With reference to the above, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, will be making a representation.

It is our belief that if granted the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives in relation to The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, as there are insufficient conditions contained within the operating schedule.

In order that Police withdraw their representation, the following conditions would have to be agreed to:

- 1) No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises, except for premium beers and ciders supplied in glass bottles.
- 2) No more than **15** % of the sales area shall be used at any one time for the sale, exposure for sale, or display of alcohol.

**Note:** upon the applicant's agreement to the above conditions, the Metropolitan Police have withdrawn their representation.

My objection is primarily based on health and safety concerns. Quite obviously, the proposal does not consider the effect of smoke on the residents in this block.

My apartment is located on the second floor of 72 Pimlico Rd. Bedroom and kitchen windows are facing into a highly wind-protected area above the proposed smoking terrace, as it is the case for a total of nine units in Lumley flats. I fear my respiratory condition will worsen if I am exposed to the smoke rising from the proposed licensed unit. Moreover, the window isolation of this Victorian building block is poor and a smoking terrace would increase the noise levels of the courtyard significantly during the extensive opening hours.

However, I would also like to point out that the proposed venue would change the unique artistic character of Pimlico Road, which is famous for its galleries and decoration shops.

I invite the Licensing Team to visit the property and see for themselves how the construction of the building's backside generates a wind channel that would carry smoke into the residential flats.

This unit has been used for several decades as a very quiet antique shop / art gallery. It has always closed at 6pm and has always been closed on Sundays.

The building directly above is a densely populated social housing block. This Victorian building has very poor sound insulation.

I am concerned that if this application is granted, there will be noise pollution, and vibration in the building. The seven-day opening and the late evenings in the proposal are most unwelcome.

The entire parade of shops at this location are art shops, and I believe this unit should continue to be used in this way.

I believe that the entire Pimlico Road 'Design District' of art shops should be supported, and that no art shop or gallery in this locality should be changed into a late night hot food and alcohol venue.

I am also concerned about the dumping of rubbish on the pavement outside by shops. Some years ago, there was a restaurant across the road, and the pavement was always covered in cooking oils. Sadly, this type of thing is common practice with these types of shop.

I am also concerned that if a licence is granted, there may be a further application to extend opening hours, and to place tables and chairs on the pavement outside. This type of thing is also common among this type of establishment.

For these reasons I oppose the application.

Note: While Mr Winters welcomes the recent changes made by the applicant, there remain two issues that Mr Winters still objects to (extract taken from Mr Winters email dated 12<sup>th</sup> October):

- "1. I do not agree that the open back yard area should be used by customers at any time, because this area is directly underneath ten bedroom windows and the particular architecture of this building will mean that noise will travel both upwards and also into the courtyard beyond, where there are adjacent bedrooms. This area is best suited for use as storage and emergency exit.
- 2. I believe that the premises should close at 9pm seven days a week. This is due to the sheer density of housing units above, and the poor soundproofing in this old building.

I would no longer object to the licence if the above two conditions are included with the concessions already made, and I believe that this commercial venture would still be entirely viable and profitable even if these two additional restrictions are imposed.

I would still like Cllr Gassanly to attend the meeting on my behalf and to represent me."





**Pre application advice purpose:** To comment on appropriate conditions including capacities for a new premises licence. The proposed operator will operate an Italian Café/Bar. Advise on technical suitability and policy implications in advance of the appropriate application. The premises are currently empty and consist of ground and basement floors with a small internal courtyard.

Issues discussed and actions taken:

Inspection carried out by Ian Watson (Environmental Health – EH) and Alan Lynagh (District Surveyor – DS) of the ground and basement floor on the 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2016. The findings are detailed below.

#### **District Surveyor Comments**

The premises consist of a single entrance/exit at ground floor level, which opens inwards and appears to be approximately 750mm wide. This limits the overall premises to 60 patrons. The basement is proposed to be used for a minimal number approx 15-20 and this is deemed adequate given the travel distances and overall size of the premises even through the basement does not have a protected exit route (accommodation stair back to ground floor).



I addition we would recommend the following additional measures should form part of the proposed design:

- The access arrangements to the proposed wine cellar location at basement level needs to be suitably designed so that it does not present a risk of trips and falls to staff accessing this location, particularly as some may be carrying stock. We can provide more advise as required but suggest a suitable controlled stepped access is provided.
- Means of escape from the premises will be based on a simultaneous evacuation upon activation of the fire detection and alarm system and it is recommended an automatic system is provided throughout with ideally an L2 system coverage.
- All risk areas to be provided with 30 minutes fire separation to other parts of the premises
- All Fire doors protecting escape routes will be provided with intumescent strips and smoke seals and all fire doors will comply with the relevant provisions of Table B1 of ADB.
- Every escape route (other than those in ordinary use) will be marked by emergency exit signs complying with BS 5499: Part 1 and these will be located in accordance with the recommendations of BS 5499: Part 4

If the alterations are carried out In line with the principles detailed above this would be adequate from a technical perspective.

## Public Safety/Nuisance and Capacity

The proposed toilet provision is two WC's for both the public and staff located on the ground floor.

An agreed capacity of 60 persons (including staff) on the premises with a restricted occupancy within the basement.

The premises have substantial residential properties directly above and it may be that recorded music is not applied for due to the sensitive nature of the properties and fear that there may be associated noise nuisance. It is also recommended to limit the use of the internal courtyard by persons and times of use.

#### Licensing Policy:

The premises are not located within any recognised impact areas therefore subject to conditions addressing the licensing objectives applications will generally be granted.

The proposed toilet provision whilst not in line with BS 6465 2006 part 2 should not impact on Public Nuisance but the capacity would be inclusive of staff due to no separate facilities being provided.

As the premises are not located within any recognised impact area then the proposed hours of operation are;

Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off' Monday to Thursday 10.00 – 23.30 hours. Friday and Saturday 10.00 - 00.00 hours. Sunday 12.00 – 22.30 hours.

Late Night Refreshment 'Indoors' and 'Outdoors' Monday to Thursday 23.00 – 23.30 hours. Friday and Saturday 23.00 – 00.00 hours.

Recorded Music 'Indoors' Monday to Thursday 10.00 – 23.30 hours. Friday and Saturday 10.00 – 00.00 hours. Sunday 12.00 – 22.30 hours.

Licensable activities can be provided from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

Sunday before a Bank Holiday Monday 10.00 – 00.00 hours (Midnight) (Alcohol) 23.00 – 00.00 hours (LNR) and 12.00 – 00.00 hours (RM).

#### Licensing Position:

It is proposed that a new application be submitted with conditions to address the four licensing objectives to minimise the impact of the operation on the area.

To address the licensing objective of Public Safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm the following model conditions are proposed.

#### Proposed conditions.

- The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only to persons seated.
- Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- The maximum number of persons permitted on the premises at any one time (including staff) shall not exceed

Ground Floor xx persons.

Basement xx persons

With no more than 60 persons at any one time.

A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only
acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a
driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

- There shall be no primary cooking at the premises.
- Alcohol consumed outside the premises building shall only be consumed by patrons seated at tables.
- No activity shall be carried out within the internal courtyard after 22.00 hours.
- No smoking shall be permitted within the internal courtyard at any time.
- The doors into the internal courtyard shall be locked closed after 22.00 hours.
- There shall be no sales of hot food or drink for consumption off the premises after 23.00
- hours.
- There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption 'Off' the premises after 23.00 hours.
- Off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers only and for consumption off the premises.
- All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 23.00 hours each day.
- The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premise is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
- Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.

- The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans
- The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- · No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23.00 and 08.00 hours.
- An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - (d) any incidents of disorder
  - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
  - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 hours.
- The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the
- Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

#### Conclusions

It is advised that the provision of recorded music is not applied for due to the residential properties above and that the use of the internal courtyard is carefully managed as it could be an area of contention especially the later hours. The conditions proposed are in line with model conditions and suitably address the licensing objectives. Conditions have also been proposed to address Prevention of Crime and Disorder in line with police concerns. Due to the level of residential accommodation within the vicinity it is likely that representations will be made by residents. The works condition will allow the responsible authorities comfort in assessing the premises on completion.

As part of the application process it is advised that the other responsible authorities will also need to assess the proposals and may wish to make additional comments.

Please note that any advice given will not guarantee that your application will be granted by the Licensing Service and the Environmental Health Consultation Team may still choose to make a representation to the application submitted.

## CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

#### Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the

permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.



- 29. The Licence will have no effect until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team and this condition has been removed from the Licence.
- 30. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental

#### Conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the Police

- 31. No super-strength beer, lagers, ciders or spirit mixtures of 5.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises, except for premium beers and ciders supplied in glass bottles.
- 32. No more than **15** % of the sales area shall be used at any one time for the sale, exposure for sale, or display of alcohol.
