#### MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS

#### 1 MEMBERSHIP

1.1 There were no changes to the membership.

#### 2 DECLARATION OF INTEREST

2.1 There were no declarations of interest.

#### 3 MINUTES

3.1 **RESOLVED:** That the minutes of the Licensing Committee meeting held on Wednesday 1 December 2021 were signed as a correct record of proceedings.

#### 4 THE POTENTIAL IMPACT OF THE LEVELLING-UP AND REGENERATION BILL ON THE LICENSING OF TABLES AND CHAIRS

4.1 The Committee were advised that officers wished to defer this item to a future meeting as there were some points that needed further clarification before discussion with members.

4.2 **RESOLVED:** That the report be submitted to a future meeting.

## **5 LICENSING POLICY REVIEWS PROGRAMME 2022/23 TO 2024/25**

- 5.1 The Committee received a report providing an overview of the Licensing Policy Review Programme which will be carried out over the next three years.
- 5.2 The Committee heard that licensing policies under the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 have to be reviewed within specific statutory requirements and the other policies referred to in the report should be reviewed at regular intervals. Members noted that certain licensing policies needed to be approved by Full Council.
- 5.3 The Committee discussed:
- how the programme was subject to change due to external factors such as changes in legislation associated with existing or new licensing regimes.
  - how the Licensing Service were seeking to rectify the specifying resolution in place for street trading pitches in and around Oxford Street.
  - how areas became special consideration zones.
  - the possibility of reducing the number of sex establishment licences.
  - the importance of consulting stakeholders and members on each policy.
  - the importance of including modern slavery and violence against women and girls in the Statement of Licensing Policy Review.
- 5.4 **ACTION:** That a scheduled timetable of the Review Programme (with deadlines) be submitted to the next meeting.
- 5.5 **RESOLVED:** That the report be noted.

## **6 UPDATE OF LICENSING APPEALS**

- 6.1 The Committee received a report which provided a summary of recent appeal results. The Committee noted the summary which included details of the six appeals that Legal Services had been dealing with since March 2021, four of which had now been withdrawn and two of which were pending determination.
- 6.2 The Committee heard that the first pending appeal was regarding the refusal to grant a licence for a 24-hour Adult Gaming Centre (AGC) and the second pending appeal was made by Interested Parties who want the Authority to attach their requested conditions to the Premises Licence. The Committee noted that further details of the outcomes of these appeals would be provided once the appeals had been dealt with.
- 6.3 The Committee were pleased that the Hemming's directions hearing had been listed for December.
- 6.4 **RESOLVED:** That the report be noted.

## **7 THE PERFORMANCE OF THE LICENSING SERVICE**

- 7.1 The Committee received a report which provided an overview of the Licensing Service over the financial periods 2020/2021 and 2021/2022. The Committee noted that during 2021/2022 the total number of applications received was 9546.
- 7.2 The Committee heard about the types of regimes and applications handled by the Licensing Service, team performance, significant trends and high-profile events such as the Queens Jubilee, Pride and Notting Hill Carnival.
- 7.3 The Committee discussed:
- the value for money and benefits of the pre-application advice service offered by the Licensing Authority to all Applicants.
  - the importance of robust proof-reading of conditions on Premises Licences.
  - the robust policing and preparation for the Notting Hill Carnival weekend.
  - the benefits of holding the summer concerts simultaneously at Hyde Park.
  - the recovery of debt owed by street traders.
- 7.4 The Committee welcomed the Licensing Services' performance on processing applications within two working days of receipt. The Committee noted that currently key performance indicators (KPIs) were set at 90% and the performance attainment for these indicators during 2020/2021 and 2021/2022 was 97%.
- 7.5 The Committee congratulated the Licensing Service on clearing the backlog of licensing cases.
- 7.6 **RESOLVED:** That the report be noted.

## **1. Executive Summary**

- 1.1 This report proposes the appointment of an additional Licensing Sub-Committee Chair.

## **2. Recommendations**

- 2.1 That Councillor Angela Piddock be elected a Licensing Sub-Committee Chair.

## **3. Background**

- 3.1 At the Council Annual Meeting (Meeting of Standing Committees) all standing Committees are required to note their Sub-Committee's membership and to allow the appointment of Chairs which it considers appropriate for the effective operation of the Authority's licensing duties.
- 3.2 Currently there are three Licensing Sub-Committee Chairs, however as the Council is the busiest Licensing authority, it is now deemed necessary to appoint a fourth Chair to ensure the efficient administration of the Sub-Committees and ease the workload on the current Chairs.
- 3.3 The power to appoint members to Sub-Committees lies with the parent committee, the Licensing Committee, and it is recommended the position of an additional Chair be confirmed. The majority party have indicated that they wish Councillor Angela Piddock to be appointed as the additional Sub-Committee Chair.

## **4. Financial Implications**

- 4.1 The appointment of an additional Licensing Sub-Committee Chair will incur additional expenditure of £2,133 per annum. The Members' Allowances budget for 2022-2023 is sufficient to fund the change proposed in this report.

## **5. Legal Implications**

- 5.1 Licensing Sub-Committees are governed by the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 rather than the Local Government Act 1972. Under the Licensing Act 2003 the functions of the Licensing Authority must be carried out by the Licensing Committee which must consist of between 10 and 15 members of the Authority. The Licensing Committee may establish one or more Sub-Committee comprising of three members of the Licensing Committee to determine the licensing applications which cannot be decided by officers of the Authority, which basically means any applications which have attracted representations. The Licensing Sub-Committees are not subject to political proportionality.



5.2 The Licensing Committee has established five Licensing Sub-Committees to determine Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 contested licensing applications, and these Sub-Committees are generally scheduled on a weekly basis. As the Licensing Authority has so many applications it helps an efficient administration process to appoint another Vice Chair of the Licensing Sub-Committee as recommended by this report.

## **6. Carbon Impact**

6.1 The decision will have no carbon impact.

## **7. Consultation**

7.1 Any comments received will be reported at the meeting.

## **8. Equalities Implications**

8.1 S.149 of the Equality Act 2010 places a duty on local authorities to have due regard to the need to eliminate unlawful discrimination, to advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and to encourage good relations between those who share a protected characteristic and those who do not. The Council has had due regard to this duty but does not consider the appointment of an additional Vice Chair has a negative impact on this duty, on the contrary it will assist effective determination of licensing applications.

<b>Financial summary</b>	This report sets out the fee strategy for the licensing regimes where the authority can set a fee to attempt to recover its own costs. The proposed fees will enable the authority to recover its own costs in administering and ensuring compliance within those licensing regimes.

### 1. Executive Summary

- 1.1 This report sets out the fee review that has been undertaken by the Licensing Service for all licensing regimes where the council can set a fee. It is proposed that the amended fees set out in Appendix one of this report will take affect from the **1 April 2023**
- 1.2 This report is written in line with the corporate timeframe for setting the council's fees and charges, which is carried out each year. By aligning the fee review with the corporate approach to setting fees and charges it enables a standardised approach across the Council.

### 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 The Licensing Committee is requested to:

Approve the proposed fees attached to this report as set out Appendix one hereof so that they commence on the **1 April 2023**.

### **3 Reasons for Decision**

- 3.1 The proposed fees, as attached at Appendix one, will enable the Council to recover its reasonable costs for administering, monitoring, and enforcing the Council's licensing regimes.

### **4 Background**

- 4.1 Fees set by the Licensing Service were last approved in December 2021 and came into effect from the 2 November 2021. However, street trading licensing fees were not included as they had previously been agreed by the Licensing Committee and only fully came into force in July 2020.
- 4.2 The Licensing Service undertakes a review annually on the fees which it has the power to set.
- 4.3 The fees for processing each type of application are estimated by assessing the time it takes for each step in the process from receipt of application to determination. This includes the time taken by internal consultees, such as the Environmental Health Consultation Team and Registrars.
- 4.4 In the last annual fee review the Licensing Service estimated the cost for the compliance and enforcement function carried out by the Council's City Inspectors. The time was assigned to different roles and the costs based on hourly rates. There was also a proportion attributed to these fees for management time, which included the costs associated with running the department and services involved with delivering a function associated with one or more licensing regimes. The fees were then established by calculating the cost associated with each of the licensing functions.
- 4.5 Although the Council does not receive any applications or issue licences for some regimes it still must set a fee to recover the costs of carrying out that function. In this instance the costs are estimated based on similar types of application processes and licences.

### **5 Fee review and financial implications**

- 5.1 The Council may set fees under the following licensing regimes:

5.3 When setting fees there is a statutory requirement to consider the income received for a licensing scheme compared to the overall cost of delivering the scheme. The fee level must be set to recover the actual costs incurred by the Council in running the regime but not to make a profit.

5.4 The table setting out the current fee and proposed fee are shown within Appendix one to this report.

## **Licensing costs associated with Premises**

- 5.5 Premises licensing fees for several regimes are set in two parts, including massage and special treatment premises, and sex establishments. The splitting of the fees into two parts has been established following the ruling by the Supreme Court for the Hemming case. This approach is in compliance with the Provisions of Services Regulations 2009.
- 5.6 Fees have to be charged in two parts. Part A is payable with the application and is a non-refundable administration fee for processing the application and carrying out any consultation and determining whether the licence should or should not be granted. If the application is successful, a second fee is payable (called a Part B fee) which covers the costs of monitoring and enforcing the licensing regime.
- 5.7 The fee for Part B covers 12 months of enforcement cost and would be refunded on a monthly pro rata basis if the licence is surrendered.

## **6 Street Trading Licensing**

- 6.1 Street trading fees are set under the provisions of the City of Westminster Act 1999 ("The 1999 Act").  
There are two types of fees for street trading, the application fee for processing and grant of a licence and a daily fee for each day the licence is given which is full cost recovery for costs associated with cleansing, administration and enforcement.
- 6.2 Any variation to the street trading charge is governed by Section 22 of the 1999 Act. Any proposed fee must be subject to a 28-day consultation period with existing licence holders and those that represent licence holders. During the consultation period any questions must be fully addressed and whilst answers are being provided the 28-day time period is extended.
- 6.3 The different types of street trading licences include market pitches, isolated pitches, casual traders, exhibition sites and tables and chairs.
- 6.4 Street trading fees for markets were reviewed and approved by Licensing Committee in November 2018 where a 2-year phased increase was agreed. Phase 1 came into effect on 01 April 2019. Phase 2 was due to take effect on 01 April 2020 but was suspended due to Covid-19 until 01 July 2020.
- 6.5 Casual trading fees were reviewed with the market fees in November 2018. The application fee for registration was increased to take effect from April 2019 but no change was made to the daily pitch charge.
- 6.6 Isolated pitch fees and Exhibition charges were last reviewed in June 2006 when the fees were increased to recover the costs of the Council as well as to recover an accumulative deficit on the street trading account.
- 6.7 A full review of the charges relating to street trading licensing is underway and will be brought to a future Licensing Committee for consideration once the statutory process has been followed.

## **7 Tables & Chairs**

- 7.1 Until 2020, Table & Chairs licences were administered under the 1999 Act. The Council was able to set this fee to recover its costs administering the regime. However, since the introduction of the Business & Planning Act 2020 (“B&PA 2020”) the fee for applying for T&Cs is set by the Legislation.
- 7.2 The B&PA 2020 has been extended to September 2023 to allow the government time to introduce new primary legislation under the Levelling Up & Regeneration Bill which will make permanent the provisions of the B&PA and this fee will be set by the Act.

## **8 Legal implications**

- 8.1 The Council can set its own fees for the regimes as listed above.
- 8.2 All of the licensing regimes (excluding Licensing Act and Gambling Act) are covered by the European Union Services Directive. Regulation 18 of the Provision of Services Regulations 2009 which implements the EU Services Directive into UK law requires that any licensing fees charged in relation to “authorisations” must be reasonable and proportionate to the costs of processing applications. As stated above, the Hemmings case confirmed that when setting licence fees, authorities can recover the costs of processing the application and where applications are successful, the costs of monitoring and enforcing the licensing regime as a whole, provided such costs are charged in two parts (part A and part B). The proposed fees must not be used to make a profit.
- 8.3 If the proposed fee structure results in a surplus or loss for the financial year there will be an appropriate reduction or increase in fees as the case may be for the following financial year.

## **9. Equalities Implications**

- 9.1 The Council must have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:
- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
  - (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
  - (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.
- 9.2 Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

9.3 The Council believes that these proposals do not adversely impact or unlawfully discriminate against any protected characteristics.

## 10. **Financial Implications**

10.1 The licensing fees are set based on the full recovery of the administration, inspection, and enforcement costs of the various licensing regimes. A component for inflation is added to the administration costs to reflect the rising input costs to the Council. The inflation rate used was 10.1%.

10.2 A full review of resource allocation for each licence was undertaken and where necessary reasonable estimates were made. As a result of this review the fees are to increase for 81% of all licences; with 72% of these licences increasing by on average 10.4%.

10.3 It is assumed there will be a negligible financial impact in terms of additional income to the Council because of the fee increases. The reason for this marginal impact is the volume of applications for the licence types included in the 72% have been historically very low.
