1. Applicant submissions

- 1.1 The applicant has been in discussions with the Environmental Health Service and the Police to agree conditions. A full schedule of conditions can be found at **Appendix B**.

2. Relevant representations

- 2.1 The Environmental Health Service has made an adverse representation against this application on the following grounds:
- The additional hours requested to permit the provision of live music will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area.
 - The additional hours requested for Late Night Refreshment will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area.
 - The additional hours requested for the Supply of Alcohol will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area.
- 2.2 On 19 June 2015, the Environmental Health Officer has agreed conditions with the applicant and proposed further conditions to be added to the premises licence, if granted (see **Appendix B**).
- 2.3 The Metropolitan Police Licensing Team has made an adverse representation against this application on the basis that, if granted, the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives. Police have concerns regarding the additional hours sought.
- 2.4 The Police have proposed conditions to be added to the premises licence, if granted (see **Appendix B**).
- 2.5 The Covent Garden Community Association has made an adverse representation against this application, stating the concern that the premises could change its nature without the requirement for a variation. It states that the licence conditions should be modified to include Model Conditions which mean that the premises can only operate as a table service restaurant with alcohol ancillary from 23:00 until close on any night, the physical connection with the Savoy Hotel and the ability of customers to move in both directions must remain open by condition.

3. Policies Applicable

- 3.1 The following policies within the City Of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy apply:

Applications for hours outside the core hours in this policy will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies and with particular regard to the criteria specified.

4. Summary

- 4.1 The Licensing Sub-committee may refuse, grant in full or grant in part this proposal, having taken into account the representations received and Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy. The decision taken should promote the licensing objectives of:
- prevention of public nuisance,
 - prevention of crime & disorder,
 - public safety and
 - protection of children from harm.
- 4.2 Where the committee is minded to grant the licence it will be granted subject to the mandatory conditions and conditions consistent with the operating schedule modified to such extent as

the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives detailed in Appendix B to this report.

5. Current Licensing Position

These premises currently hold a Premises Licence 15/00949/LIPDPS. A full licence history can be found in **Appendix A** and the current licence for Simpsons In The Strand and the Savoy Hotel can be found in the background documents.

6. Residential Density

No units within a 75m radius of the premises are residential or proposed residential or under construction (see **Appendix C**).

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Conditions: On Current Licence -

Mandatory:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactment

Conditions related to the Sale of Alcohol

9. Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, consumed in or taken from the premises except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- (a) On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10:00 to 23:00
- (b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12:00 to 22:30
- (c) On Good Friday, 12:00 to 22:30
- (d) On Christmas Day, 12:00 to 15:00. and 19:00 to 22:30
- (e) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10:00 to 23:00
- (f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 to 22:30

(g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

(ii) Alcohol may be sold or supplied for one hour following the hours set out above and on Christmas day, between 15.00 and 19.00, to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

Monday to Saturday

(iii) (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied until 01:00 in the morning following weekdays to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by that person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal.

(b) The alcohol must be sold or supplied at a time before (i) the provision of entertainment by persons present and performing or (ii) the provision of substantial refreshment, has ended. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

(c) This condition does not authorise any sale or supply to any person admitted to the premises either after midnight or less than half an hour before the entertainment is due to end, except in accordance with condition number 9 (ii) above.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

(a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;

(b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

(c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking table meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;

(d) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;

(e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

(f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;

(g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

(h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;

(i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;

(j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the

consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

10. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:
- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
 - (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
 - (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
 - (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

11. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

12. Notwithstanding condition 9, Annex 1 of this licence, the sale or supply of alcohol is permitted with the service of breakfast only between 07:30 and 10:00. The alcohol is restricted to wines or champagnes (but not other alcoholic beverages) served by waiter or waitress to seated customers and the service of such alcohol to be ancillary to the supply of alcohol.
13. Regulated entertainment, in the form of live music, is permitted but is limited to up to two live musicians/ performers, Monday to Saturday 07:00 to 01:00 and 07:00 to 23:30 on Sundays.

Conditions proposed by the applicant and agreed with Environmental Health and Police:

14. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.

Conditions proposed by the applicant and agreed with Environmental Health:

Conditions that relate to the premises as a whole

15. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
16. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

17. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
18. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after 22.00 hours at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
19. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and business and leave the area quietly.
20. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
21. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
22. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
23. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
24. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
25. No deliveries shall be made to the front of the premises between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
26. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
27. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
28. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
29. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
30. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
31. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
32. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes (other than foyers), entertainment areas or function rooms, shall be non-combustible.

Conditions relating to the Grand Divan- Simpson's Restaurant

33. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant:
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,

(iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
(v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
(vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

34. The number of persons permitted in the Grand Divan- Simpson's Restaurant at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 110 persons and is to be assessed by District Surveyor from the Environmental Health Consultation Team

Conditions proposed by the applicant:

35. The variation of the Premises Licence 15/03287/LIPV to include the extension of regulated hours will have no effect until the two following conditions have been assessed as satisfactory by the Police Licensing Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.
- The premises shall install and maintain a **comprehensive** CCTV system as per the **minimum requirements** of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
 - A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Conditions relating to the Bishop's Room

35. The number of persons permitted in the Bishop's Room at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 100 persons and is to be assessed by District Surveyor from the Environmental Health Consultation Team.

Additional condition proposed by Environmental Health:

36. All licensable activities in the Bishop's Room between the hours of 0100 hours and 0300hours shall only be during a private pre-booked event"

Conditions relating to The West Room &The West Room Ante Bar

37. All licensable activities after Midnight in the West Room &The West room Ante Bar shall only be during a private pre-booked event.
38. The number of persons permitted in the West Room &The West room Ante Bar at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 180 persons and is to be assessed by District Surveyor from the Environmental Health Consultation Team.

Conditions relating to The Knight's Bar

39. The number of persons permitted in the Knight's Bar at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 50 persons and is to be assessed by District Surveyor from the Environmental Health Consultation Team.

Additional condition proposed by Environmental Health:

40. All licensable activities in the Knight's Bar between the hours of 0100 hours and 0300hours shall only be during a private pre-booked event

Conditions relating to The Regency Room

41. All licensable activities after Midnight in the Regency Room shall only be during a private pre-booked event
42. The number of persons permitted in the Regency Room at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 250 persons and is to be assessed by District Surveyor from the Environmental Health Consultation Team.

Conditions proposed by the Police:

43. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
44. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
45. A minimum of 2 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty on the premises between 01.00hrs and 03.30hrs on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights when the premises are trading.
46. A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
47. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

48. The Licence will have no effect until the Police are satisfied that the premises have upgraded the current CCTV system in accordance to the wording of condition 1 shown above.

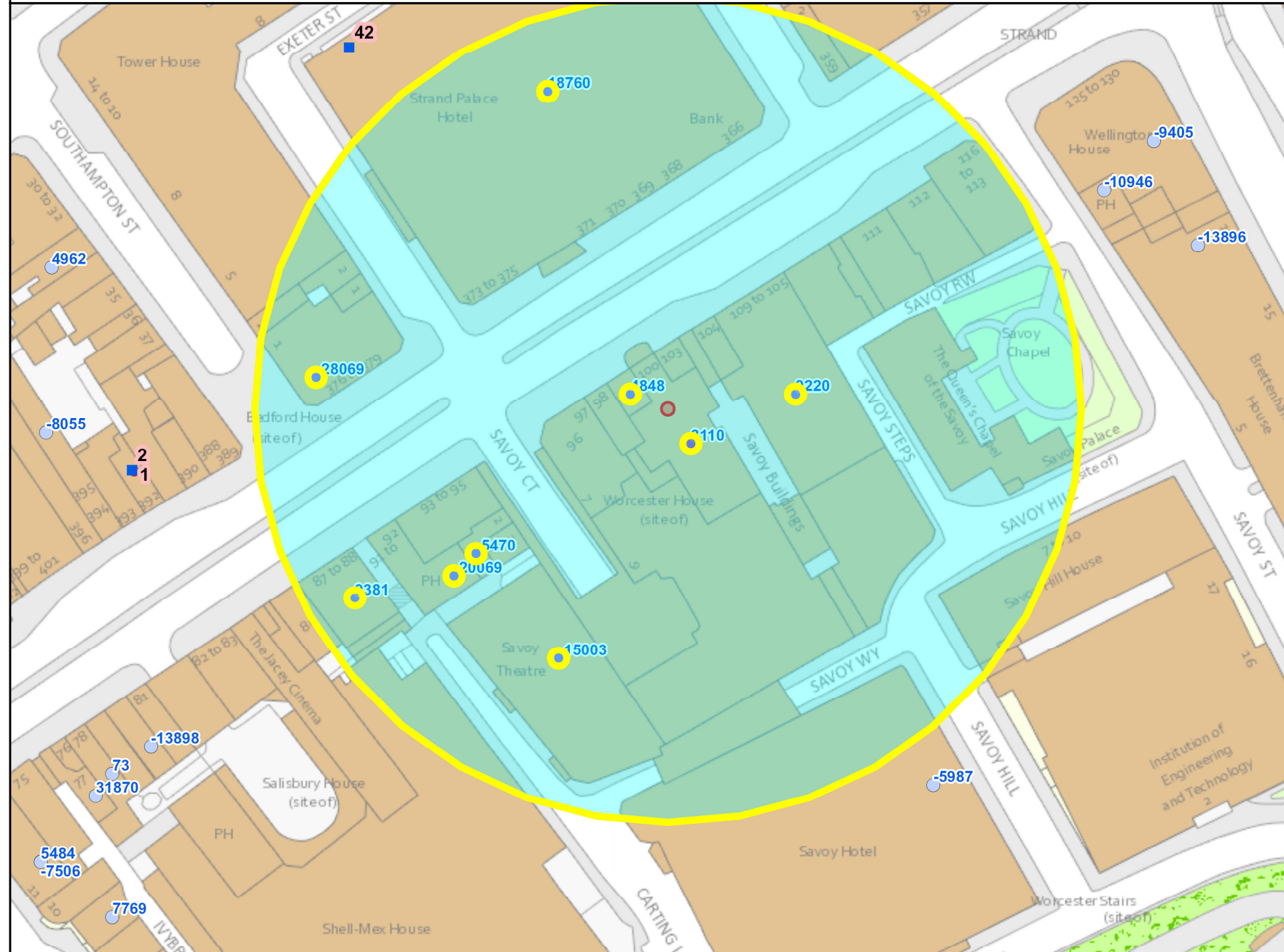

 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premises licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactment

Conditions related to the Sale of Alcohol

 - (g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- (ii) Alcohol may be sold or supplied for one hour following the hours set out above and on Christmas day, between 15.00 and 19.00, to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by such a person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.

Monday to Saturday

- (iii) (a) Alcohol may be sold or supplied until 01:00 in the morning following weekdays to persons taking table meals in the premises in a part of the premises usually set apart for the service of such persons and for consumption by that person in that part of the premises as an ancillary to his meal.

- (b) The alcohol must be sold or supplied at a time before (i) the provision of entertainment by persons present and performing or (ii) the provision of substantial refreshment, has ended. For other purposes or in other parts of the premises the hours set out above shall continue to apply.
- (c) This condition does not authorise any sale or supply to any person admitted to the premises either after midnight or less than half an hour before the entertainment is due to end, except in accordance with condition number 9 (ii) above.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;

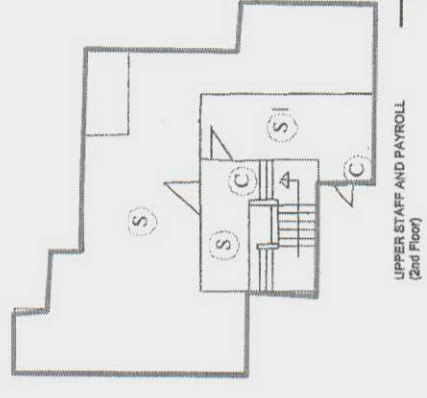
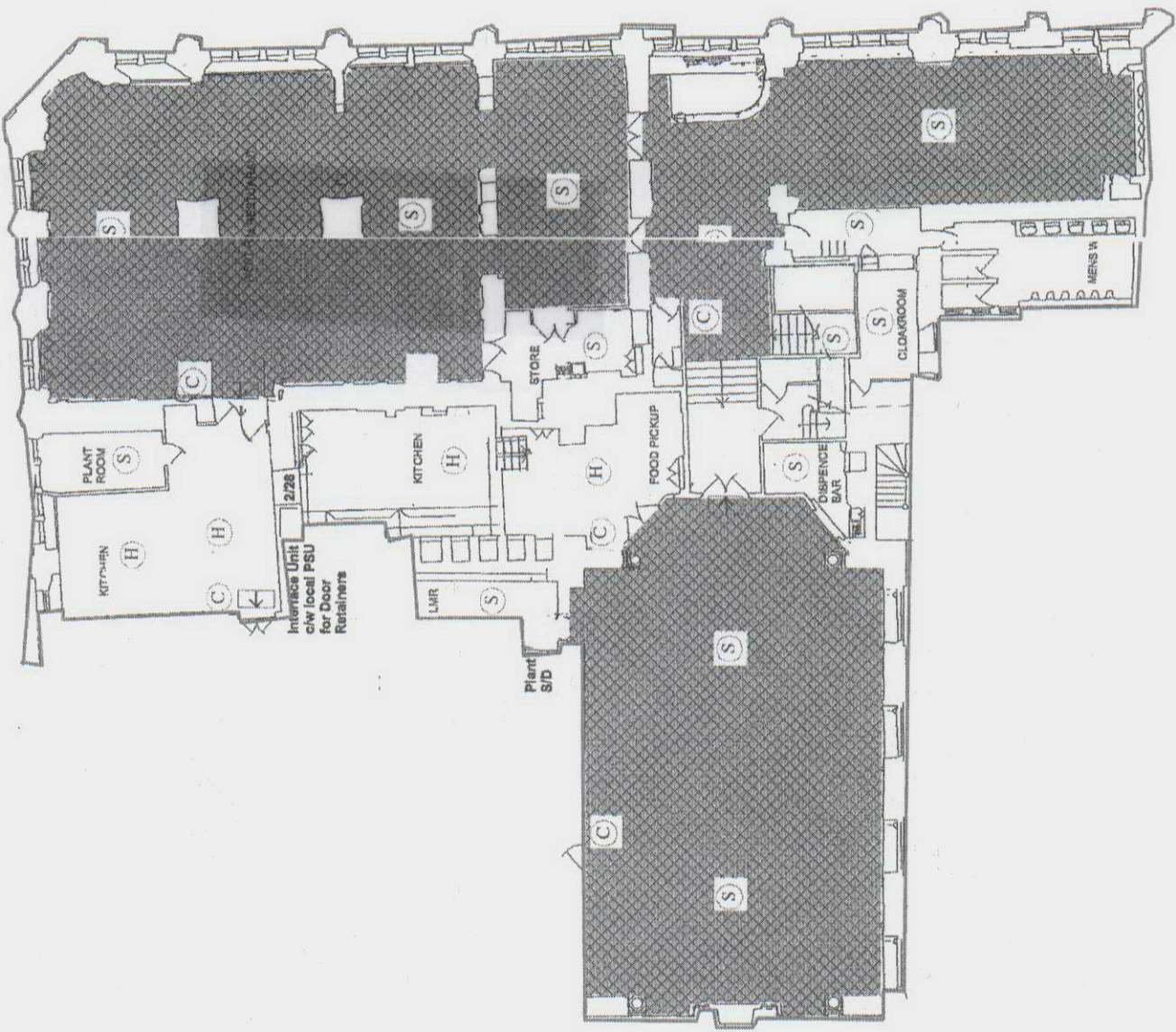

(a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;

(b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

Good to see you yesterday, thank you for arranging and for the tea.

Below are the conditions police require:

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
3. A minimum of 2 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty on the premises between 01.00hrs and 03.30hrs on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights when the premises are trading.
4. A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder

The CGCA understands the desire of the Applicant to share the same times as the Savoy Hotel and agrees that whilst the premises remain part of the hotel it is unlikely to cause a public nuisance. However the fact of being connected to the Hotel and the nature of the premises would need to be fully conditioned within the licence. If they are not then the premises could, in the future, change its nature and a nuisance could arise without any requirement for a variation in the licence. being applied for. This is especially the case because the licence is a converted supper hours certificate from the period before LA2003.

The CGCA's view is that the licence conditions should be modified to include Model Conditions which mean that the premises can only operate as a table service restaurant with alcohol ancillary from 23:00 until close on any night and the physical connection with the Savoy Hotel and the ability of customers to move in both directions must remain open by condition.
