I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises.

The applicant has submitted plans of the premises showing the lower ground floor and the ground floor, drawing no. ref. 1893_LP_000 and 1893_LP_001, respectively and dated 10 April 2018.

The following licensable activities are being sought:

1. To provide for the Supply of Alcohol 'On' and 'Off' the premises between 10:00 and 22:30 Monday to Saturday and 10:00 and 22:00 Sunday
2. Provision of Late Night Refreshment 'Indoors' 23:00 and 00:00 Monday to Saturday
3. Provision of Recorded Music 'Indoors' 07:00 and 23:30 Monday to Friday and 08:00 and 00:00 Saturday and 08:00 to 22:30 Sunday.

I wish to make the following representations based on the plans submitted and the supporting operating schedule:

1. The hours requested for and the Supply of Alcohol may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the Area
2. The hours requested for and the Provision of Late Night Refreshment may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the Area
3. The hours requested for and the Provision of Recorded Music may lead to an increase in Public Nuisance in the Area

Environmental Health also makes the following further comments:

- An extensive list of conditions have been offered in the operating schedule and these are being considered as to whether they are sufficient to allay Environmental Health concerns
- Clarification is requested on the proposed external seating area – ie is it on a private forecourt or on the public highway - as this will determine the appropriate licence for the use of this area.
- Clarification is also requested on the proposed capacity as the conditions and plans appear to differ markedly. It is unclear if the premises have already undergone refurbishment for the proposed use. In any case the premises will need to be assessed for Public Safety on completion and an appropriate safe capacity restriction determined based on the District Surveyor's Technical Guidance on Places of Entertainment.

- In addition the provision of sanitary accommodation for any proposed capacity is recommended to be in line with the minimum standards as provided in British Standard 6465
- The premises will also need to be assessed for its food preparation/cooking facilities in order to evaluate whether Public Nuisance may arise from odour and/or noise from the operation of any plant and machinery.

<p>My objection to this new premises licence application is because of the noise that will be created, primarily at night, by those departing the restaurant. My flat is just [REDACTED] from the proposed restaurant and the noise will be invasive. New Quebec St has a number of restaurants with seating on the pavement and The Grazing Goat is an example of the unacceptable noise level that would emanate from yet another restaurant in this short street.</p> <p>Residents will not want another noisy restaurant with tables on the street and I therefore object to this licence being issued.</p>

These are new premises to be leased by the applicant ("Margaux") from the Portman Estate, comprising the ground floor and basement (as set out on the attached plan) on New Quebec Street, in the Portman Village, Marylebone.

The Margaux Group's new restaurant, "Picpoul" will be a high class, seafood inspired all-day brasserie and oyster bar, serving breakfast, lunch and dinner. The number of covers indoors is 93, and the table layout is as shown on the plan.

The bar will be positioned as shown on the plan to the front of the premises, and will be used for the preparation of hot and cold drinks, and the retail sale of bottles of wine, croissants and hot drinks for takeaway. Also, there will be a large oyster display and a chef behind the bar preparing cold starters (no cooking will be involved in this area, just prepping raw fish, salads and desserts). There will be no table service in the front area of the premises shown shaded blue on the ground floor plan, but it is envisaged that customers will be able to consume drinks whilst they wait to be seated.

In addition, it is proposed to have outdoor seating for 16 covers at the front of the premises (subject to the necessary planning application).

The kitchen, main food prep and alcohol storage will be to the rear of the basement floor. By way of background, this will be the Margaux Group's third restaurant. It has been running Margaux, a high class French Restaurant and bar on Old Brompton Road, South Kensington since 2013. It opened its second premises, Bandol (an elegant restaurant, showcasing the flavours and style of the South of France), in Chelsea, in 2015.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

9. The supply of alcohol at the premises in the restaurant area shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
10. Notwithstanding condition [1], alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to their meal in the seating at the bar area designated on the plan, by up to a maximum at any one time, of 16 persons dining at the premises.
11. The premises may remain open for the sale of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment from the terminal hour for those activities on New Year's Eve through to the commencement time for those activities on New Year's Day.
12. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.

Condition 12 has also been requested by the Police

13. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Condition 13 has also been requested by the Police

14. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
15. Prominent signage indicating the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol shall be displayed so as to be visible before entering the premises, where alcohol is on public display, and at the point of sale.
16. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (including staff) shall not exceed 150 persons.

Proposed amendment of condition 16 by Environmental Health:

The number of persons permitted at the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 100 persons with a local restriction of:

- 30 in the basement
- 16 seated in the external area

17. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
18. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 22.30 each day.
19. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be

swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

20. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

Conditions proposed by the Police and agreed by the applicant to form part of the operating schedule

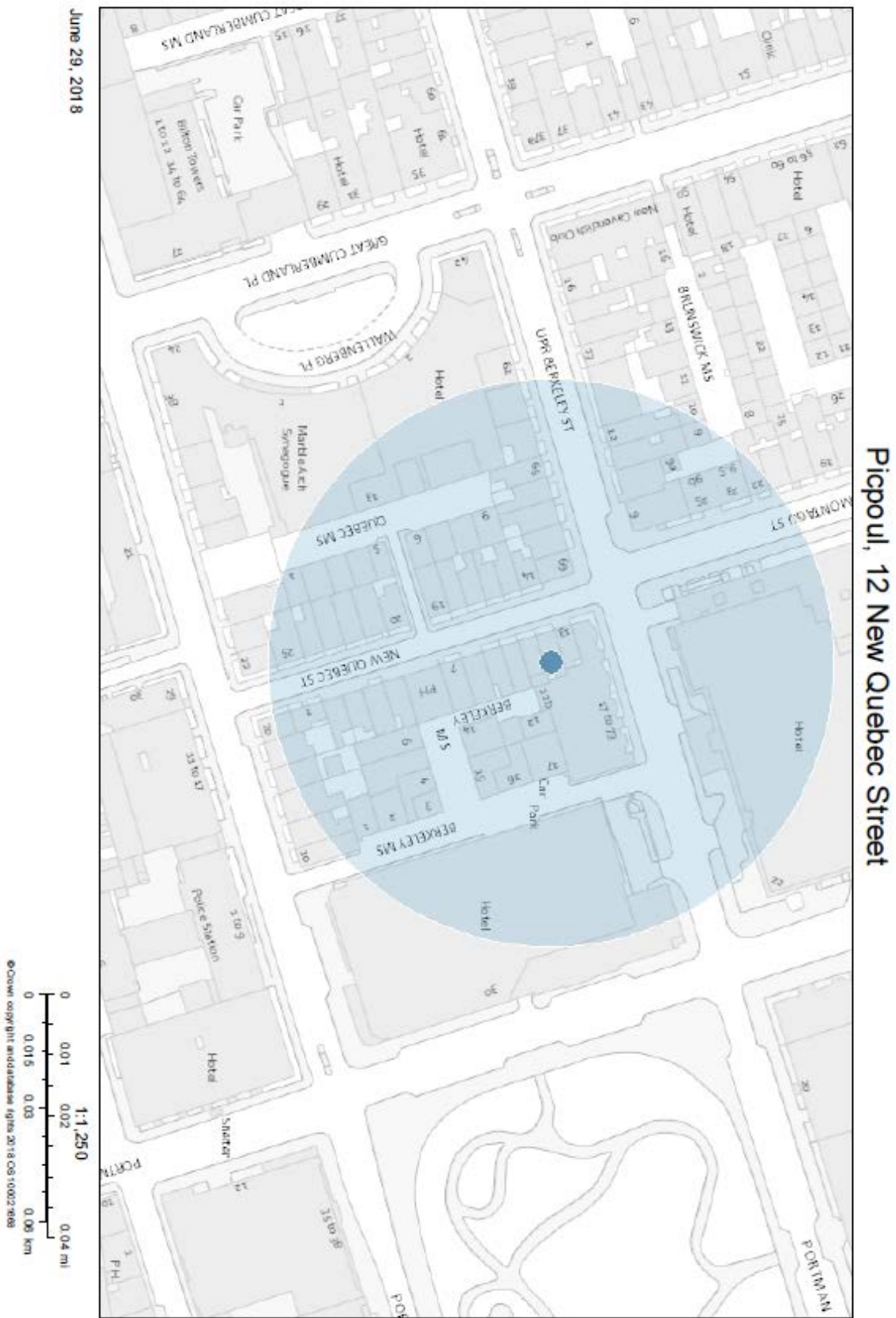
21. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant;
- (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 22.30 Monday-Saturday and 22.00hrs on Sundays, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

22. Notwithstanding condition 3, alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to their meal in the seating at the bar area designated on the plan, by up to a maximum at any one time, of 16 persons dining at the premises.
23. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 22.30hrs each day.
24. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
25. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
26. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
27. Save for customers who are seated within the outside area, patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
28. There shall be no self-service of alcohol.

Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health

29. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
30. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
31. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
32. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours on the following day or as specified on the Council's website for Commercial Waste collection times for the street.
33. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 08.00 on the following day.
34. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises is open. This telephone number is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
35. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Premises Licence by the Licensing Authority. If there are minor changes to the layout during the course of construction new plans shall be submitted when requesting removal of this condition.
