The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact area and as such, policy points CIP1 and PB2 must be considered.

The application as it stands does not restrict the operation of the premises as a restaurant therefore will be considered within policy PB2. Please note it is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1.

However paragraph 2.5.23 of the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy 2016, states "the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of variations or new licences for pubs and bars in the cumulative impact area should be limited to exceptional circumstances". Therefore it is for the applicant to demonstrate that this application can be regarded as an exception to policy.

We note that the applicant proposes to surrender an existing premises licence if this application is granted.

Furthermore the applicant must also demonstrate that the operation of the premises will not add to cumulative impact in the Cumulative Impact Area. Currently no additional information has been received which addresses this policy concern, and the Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to provide further submissions as to how the premises will not add to cumulative impact within the West End cumulative impact area.

Further discussions will be held with the applicant prior to the hearing and any further submissions will be forwarded on for Members information.

I wish to make Representations on the following grounds:

Representation is made in relation to the application, as the proposals are likely to increase the risk of Public Nuisance and may impact upon Public Safety. The applicant has not included sufficient Conditions in the Operating Schedule to show how the Licensing Objectives will be promoted. The premises is located in the West End Cumulative Impact Area and the application will need to be adjudicated at a Hearing of the Licensing Sub Committee in relation to the City Council's Licensing Policy.

Proposed conditions from Environmental Health to the Applicant dated 21 March 2019:

As discussed, I note that you have proposed some Conditions as part of the Operating Schedule, to which I have no objection.

In addition I make the following comments and propose some additional conditions:

1. The proposed capacity conditions for the Mezzanine and the premises generally are subject to a final clearance inspection following works to adapt and fit out the premises. Perhaps the exact figures can be left to be determined at final inspection by EH? **Agreed**
2. Is the application for 'Off' Sales to cover the external area, as referred to in my Pre-App Report? In which case I propose that this is reflected in a suitable condition such as MC70 or Mc70a, noting of course that alcohol need not be ancillary to a meal. – **Agreed although the new external area on the "corner" of the outside will apparently be reserved for diners.**

3. MC56 **There shall be no sales of hot food or hot drink for consumption off the premises after 23.00** **Agreed**
4. MC47 **A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram. - Agreed**
5. MC81 – the 'works' Condition. - **Agreed**
6. MC19 **All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by (23.00) each day. Agreed and already conditioned by the tables and chairs licence**
7. You may wish to consider a condition which limits or prohibits 'vertical drinking' in the GF and/or external area. – **Can't offer this. They definitely want a certain amount of vertical drinking inside on the GF and also in the small external area which currently exists. I can probably limit it by numbers although in practice I think this is difficult for management to supervise/police.**

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

9. The supply of alcohol on the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
10. The supply of alcohol on the premises shall be by waiter or waitress service only.
11. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
12. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after 23.00.
13. There shall be no take away of hot food or hot drink after 23:00 hours.
14. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only.
15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
16. A staff member from the Premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the Premises at all times when the Premises is open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
17. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
18. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
19. Except for the external seating area, patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
20. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
21. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises and that this area shall be swept and or washed and litter and sweeping collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
22. There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a sexual entertainment Venue Licence.

23. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 135 persons.
24. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
25. Deliveries and waste collections shall only take place in the underground service area.
26. All external tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable after 23:00 hours daily.
27. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
28. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
29. All emergency exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
30. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
31. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
32. There shall be no regulated entertainment in the external area.
33. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed when there is regulated entertainment after 23:00 hours, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.

23. The number of persons permitted in the premises at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed 135 persons.

At the site meeting with representatives from The Crown it soon became apparent that what would be desired by the Crown for a potential operator in terms of alcohol sales and consumption would not be capable of complying with the City Council's Licensing Policy. This is because the premises is located within the West End CIA.

A number of options were discussed, including reduction of hours, change to more of a mixed-use premises along the lines described in 2.4.17 – 2.4.22 of the Policy. However, it was felt by the Crown that this would not achieve what they wanted in business terms.

EH advice is that the applicant needs to show either (i) what is sought is a genuine exception to Policy and (ii) what is sought would not add to Cumulative Impact. This would be difficult where a Restaurant operation is varied to allow consumption of alcohol without being ancillary to food, especially in light of paragraph 2.5.3 of the Policy.

An alternative consideration would be to identify a premises located in the West End CIA with a Premises Licence which would allow greater flexibility for the Sale and consumption of alcohol with a view to surrendering that Licence and relocating those licensable activities at Norris Street. The idea of such a move would be that there is no net adverse effect in the CIA. The advantage to the City Council would be that the location of the more flexible Licence would be accompanied by a number of additional and more up to date Conditions which would allow better regulation.

A very nearby premises belonging to The Crown seems to have an older style Public House Licence has 'On' Sales of alcohol with very few Licence Conditions and no restriction on capacity. The recent references are:

17/05308/LIPCH – 69-71 Haymarket

17/13796/LI178 – a notification of interest under s.178 by The Crown

The premises appears to be located in the CIA.

The Crown or the prospective operator could apply for a New Licence for the Norris Street premises to match the permitted activities and hours (or possibly 'Core Hours') of 17/05308/LIPCH.

EH COMMENTS & ADVICE:

In Pre-App Advice 18/09280/PREAPM the Crown was advised to identify a premises located in the West End CIA with a Premises Licence which would allow greater flexibility for the Sale and consumption of alcohol with a view to surrendering that Licence and relocating those licensable activities to 1 Norris Street. The idea of such a move would be that there is no net adverse impact in the West End CIA.

The advantage to the City Council would be that the relocation of the more flexible Licence to Norris Street would be accompanied by a number of additional and more up to date Conditions which would allow better regulation and an opportunity to set capacities for both Licensed Premises. There are no residents in the immediate vicinity of the Norris Street premises who might be adversely affected by such an application.

A very nearby premises belonging to The Crown (17/05308/LIPCH – 69-71 Haymarket) has an older style 'Converted' Public House Licence with:

- 'On' Sales of alcohol
- Very few Licence Conditions and
- No restriction on capacity.
- The premises is across two floors

EH advice is that the Crown applies for a New Licence for the Sale of Alcohol at 1 Norris Street for no greater than the 'Core Hours'. The Sale of Alcohol would include 'Off' Sales so as to include patrons who are using the outside seating area as shown on the plans.

In effect, the more up to date 0100hrs restaurant with model conditions at Norris Street would change places with the older converted pub licence in the Haymarket and a capacity, model conditions and 'Core Hours' would be imposed on the older Licence.

There will be an application for a new Licence for the Haymarket premises for a Restaurant operation (i.e. MC66/MC38). The capacity of the Haymarket premises will be assessed by EH accordingly.

The applicant has submitted Drawings for the BMT, GF, and Mezz Floors (Ref 15132-ID-105) for a proposed restaurant/bar style operation. I have assessed the drawings and note that the following Sanitary Provision is shown:

GF: 1 DDA WC

BMT: 3 WCs for Female Customers; 1 WC + 2 Urinals for Male Customers

MEZZ: 1 Staff WC

This would support a capacity of 180 patrons. An additional Female Customer WC (i.e. 4 WCs + the DDA WC) would support 240 patrons.

4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or

less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

18. A Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
19. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the licensing authority.


