gentle man that fell to the back exit he complained that his leg was hurting. There was no damage to his jeans so he pulled down his trousers to reveal a cut just below his right hand trouser pocket (approx. 5 minutes after incident), impossible to identify whether this has been caused by his fall or something within his pocket. First Aid was applied, police and ambulance were called immediately.

The premises themselves proposed 6 recommendations on their incident report, detailing the following:-

- Security Positions and front door policy , continual monitoring of large groups of males, reviewed on a nightly basis.
- Large groups of males to be monitored continually. Not allowing large group of males and VIP tables should be mixed male/female groups.
- Searching to include wand and pat down and all re-entries for people leaving for cash machine/cigarettes however long they are out of the building.
- Upgrade of CCTV hard drive.

The premises also noted the Police Licensing observations/recommendations as follows:-

- *Police licensing suggest that looking at this incident the likelihood was that someone could have been hurt and a crime scene should have been implemented until it had been established that this was not the case.*
- *In any incident where a person has been injured both the police and ambulance services must be requested at same time*
- *Guests should not be allowed to walk around with spirits or champagne in their hands. Beer bottles decanted*

These recommendations were based initial observations on the information provide and CCTV that had been viewed at this meeting. Even at this early initial stage Police raised concerns over what had been seen on CCTV and the way in which the incident had been dealt with.


We requested that CCTV footage be provided to us. This was provided on 9th September 2016. I then reviewed the CCTV provided and having viewed the footage it was apparent that the account provided by the venue had clearly downplayed the incident and the level of disorder was far greater than that initially portrayed by the venue. It was clear that blood could be seen on the floor within the club and that one of the managers (Alessandro Andolina) gave instructions to staff to clear up the scene.

I then contacted Mr Flynn to arrange a meeting at City Hall to discuss the Police concerns. This meeting took place on 16th September 2017 at 0920 hours at City Hall and was attended by Mr Aaron Curtis, PS Hoppe and myself. Mr Flynn was unable to attend to a train derailment.

Mr Curtis was shown CCTV footage from the incident. The failings and concerns identified by police were discussed with Mr Curtis, When showed the footage the following was pointed out to him:-

- Level of disorder and violence
- Victim with trousers down identifying he has an injury
- Reaction of customers and in particular the reaction of security

- The large amount of blood on the floor after the victim has been stabbed
- Actions of the manager Alessandro Andolina.
- Staff clearing up scene within minutes of incident.

Mr Curtis insisted the victim had not been stabbed, there was no crime scene as there was no obvious injury and that it was Cranberry Juice that had been split on the floor.

At the meeting I requested the premises provide an action plan to address police concerns. With the information provided at the initial meeting at the venue and the subsequent meeting at City Hall it was clear to me that the venue were still insistent that the victim had not received any serious injury within their venue.

Mr Curtis followed this up by email later that day with an action plan, a copy is produced as exhibit RGG/02

Jack Neil (TSS Security Operation Manager) provided Police with details of all SIA door supervisors on duty, email dated 15th September 2016, produced as exhibit RGG/03

Police have been provided accounts by email dated 15th September 2016 from two of the door supervisors working on the night, these are produced as exhibit RGG/04,

The account provided by Gbenga Olajide is as follows:

My name is Gbenga Olajide. On the 2nd of September 2016. I worked at Rahrah Room night club. Around 03:20 am I notice there fighting on the ground floor of the club very close to the fire exit where I manned. Myself and other security around were all around to address the situation. I managed to contained the group in which one of them was stab and asked one of the management staff to asked the other group to out. But they refused to leave. One of the group I hold came from now where with his trouser opened and I saw blood gushing out and all his mate are furious about this. Security advice Manager to call for Ambulance which he did. Very shortly ambulance arrived and later a group of police attended the incident. I did not see or identified the one that carry out the stabbing. Thank you.

The account provided Mr Gbenga Olajide was clearly contrary to what police had been to both by Mr Dugard and Mr Curtis.

Given the information provided by security and the CCTV footage seen by police I suggested a number of conditions to be added to their premises licence with a view to reducing the risk of similar incidents re-occurring. Whilst some of the suggested conditions were agreed and accepted, Mr Dugard stated he felt that some of the conditions were not appropriate nor proportionate. Further to his comments I

This statement refers to the incident on 1st January 2016 at the RAH RAH ROOM, 217 PICCADILLY, W1J 9. I was working alongside the WESTMINSTER LICENSING team for new years eve to help with the high demand of licensing checks needed during this time. I was working along side PC ADAM DEWELTZ 2556CW, PC MICHAEL DAY and PC WILL HEATON 1274CW for the evening.

Earlier in the evening we had been to the RAH RAH ROOM venue and spoken to the director ARRON CURTIS in relation to their licensing agreements and to ensure that they were being followed appropriately. We were told that it was a ticketed event and the numbers etc were all pre-arranged and were being monitored.

Whilst my colleagues and I were conducting a licensing visit on another venue on the WEST END I was informed by my colleagues on the licensing team that they had just received a call from their Sergeant stating that there had been an incident at the RAH RAH ROOMS venue. Due to this we made our way to the venue, where we arrived at about 0110 hours. On our approach from Piccadilly Circus it could be seen that the rear of the venue, JERMYN STREET W1 had been cordoned off by police and I could see both police and LAS vehicles were on scene. I also noticed that there was a large crowd out the front of the venue due to the club cancelling the event and everyone in the venue having to leave. We made our way to the front of the venue where after speaking to the door staff we were met by the director ARRON CURTIS and escorted into the venue.

We were taken to the first floor of the venue where there was a small office which contained the CCTV facilities where ARRON CURTIS stated that he would show us the incident. At this point we were speaking with ARRON CURTIS to find out the details of the incident and how it occurred. ARRON CURTIS showed us where the incident had taken place that was on the ground floor in the front corner nearer the stage. It seemed that the area had not been properly cornered off and people could easily and were walking in and around the area. ARRON CURTIS appeared to be shocked and kept stating to us that he didn't understand how the incident happened as it was a great evening and that it came out of no where. ARRON CURTIS stated that the whole incident only lasted a few minutes and also stated that to his knowledge there were no serious injuries, only one male with a graze looking injury on his stomach/ abdomen, this description did not match the police scene and LAS presence we had seen out the back of the venue and for this reason myself and PC

These are my original notes, written at CHARING CROSS POLICE STATION on WEDNESDAY 18th JANUARY 2017. My notes started at 1516hrs.

I am Police Constable Will Heaton 1274CW and I am employed by the Metropolitan Police Service since FEBRUARY 2015. I am based at CHARING CROSS POLICE STATION and on WESTMINSTER BOROUGH, attached to MAYFAIR SNT.

These notes relate to an incident that I helped deal with on 1st January 2016 at the RAH RAH ROOM, 217 PICCADILLY, W1J 9HN. During my shift, I was working alongside the Licensing team as part of police aid for NEW YEARS EVE. I attended RAH RAH ROOM with colleagues PC GRANT CHURCHILL 1748CW, PC ADAM DEWELTZ 2556CW and PC MICHAEL DAY at 0122hrs after a call came out saying that there had been a double stabbing at the venue.

We had previously been to this venue earlier that evening, following a licensing check to see that the club was adhering to its licence and to speak with the manager about the event which was occurring that evening. We spoke to the Operations Director, ARRON CURTIS, who informed us that the New Year's event at the venue was a ticketed only event, it had been self-promoted and that attendees were having their bags searched before entering the club.

When we arrived at the venue at 0122hrs, I noticed that JERMYN STREET, which is at the back exit of RAH RAH ROOM had already been cornered off by police on scene. I also noticed that there were two males lying on the floor next to the back exit of the venue, being treated by LAS. I was told by one officer standing by the crime scene that those were the victims who were suffering from stab wounds. I walked with colleagues around to the front of the venue on PICCADILLY. We spoke to bouncers and asked to speak to the manager. ARRON came to meet us and took us down stairs to the first floor.

Firstly, ARRON showed us where the incident was said to have occurred which was on the ground floor in the corner of the dance floor next to the seated area. A cornered off area could visibly be seen when looking over the railings from the first floor onto the ground floor. All Guests had been escorted out of the venue and the lights were on. I sat with Adam and Michael while they spoke to ARRON about what had happened. ARRON seemed to be bewildered by what had occurred and i felt like he was trying to play the whole incident down

somewhat. I felt this because ARRON stated that he had seen a victim of the incident and said that the only injury suffered was a graze on his side and that there was no blood. ARRON appeared to be unaware of the crime scene and the state of the victims outside the venue. ARRON also continually stated that he had no idea why or how the incident had happened as the event was ticketed only and that it had been a lovely evening prior to this.

After speaking with ARRON, PC CHURCHILL and I went outside towards the rear of the venue on JERMYN STREET to the crime scene in order to get an update about the injuries suffered by the victims.

PC CHURCHILL spoke to LAS while I spoke to two Detective Constables who were at the crime scene. However, I cannot remember their names. I was informed by one of the Detective Constables that the incident was possibly gang related. I was then also informed by LAS on scene that both victims were IC3 males. One was suffering from two minor stab wounds and the other had a stab wound on the lower left hand side on his abdomen. These were not thought to be life threatening at the time.

Upon heading back to the front entrance to RAH RAH ROOM, I spoke to PC DAY and updated him on the status of the victims. During this time, PC DAY and PC DEWELTZ began looking over CCTV alongside ARRON. Although I did not view all of the CCTV, I saw at one point that there appeared to be an IC3 male sat down on a chair with his top off being treated by other attendees. It was believed that this male was one of the victims who had been stabbed.

Due to this, I went downstairs to the ground floor where the incident had taken place and towards the cornered off area. Looking into the crime scene, I could visibly see that there were specks of red liquid on one of the chairs where CCTV had shown the victim sitting. I believed this to be blood. I therefore went upstairs to the CCTV room and told both PC DEWELTZ and PC DAY. At this point, two detective constables also arrived and began viewing CCTV as well.

I went downstairs again and saw that SOCO had arrived at the crime scene on the ground floor. At this point, I was then told by PC DAY and PC DEWELTZ to go back to CHARING CROSS POLICE STATION as they were going to continue looking at CCTV footage. This statement was completed at 1605hrs at CHARING CROSS POLICE STATION.

This statement relates to the day I was present during a training session for Crime Scene Preservation Training at Rah Rah Rooms Piccadilly in September 2016.

I am a Police Licensing Officer and have worked as part of Westminster's Licensing team for 7 years. I am an officer of 23 years service within the Metropolitan police and have gained a vast amount of operational and training experience in this time.

One of my responsibilities as part of my current role is to provide Crime Scene Preservation training free of charge to Licensed premises. This would normally take place when requested by a responsible operator or offered to venues where an incident of violence has taken place. The training I offer is about an hour long and involves the use of a power point presentation. To date I have provided the training for many venues and to over 1500 members of staff. I have received positive feed back and found that it is good for forming relations between the venues, their staff and the police. My package includes covering what a venue is expected to consider and implement once an incident occurs. I also cover the following:


How to deal with making a 999 call and when they should do this, what to do with the victim, a suspect, a crime scene, any witnesses. We discuss the use of force, powers to detain a person, how to avoid a detained person suffering with positional asphyxia and how to identify a person who may be suffering from excited delirium and how to deal with it.

On Saturday 3rd September, 2016 there was an incident involving violence at Rah Rah Rooms in Piccadilly. We believed that a male had been stabbed during a fight. I was asked by PC Reaz GUERRA whether I would be willing to provide my training package to the venue, I said that I would be happy to. Within a short period of time I was told by the venue that they had arranged their own training through JSS Security, the company who supply their door staff. I contacted Tony FLYNN, the DPS of Rah Rah room and asked whether I could attend and sit in on the training to ensure it was detailed enough, Mr FLYNN agreed. Mr FLYNN told me he would see me there but he wasn't present at the venue when I arrived or make himself known to me while I was there.

I attended the venue for the training on the evening of 23rd September and was shown to the seating area where the training was due to take place by Alessandro ANDOLINA, one of the managers. I don't recall seeing any other member of the management team there during the evening. I was soon introduced to John FIELDS from Abacus Training Group who was the trainer, I found him to be friendly, professional and welcoming. He told me he would appreciate my input into his training and explained his back ground, I was impressed with his experience. When we started the session there were a good number of staff present including members of the security team who were involved in the incident. I was say there were around 20 people present overall, maybe more. In the main I listened to Mr FIELDS and I found him to be a very knowledgeable, clear and professional trainer. As we went over the incident the effect it had on staff started to become apparent and the session turned into a de-brief. The door staff stated they did not feel there were enough of them to deal with the incident and contain parties. They said they thought that the police should have been called sooner in the evening but they weren't. They felt the groups who were verbally arguing to start with should have been ejected earlier but they weren't as the manager had not given them permission to do this and the groups would be monitored. As a result the incident escalated and became the large scale violent disorder that it was They said bottles were used and there was a great deal of glass

and blood across the floor, that was quickly cleared away by staff. One doorman said that he felt very vulnerable during the incident and they were unable to contain it and detain offenders due to the level of violence. It was said that the cleaning staff were instructed to clean up the mess very quickly, clearly having no understanding of crime scene preservation. Mr FIELDS and myself went over, slowly and clearly what we would have expected the venue to do, where they went wrong and what they must do if anything similar were to happen in the future. The input was detailed, accurate, reassuring and honest. The session went on for such a long time I had to leave before it's conclusion. I left the venue confident that Mr FIELDS would end the input with the staff being clear on police expectations should anything similar happen again.

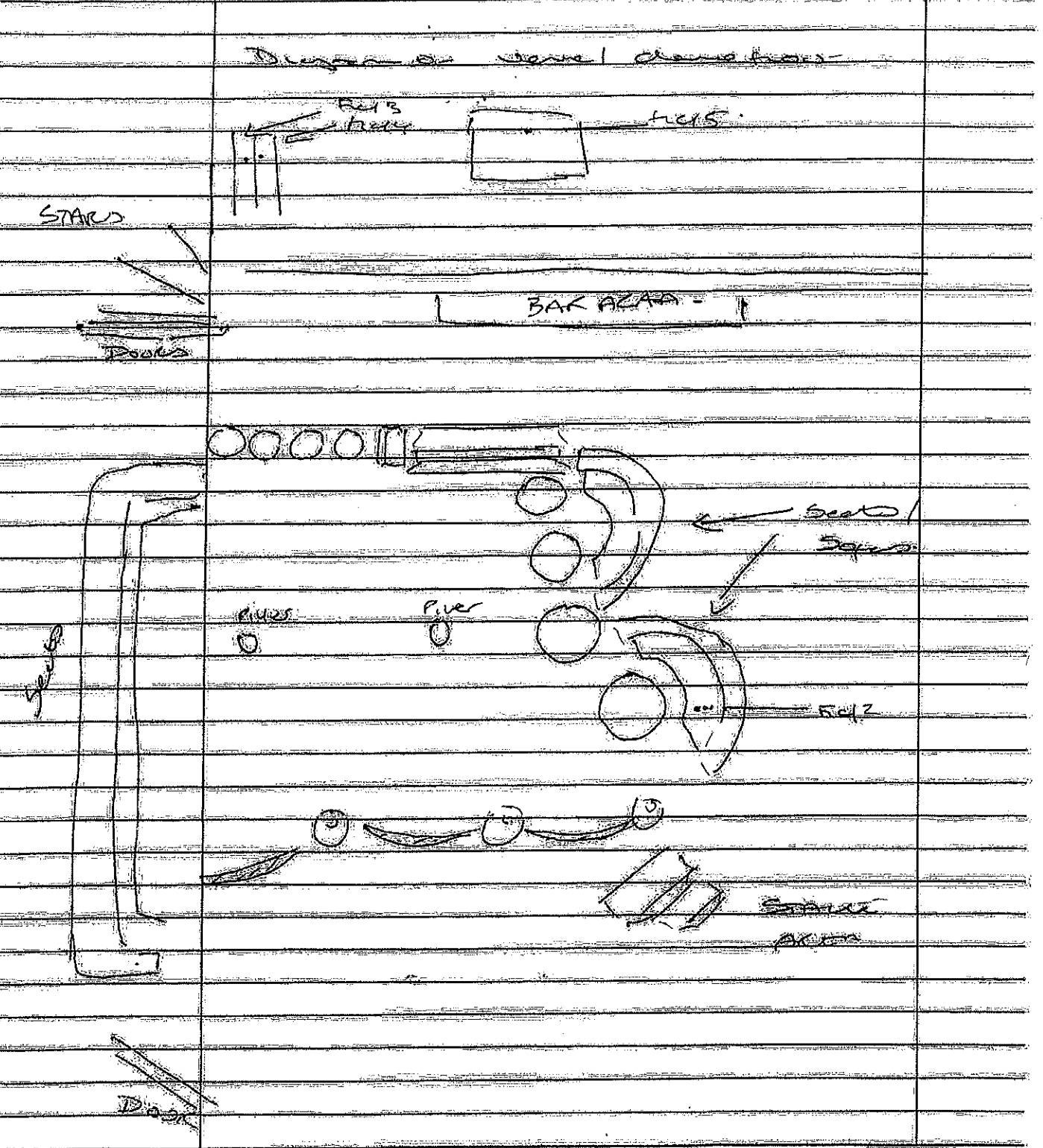

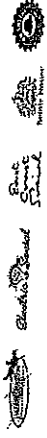

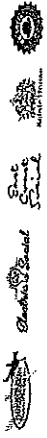

Dear Reaz,

Thank you for your time earlier today today at City Hall, it was unfortunate that our DPS Tony Flynn could not attend the meeting due to a train derailment, also with Paul being delayed meant we were pushed for time to go through issues raised.

As i said in the meeting and as per your request, please see below the list of actions we have already taken and will implement again this weekend to prevent further incidents taking place.

1. A full security and staff briefing held along with security operation manager to address the issues of the incident and to hi-light to all their roles and responsibilities
2. This weekend extra security including an operations manager from TSS to be onsite. Both DPS and Operations Manager to be onsite.
3. A enhanced door search policy implemented including metal detector wands on both entrance and customers re-entering the premises.
4. A lights up policy which will cut off music and turn all lights on full to prevent any further escalation of similar incidents.
5. We have implemented a secure area for VIP tables which has now permanent security position, and is clearly roped, this is to stop glass bottles from exiting that area.
6. We already have poly carbonate cups and mixer jugs and will no longer serve beer in bottles to VIP tables.
7. Training with VIP waitress team & bus Boys to ensure quick removal of any empty champagne or spirit bottles as soon as possible, making sure the area is kept clean at all times as per our policy.

Further to the above measures we have arranged the following to take place, secondary interviews with all staff involved , clarity on their initial statements and review of CCTV with all concerned.

We have asked for detailed statements from TSS of all security involved, Tony Flynn sent Lawrence our head doorman badge 3680 incident report on an email along with statements from [REDACTED] on the 7/9/16, agreed the hand writing is difficult to read, these will be addressed.

The completion of a CCTV transcript will be made with a detailed break down of the whole nights operation leading to the incident for future training and prevention purposes.

I would like to mention that in the meeting you said that we had not called the emergency services, i can confirm that we have a log from our system which shows a call was made by [REDACTED] at 03.39 on 04/09/16 and the duration of the call was approx. 6 minutes.

We would like to send all our managers on the crime scene preservation course which i believe is held at City Hall, please can you provide us with the details of how we can book them in ASAP.

All managers have recently completed and passed the Personal Licence exam and are awaiting their ID cards to return.

We have arranged for a senior management meeting to held on site Monday the 19th of September with Alan Dugard, Tony Flynn and myself to review all policies and discuss staff performance and re-training to help further prevent any incidents of this nature.

We hope that our stepped approach and measures implemented have reaffirmed our willingness to work with all authorities and that we can continue to build a good relationship with yourselves moving forward.

I will be on site from 8pm today should you wish to see me, my mobile number is below should you wish to speak to me in the meantime.

I have read through your comments and also spoken with PS Hoppe, he confirms that although you had a discussion regarding these conditions, nothing had been agreed.

For clarity and avoidance of doubt I have numbered the conditions.

- Condition 1 – Your comment is accepted, and is covered by existing licence condition 43.
- Conditions 2, 4, 10, 12, 14 – You have agreed as proposed by police.
- Condition 7 – Your amendment is accepted and the condition is agreed.
- Condition 11 – Your comment is accepted, last entry time shall remain at 0230hours.
- Condition 5 - Please see comment below, - your comment is accepted and condition will not apply.
- Condition 13 – Please see comment below, the police would suggest that street teams/touts are not used.

For conditions 3, 6, 8, 9, 13 :-

These conditions are considered entirely appropriate and proportionate given the seriousness of this incident and the subsequent failings that have been identified. I fully appreciate that the imposition of these conditions may have a financial impact, however the emphasis is on your premises to promote and uphold the licensing objectives. The police suggest that these conditions as below be added by way of minor variation to your premises licence, if you choose not to do so the Police will have to consider a review of the premises licence.

Please provide a response by Monday 3rd October and reply to all on this email.

Conditions

1. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol. Condition 47 states the same after 23.00. Before this time we trade as private functions and cabaret etc. The incident occurred at the end of the trading and I do not feel this is relevant.
2. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of

recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. Agreed

3. A minimum of two SIA staff shall be deployed with Body Worn Video, capable of recording audio and video in any light condition. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. As discussed we do not feel this is necessary at this point in time. Our door CCTV has good coverage and is HD quality. –

Many premises are implementing body worn video (BWV), particularly as it records audio and video, captures best evidence, thus providing a further safeguard for your customers and staff.

- *A means of capturing audio recordings of any threatening, abusive and insulting language you are subjected to.*
- *BWV equipment generally has a deterrent effect on abusive members of the public who otherwise may think "its my word against theirs". Its important to stress that legally persons you deal with must be made aware that BWV is in use and that it has been switched on and that the evidence produced may be passed to the Police. for them to consider prosecution.*
- *BWV captures very good facial images as it is set at the perfect height and distance from the suspect.*
- *BWV provides evidence that can be used in court to achieve a successful prosecution.*
- *BWV ensures that Door Supervisors exercise more self control and decorum as they are being recorded themselves.*
- *BWV enable CCTV evidence to be captured in areas where there is no fixed CCTV cameras*
- *BWV provides a first person account as it is what the staff member is experiencing in audio and visual terms.*

In relation to this incident whilst I accept that it may not have captured how the injury was sustained, it could have shown how the premises dealt with the aftermath.

4. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested. Agreed
5. There shall be an electronic search arch installed and every patron entering the premises when in use under this licence shall pass through the search arch. This is a condition we would not be happy to add, they are large object and we would have no room to store when not in use, we would prefer the use of search wands as a compromise. As discussed & agreed, we do not feel that this is an appropriate step at this point in time. We have implemented wands as part of our enhanced search policy. -
6. After 23.00hrs all persons entering or re-entering the premises shall be searched by an SIA-trained member of staff and monitored and recorded by the premises CCTV system. The searching will be supplemented by the use of two functional metal detecting wands. Amended & Agreed

I accept the rationale for not implement search arches. It is essential that all customers are searched upon entry/re-entry, and not just after 2300 hours to minimise the risk of any weapons being brought into the venue. At our initial meeting on 06/09/12 Police were told that all persons entering the venue are searched with the exception of customers who leave and return within ten minutes. From viewing CCTV customers are clearly not being searched. Allowing persons to leave and re-enter without being searched negates any previous searching that has taken place.

7. After 23.00 hrs all security employed at the premises shall wear high viz jackets or tabards. Security outside will wear Yellow & inside wear black high viz (This appears to work better with our CCTV) - Agreed
8. All customers entering the premises shall have their ID scanned on entry, save for a when biometric scanning system is in place (when fingerprint scanning will be required for all customers who have previously shown identification at the premises.), The details recorded by the ID scanner system shall be

made available to the Police upon request. As discussed & agreed we do not feel this is appropriate step at this time.

Specifically in relation to this incident. The victim received a life threatening injury. No persons were detained and subsequently any potential suspects could not be identified. ID scan systems provide further safeguards by highlighting the following:-

- fake/fraudulent identification
- persons who have been barred from other premises
- Persons ejected for violence/drunkenness etc. and potentially pose a danger to others.

Such systems are being used by many venues, not just late night venues allowing them to make a more informed opinion about the customers entering there venue.

9. All drinking containers used within the premises shall be polycarbonate. All glass bottles to be decanted into polycarbonate glassware or polycarbonate glassware carafes, with the exception of champagne and bottles of spirits of a minimum size of 70cl, supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff will clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles from the tables promptly. Customers will not permitted to self-serve or remove bottles from the tables. Customers will not be permitted to drink directly from champagne or spirit bottles. As discussed we already as this and at this point in time I would like to be given the opportunity to continue without adding this condition to the licence. I am willing to provide a Policy document to confirm how we trade with Polycarbonate.

At the meeting, on 06/09/12 police were told that the venue operates a polycarbonate policy, however from the CCTV it is evident that customers were not only drinking from beer bottles, but allowed to drink directly from champagne/spirit bottles and at no time are they challenged or prevented from doing so by staff. This condition looks to address this issue by restricting ready access and availability of such bottles.

10. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) any complaints received regarding crime and disorder
- (c) any incidents of disorder
- (d) any faults in the CCTV system
- (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service. Agreed

11. No entry / Re-entry (excluding persons exiting to smoke) to the premises after 02:00 hours or such time as agreed in writing by Westminster Police Licensing Unit (and a copy of any agreement to be held at reception) As discussed we do not feel it necessary to change our last entry time at this point in time.

12. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them. Agreed

13. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises. As discussed this is not relevant to the incident that took place and we trade as a cabaret that uses ticket agents etc.

One of the groups involved in this incident had been touted prior to coming to you venue, further to this they had been refused entry at two other venues prior to being allowed into yours.

14. In the event that a serious assault is committed on the premises (or appears to have been committed) the management will immediately ensure that:

- (a) The Police (and where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay, using emergency telephone number 999;

- (b) All measures that are reasonably practicable are taken to apprehend any suspects pending the arrival of the Police;
- (c) As is reasonably practicable, the crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the Police; and
- (d) Such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises."

'Serious assault' includes (but is not limited to) any assault in which emergency medical treatment is required and any assault in which a weapon is used. very vague and is hard to place on the licence as there are grey areas in which is considered serious assault, our policy and training will cover these points and will not be needed as a condition on the license. As discussed, we confirmed and provided evidence that we did call the emergency services on the night of the incident. We have also sent staff on an external Crime Scene Preservation training. Held on 22/09/16..

At the meeting, on 06/09/12 police were told :-

- The incident was over in 40 seconds,
- There was no apparent crime scene, there was no blood within the venue.
- There were no serious injuries.

There was a concerted effort made to clear up any crime scene within the venue minutes after the incident took place, as well as stating that liquid on the floor was Cranberry juice and not blood. Please provide me with a list of all the staff (and their job title/position) who attended this training.

I was situated in the tech booth in the club, a call came on the radio for security back up around 12.33am, I immediately attended where an IC1 male had said someone had punched him in the face, this guy was very noticeable as he had a large abscess, at the time I thought it was an injury sustained by the punch. I took him to the bar area to assess his injuries which were none, no obvious signs.

At the same time I was looking at the person a further call code red was called in as a large fight started to break out in the same area, I went straight to the incident and called for all security, this situation was contained very quickly, I myself stopped the music and put the house lights on full.

Both sets of people were separated, the group closest to the exit slope were being very aggressive towards security and they handled the situation well by calming them down, it seemed that some of both sets of people knew each other, I said to our security and manager we need to eject the aggressive group and hold back the others, this took a little while but as they were being escorted out, somehow another fight broke out with the other group being held back around 12.44am

It was a very difficult to manager as we didn't know who was fighting who, in this second incident injuries were sustained to 3 males, I called for Sunny Manager to call emergency services which he did 12.50 approx. I then made the call to close the venue and preserve the area where the fight broke out to help with any investigation. Also Lawrence HD called from his phone also as he had taken one of the injured to the rear exit (not known to me at the time) I was informed that there was an injured person IC3 in the upstairs bar near the kitchen, I went to assess his injuries but it was superficial a out which only tore the skin and did not penetrate any further, we put a large plaster on it and he was fine.

Details:

I have heard a call on the radio which was not at all clear so security at the front door could not understand the message. I heard a female and a male trying to communicate and screaming so I sent 3 members of security from the front door to the club area and I have called a manager to cover my position so I could make my way downstairs.

When I arrived downstairs I saw 2 groups males trying to attack each other around the centre of the club area. Other security were present (Ola, Joel, Darren, Kah, Koon, Waneton) and we approached all males and tried calming them down. One or two picked up a bottle from a table and threw others so we moved some of them upstairs. I tried to keep a few of them inside the venue (for police investigation and avoiding further conflict outside). They refused to stay in or give us any details about themselves; they pushed themselves away from me and ran away.

Management had stopped the music and to turn all lights on and I have asked all security to clear the venue and keep stairs clear.

When I was going back downstairs, I found a male near the lounge door and he was making his way down to the club. I stopped him and I told him that the club was being evacuated, he told me to 'get the fuck away' and to 'fuck off' a few times, so I held him by the arms and I told him to go upstairs and outside. I saw some blood on his shirt so I called management and 1 more member of security and I took him for first aid. I noticed that he was bleeding and I tried calling an ambulance but I had no phone reception. I have asked his details; if he had friends in the club/whether he got hurt on or off premises - but he refused to answer my questions. Myself, Ola, Monique and Joel took him through the back door to the outside area for phone reception and easier paramedics access and I called an ambulance again.

Emergency staff instructed me over the phone in how to help and position the male until ambulance arrival. They asked for the male's details and he said that his name is [REDACTED] and he is 21 years old. Soon after the emergency call, another male came out from the same back door (Jermyn Street) and he was speaking to Stefan and they seemed to know each other. Monique was keeping the other male inside the door away from Stefan. Monique said that the male was intoxicated.

A police van arrived approximately 8 minutes after my phone call and paramedics arrived approximately 5 minutes after police arrived.

I went back to the club area and I instructed Ola (security) to keep people away from the club whilst I helped management preserving the area for investigation. When the club was empty, security and management provided police officers with CCTV viewing and written reports.

I have read through your comments and also spoken with PS Hoppe, he confirms that although you had a discussion regarding these conditions, nothing had been agreed.

For clarity and avoidance of doubt I have numbered the conditions.

- Condition 1 – Your comment is accepted, and is covered by existing licence condition 43.
- Conditions 2, 4, 10, 12, 14 – You have agreed as proposed by police.
- Condition 7 – Your amendment is accepted and the condition is agreed.
- Condition 11 – Your comment is accepted, last entry time shall remain at 0230hours.
- Condition 5 - Please see comment below, - your comment is accepted and condition will not apply.
- Condition 13 – Please see comment below, the police would suggest that street teams/touts are not used.

For conditions 3, 6, 8, 9, 13 :-

These conditions are considered entirely appropriate and proportionate given the seriousness of this incident and the subsequent failings that have been identified. I fully appreciate that the imposition of these conditions may have a financial impact, however the emphasis is on your premises to promote and uphold the licensing objectives. The police suggest that these conditions as below be added by way of minor variation to your premises licence, if you choose not to do so the Police will have to consider a review of the premises licence.

Please provide a response by Monday 3rd October and reply to all on this email.

Conditions

1. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol. Condition 47 states the same after 23.00. Before this time we trade as private functions and cabaret etc. The incident occurred at the end of the trading and I do not feel this is relevant.
2. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. Agreed
3. A minimum of two SIA staff shall be deployed with Body Worn Video, capable of recording audio and video in any light condition. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. As discussed we do not feel this is necessary at this point in time. Our door CCTV has good coverage and is HD quality. –

Many premises are implementing body worn video (BWV), particularly as it records audio and video, captures best evidence, thus providing a further safeguard for your customers and staff.

- *A means of capturing audio recordings of any threatening, abusive and insulting language you are subjected to.*
- *BWV equipment generally has a deterrent effect on abusive members of the public who otherwise may think "its my word against theirs". Its important to stress that legally persons you deal with must be made aware that BWV is in use and that it has been switched on and that the evidence produced may be passed to the Police. for them to consider prosecution.*
- *BWV captures very good facial images as it is set at the perfect height and distance from the suspect.*
- *BWV provides evidence that can be used in court to achieve a successful prosecution.*
- *BWV ensures that Door Supervisors exercise more self control and decorum as they are being recorded themselves.*
- *BWV enable CCTV evidence to be captured in areas where there is no fixed CCTV cameras*
- *BWV provides a first person account as it is what the staff member is experiencing in audio and visual terms.*

In relation to this incident whilst I accept that it may not have captured how the injury was sustained, it could have shown how the premises dealt with the aftermath.

4. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested. Agreed ✓
5. There shall be an electronic search arch installed and every patron entering the premises when in use under this licence shall pass through the search arch. This is a condition we would not be happy to add, they are large object and we would have no room to store when not in use, we would prefer the use of search wands as a compromise. As discussed & agreed, we do not feel that this is an appropriate step at this point in time. We have implemented wands as part of our enhanced search policy. -
6. After 23.00hrs all persons entering or re-entering the premises shall be searched by an SIA-trained member of staff and monitored and recorded by the premises CCTV system. The searching will be supplemented by the use of two functional metal detecting wands. Amended & Agreed ✓

I accept the rationale for not implement search arches. It is essential that all customers are searched upon entry/re-entry, and not just after 2300 hours to minimise the risk of any weapons being brought into the venue. At our initial meeting on 06/09/12 Police were told that all persons entering the venue are searched with the exception of customers who leave and return within ten minutes. From viewing CCTV customers are clearly not being searched. Allowing persons to leave and re-enter without being searched negates any previous searching that has taken place.

7. After 23.00 hrs all security employed at the premises shall wear high viz jackets or tabards. Security outside will wear Yellow & inside wear black high viz (This appears to work better with our CCTV) - Agreed ✓
8. All customers entering the premises shall have their ID scanned on entry, save for a when biometric scanning system is in place (when fingerprint scanning will be required for all customers who have previously shown identification at the premises.), The details recorded by the ID scanner system shall be made available to the Police upon request. As discussed & agreed we do not feel this is appropriate step at this time.

Specifically in relation to this incident. The victim received a life threatening injury. No persons were detained and subsequently any potential suspects could not be identified. ID scan systems provide further safeguards by highlighting the following:-

- fake/fraudulent identification
- persons who have been barred from other premises
- Persons ejected for violence/drunkenness etc. and potentially pose a danger to others.

Such systems are being used by many venues, not just late night venues allowing them to make a more informed opinion about the customers entering there venue.

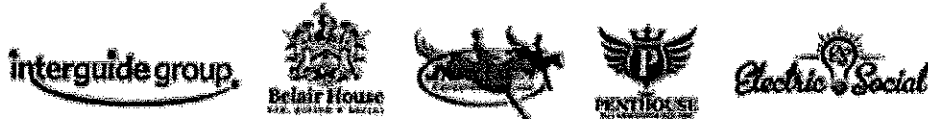
Thank you for your response and views.

I have read through your comments and also spoken with PS Hoppe, he confirms that although you had a discussion regarding these conditions, nothing had been agreed.

For clarity and avoidance of doubt I have numbered the conditions.

Condition 1 – Your comment is accepted, and is covered by existing licence condition 43.

Conditions 2, 4, 10, 12, 14 – You have agreed as proposed by police.

Condition 7 – Your amendment is accepted and the condition is agreed.

Condition 11 – Your comment is accepted, last entry time shall remain at 0230hours.

Condition 5 - Please see comment below, - your comment is accepted and condition will not apply.

Condition 13 – Please see comment below, the police would suggest that street teams/touts are not used.

For conditions 3, 6, 8, 9, 13 :-

These conditions are considered entirely appropriate and proportionate given the seriousness of this incident and the subsequent failings that have been identified. I fully appreciate that the imposition of these conditions may have a financial impact, however the emphasis is on your premises to promote and uphold the licensing objectives. The police suggest that these conditions as below be added by way of minor variation to your premises licence, if you choose not to do so the Police will have to consider a review of the premises licence.

Please provide a response by Monday 3rd October and reply to all on this email.

Many premises are implementing body worn video (BWV), particularly as it records audio and video, captures best evidence, thus providing a further safeguard for your customers and staff.

- *A means of capturing audio recordings of any threatening, abusive and insulting language you are subjected to.*
- *BWV equipment generally has a deterrent effect on abusive members of the public who otherwise may think "its my word against theirs". Its important to stress that legally persons you deal with must be made aware that BWV is in use and that it has been switched on and that the evidence produced may be passed to the Police. for them to consider prosecution.*
- *BWV captures very good facial images as it is set at the perfect height and distance from the suspect.*

 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

49. A challenge 21 scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
50. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
51. External doors shall be kept closed after 21:00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
52. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
53. The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.

55. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
56. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
57. No advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services shall be inscribed or affixed upon the

surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or be distributed to the public.

58. The exit to Jermyn Street will only be opened and used in the event of emergency.
59. The opening hours, regulated entertainment and the sale of alcohol from the start time on New Year's Eve until the finish time on New Year's Day.
60. Late Night refreshment shall be permitted from 23:00 on New Year's Eve until 05:00 on New Years Day.

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MINUTES FROM COMMITTEE

LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE No. 4*Friday 6th January 2017*

Present: PC Adam Deweltz, PC Mike Day and PC Toby Janes (Metropolitan Police), Mr Andrew Woods (Solicitor, representing the Licensee), Mr Tony Flynn (Licensee and Designated Premises Supervisor), Mr Alan Dugard (Chairman of company which owns premises) and Mr Arron Curtis (Operations Director).

Initial consideration for any interim steps pending the full review of the premises licence for Rah Rah Rooms, 215-217 Piccadilly, W1 15/04320/LIREVX

The Sub-Committee heard from PC Deweltz. He stated that the application had been submitted by the Police on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety. On Sunday 1 January from 00:33 hours, serious crime and disorder had taken place. Three males, one of whom is a 17 year old juvenile, had received stab wounds at the venue which was operating as a nightclub. It was believed that the injuries were caused by a knife or a bladed article. The Police were currently investigating the matter and as yet no knife had been found. PC Deweltz advised those present that the injuries were consistent with that of a knife. No fragments of glass had been found in the room. The Police had requested medical reports from the Ambulance Service which would be received in due course. As yet no arrests had been made as part of the on-going investigations. Two of the victims had been identified as members of the Mozart Gang by the Westminster Gangs Unit. PC Deweltz added that the Police were requesting the suspension of the premises licence pending the full review hearing where they expected to request a revocation of the premises licence.

PC Deweltz explained that what had taken place on 1 January was the second example of a serious incident at the venue where a stabbing had occurred. On Saturday 3 September 2016, a male had received stab wounds to his right upper leg. The Police Licensing Team had spoken with representatives of the venue and had advocated a 'stepped approach' with recommended operational improvements and conditions in order to prevent further incidents, such as that on 3 September, taking place in the future. PC Deweltz informed those present that many failings had been found following the 3 September incident. These included that patrons had not been searched to the levels that would have been expected, the suspects carrying out the disorder had not been detained and the crime scene had not been preserved. He

made the point that by staff mopping up the blood in the Club, they had removed the forensic evidence. He also stated that staff had told Police that the blood on the floor had been cranberry juice. The Police had subsequently been able to confirm it was blood.

PC Deweltz advised the Sub-Committee that there were conditions proposed by the Police following the 3 September incident that were not accepted by those responsible for the venue. These were an ID scan system, polycarbonate drinking vessels and search arches. He expressed the view that if the safety measures had been implemented, the incident on 1 January 2017 could have been prevented. This included that the 17 year old who had been stabbed would not have gained entry to the venue. PC Deweltz also believed that by not agreeing the conditions those responsible for the premises had not adequately considered the safety of their customers and staff members.

The Sub-Committee was then shown CCTV footage from a number of the venue's cameras of what had taken place on the morning of 1 January 2017. PC Day referred to disorder breaking out from 00:34 onwards when two males began to dance with a female on the dance floor. Another male, who was in a group with this female, punched one of the males. There was a man in a black suit who was a member of the security/operations team in the venue and he was located near to the female's group in the seating area throughout the evening. It was the Police's perception, having viewed the footage, that the actions of the man in the black suit were not decisive enough in separating the groups or bringing other members of security to the scene of the altercation at any early stage. PC Day referred to one of the two men who had attempted to dance with the female (the colleague of the man who received the punch) being held in a headlock by another man and he believed this was in full view of a security guard. There was a second incident at 00:36.31 when another fight began between the two groups. PC Day stated that the Police were of the view that this could have been avoided if the security had been more proactive with the first incident and dispersed the individual who had thrown the punch. The groups are seen using bottles and other objects such as a champagne flute to assault each other. Security was seen to detain the group at the seating area and also members of the other group on the opposite side of the venue.

The Sub-Committee saw that following the second incident lighting was put on and the Operations Director, Mr Curtis had made an announcement to the patrons in the venue. The Police believed that he had advised them to stay calm and that the Police had been called. PC Day then showed footage from 00:43.53. He made the point that there were members of the seated group who were able to roam around the Club freely. He then moved the footage on to where the black male with dreadlocks who had thrown the original punch came into view. He had received two stab wounds which PC Day advised had resulted in life changing injuries. A wound to his back could be seen. There was also a wound to the front of his body. A female had taken off his shirt and blood was clearly visible on his clothing.

The Police had then showed footage from the same camera at 00:51:13 which PC Day stated displayed numerous failings in terms of preserving the crime scene where the man with dreadlocks had been stabbed. PC Day provided the information that staff had been given crime scene preservation training by an external company in the

presence of PC Russell after the incident in September 2016. The inability to preserve the crime scene had been contrary to the training given. The security and management had gone elsewhere to deal with other issues in the Club and there were no security or management overseeing the crime scene. PC Day referred to members of the public still freely drinking within the venue then leaving through the crime scene.

Footage was shown from another camera which showed a ramp on the other side of the seating area. The man who received the punch was seen at 00:36.03 being led up the ramp by Mr Curtis and a member of security. PC Day referred to the aftermath being seen of the man's friend being in a headlock which involved members of the public moving away from the altercation in fear of their safety. Security had then started to detain the suspects. From 00:43.37 in the footage PC Day indicated a black male with a jacket with a fur collar and a colleague of his with dark sleeves who were upstairs during the course of the booking. The Police were trying to identify these men as part of their investigations. These two men had approached one of the groups, one of them had swung a bottle and another fight started. PC Day showed footage at 00:45.09 of the man who had held the man from the other group in the headlock still being armed with a bottle. He stated that at no stage during the footage is the bottle removed from his hand although he was identified and stopped by security officers. PC Day informed the Sub-Committee that a man had been stabbed off camera in the abdomen and subsequently went upstairs in an attempt to gain revenge for the attack.

A further camera showed members of the public rushing to escape after the first incident. In respect of the second incident PC Day showed objects being picked up from the venue with the intent to arm. From 00:42.13, he referred to the group from the booking upstairs, including the male who was about to swing the bottle. The male can then be seen again following the incident with the bottle above his head in fear of the other group. PC Day also showed that staff had attempted to clean where the original incident had occurred. A mop and an industrial unit were subsequently used as weapons during the fighting. One of the men using these as weapons was allowed by a security guard to run past him and towards the foot of the stairs.

CCTV footage from the bottom of the stairs showed the second incident with the bottle. The second man from the upstairs group could be seen leaving with a bottle. There was a man with injuries in the stairs area who was a member of the public and not involved with any of the groups. He was hit in the face by a man armed with the mop. The mop is picked up by a member of the cleaning team which PC Day stated was contrary to the crime scene preservation training as it was a weapon used in an assault.

Finally the Sub-Committee was shown footage from cameras either side of the front door in Piccadilly. This included one of the stabbed men seeking reprisal at 00:45.16. PC Day advised Members that he had identified the male he believed was responsible for the stabbing and had attempted to punch him. He was restrained by staff, members of the public and his group. At 00:50, the member of the public hit in the face could be seen. PC Day stated that his friend was visibly unhappy with how the situation had been dealt with. He was aggressive in his manner for the next quarter of an hour, grabbing items such as the barrier. PC Day added that members

of the public were injured in the process. He believed that the footage showed that the handling of the friend of the injured man had been badly managed.

The Sub-Committee asked the Police a number of questions. The Police were able to advise in response to the questions that the Premises had first made contact at 00:50 hours and the first Police had arrived at the premises at 01:11. Multiple units had attended the venue. The Police Licensing Team had arrived at 01:31, having been first informed of an incident involving a bottle at 00:56. They were then informed of a stabbing at 01:26. The Police Constables emphasised just how busy an evening New Year's Eve is for them and that they had been dealing with a previous matter. They were of the view that there had been a delay between the first incident at 00:34 and the Police being called. It was believed that an ambulance was called from the premises. The Police Constables were of the view that Mr Curtis' announcement a number of minutes prior to 00:50 when the lights had been turned on had suggested that the Police had already been called which had not been the case. They informed Members that they would have expected those who were responsible for the incidents of disorder to be detained or taken somewhere safe and not allowed out of the venue. Members were also advised that in the Police's opinion there was a lack of urgency on the part of some members of security to deal with issues as they arose and that events had been badly handled. In some cases, they had perceived from the CCTV footage that some members of security were avoiding confronting the perpetrators whilst the incidents were taking place which they believed to be unacceptable.

The Sub-Committee heard from Mr Woods, representing the Licensee. He stated that the incidents were not what anyone wanted to see take place in Westminster. He was, however, seeking to persuade the Sub-Committee that a suspension of the premises licence pending the full review hearing was not necessary. He made the point that it was easy to view CCTV with hindsight. At the time though Mr Curtis and the security team had been required to respond to events as they arose. Those responsible for the premises had not been aware prior to the current hearing that there had been gang members involved in the incidents.

Mr Woods explained that Mr Curtis had been on duty on 1 January. Mr Flynn, the Licensee and DPS had not been present. Mr Woods emphasised the experience of the management who he stated had been involved with the operation at 1 Leicester Square over a 12 year period without any serious incidents taking place. They had commenced running the premises at 215-217 Piccadilly on 1 July 2015. Rah Rah Rooms is a cabaret venue which on certain nights operates as a nightclub. Mr Woods advised that there were a number of corporate bookings scheduled during January 2017. He expressed the view that the premises did not attract trouble on a regular basis. He sought to differentiate Rah Rah Rooms from other premises who were the subject of reviews and where there had been a number of escalating crimes. He emphasised that there had not been any incidents of note from 1 July 2015 to 3 September 2016.

Mr Woods addressed Members on matters from 3 September 2016 onwards. He commented that on 3 September the crime scene had not been preserved as an inexperienced member of the team had cleaned it up. Within a few days of the incident staff had been booked on a crime scene preservation training course. In

respect of the Police's 'stepped approach' following the stabbing in September, Mr Dugard advised that there had been 13 conditions proposed by the Police and on behalf of the owners of the premises he had agreed 9 of them. He added that the conditions had been the subject of a minor variation application and there had been no objections to this. It was his view that search arches were not appropriate for a cabaret premises.

Mr Woods stated that in respect of New Year's Eve, there had been 12 SIA qualified door supervisors on duty at the premises. Additional TSS security staff were also employed and they had previously been employed when management had worked at 1 Leicester Square. Two members of the management team at Rah Rah Rooms were SIA qualified. There were five managers on duty. Mr Woods brought to Members' attention that there was a ratio of 1 door staff to 25 customers which was considerably more than would usually have been employed. Details of the booked tables and tickets were being handed over to the Police as had all the CCTV footage. There were no special promotions and some of the tables booked had been particularly expensive, including the group with the male who had thrown the initial punch. Mr Woods commented that PC Day and PC Deweltz had attended the premises at 22:25 on 31 December, a couple of hours before the incident and had seen the search wand in action.

Mr Woods explained the incidents of 1 January from his client's point of view. The seated group which included the woman dancing and the man who had thrown the initial punch were a celebrity group. Following the punch being thrown, Mr Curtis had been called and was assessing the extent of the injuries to the man who had been the subject of it. At that stage he had not considered this to be a serious assault and so had not contacted the Police. From 00:36, it was clear that there were issues between the celebrity group and a second group. At that stage security had detained the celebrity group and the other group had been taken to the other side of the Club and were told to calm down. Mr Curtis took the decision to turn the lights on and turn off the music. Mr Curtis added that his announcement was to calm down and he had told those present at the venue that he would call the Police if there were further issues.

Mr Woods informed Members that it was his client's view that the problems were contained until 00:44 when the two men from the upstairs booking appeared and used bottles. They had not been detained as they had left the venue quickly before it was known who had caused this incident. It was not known yet whether they were connected to anyone involved with the incidents in the previous few minutes. Mr Curtis stated that after the use of bottles he had instructed a member of staff to call Police. It was his belief that the Police had actually been called at 00:46.10. The Ambulance Service had also been called. Mr Dugard stated that it was his understanding that the first two groups who had clashed initially were detained for 16 minutes and there was only so long that it was possible to detain ten to fifteen males.

Mr Woods stated that Mr Curtis had placed barriers around the crime scene. He accepted that 8 people should not have been allowed to walk through the crime scene and that a member of staff should have overseen the area.

The Sub-Committee asked those responsible for the premises a number of

questions. Mr Curtis was asked whether the male who threw the initial punch had been detained. Mr Curtis replied that the man who had been struck by the punch had not known who had thrown it. It was Mr Curtis' priority to assess the injuries. He had brought a manager to the scene and then a further incident had taken place. Mr Dugard was asked why he had rejected the Police's conditions in respect of the ID scan system and search arches. Mr Dugard replied that Rah Rah Rooms is predominantly a cabaret and burlesque dance venue with corporate and private events. A safety wand was used because search arches would look out of place. He added that the search arches tended to go off when any females walked through whereas the safety wand was more specific. In respect of an ID scan system, Mr Dugard made the point that there had not previously been issues with gangs at the premises. He was not convinced that ID would have picked up the gang members or that they would have prevented the incidents on 1 January. He was however committed to installing the ID scan system now. Mr Curtis confirmed that the safety wand was used for everyone entering the premises. Mr Dugard volunteered the information that polycarbonate vessels were already used throughout the premises.

In response to further questions, those responsible for the premises clarified that there had been two inexperienced cleaners employed on 3 September 2016 who had cleaned the crime scene. The failure to preserve the crime scene on 1 January had been a momentary lapse. It was also clarified that Rah Rah Rooms is a cabaret venue until 23:00 or midnight. Other activities, including the premises becoming a bar, took place after that time.

Mr Woods was also asked whether consideration was given to eject everyone present after the coming together of the two groups at 00:36. Mr Curtis replied that it was seen at that time as a containment operation as there were no visible injuries. After the use of the bottles and staff being aware of injuries, everyone was told to leave the premises. Mr Dugard commented that when the two men came downstairs it was very difficult to find out who was who. He did not believe that any security had seen the bottle swung. The two men had disappeared through the fire escape before they could be detained. Those responsible for the premises were also asked whether those involved with the initial incidents should have been ejected. Mr Curtis replied that the two groups had been separated and requiring them to leave would have been a mistake. Mr Dugard added that there is only one entrance and a fire exit at the premises and all would have had to leave via the same stairs. It was also the position of those responsible for the premises that it was doubtful whether the security guard positioned by the celebrity group's table had seen the original punch being thrown

The Police were given the opportunity to respond to the comments of those responsible for the premises. PC Deweltz stated that there was extra security employed and additional conditions had been attached to the premises licence after 3 September 2016. However, despite this management had lost control on 1 January. Three people had been stabbed. People could have died. One of the injuries was very serious and was described as a life changing injury. The Police had no faith that management were able to keep members of the public or staff safe. Staff had not been sufficiently proactive, including hiding behind the bars. It was proportionate and necessary to suspend the premises licence.

Mr Woods summed up that on 363 days in the year the premises had been run exceptionally well. There had been two incidents. He disputed that there had been any delay in calling the Police. Staff had looked to calm down the two groups who had had the initial altercation. He made the point that if the two men from upstairs had not become involved that likely would have been the end of the incidents. Mr Woods expressed concerns that suspension of the premises licence could lead to the Club closing. The track record did not show that Rah Rah Rooms was a troublesome venue.

The Sub-Committee had carefully read the report and listened to the representations made at the hearing. Members took the view that the Police and those responsible for the premises had explained their positions well. They appreciated the Police's investigation was on-going. Based however on the information provided to the Sub-Committee at this stage, Members decided it was necessary to suspend the premises licence, pending the full review hearing. The Sub-Committee shared the view of the Police that they lacked confidence in the way that management had responded to the incidents of 3 September 2016 and 1 January 2017. Members considered that given the seriousness of the events of 3 September 2016, those responsible for the premises should have agreed to ID scan and search arches conditions. Management had not appeared to sufficiently learn the lessons from the incidents of September 2016 and apply them to the issues raised on 1 January.

The Sub-Committee agreed with the position of the Police that there was a lack of urgency on the part of some members of security to deal with issues as they arose and that some members of security were avoiding confronting the perpetrators whilst the incidents were taking place. One such example was the footage that showed the man who had held the man from the other group in the headlock still being armed with a bottle. The footage showed him still holding the bottle as a potential weapon even though he had been confronted by security officers. The Sub-Committee had also seen the footage at the front of the premises of the friend of the member of the public who was hit by the mop where little was done to calm him down.

A further concern was that the crime scene and the mop which had been used as a weapon had not been guarded despite there being a large number of security staff employed on the night. Whilst the crime scene not being preserved could be viewed as a momentary lapse, it was an example of management not responding adequately to the incidents which arose on 1 January and not applying what should have been learnt from the stabbing incident on 3 September.

	Decision (including reasons if different from those set out in report): The Sub-Committee granted the application, subject to conditions as set out below. Paragraph 2.1.7 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy states that 'in cases where licences have lapsed through insolvency or death, the Council will generally grant a new licence on similar terms to the lapsed licence as a replacement. However, the Council will take into account the previous history of the premises, the length of time the premises have been closed, and any problems at the premises, and will impose conditions that reflect current good practice for the type of business proposed at the premises'. The Sub-Committee considered that there had not been any significant issues at the						

premises in the past and the licence had lapsed in July 2012 prior to an interim authority being submitted by the appointed administrator. Conditions had been proposed by Metropolitan Police and Environmental Health and been agreed by the Applicant, the Crown Estate Commissioners. Members of the Sub-Committee in reaching their decision noted that the Applicant had agreed in correspondence with the Responsible Authorities to reduce the terminal hour for licensable activities on Sundays from those on the existing licence. This had been a factor in the Metropolitan Police withdrawing their representation. Members considered that the conditions attached to the licence would promote the licensing objectives. Mr Bolton stated at the hearing that Environmental Health were relatively content with the application, subject to specific conditions being attached to the licence. The particular difference between this application and the new premises licence application at Le Pigalle submitted by the appointed administrator being that there was a proposed change of layout in this case. Environmental Health required works conditions to be applied to the licence.

Mr Rankin, representing the Crown Estate Commissioners, stated at the hearing that his client was very unhappy that the licence for Le Pigalle had lapsed and been put at risk. He was requesting a 'shadow licence' which would protect the freeholders in case the licence was surrendered or the licence holder company went into administration. He did not believe that the representations of Lord West and David West Junior were relevant on the grounds that they did not refer to the likely effect of the granting of the application on the licensing objectives. He asked Members to make a ruling on whether these representations were relevant which would leave Environmental Health as the only remaining representation.

Mr Bromley-Martin QC representing Lord West and David West Junior addressed the Sub-Committee on the point of the relevance of his client's representations. He stated that the e-mail set out on page 67 of the report was relevant. It was the case that those who were entitled to apply for a premises licence were those persons who carried on or proposed to carry on a business which involved the use of the premises for licensable activities. The Crown Estate Commissioners were the freeholders of Le Pigalle and they had no intention of carrying on a business and undertaking licensable activities at the premises. He expressed the view that the only reason the Applicant had submitted the application was in order to create the leverage to introduce a different lessee. Mr Bromley-Martin stated that it had come to his clients' attention that the Crown Estate Commissioners were in negotiations with Brompton Brands Limited to operate Le Pigalle. He queried whether Members of the Sub-Committee were content for there to be two different premises licences held by two different licence holders with different conditions applied to the licences.

Mr Panto, the Legal Adviser, advised Members that he was reluctant to say that the representations were not relevant although he did believe they were of dubious relevance. He made the point that there was nothing unlawful in the freeholder submitting a licensing application and not carrying on the licensing activities at the premises. All that was required was an intention to carry on a

	business which would involve the use of the premises for licensable activities. It was correct that the Crown could then transfer the licence to an operator subject only to challenge from the police but that was the structure of the legislation which applied to the grant of any premises licence. The Sub-Committee decided that the West's submissions would be considered on their merits.

Conditions attached to the Licence

Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or

(ii) process, or
the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
7.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
8. The responsible person shall ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Additional Conditions

10. The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
11. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including water, shall be available throughout the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold and supplied for consumption on the premises.
12. On any evening where the premises or part of the premises are open for public music, dance and entertainment, alcohol may not be sold or supplied to persons admitted after 23:00 other than to:
 - (a) Persons taking a table meal; or
 - (b) Persons who have paid a minimum admission fee of at least £5 for music, dancing and entertainment (not to be credited against consumables)
 - (c) Persons who have paid a minimum annual membership fee of at least £150 payable in advance for music, dancing and entertainment (not to be credited against consumables) and their bona fide guests. A list of all people who have paid an annual membership fee and their guests will be held at reception for inspection by relevant authority; or
 - (d) Persons given free membership and their bona fide guests where there has been an interval of at least 24 hours between application for membership. A list of all persons who have free membership will be held at reception for inspection by the relevant authority; or
 - (e) Persons who are bona fide guests of the license holder or management, a list of whom shall be kept at reception for inspection by the relevant authorities; or
 - (f) Artistes and persons employed by the premises; or
 - (g) Persons attending at private function; the function organiser's name and address to be kept at reception for inspection by the relevant authorities
13. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed the following:

Mezzanine – 100
Basement Auditorium – 300

With a maximum capacity of 400.
14. Arrangements will be made to ensure that any capacity limit set for the premises can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity should be given to an authorised officer on request.
15. From 21:00 until 30 minutes after close of business, a minimum of 2 SIA licensed door staff to be stationed at the entrance on Piccadilly whose tasks will include:
 - Reminding customers that this is a residential area and to respect the

needs of neighbours

- To maintain an orderly queue where necessary
- To ask customers leaving the premises to do so quickly and quietly

16. There shall be no admissions to the premises after 02:30 hours.
17. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
18. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Service.
19. Any additional sound generating equipment shall not be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
20. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
21. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
22. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
23. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours.
24. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
25. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.
26. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning and emergency equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
27. The certificates below shall be submitted to Westminster Council Consultation

Team upon written request:

- a) Any emergency lighting battery or system.
- b) Any electrical installation.
- c) Any emergency alarm system.

- 28. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 29. All emergency doors will be maintained effectively self-closing, and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 30. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct safety signs other emergency equipment.
- 31. Only hanging, curtains, upholstery and temporary decorations, complying with the relevant British Standard shall be used. Where necessary these shall be periodically tested for flame resistance and re-treated as necessary.
- 32. The edges of the treads and steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 33. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 34. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
- 35. No payment shall be made by or on behalf of the premises for distribution of flyers or tickets within public areas in the Licensing District of Westminster.
- 36. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.

NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.

- 37. Unless the premises are operating under the benefit of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence there shall be no striptease, no nudity and all persons to be

decently attired at all times.

38. The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.
39. Before the premises are open to the public, the plans as provided with the application will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises and this condition has been removed from the Licence. Where the premises layout has changed from the plans provided a variation application may be required.
40. No children under the age of 16 shall be permitted on the premises after 21:00 hours.
41. No children under the age of 14 shall be admitted on the premises.
42. No unauthorised advertisements of any kind shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree or any other property, or is distributed to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises or any of its events, facilities, goods and services.
43. A daily log is to be maintained to ensure that any capacity limit set for the various floors and the overall capacity of the premises is recorded hourly and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.
44. All entrance doors to be kept closed except for people's immediate access and egress.
45. Doors to ducts, service shafts and cupboards shall be kept locked shut.
46. Staff with specific responsibilities in the vent of fire or other emergency, together with deputies, shall receive training and written instruction appropriate to their role.
47. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and sorted so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - smoke machines and generators
 - pyrotechnics and fog generators
 - firearms
 - lasers
 - explosives and highly flammable substances
 - real flame
 - strobe lighting

Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises will not be permitted to cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention or crime).

48. After 23:00, at least one Personal License Holder shall be on duty on the premises while intoxicating liquor is being sold or supplied.
49. A challenge 21 scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
50. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
51. External doors shall be kept closed after 21:00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
52. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
53. The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by door staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction to the public highway.
54. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received regards crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
55. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
56. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
57. No advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) that advertises or promotes the establishment, its

premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or be distributed to the public.

58. The exit to Jermyn Street will only be opened and used in the event of emergency.

RAH RAH ROOM, 215-217 PICCADILLY, LONDON

APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION TO SUSPEND THE LICENCE AS AN INTERIM MEASURE FOLLOWING THE SECTION 53A LICENSING ACT 2003 EXPEDITED REVIEW

1. Background

This Appeal has been lodged against the decision of the Westminster City Council Licensing Sub-Committee on Friday 6 January 2017 to suspend the Premises Licence in respect of Rah Rah Room, 215-217 Piccadilly, London, W1J 9HF following an expedited review served by the Metropolitan Police on 4 January 2017.

The interim measures hearing took place on the 6 January 2017 when CCTV evidence was shown by officers from the Metropolitan Police relating to an incident at the premises during the trading hours commencing on 31 December 2016 and when reference was made to another incident on 3 September 2016. Whilst noting in their decision that the defence had put up a “very strong case” and that the investigations were ongoing the Licensing Sub-Committee felt it necessary to suspend the licence in order to protect the public and expressed no confidence in the way the September or December evenings had been handled.

The purpose behind lodging the Appeal is to enable the Premises Licence holder to:

- a) show different CCTV evidence to the Licensing Sub-Committee which highlights the way in which the New Years Eve incident was dealt with by management and the door team – some of this CCTV evidence was not shown to the Licensing Sub-Committee on 6 January 2017 who felt that enough CCTV evidence had been shown to them by the Police; and
- b) correct some errors relating to the facts of the case presented to the Licensing Sub Committee on the 6th January which the Premises Licence holder is now aware of having been able to look into matters in more detail.
- c) confirm the action taken by the Premises Licence Holder at the New Years Eve event and in particular by the Management Team and Door Supervisors which it is submitted can be

seen to be promoting the Licensing Objectives and therefore to give the Licensing Sub Committee confidence in Management and Door Staff.

- d) Invite the Licensing Sub Committee to assess the fact that this Operational Team have operated approximately 9 New Years Eve nights in this area and operated successfully and without issue in 2015.
- e) ask the Licensing Sub- Committee to find that the Premises Licence Holder did promote the Licensing Objectives and to therefore allow the premises to re-open on Monday 16th January following refresher training to all staff and door supervisors commencing on Friday 13th January.
- f) The review application by the Met Police will of course still be considered at the final review hearing and any issues can be dealt with at that stage.

The following submissions made by the Premises Licence holder on 6 January 2017 were not disputed:

- The premises have been running as Rah Rah Room since July 2015 with the current operational team in place.
- The current operational team consists of three individuals who are experienced Westminster operators; Tony Flynn who is the DPS and has worked in the industry most of his life, has been a DPS at many premises and worked as part of the management team at Penthouse, 1 Leicester Square, London since 2009; Arron Curtis who is the Operations Director of the company and who was in operational charge on the evening of New Years Eve and who also has many years experience in the industry and was part of the management team at Penthouse and Alan Dugard who also had worked in the industry most of his life , is Chairman of the group and for 8/9years was responsible for running Penthouse.
- The operational team also run other premises in Dulwich, Milton Keynes and Brixton.
- These are not premises which have attracted trouble or incidents regularly. The police application for an expedited review referred to one other incident on 3 September 2016 and

during the seventeen months that this operational team has been in place the only incidents referred to are the incidents on 3 September 2016 and New Years Eve 2016.

- There have been eighteen months of this operational team promoting the licensing objectives (July 2015 – December 2016).
- Until the incident on 3 September 2016 the police have not requested any meeting or dialogue with the operators which again highlights that the premises have been run well and promoting the licensing objectives.

2. Rah Rah Room

Rah Rah Room operates as a cabaret restaurant and bar with tables available for customers and for private hire and corporate events. There is a stage in the premises and there is cabaret on until 11:00pm/Midnight. There is live music with famous acts such as Alexander O'Neal booked and the premises work with a well established door company namely TSS Security.

In December 2016 there were 21 days booked as fully corporate evenings and other corporate bookings were planned for January.

There is a new supper club launch on 26 January 2017 with a cost of £69 for premium dinner and show and £99 for a VIP package.

New Years Eve 2015 was a successful evening which ran without incident and the premises are not connected or associated with crime or disorder.

The incidents which occurred on 3 September and 31 December 2016 are incidents which would appear to have been sparked off because of a dispute between customers and not because of the way in which the premises are run, a lack of management control, promotions which may lead to over-intoxication or any other reason. The incidents could have occurred in any premises and did not occur in these premises because of any management or door staff issues.

It is regrettable that serious incidents do occur in premises but those incidents are not always caused by the way in which the Premises operate or because of a lack of strong and effective

management. Those matters will be dealt with at the Full Review Hearing and it is submitted that it is not necessary to suspend the licence until that hearing.

3. New Years Eve 2016

In preparation for New Years Eve 2016 the management team employed 12 door staff from TSS Security Limited and ensured that there were 5 managers including Arron Curtis working at the premises that evening.

There were 300 customers in the premises during the evening which is a ratio of one door staff to 25 customers which can only be seen as promoting the licensing objectives extremely well given that the general requirement on numbers of door staff to customers would be 1;100 or 1;75.

This highlights good practice.

Approximately 100 people booked tables and all booking details have been retained and handed to the police.

There were 168 online tickets sold and all booking emails/social media details have been retained.

There were no special promotions during New Years Eve.

There were no special deals in terms of alcohol purchases.

The Premises were operating with Polycarbonate drinking vessels – this was introduced by Alan Dugard at the premises.

Some of the guests attending the premises were spending significant amounts of money and up to £3,000 per table.

At 10:25pm there was a police licensing visit from Michael Day and Adam Deweltz. Michael Day was actually searched with a wand as he entered the premises as the premises were ensuring that everyone was searched coming into the premises.

The premises had no issues up to 00.30.

New Years Eve at midnight passed well and the premises were running an enjoyable evening with all door staff and management controlling the premises.

At 00:30am the premises were absolutely fine and there was no suggestion or indication that the incidents which followed would occur at the premises. The CCTV clearly shows a happy well run club with people enjoying the New Years Eve festivities. At 00.30am there are door staff positioned through the club monitoring customers. The club is being well run and promoting the licensing objectives.

4. New Years Eve Incident

At 00:33am there is a group on the dance floor from a well known television programme "the celebrity group" and this group includes a girl who is dancing to the music. Two men not from "the celebrity group" but from another group "the other group" start dancing with the girl. One member of "celebrity group" punches one of the two men from "the other group" who is attempting to dance with the girl.

Door staff are in exactly the right position. Door Staff are positioned on the dance floor. It is now clear from the CCTV that the door man who is next to the incident has his back to the incident. He did not witness a punch. We have also spoken to the member of the door team involved and he has confirmed that he did not see the actual punch but realises very quickly that something has happened and that the man (who threw the punch) is clearly animated.

Door staff calm this man down but are not aware at this stage that he has thrown a punch. Arron Curtis is immediately called to the scene and speaks with the person who was assaulted and who advises Arron that it was nothing and that he just wants to get on with the night. The CCTV shows Arron walking with the 'victim' and the door staff talking to the person who threw the punch. At this stage therefore one member of the door staff is speaking to the alleged assailant and Arron has spoken to the alleged victim and even at this stage there is nothing to suggest that anything

else needs to be done. The victim confirms that he does not know who threw the punch, does not want any action taken and wants to continue the night.

AT THIS STAGE THERE HAS NOT BEEN A SERIOUS INCIDENT, STAFF HAVE DEALT WITH THE INCIDENT WELL AND THERE CANNOT BE ANY SUGGESTION THAT ANYTHING ELSE COULD OR SHOULD HAVE BEEN DONE.

00:36am there is a coming together of “the celebrity group” and “the other group” which by now contains friends of the 2 men who initially tried to dance with the girl from the Celebrity Group. What can be seen on the CCTV cannot be seen by the Management Team and Door Staff. There can be seen a man swinging a bottle in the direction of others but it does not break and he does not let go of it (in fact he still has hold of it several minutes later).

Having spent hours looking at the CCTV there is no evidence of a serious assault, there is nothing that would normally require police presence as it is dealt with by the premises.

ARRON TAKES IMMEDIATE ACTION AND CALLS FOR THE MUSIC TO BE TURNED OFF AND THE LIGHTS ON. THIS IS EXACTLY THE ACTION THAT THE OPERATIONAL MANAGER SHOULD TAKE. ARRON MAKES AN ANNOUNCEMENT ASKING EVERYONE TO STAY CALM. THERE HAS NOT BEEN A SERIOUS ASSAULT AT THIS STAGE.

The CCTV shows that the groups are contained and dealt with in a way which would be expected to be dealt with. “The celebrity group” are kept at one end of the club and told to calm down and “the other group” are taken to the other end of the club and told to calm down and are being told that they will have to leave the premises because of their behaviour.

MANAGEMENT ARE AT THIS STAGE ASSESSING WHAT HAS HAPPENED, ASSESSING WHETHER ANY OFFENCE HAS TAKEN PLACE AND CONSIDERING THEIR ACTIONS. THE DECISION IS TO REQUIRE ‘THE OTHER GROUP ‘ TO LEAVE THE PREMISES AS THEIR Demeanour IS AGITATED AND EXCITABLE.

It is not the right approach for door staff to simply manhandle all of this “other group” out of the premises. This would not have promoted the licensing objectives and is not the correct way to

deal with this. "The other group" were being calmed down and would then have been escorted from the premises.

Arron Curtis takes the decision to keep the music off and puts the lights on and makes a second announcement to try and calm everybody down.

There is no need for police presence at this stage.

IT IS AGAIN SUBMITTED THAT AT THIS STAGE THE APPROACH OF THE MANAGEMENT TEAM AND DOOR STAFF IS EXACTLY WHAT WOULD HAVE BEEN EXPECTED. THEY HAD DECIDED TO ASK 'THE OTHER GROUP' TO LEAVE AND THEY WERE TRYING TO ENSURE THAT THIS WOULD HAPPEN IN A WAY THAT PROTECTS MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.

At 00:36am to 00:44am all is well. The premises have contained the dispute and are handling the dispute . The premises are not aware of any serious offence at all that would require the police being called. The CCTV shows that the incidents are contained.

At 00:44am two men enter the area holding bottles and throw the bottles at one of the groups. These two men immediately run back upstairs and down a side exit and are out of the premises within sixty seconds. It is impossible for any action to have been taken at the time with regard to these two men. It would have been impossible to detain these two men because of the speed at which this happened and the door staff at this stage are dealing with the two groups.

It is soon after this that Arron notices there is an injury (blood) and immediately radios upstairs for his assistant manager (Sunny) to call the police and an ambulance. Arron cannot call the police and ambulance himself because he has no reception on the dance floor but as soon as Arron is aware that there is blood and therefore a serious incident Arron calls the police and an ambulance service. Arron also makes the decision on New Year Eve to inform everyone that the premises are being closed.

THE DECISION TO CALL THE POLICE IS TAKEN IMMEDIATELY THAT ARRON IS AWARE THAT THERE IS BLOOD. AN AMBULANCE IS ALSO CALLED. THE DECISION IS ALSO TAKEN TO ANNOUNCE THAT CLUB IS CLOSING. IT IS SUBMITTED THAT THIS IS EXACTLY WHAT WAS

REQUIRED AND TO TAKE THAT DECISION ON NEW YEARS EVE SHOWS STRONG MANAGEMENT PROMOTING THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES.

Arron realises that the area in which there is blood needs to be cordoned off and puts two barriers around this area. It is right to say that a member of staff was not positioned on these barriers as the staff were dealing with exiting all customers in a safe and orderly manner and it is accepted that up to 8 members of the public walk through this potential crime scene. The CCTV does show that as soon as a member of the management team (Joanne Ronan) realises this she runs over and gets everybody out of the area. Clearly this area should have been marshalled but management and door staff were dealing with other issues.

No weapon has ever been discovered and it is unclear what caused the injuries at this stage. The premises continue to work with the Police to ascertain this.

The police took approximately 20 minutes to attend at the premises. The 'Celebrity Group' remained in the premises. The 'Other Group' were asked to remain outside the premises and some were still there when the Police arrived. It was not clear and is still not clear who had committed any offence. The 2 men who caused the 3rd incident escaped although all known information has been handed to the police.

There is reference made to a 17 year old at the premises. Although investigations are still continuing it would appear that the 17 year old had valid I.D for a 21 year old on him at the time.

The premises were closed voluntarily and remained closed at the instigation of the Premises Licence Holder until consideration was given to Interim measures.

5. Injured Persons

There are three people who were injured during the disturbances.

- 1) The gentleman with dreadlocks was dealt with by Monique who is a member of the management team and handed over to a paramedic. Monique stayed with this gentleman until the paramedics came and ensured that the gentleman was comfortable.

- 2) There is a gentleman who had a cut and was dealt with by Arron himself. This injury required a plaster and the gentleman left on his own volition.
- 3) A third gentleman who was injured was attended to by a member of the door staff called Laurence and he was speaking to the paramedics who were on route to ensure that he was administering the correct first aid.

All three injured people were dealt with correctly by management. One incident is referred to on the CRIS Report as "first aid was required as the victim had a wound on his mid level thigh of his right leg. According to the consultant at St Mary's the wound was most likely punctured by a "non-descriptive blade". This victim wanted to leave hospital and did not provide any more details.

The ambulance reports appear to suggest the following.

- First victim - two stab wounds to lower abdomen.
Second victim had lacerations to back, walking wounded.
Danny Sharp stated with regard to another victim "possibly life changing if any of the glass had gone into his bowels".

6. Action following New Years Eve

All CCTV evidence was immediately prepared and handed over the police. In fact the CCTV evidence shown by the police to the Licensing Committee on 6 January 2017 was all the CCTV evidence handed to them by the operators.

All booking information and personal details have been handed over to the police and the premises have worked with the police in providing all information relating to the evening.

PC Adam Deweltz commented that the premises have done a very good job in providing all of the information to the police. This was done very quickly and is very good practice. The Premises

have also handed over all information held by them on Individuals to the Police to assist with Identification.

7. 3 September 2016 Incident

There is reference to another incident on 3 September 2016. This is the only other incident referred to by the police and the only other incident of note at the premises.

The Premises Licence holder has not had any update on this incident other than the report which confirms that the injury required one stitch. There was no evidence of a weapon being used as far as we are aware. The victim did not want any action taken.

It is accepted that there was an error by a cleaner in cleaning up the crime scene. This is against policy and against the advice of the Premises Licence holder and the cleaner in question was dismissed.

The Premises Licence holder also arranged for all staff to undergo crime scene preservation training within five days of 3 September.

There was email correspondence with the Police with regard to additional conditions being placed on the licence. Thirteen conditions were sought by the Police and nine conditions were agreed to by the Premises Licence holder. It is entirely standard procedure in Westminster for there to be discussions between the Police and the Premises Licence holder with regard to conditions. It is also very common for a Premises Licence holder to not necessarily agree with all the conditions proposed by the Police and that is not in any way meant to be discourteous to the Police or to be a sign of not working in partnership. In this case nine conditions were agreed to.

The 'Search Arch' was not agreed as the premises used search wands to search customers and this is as effective if not more.

8. Summary

The New Years Eve event was well prepared for and the Premises Licence holder more than promoted the licensing objectives with a number of door staff and management team on duty.

The behaviour of the clientele had been exemplary up to 00:30 hours and at that stage the whole evening was being managed by the Premises Licence holder.

What happened next all started with two men trying to dance with a girl and provide unwarranted attention. There was a punch which was unseen by door staff and management and at that stage management and door staff dealt with the initial instance at 00:33 hours in an entirely appropriate way. The disturbance which followed at 00:36 hours was then dealt with as the two groups were kept separate whilst management assessed what had happened and were making decisions.

Members of the management team can be seen to be looking for any crime and the instant decision was taken (quite rightly) to turn the music off and put the lights on. This was entirely the correct approach by Arron who was in charge operationally during the evening.

During the next six or seven minutes Arron assessed the situation and the decision was taken to evict "the other group" due to their excitable and agitated behaviour. Best practice dictates that this is not done by manhandling the group from the premises as this would potentially put other members of the public in danger. The eviction is carried out by calming the group down and then managing the group from the premises in an orderly fashion so as not to disrupt other people.

This would have been achieved had it not been for the third incident caused by the two men running into the dance floor with bottles and then escaping from the premises.

The instant management are aware of blood and a serious incident the Police and the ambulance services are called. All three people found with an injury are dealt with by management and handed over to paramedics. Management attempt to keep "the other group" at the premises and some are still at the premises when the Police arrive but nobody is making a complaint and there is therefore nobody to arrest.

As there were no direct claims by an injured person and as no serious assault can be seen on the CCTV we understand that there have been no arrests. As the incidents which may have caused the injuries were not witnessed the Premises Licence Holder can do no more than hand over all

CCTV and all information held about customers in the venue. This has been done and the Premises Licence Holder will continue to work with DC Bradshaw.

An Search Arch would not have improved the situation as the Search Wands were being used.

The CCTV shows the Management and Door Staff acting swiftly and decisively.

Had any member of the door team seen any person holding a bottle then it would have been removed.

The crime scene was preserved although it is accepted that it was contaminated due to some customers walking through it. Management responded immediately.

9. Independent Refresher Training and Audit and ID Scan

The Premises Licence holder has instructed Mark Halton to undertake refresher training at the premises for all staff and door staff prior to the 16 January 2017. Mark Halton's CV is attached to this note.

Mark Halton will also be undertaking a full independent audit of the premises and the way in which the instance on New Years Eve was dealt with and a full report will be available for the Licensing Committee at the ultimate review hearing.

The Premises will immediately and prior to opening have ID Scan System in operation at the premises.

Witness Statement of Mr. Mark HALTON (MJH LICENSING CONSULTANTS).

1. I have been instructed to review independently, CCTV footage from the venue Rah Rah Room 217 Piccadilly London W1J 9HN and initial evidence provided by police for the expedited review hearing on the 6th January 2017 that resulted in the premises licence for the venue being suspended because of an interim step imposed. I am aware that the venue may wish to make representation against the hearings imposed interim step and therefore this is an interim report, an updated full report will be available for the full committee hearing.

2. I have recently retired from the Metropolitan Police Service, completing 30 year's exemplary service. I served for 9 years within the Central Clubs & Vice Unit and dealt with street prostitution, brothels, massage parlors, illegal gaming/casino crime and both licensed and unlicensed venues for the sale of alcohol. Serving as a field intelligence officer within CO14 Clubs & Vice I conducted covert policing and surveillance operations. I became a drugs test purchasing officer and financial investigator used primarily in the night club economy specializing in nightclubs and bars.

I then became employed as a police licensing officer within the Clubs & Vice Licensing Unit. Supervising and dealing with licensing prosecutions, administration and applications.

After this I was selected as the Westminster Borough Licensing Co-ordinator. Supervising all licensing teams within the Borough, modifying police process's particularly prosecutions.

This directly led me to set up the Westminster police licensing unit in which I supervised. I wrote the crime reduction management plan and assisted with the first Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy.

I was then appointed the Police Licensing Advisor to the Home Office on secondment. Running and supervising the Home Office Intensive Support Visit program (ISV) supplying training on legislation, powers and practical implementation. Completed submissions on Prime Ministerial Questions (PMQs), advice to various ministers including the Home Secretary. Wrote the Home Office guidance on expedited reviews and section 19 closure notices. Sat on the boards of Best Bar None, Pub Watch and Purple Flag. During this time assisted in the licensing of the Olympics 2012.

In 2013 I returned to the Met. Police and supervised and organized the police licensing for the Rugby World Cup 2015.

A Home Office qualified Crime Reduction Officer, Crime Prevention Design Advisor, Architectural Liaison Officer and CCTV system approved officer. An expert in crime reduction measures, designing out crime and getting venues experiencing such problems back on track.

3. I have viewed the venues CCTV images. The image is clear and visibility is very good. I am informed that the running time on the image is slow by three (3) minutes.

CAMERA 15 – Shows the dance floor and seating area. Persons seem to be enjoying the night until 0036:27 when two males approach a female who is with persons within the seating area. One of these males seems to have what appears to be a lump or abscess on his left cheek. A conversation is attempted by the males with the female. The males' attention

seems to be unwanted and results in a male from the seated party speaking with the two males and what appears to be an argument ensues. Security at this point are aware and get in between the parties. Whilst security has his back turned on the male from the seated party, this male throws a punch at one of the males. This punch does not fully connect and appears to glance the side of the face of the male, it is not seen by security, who has his back to the male. A scuffle ensues on the dancefloor, from this image there is pushing and holding back. There are champagne flutes being held by males, these are plastic.

At 0036:57 (thirty (30) seconds after incident) the lights are on and I am informed the music is turned off. This action was done by the manager on the night Aaron Curtis. Both parties have been split by security to either ends of the venue and the situation is contained very quickly in seconds. There appears at this stage to be no injuries and no serious crime or disorder. Parties are split and contained whilst a decision is being made by management and security as to just exactly what they have got at this moment in terms of crime, ejections, allegations and possibly closing the venue.

At 0040:10 Security can be seen ejecting a group of males who are arguing and pushing security.

At 0046:10 A male who was with the seated party with long dreadlock style hair can be seen sitting down and having his top and vest removed by a female. It appears there is blood on his vest.

CAMERA 08 – At 0036:39 there is a scuffle on the dance floor, a male attempts to kick but misses. There are no images of persons being struck with objects. The groups are quickly segregated by security. At 0039:09 persons are being moved out of venue. At this point a scuffle, no apparent victims and no injuries seen. The managers Aaron and Joanne are seen

proactively looking on the floor for any signs of blood or articles but can it appears find none. At 0041:41 the groups are still segregated and appear to be calming down. At 0043:44 two males walk up to the group. They have walked through from the bar, I have not seen either previously. They start to argue and throw bottle of champagne, they miss.

At 00:51:00 a cordon is placed around the seating area.

CAMERA 07 – At 00:36:30 the scuffle can again be seen. I do see the dreadlocked male I saw previously with blood on his t-shirt fall over onto his back.

A male is seen throwing a mop squeezer at a male leaving the venue, this stays at the bottom of the stairs.

At 045:12 security seen detaining people and bringing them back into club. The manager Sonny is seen on his mobile phone.

At 046:10 the dreadlocked male with injury is stopped by security from leaving.

4. I further viewed the evidence submitted by police for the initial expedited review hearing.

I wish to stress before making comment that I in no way believe that the police have not acted appropriately. They have. The mere fact that they honestly believe serious crime has occurred at the venue and needs further investigation, is reason in my opinion to launch such action. However facts often come to light as a result of those investigations that were not available at the time of launching the review, that show a venue has done all it can during the incident and that there may be reasons why certain action was and was not taken.

Within form 693 (police application for summary review) Pc Adam DEWELTZ mention that three (3) males received serious stab wounds. From the CCTV and speaking with the manager on the night Mr. Aaron CURTIS it cannot be ascertained that these are all stab wounds. The dreadlocked male that is seen falling onto his back is injured this may have been caused by this. A little unfair to state evidentially that these are definitive stab wounds. We simply do not know this is the case at this moment in time. What we do now know, is that these are not as serious as first thought.

PC DEWELTZ further states that during an ensuing scuffle bottles are used to assault each other. I do not see this. There are bottles in hand, only once do I see bottles being used threateningly and this does not make contact. Other items I observe, flutes etc. I am informed are polycarbonate. The males throwing the bottles do not make contact.

There is also mention that there was a full seventeen (17) minutes between the police being called and the incident. This is deceptive. Police were called as soon as the venue believed this was serious. Up until ascertaining this, they were dealing with what appears to be a scuffle. There is no apparent injury, allegation or serious offence until 0046:10, this timing is out by three minutes and therefore the real time is 0049:10 when manager Aaron CURTIS is aware that the dreadlocked male has been injured. He ensures the male is prevented from leaving and first aid is tendered. He then asks manager 'Sonny to call the police'. The images show dreadlocked male taken back into venue and as management state Sonny calling police. Therefore, the call is immediate. As throughout the incident this has happened quickly as soon as manager Aaron Curtis is aware. Police state Suspects being 'allowed' to leave. Again, at this point, the venue knows of no serious incident. Ten minutes previous to this manager Aaron Curtis had placed the lights on, turned the music off and gone onto the

venue PA system requesting calmness. The security had divided clientele and averted further injury. Up until the injury being brought to his attention there is no indication of a serious offence and the matter had been dealt with extremely well and quickly. At an early stage, the management have done far better than many clubs in my experience would have done so, even to the extent of looking for any evidence of injury within the venue. A job well done at this stage. A scuffle – yes. Common assault – yes. Serious crime – no. Serious disorder – no. As soon as this became serious, police were called. Up to this point the incident was not serious and had been dealt with well.

Information is given that one of the males injured is seventeen (17). I am informed that he produced ID showing he was older than 17. The venue does not want persons of this age within but to state 'and therefore should not have been in the venue 'is misleading, due diligence measures had been taken. This is not an offence and is not conditional.

Further mention is made of an incident in September 2016 where the police took a stepped approach in working with the venue and agreeing various conditions. Quite rightly the police state the venue did not accept all the police proposals.

There is further mention as to the DPS Mr. Tony FLYNN, his lack of contact with police and his not being at the venue on New Year's Eve. They are correct this is not acceptable.

Crime scene management is further mentioned. On New Year's Eve the seating area was cordoned off as soon as the venue were aware that dreadlocked male was injured (although as stated this could have been due to a fall), this cordon was not well managed. There was no other scene as the venue were not aware that any serious assault had taken place, I believe because of what I have observed, no fault of their own.

In September, there was a major issue in the management of the venue by not preserving a crime scene. This issue needs to be dealt with.

Conclusion.

It is my opinion that the police were correct in launching this review, with the evidence they had at the time.

It is my opinion that they are not correct at this stage in requesting a continuance of the interim step suspending the licence and definitely not a revocation of the premises licence.

The venue could not have dealt with the incident any better than they did on the night.

To promote the licensing objectives and get this venue back on track, the police have mentioned that they have in the past worked with the venue. I would ask that this continues and that these issues will be addressed by the following actions and steps that fall within the powers of the licensing subcommittee.

- I. Conditional. ID Scan. All persons entering.
- II. Conditional. All persons searched upon entry. I do note that the current condition 16 on the premises licence requires searching after 11pm. The current condition is not strong enough and requires a much earlier in the evening start time.
- III. Conditional. Risk reduction training inclusive of crime scene preservation to be carried out within 3 days of the hearing and refresher training every 6 months thereafter.

This is the second incident at the venue, I believe within 18 months.

These crime reduction measures as those already implemented by the venue can achieve significant results. Offences happen at the best run venues and premises. They will in my opinion never be zero, it's impossible but as the venue is attempting, the continuing crime reduction is very possible. During all my police service with the metropolitan police a stance of zero crime has never been requested of a nightclub venue, such requests must be achievable. The venue and security have dealt with the matter well, there were 12 security and 5 managers engaged on the night, extremely good for a 300-capacity venue: The aspects they can improve upon are prevention and communication. The crimes alleged are low when compared to admissions and capacity. I believe the DPS removal and conditions added to the recent measures implemented to reduce crime will have a positive effect. This will not reduce crime to zero, as this is never achievable, but will have a marked effect on reducing such crime at the venue.

I understand that my duty is to the court and this statement has been completed in compliance with that duty. All matters relevant to the issues on which my expert evidence is given have been included within my statement. I believe the facts and statements are honest and true and that the opinions I have expressed are correct to the best of my judgement. The fee for my independent service is not conditional on the outcome of the case in any way whatsoever.

Present: PC Adam Deweltz, PC Mike Day and PC Toby Janes (Metropolitan Police), Mr Andrew Woods (Solicitor, representing the Licensee), Mr Tony Flynn (Licensee and Designated Premises Supervisor), Mr Alan Dugard (Chairman of company which owns premises) and Mr Arron Curtis (Operations Director).

Initial consideration for any interim steps pending the full review of the premises licence for Rah Rah Rooms, 215-217 Piccadilly, W1 15/04320/LIREVX

The Sub-Committee heard from PC Deweltz. He stated that the application had been submitted by the Police on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety. On Sunday 1 January from 00:33 hours, serious crime and disorder had taken place. Three males, one of whom is a 17 year old juvenile, had received stab wounds at the venue which was operating as a nightclub. It was believed that the injuries were caused by a knife or a bladed article. The Police were currently investigating the matter and as yet no knife had been found. PC Deweltz advised those present that the injuries were consistent with that of a knife. No fragments of glass had been found in the room. The Police had requested medical reports from the Ambulance Service which would be received in due course. As yet no arrests had been made as part of the on-going investigations. Two of the victims had been identified as members of the Mozart Gang by the Westminster Gangs Unit. PC Deweltz added that the Police were requesting the suspension of the premises licence pending the full review hearing where they expected to request a revocation of the premises licence.

PC Deweltz explained that what had taken place on 1 January was the second example of a serious incident at the venue where a stabbing had occurred. On Saturday 3 September 2016, a male had received stab wounds to his right upper leg. The Police Licensing Team had spoken with representatives of the venue and had advocated a 'stepped approach' with recommended operational improvements and conditions in order to prevent further incidents, such as that on 3 September, taking place in the future. PC Deweltz informed those present that many failings had been found following the 3 September incident. These included that patrons had not been searched to the levels that would have been expected, the suspects carrying out the disorder had not been detained and the crime scene had not been preserved. He

made the point that by staff mopping up the blood in the Club, they had removed the forensic evidence. He also stated that staff had told Police that the blood on the floor had been cranberry juice. The Police had subsequently been able to confirm it was blood.

PC Deweltz advised the Sub-Committee that there were conditions proposed by the Police following the 3 September incident that were not accepted by those responsible for the venue. These were an ID scan system, polycarbonate drinking vessels and search arches. He expressed the view that if the safety measures had been implemented, the incident on 1 January 2017 could have been prevented. This included that the 17 year old who had been stabbed would not have gained entry to the venue. PC Deweltz also believed that by not agreeing the conditions those responsible for the premises had not adequately considered the safety of their customers and staff members.

The Sub-Committee was then shown CCTV footage from a number of the venue's cameras of what had taken place on the morning of 1 January 2017. PC Day referred to disorder breaking out from 00:34 onwards when two males began to dance with a female on the dance floor. Another male, who was in a group with this female, punched one of the males. There was a man in a black suit who was a member of the security/operations team in the venue and he was located near to the female's group in the seating area throughout the evening. It was the Police's perception, having viewed the footage, that the actions of the man in the black suit were not decisive enough in separating the groups or bringing other members of security to the scene of the altercation at any early stage. PC Day referred to one of the two men who had attempted to dance with the female (the colleague of the man who received the punch) being held in a headlock by another man and he believed this was in full view of a security guard. There was a second incident at 00:36.31 when another fight began between the two groups. PC Day stated that the Police were of the view that this could have been avoided if the security had been more proactive with the first incident and dispersed the individual who had thrown the punch. The groups are seen using bottles and other objects such as a champagne flute to assault each other. Security was seen to detain the group at the seating area and also members of the other group on the opposite side of the venue.

The Sub-Committee saw that following the second incident lighting was put on and the Operations Director, Mr Curtis had made an announcement to the patrons in the venue. The Police believed that he had advised them to stay calm and that the Police had been called. PC Day then showed footage from 00:43.53. He made the point that there were members of the seated group who were able to roam around the Club freely. He then moved the footage on to where the black male with dreadlocks who had thrown the original punch came into view. He had received two stab wounds which PC Day advised had resulted in life changing injuries. A wound to his back could be seen. There was also a wound to the front of his body. A female had taken off his shirt and blood was clearly visible on his clothing.

The Police had then showed footage from the same camera at 00:51:13 which PC Day stated displayed numerous failings in terms of preserving the crime scene where the man with dreadlocks had been stabbed. PC Day provided the information that staff had been given crime scene preservation training by an external company in the

presence of PC Russell after the incident in September 2016. The inability to preserve the crime scene had been contrary to the training given. The security and management had gone elsewhere to deal with other issues in the Club and there were no security or management overseeing the crime scene. PC Day referred to members of the public still freely drinking within the venue then leaving through the crime scene.

Footage was shown from another camera which showed a ramp on the other side of the seating area. The man who received the punch was seen at 00:36.03 being led up the ramp by Mr Curtis and a member of security. PC Day referred to the aftermath being seen of the man's friend being in a headlock which involved members of the public moving away from the altercation in fear of their safety. Security had then started to detain the suspects. From 00:43.37 in the footage PC Day indicated a black male with a jacket with a fur collar and a colleague of his with dark sleeves who were upstairs during the course of the booking. The Police were trying to identify these men as part of their investigations. These two men had approached one of the groups, one of them had swung a bottle and another fight started. PC Day showed footage at 00:45.09 of the man who had held the man from the other group in the headlock still being armed with a bottle. He stated that at no stage during the footage is the bottle removed from his hand although he was identified and stopped by security officers. PC Day informed the Sub-Committee that a man had been stabbed off camera in the abdomen and subsequently went upstairs in an attempt to gain revenge for the attack.

A further camera showed members of the public rushing to escape after the first incident. In respect of the second incident PC Day showed objects being picked up from the venue with the intent to arm. From 00:42.13, he referred to the group from the booking upstairs, including the male who was about to swing the bottle. The male can then be seen again following the incident with the bottle above his head in fear of the other group. PC Day also showed that staff had attempted to clean where the original incident had occurred. A mop and an industrial unit were subsequently used as weapons during the fighting. One of the men using these as weapons was allowed by a security guard to run past him and towards the foot of the stairs.

CCTV footage from the bottom of the stairs showed the second incident with the bottle. The second man from the upstairs group could be seen leaving with a bottle. There was a man with injuries in the stairs area who was a member of the public and not involved with any of the groups. He was hit in the face by a man armed with the mop. The mop is picked up by a member of the cleaning team which PC Day stated was contrary to the crime scene preservation training as it was a weapon used in an assault.

Finally the Sub-Committee was shown footage from cameras either side of the front door in Piccadilly. This included one of the stabbed men seeking reprisal at 00:45.16. PC Day advised Members that he had identified the male he believed was responsible for the stabbing and had attempted to punch him. He was restrained by staff, members of the public and his group. At 00:50, the member of the public hit in the face could be seen. PC Day stated that his friend was visibly unhappy with how the situation had been dealt with. He was aggressive in his manner for the next quarter of an hour, grabbing items such as the barrier. PC Day added that members

of the public were injured in the process. He believed that the footage showed that the handling of the friend of the injured man had been badly managed.

The Sub-Committee asked the Police a number of questions. The Police were able to advise in response to the questions that the Premises had first made contact at 00:50 hours and the first Police had arrived at the premises at 01:11. Multiple units had attended the venue. The Police Licensing Team had arrived at 01:31, having been first informed of an incident involving a bottle at 00:56. They were then informed of a stabbing at 01:26. The Police Constables emphasised just how busy an evening New Year's Eve is for them and that they had been dealing with a previous matter. They were of the view that there had been a delay between the first incident at 00:34 and the Police being called. It was believed that an ambulance was called from the premises. The Police Constables were of the view that Mr Curtis' announcement a number of minutes prior to 00:50 when the lights had been turned on had suggested that the Police had already been called which had not been the case. They informed Members that they would have expected those who were responsible for the incidents of disorder to be detained or taken somewhere safe and not allowed out of the venue. Members were also advised that in the Police's opinion there was a lack of urgency on the part of some members of security to deal with issues as they arose and that events had been badly handled. In some cases, they had perceived from the CCTV footage that some members of security were avoiding confronting the perpetrators whilst the incidents were taking place which they believed to be unacceptable.

The Sub-Committee heard from Mr Woods, representing the Licensee. He stated that the incidents were not what anyone wanted to see take place in Westminster. He was, however, seeking to persuade the Sub-Committee that a suspension of the premises licence pending the full review hearing was not necessary. He made the point that it was easy to view CCTV with hindsight. At the time though Mr Curtis and the security team had been required to respond to events as they arose. Those responsible for the premises had not been aware prior to the current hearing that there had been gang members involved in the incidents.

Mr Woods explained that Mr Curtis had been on duty on 1 January. Mr Flynn, the Licensee and DPS had not been present. Mr Woods emphasised the experience of the management who he stated had been involved with the operation at 1 Leicester Square over a 12 year period without any serious incidents taking place. They had commenced running the premises at 215-217 Piccadilly on 1 July 2015. Rah Rah Rooms is a cabaret venue which on certain nights operates as a nightclub. Mr Woods advised that there were a number of corporate bookings scheduled during January 2017. He expressed the view that the premises did not attract trouble on a regular basis. He sought to differentiate Rah Rah Rooms from other premises who were the subject of reviews and where there had been a number of escalating crimes. He emphasised that there had not been any incidents of note from 1 July 2015 to 3 September 2016.

Mr Woods addressed Members on matters from 3 September 2016 onwards. He commented that on 3 September the crime scene had not been preserved as an inexperienced member of the team had cleaned it up. Within a few days of the incident staff had been booked on a crime scene preservation training course. In

respect of the Police's 'stepped approach' following the stabbing in September, Mr Dugard advised that there had been 13 conditions proposed by the Police and on behalf of the owners of the premises he had agreed 9 of them. He added that the conditions had been the subject of a minor variation application and there had been no objections to this. It was his view that search arches were not appropriate for a cabaret premises.

Mr Woods stated that in respect of New Year's Eve, there had been 12 SIA qualified door supervisors on duty at the premises. Additional TSS security staff were also employed and they had previously been employed when management had worked at 1 Leicester Square. Two members of the management team at Rah Rah Rooms were SIA qualified. There were five managers on duty. Mr Woods brought to Members' attention that there was a ratio of 1 door staff to 25 customers which was considerably more than would usually have been employed. Details of the booked tables and tickets were being handed over to the Police as had all the CCTV footage. There were no special promotions and some of the tables booked had been particularly expensive, including the group with the male who had thrown the initial punch. Mr Woods commented that PC Day and PC Deweltz had attended the premises at 22:25 on 31 December, a couple of hours before the incident and had seen the search wand in action.

Mr Woods explained the incidents of 1 January from his client's point of view. The seated group which included the woman dancing and the man who had thrown the initial punch were a celebrity group. Following the punch being thrown, Mr Curtis had been called and was assessing the extent of the injuries to the man who had been the subject of it. At that stage he had not considered this to be a serious assault and so had not contacted the Police. From 00:36, it was clear that there were issues between the celebrity group and a second group. At that stage security had detained the celebrity group and the other group had been taken to the other side of the Club and were told to calm down. Mr Curtis took the decision to turn the lights on and turn off the music. Mr Curtis added that his announcement was to calm down and he had told those present at the venue that he would call the Police if there were further issues.

Mr Woods informed Members that it was his client's view that the problems were contained until 00:44 when the two men from the upstairs booking appeared and used bottles. They had not been detained as they had left the venue quickly before it was known who had caused this incident. It was not known yet whether they were connected to anyone involved with the incidents in the previous few minutes. Mr Curtis stated that after the use of bottles he had instructed a member of staff to call Police. It was his belief that the Police had actually been called at 00:46.10. The Ambulance Service had also been called. Mr Dugard stated that it was his understanding that the first two groups who had clashed initially were detained for 16 minutes and there was only so long that it was possible to detain ten to fifteen males.

Mr Woods stated that Mr Curtis had placed barriers around the crime scene. He accepted that 8 people should not have been allowed to walk through the crime scene and that a member of staff should have overseen the area.

The Sub-Committee asked those responsible for the premises a number of

questions. Mr Curtis was asked whether the male who threw the initial punch had been detained. Mr Curtis replied that the man who had been struck by the punch had not known who had thrown it. It was Mr Curtis' priority to assess the injuries. He had brought a manager to the scene and then a further incident had taken place. Mr Dugard was asked why he had rejected the Police's conditions in respect of the ID scan system and search arches. Mr Dugard replied that Rah Rah Rooms is predominantly a cabaret and burlesque dance venue with corporate and private events. A safety wand was used because search arches would look out of place. He added that the search arches tended to go off when any females walked through whereas the safety wand was more specific. In respect of an ID scan system, Mr Dugard made the point that there had not previously been issues with gangs at the premises. He was not convinced that ID would have picked up the gang members or that they would have prevented the incidents on 1 January. He was however committed to installing the ID scan system now. Mr Curtis confirmed that the safety wand was used for everyone entering the premises. Mr Dugard volunteered the information that polycarbonate vessels were already used throughout the premises.

In response to further questions, those responsible for the premises clarified that there had been two inexperienced cleaners employed on 3 September 2016 who had cleaned the crime scene. The failure to preserve the crime scene on 1 January had been a momentary lapse. It was also clarified that Rah Rah Rooms is a cabaret venue until 23:00 or midnight. Other activities, including the premises becoming a bar, took place after that time.

Mr Woods was also asked whether consideration was given to eject everyone present after the coming together of the two groups at 00:36. Mr Curtis replied that it was seen at that time as a containment operation as there were no visible injuries. After the use of the bottles and staff being aware of injuries, everyone was told to leave the premises. Mr Dugard commented that when the two men came downstairs it was very difficult to find out who was who. He did not believe that any security had seen the bottle swung. The two men had disappeared through the fire escape before they could be detained. Those responsible for the premises were also asked whether those involved with the initial incidents should have been ejected. Mr Curtis replied that the two groups had been separated and requiring them to leave would have been a mistake. Mr Dugard added that there is only one entrance and a fire exit at the premises and all would have had to leave via the same stairs. It was also the position of those responsible for the premises that it was doubtful whether the security guard positioned by the celebrity group's table had seen the original punch being thrown

The Police were given the opportunity to respond to the comments of those responsible for the premises. PC Deweltz stated that there was extra security employed and additional conditions had been attached to the premises licence after 3 September 2016. However, despite this management had lost control on 1 January. Three people had been stabbed. People could have died. One of the injuries was very serious and was described as a life changing injury. The Police had no faith that management were able to keep members of the public or staff safe. Staff had not been sufficiently proactive, including hiding behind the bars. It was proportionate and necessary to suspend the premises licence.

Mr Woods summed up that on 363 days in the year the premises had been run exceptionally well. There had been two incidents. He disputed that there had been any delay in calling the Police. Staff had looked to calm down the two groups who had had the initial altercation. He made the point that if the two men from upstairs had not become involved that likely would have been the end of the incidents. Mr Woods expressed concerns that suspension of the premises licence could lead to the Club closing. The track record did not show that Rah Rah Rooms was a troublesome venue.

The Sub-Committee had carefully read the report and listened to the representations made at the hearing. Members took the view that the Police and those responsible for the premises had explained their positions well. They appreciated the Police's investigation was on-going. Based however on the information provided to the Sub-Committee at this stage, Members decided it was necessary to suspend the premises licence, pending the full review hearing. The Sub-Committee shared the view of the Police that they lacked confidence in the way that management had responded to the incidents of 3 September 2016 and 1 January 2017. Members considered that given the seriousness of the events of 3 September 2016, those responsible for the premises should have agreed to ID scan and search arches conditions. Management had not appeared to sufficiently learn the lessons from the incidents of September 2016 and apply them to the issues raised on 1 January.

The Sub-Committee agreed with the position of the Police that there was a lack of urgency on the part of some members of security to deal with issues as they arose and that some members of security were avoiding confronting the perpetrators whilst the incidents were taking place. One such example was the footage that showed the man who had held the man from the other group in the headlock still being armed with a bottle. The footage showed him still holding the bottle as a potential weapon even though he had been confronted by security officers. The Sub-Committee had also seen the footage at the front of the premises of the friend of the member of the public who was hit by the mop where little was done to calm him down.

A further concern was that the crime scene and the mop which had been used as a weapon had not been guarded despite there being a large number of security staff employed on the night. Whilst the crime scene not being preserved could be viewed as a momentary lapse, it was an example of management not responding adequately to the incidents which arose on 1 January and not applying what should have been learnt from the stabbing incident on 3 September.

To consider the representation received against the interim step determined at the Licensing Sub-Committee on 6th January 2017 pending the full review of the premises licence for Rah Rah Rooms, 215-217 Piccadilly, W1 15/04320/LIREVX

In the early hours of the morning on New Year's Day, serious crime and disorder took place at the premises. Three males sustained serious injuries, which the Police believe to be stab wounds. An application was made by the Metropolitan Police on 4 January 2017 for a summary review of the premises licence pursuant to section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003. A hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee took place on 6 January 2017 within 48 hours of the Police submitting the application. The Sub-Committee was required to consider whether it was necessary to take interim steps pending the determination of the review applied for. Members decided to suspend the premises licence pending the full hearing which will take place within 28 days of the Police submitting the summary review application. On 10 January 2017 the Licence Holder submitted representations against the interim step. A hearing was therefore scheduled for the Sub-Committee to consider those representations on 12 January 2017.

At the beginning of the hearing the Metropolitan Police requested that the public and press were excluded as the Police investigation into the events of the early hours of 1 January was on-going and they were keen that any disclosure of information did not prejudice the investigation. The Sub-Committee decided to approve this request and the public and press were therefore excluded from the hearing.

The Sub-Committee initially heard from Mr Woods, representing the Premises

Licence Holder. He had set out his reasons for his clients making the representations against the Sub-Committee's decision to suspend the premises licence pending the full hearing which had been taken on 6 January 2017. He confirmed that his clients wished to show different CCTV evidence to that shown by the Police at the interim steps hearing. The Premises Licence Holder had not shown CCTV evidence at that meeting. He wished to demonstrate that those running the premises on the night of New Year's Eve / New Year's Day were promoting the licensing objectives and that Rah Rah Rooms should remain open until the full review hearing. Mr Woods referred to the supporting evidence from Mr Halton, the Licensing Consultant, which had been submitted prior to the hearing and had concluded that the venue 'could not have dealt with the incident any better than they did on the night'. Mr Thompson was available at the hearing to provide an assessment of how security had behaved.

Mr Woods wished to emphasise that following the incident the venue had handed over all the relevant CCTV footage and had been commended by the Police for doing so. It was the Premises Licence Holder's hope that management would be able to work in partnership with the Police. Mr Woods explained that there were matters that could be seen on the CCTV which management had said they were not aware of at the time. This included a young man holding a bottle for the duration of the footage being shown. Mr Woods confirmed to Members that the champagne flutes and drinking vessels used on the night of 31 December / 1 January were polycarbonate whilst the bottles used were made of glass.

Mr Woods stated that the premises had been trading since July 2015 and until September 2016 there had not been any incidents of note. On 3 September 2016, a male had been taken to hospital and had required a stitch to an injury in the thigh. He added that following e-mail correspondence between Mr Dugard, on behalf of the company which owns the premises and Sergeant Hoppe of the Metropolitan Police, nine out of thirteen of the Police's proposed conditions had been agreed. However, it was Mr Dugard's position that a safety wand was more effective as search arches tended to go off indiscriminately whereas the safety wand was more specific. Mr Dugard also had not believed that the search arches were appropriate for a cabaret premises. Mr Woods also made the point that the IDs of the patrons of the venue were checked. It was however the preference of the management not to use an ID scanner. Mr Woods wished to refute the Police's point that an ID scanner would have prevented one of the victims from entering the premises on the night of 31 December because he was seventeen years of age. This was because it was understood that he had produced ID on the night showing he was older than seventeen.

Mr Woods also wished to emphasise the numbers of door staff that were operating on the night of 31 December / 1 January, that there had been no drinks promotions or any promotional material used which might encourage anti-social behaviour and that the management were experienced with many of them having run this premises and 1 Leicester Square over eight or nine New Year's Eve evenings without incident.

Mr Curtis, who had been in charge of the premises on the night of 31 December / 1 January in Mr Flynn's absence, showed the CCTV footage and explained the events from his point of view. He began with CCTV footage of the front door area where Mr

Curtis had spoken with the Police. During the evening PC Mike Day, as well as both a first group described as a celebrity group and a second group (other group) who were involved in the incidents all appeared to be searched with the safety wand before entering the premises.

Next Mr Curtis showed footage of the first incident from camera 15 at 00:36.27 onwards where two men from the second group attempted to dance with a woman from the celebrity group. Mr Curtis believed that a door supervisor who was close to the first incident (when a male from the celebrity group punched one of the two men), had not seen the punch although he had recognised something had happened. Mr Curtis had then spoken with the male who had been punched (Mr Curtis and the male were shown on camera 7). This male had said that he had not known who had thrown the punch. Mr Curtis had then told a security officer and manager of the incident. A second incident occurred a few minutes after a scuffle had then ensued on the dance floor with one male pushing another male backwards. It was believed that one of the males from the celebrity group went to hit a male from the other group with a plastic champagne flute.

Mr Curtis advised that the second incident had been contained within seconds. Thirty seconds after the incident he had put the house lights on and turned off the music (the house lights being turned on were also shown on camera 8). A number of managers, security and other staff had arrived at the scene and the two groups were separated and kept at either end of the venue. Members of the Sub-Committee were informed that the other group were calmed down and by 00:39 the other group were being moved towards the exit of the venue whilst the celebrity group were kept at the table they had booked. Mr Curtis added that there had been no sign of injuries at this stage.

The Sub-Committee then saw footage from camera 8 of what was described as the third incident when two men from a third group, known as the Mac group, approached the celebrity group. There were at least three members of this group seen on CCTV. One threw a champagne bottle at the celebrity group. Mr Curtis explained that the men were not detained because they fled the venue via the fire escape within approximately 40 seconds of the incident. Their departure could be seen on camera 7.

A man from the celebrity group (victim A) had received an injury and he could be seen on the CCTV footage being brought to the seated area.

The Sub-Committee gave the Police and those responsible for the premises the opportunity to comment whilst the other party was showing CCTV footage. The Police commented at this stage that management should have called the Police after the initial punch was known about as this was an assault. It was the premises management's position as set out by Mr Woods that the first incident would have merited an entry in the incident book but was not sufficiently serious to warrant a call to the Police. Mr Curtis also made the point that the incidents had occurred instantaneously. He believed the two assailants responsible for the third incident had been through the search wand.

There was a difference in opinion between those responsible for the premises and

the Police as to whether a man who threw a mop bucket who had sought to chase the Mac group had struck another male on the stairwell. The Police believed that it had whilst those responsible for the premises believed it had struck the wall.

Mr Curtis was of the view that there was a three minute delay on the camera footage and that a manager had phoned the Police at approximately 00:45.39. Mr Curtis also referred to members of the celebrity group being detained and brought back inside the venue.

On camera 4, a man could be seen in the stairwell with a stab wound to the abdomen. Another man who was injured from the celebrity group was escorted to the back of the venue. Mr Curtis advised that Jermyn Street was the best place for those who were injured to receive paramedic help.

During the showing of the CCTV, the Sub-Committee asked Mr Curtis whether there were any members of the staff viewing the CCTV footage live. He replied that there were not but that the CCTV was reviewed afterwards.

The Sub-Committee were then addressed by the Police. PC Janes stated that Police investigations had found that a sharp implement had been used at least in two of the injuries, and they did not believe they were caused by broken glass. The Police indicated that the LAS reports characterised the two injuries as stab wounds.

He emphasised that during the incidents fighting had taken place and objects had been used as weapons.

PC Guerra provided a commentary to the Sub-Committee whilst he showed CCTV footage. It was the Police's view that the security man had been seen the initial punch as he had intervened quickly to try and stop the fighting. He made a further point that the footage demonstrated that a man had been able to hold a bottle throughout the period of the incidents and no one had challenged him. There were people drinking from bottles generally without being challenged.

PC Guerra stated that the Police believed that four people had been injured on the night of 31 December / 1 January. Victim A had a wound in his back and his abdomen. Victim B had an injury to the front of his abdomen. Victim C had a cut to his hip and Victim D was believed to have had a cut to his head which the Police described as a minor injury.

PC Guerra referred to the scene where the blood of victim A had been left unattended. People had been able to walk through this area which had resulted in the scene being contaminated.

On footage from an outside camera he showed an aggressive male being violent over a period of time, including picking up a barrier. The Police did not believe anyone had been injured but they were of the view that security should have made an effort to detain him.

PC Guerra also showed footage of women who had re-entered the premises at around midnight and had appeared not to be searched with the wand. He added that

weapons could be brought into the premises on others' behalf.

One of the victims with an injury had also been able to go outside the venue and attempt to throw a punch at another male. Mr Curtis, in response to this point, stated that the outside area was being manned by security. This had taken place at 00:45 when the full seriousness of the incidents was not known. The man was taken back inside and detained with the celebrity group.

The Police showed footage from camera 12 which showed the route through the fire escape of the males from the Mac group involved in the third incident. PC Guerra showed footage of members of the public at approximately 00:43 being knocked to the floor as the males escaped. One of the assailants was still carrying a bottle.

Following the conclusion of the showing of the CCTV footage, Mr Woods was asked whether there were any further differing views on the part of those responsible for the premises to those expressed by the Police. Mr Woods replied that there were one or two of the Police's comments that he did not agree with, notably the suggestion that Mr Curtis and Ms Ronan had lost control of the venue.

PC Janes provided some further information as to why the Police had submitted an expedited review. There had been three incidents over a period of 16 minutes which the Police believed had escalated because they had not been dealt with swiftly. The Police were concerned in terms of how long those involved with the incidents had been detained and that they had not been held for the Police to arrest. Following Police investigations Police had identified that there was known gang involvement in the incidents and the Police were concerned about the potential for reprisals if the premises remained open. The contaminated scene had prevented evidence being available to the Police during their investigations. It was the Police's view, as had been recommended by the September incident that search wands were not sufficient. A search arch would have provided greater assurance that an object would be identified.

PC Janes referred to the incident of 3 September. He stated that the failings then had been that suspects had not been detained and that the area roped off believing crime scene had not been preserved as this was where the blood. He added that the blood on that occasion had been mopped up and the Police had been told it was cranberry juice. The Police had later been able to confirm it was blood. Following the incident, those responsible for the premises had not agreed conditions to introduce an ID scan or search arch. It was the Police's position that an ID scanner acted as a deterrent and the search wands should be used as a complement to the search arch and not instead of it. PC Janes added that if the safety measures had been introduced they may have prevented stabbings taking place. He expressed the view that lessons from 3 September had not been learnt. There had been no reported stabbings elsewhere in venues in Westminster over the last three years and there had been four in Rah Rah Rooms inside five months. He had no confidence that the venue would be run safely by the management.

The Sub-Committee asked the Police and those responsible for the premises what their thoughts were on whether appropriate conditions could be attached which would negate the need for the premises licence to be suspended pending the full review

hearing. The Police were specifically asked whether the sale of alcohol concluding after the cabaret show ended around midnight would address their concerns. PC Janes responded that such a condition would not absolutely prevent further incidents. He emphasised that the stabbings could have led to a fatality and that some previous conditions attached to the premises licence had not been adhered to. Mr Woods advised that Mr Dugard had now ordered an ID scanner. There would be three days refresher training for staff.

In response to questions from the Sub-Committee, Mr Dugard wished to refute the Police's comment that management of the venue had said that the blood which had been cleaned up on 3 September 2016 had been cranberry juice. He believed the Police had been informed that staff had thought it had been fluids from the tables. In response to the incident he had sent all the staff on a crime scene preservation training course.

Those responsible for the premises were asked about the carrying of bottles. Ms Ronan replied that staff had received specific training that bottles were kept on tables, including empty bottles and that customers should be told to go back to their table rather than carrying the bottles. It was agreed that the carrying of bottles was not acceptable. Mr Curtis replied in response to a question as to how management would prevent a situation happening where members of the public had run towards the fire exit and fallen over as they looked to avoid the Mac group that there were a lot of lessons to be learnt and it would be necessary to put further policies in place.

Mr Woods was given the opportunity to make some concluding comments. He stated that whilst the case did not hinge on the extent of the injuries, there had been minimal blood loss in respect of the three victims. The Licence Holder had been unaware until 6 January that there had been any involvement by a gang. Anyone who had caused crime or disorder on the night of 31 December / 1 January (and the Licence Holder had facial pictures) would not be allowed back in the venue. He emphasised that the Club did not attract incidents on a regular basis and the experienced management had not faced incidents in the past 9 to 10 years at the previous premises. These premises had operated for 12 months without any incidents at all. Management held their hands up that the crime scene had not been preserved on 3 September. Mr Woods disputed that management had lost control of the venue on the night of 31 December / 1 January. He summarised the timing of the events and said that the events had not lasted for 16 minutes because the management had retained initial control. He believed there had been strong management in separating the two groups and putting the house lights on and turning off the music. He was of the view that the second incident would have been the end of the problems until two people that were unknown to security had approached the celebrity group carrying bottles at approximately 00:43. Mr Curtis had decided to close the venue after the third incident and call the Police when he was aware there was at least one injury. Door staff had detained some of those involved with the disorder but none of the three victims wanted to make a complaint.

Mr Woods explained that it had been difficult to find who had committed the incidents and that management had done a good job in exceptional circumstances. The difficult decisions taken at 00:33, 00:36 and 00:43 had all been taken in order to promote the licensing objectives. They were confident that they had made the right

calls. All the CCTV had then been forwarded to the Police. He made the point that had staff seen the bottles been carried they would have removed them. This was taking place whilst staff was seeking to contain the incidents. He also clarified that no door staff had been with one of the victims (victim A) because the area had been cleared and there was no one there. Mr Woods believed that staff had taken the man to this area because it was quiet. He also commented that there were concerns that the revocation and even the suspension of the premises licence could lead to the venue closing.

Mr Woods updated the Sub-Committee on his clients' thoughts regarding possible conditions to attach to the premises licence in order to try and negate the need for the premises licence being suspended pending the full review hearing. The conditions offered were the introduction of an ID scanner linked to other clubs, a ratio of 1 door staff to 25 patrons being employed on club nights and a knife arch being introduced in addition to the use of the search wand. There would also be three complete days of refresher training for staff, including door staff, with Mr Halton before the premises was allowed to open.

Mr Woods was asked whether his clients would be willing, in the light of the seriousness of the issues that had arisen, to offer a reduction in hours, corporate or private events only or live CCTV coverage being actively monitored in the period up until the full review hearing was held. He replied that he did not believe there was a problem with having live CCTV coverage being actively monitored. Mr Dugard stated that if purely corporate or private events were held or the hours were reduced, it would mean that running the premises at its location in Piccadilly would not be economically viable.

The Police were given the opportunity to respond to Mr Woods' summing up. PC Janes had concerns that as suspects had not been formally identified it would be difficult to ensure that they did not enter the venue. He also had concerns that despite a high ratio of security staff to patrons as was being proposed as a condition by the Licence Holder and other measures and training being introduced, the assaults had still happened.

Ms Ronan wished to get across to Members how committed staff were to their roles and to ensuring that the patrons who had caused the incidents did not get into the premises in the future.

Members of the Sub-Committee listened carefully and at length to the representations and evidence given. They had been required to consider the position regarding the premises licence in the period until the full review hearing and whether the decision to suspend the premises licence was appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives. The Sub-Committee were not of the view that the conditions offered by the Licence Holder were appropriate or sufficient to promote the licensing objectives given the issues which had arisen at the premises. Members regretted that these conditions had not been brought in after the stabbing incident on 3 September 2016. There was also a concern that these premises might be the subject of further incidents in view of the fact that those responsible for the potentially life-threatening stabbings had not been apprehended or even identified on the CCTV footage. In those circumstances the licensee and operators of the premises could not

guarantee that they would not be admitted to the premises if they were allowed to reopen before the full review had taken place.

Whilst the Sub-Committee did accept that the operators had not lost total control of the premises, it was nevertheless of the view that for a period of time control of the premises had been lost on the night of 31 December / 1 January. This could be shown in the way that members of the public had run towards the fire exit and fallen over as they looked to avoid the Mac group. Whilst it was not known who the assailants were or what the exact causes of the injuries were, the Sub-Committee did take account of the fact that there had been a previous stabbing incident at the premises and those responsible for the premises had chosen to reject some of the Police advice given at the time which may have reduced the risk. Mr Dugard's explanation regarding the use of search wands was understood, but the Sub-Committee agreed with the Police that they still had to be used to complement the use of the search arch which would at least identify an issue that might otherwise be missed by the wands. The use of a search arch and the implementation of ID scanning would have potentially deterred the unknown assailants from entering the premises.

The Sub-Committee had also been shown on the CCTV footage instances of failings to uphold the licensing objectives including patrons carrying bottles and the search wands not being effectively used. Conditions on the licence did not prevent the premises from providing drink in glass bottles but that meant that it was essential to ensure that customers did not carry such bottles around the premises. Whilst it was not ascertained that any of the stabbings had actually been caused by broken glass it was clear from the detailed CCTV evidence that some people had either used or attempted to use glass bottles as weapons. There was also concern about customers in the external smoking area not being properly searched when they re-entered the premises on the basis that management regarded the external smoking area to be a part of the premises, although items could easily have been passed from the other side of the barriers.

The Sub-Committee recognised that the operators of the premises did engage in some good and responsible practices as would be expected from such experienced operators. It did think that Mr Curtis acted responsibly in turning on the lights, turning of the music and ultimately closing the premises. It also accepted that the operators might not have appreciated that gangs were involved at the time. The main concern was that they had not fully learned from the previous and relatively recent stabbing incident and, in view of the fact that other measures proposed by the Police had not been implemented they did not have as much control on New Year's Day as was required. That was even taking into account the number of registered door supervisors and experienced managers who were on duty that night. The operators made the point that they operated as a cabaret but it was also clear that the use did change as the night progressed such that the premises appeared to be operating primarily as a nightclub when the three incidents took place. Although the Sub-Committee gave the operator the opportunity to consider shutting the premise at an earlier hour or restricting entry to pre-paid corporate events, Mr Dugard said that such restrictions would not be commercially viable. In such circumstances the Sub-Committee decided that it was not appropriate to impose them as an interim step. The final decision regarding the review of the licence was still to take place but,

having regard to the very detailed submissions that had been made by both parties, the Sub-Committee decided that it was appropriate for the interim step of suspension of the licence to remain in place.

The Sub-Committee thanked both the parties for the professional manner in which their representations had been made.

The hearing concluded at 20:10 hours.
