- 3.1 The Leader, with the consent of the Members present, signed the Part I and Part II minutes of the meeting held on 22 February 2016 as a true and correct record of the proceedings.
- 4 SCHOOL ORGANISATION AND INVESTMENT STRATEGY 2016 (SEE REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF CHILDREN'S SERVICES)
- 4.1 Andrew Christie introduced the report. He explained that the report was now required to be presented on an annual basis. The report reflected how the Council would ensure there were sufficient school places in Westminster.
