As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011 the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety

The application is for a bar in the cumulative impact area and as such the Westminster City Council Policy is to refuse new applications(PB2). The application states that the premises will have a capacity of 100 people who are not limited to guests of the proposed hotel, so the premises will operate as a public bar. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas for pubs and bars premises offering facilities for music and dancing, other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1.

The hours sought currently exceed the core hours policy for licensable activities and times the public can be on the premises (HRS1) In the application there is no reason has been given to as to why the application should be granted contrary to the Westminster City Council Policy.

We accept a number of conditions have been proposed, but do not feel they address the cumulative impact of 100 additional persons who will be at the premises primarily to drink.

The premises are located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area as stated in the City of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy.

The applicant has submitted floor plans of the premises dated March 2017.

This representation is based on the plans and operating schedule submitted.

The applicant is seeking the following

- 1. To provide for the Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off' the premises Monday to Saturday between 10.00 and 00.00 hours and Sunday between 10.00 to 23.30 hours. Bank Holiday Sunday 23.00 to 00.30 hours.
- 2. To provide Late Night Refreshment 'Indoors' and 'Outdoors' Monday to Saturday between 23.00 and 00.30 hours and Sunday between 23.00 to 00.00 hours. Bank Holiday Sunday 23.00 to 00.30 hours.
- 3. To provide regulated entertainment 'indoors' comprising
 - Recorded Music
 - Films

Monday to Saturday between 09.00 and 00.30 hours and Sunday between 09.00 to 00.00 hours. Bank Holiday Sunday 09.00 to 00.30 hours.

4. On New Year's Eve to provide regulated entertainment, late night refreshment and Supply of Alcohol from the end of authorised hours to commencement of authorised hours on New Year's Day.

I wish to make the following representation

- 1. The hours requested for the Supply of Alcohol will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the West End Cumulative Impact Area.
- 2. The hours requested to permit the provision of late night refreshment will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the West End Cumulative Impact Area.
- 3. The hours requested to permit the provision of regulated entertainment will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the West End Cumulative Impact Area.
- 4. The hours requested to permit regulated entertainment, late night refreshment and supply of alcohol on New Year's Eve will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the West End Cumulative Impact Area.

The applicant has provided additional information with the application which is being addressed.

(b) The hours of serving of alcohol to the general public will be subject to conditions limiting the sale of alcohol after a specified time to those attending pre-booked events held at the hotel, (c) The exhibition of film, in the form of recordings or non-broadcast television programmes to be viewed in hotel bedrooms, will generally be permitted.

(ii) Applications for other licensable activities in the Cumulative Impact Areas will be subject to other policies, and must demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact in the Cumulative Impact Areas. 				



Applicant Supporting Documents

Bar, Ground Floor Strand Palace Hotel, 372 Strand, London, WC2R OJJ

- 1. A minimum of 80 seats shall be provided within the premises at all times.
- 2. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 3. The number of persons accommodated at any one time, (excluding staff) shall not exceed:
 - Bar- 100 persons.
- 4. There shall be no sales of hot food or hot drink for consumption off the premises after 23.00 hours.
- 5. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after 23.00 hours.
- 6. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
- 7. The entrance door shall be kept closed after 22.00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
- 8. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
- 9. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 10. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence.
- 11. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 12. All sales of alcohol for consumption 'Off' the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 13. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person

entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

- 14. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 16. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 17. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 18. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 19. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 20. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 21. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
- 22. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected

- and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 23. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 24. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 25. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the Licensing Authority.
- 26. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.





Summary

Joe Allen opened in Covent Garden in 1977 and was considered to be the first authentic American restaurant in London. It has continued to trade successfully throughout the ast 39 years and has become one of Covent Garden's iconic restaurants. In 2012 it was acquired by a team of influential and successful UK restaurateurs including Stephen Gee, a founder/shareholder of Carluccio's, Iberica, Gaucho and Busaba Eathai. As well as Andy Bassedone, founder of Strada, Cote Brasserie and Bills, CEO of Signature Restaurants to include Ivy, Caprice and J. Sheeky (1998-2005), shareholder of Ivy Collection brand (present day) The site Joe Allen currently occupies is to be developed by CapCo into a hotel. The all day American bar and dining experience combining the Joe Allen heritage with a Strand Palace Hotel site would be the ideal location to create the ultimate 7 days a week contemporary take on an authentic American restaurant.

OE ALLEN – A POTTED HISTORY

New York restaurateur Joe Allen and business partner Richard Polo opened Joe Allen in London in 1977 with the intention of eliciting the discreet feel of PJ Clarke's in New York where Allen used to work.

The menu was similar to Joe Allen in New York: unashamedly American. Two articles in the Evening Standard, which included an obliging review from Fay Maschler, plus a piece in The New York Times helped to build buzz and it quickly became the go-to place for American stars visiting the capital.

The waiters were wannabe actors, producers and directors and the cast and crew of the West End's best theatrical productions would use it as their own canteen.

Joe Allen rapidly became the place to hang out, packed with every film, television, fashion, rock and stage celebrity. Over the years, diners have included Princess Diana, Laurence Olivier, Kenneth Williams, Elizabeth Taylor, Joan Collins, Tony Curtis, Susan Sarandon, Al Pacino, Ava Gardner, Ingrid Bergman and Rock Hudson.

Tim Healy's late actor father David Healy, who had roles in many West End productions including *Follies* and *ShowBoat*, was a regular. To this day, a picture of David Healy and Bob Hoskins, who appeared together in the stage show *Guys and Dolls*, adorns the wall.

 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.


- 10. A minimum of 80 seats shall be provided within the premises at all times.
- 11. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

 - Bar- 100 persons.

- 20. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 21. All sales of alcohol for consumption 'Off' the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises.
- 22. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be

- made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 23. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 24. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 25. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- 26. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 27. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 28. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 29. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 30. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency safety signs or emergency equipment.
- 31. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 32. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

- 33. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 08.00 hours on the following day.
- 34. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises have been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the Licensing Authority.
- 35. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

- The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified.
- All exit doors from public areas shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 20. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including the gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be kept clean and free from litter at all material times to the satisfaction of the Council.
- 21. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features including materials used in finishing and furnishing shall be either non-combustible or be durably or inherently flameretarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes, other than foyers, entertainment areas or function rooms, should be non-combustible.
- All scenery should be maintained flame retardant to the satisfaction of the Environmental Health consultation team.
- The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.

- 24. The following Certificates shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request:
 - Any emergency lighting or battery system
 - Any electrical installation
 - Any emergency warning system
- 25. In the basement function rooms (currently known as Exeter Suite, Drake and Essex Room) any sale of alcohol between 23.30 and 01.00 Monday to Thursday, 00.00 and 01.00 Friday and Saturday and 22.30 and 00.30 on Sundays shall be ancillary to the provision of substantial refreshment and musical or other entertainment (except for sales to hotel residents and their bona fide guests which are permitted without restriction).
- The hours for sale of alcohol may be extended from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.
