(v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00 (22.30hrs on Sundays), and

<p>With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, make a representation against the application.</p> <p>The venue is located in the Queensway / Bayswater cumulative impact area, a locality where there is traditionally high crime and disorder. It is our belief that if granted this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area as there are insufficient conditions within the operating schedule.</p> <p>We would want to see the following additional condition added to the licence:</p> <p>A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the point of delivery where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.</p> <p>If this condition can be agreed Police may then be able to withdraw their objection.</p> <p><b>Correspondence received from the applicant accepting the condition so as to form part of the operating schedule received on 29 May 2019:</b></p> <p>I can confirm that your proposed condition " A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the point of delivery where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram" is agreed by the applicant.</p>

<p>I refer to the application to vary the Premises Licence number for the above mentioned premises located within the Bayswater Cumulative Impact Area. I have considered the information that you have provided within and accompanying this application. I have also considered the proposed licensable activities in line with the relevant policies within the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy dated January 2016.</p> <p>The applicant is seeking following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To be permitted to supply alcohol for consumption "Off" the premises.</li> <li>2. Amend condition 22 of premise licence ref 18/09735/LIPT which currently reads: The premises shall only operate as a restaurant</li> </ol> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) in which customers are shown to their table,</li> <li>(ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,</li> <li>(iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,</li> <li>(iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,</li> <li>(v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00 (22.30hrs on Sundays), and</li> <li>(vi) where alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and</li> </ul>	

provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

**So that it reads:**

The premises shall only operate as a restaurant

(i) in which customers are shown to their table,

(ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only, with alcohol for consumption off the premises (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,

(v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and

(vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals or for alcohol delivered.

**Following consideration of the application and how it may affect the Licensing Objectives and meeting the requirements of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy I wish to make the following representations:**

1. The hours requested to supply alcohol for consumption off the premises would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may affect Public Safety within the Bayswater Cumulative Impact Area

2. The proposed changes to condition 22 would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and may affect Public Safety within the Bayswater Cumulative Impact Area

The condition proposed to replace 22 refers separately to alcohol delivery ancillary to a "food order" and "substantial food". This may be confusing and will be discussed further to ensure consistency.

It is my view that, as presented, the application does not fully address the concerns of Environmental Health. Additional conditions may be proposed.

The applicant is asked to contact the undersigned to discuss the proposed changes and its wider implication on the licensing objectives of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks the following variations:

- Permit off sales of alcohol to facilitate the delivery of alcohol ancillary to food.  
Monday to Saturday 11:00 to 23:00  
Sunday 11:00 to 22:30

- Amend condition 22 under Annex 2 to read as follows;  
22. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant  
(i) in which customers attending the premises in person are shown to their table,  
(ii) where the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises is by waiter or waitress service only, with alcohol for consumption off the premises to be by delivery only and ancillary to food order.  
(iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,  
(iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,  
(v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23:00 (22:30hrs on Sundays), and  
(vi) where alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals, or for alcohol delivered ancillary to the purchase of substantial food.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

The premises is located within the Bayswater Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and RNT2.

The Licensing Authority note that the application is within core hours and the premises is a restaurant and wishes to amend the condition 22 on the current operating schedule as above.

The Licensing Authority notes that the off-sale function will be for delivery service only and conditioned as such ancillary to a food order. In order that the licensing authority can determine any impact to the Cumulative Impact area the applicant is encouraged to submit further submissions regarding the operation of the off sales and what constitutes as a substantial food order. The Licensing Authority also notes that there is currently discussion with Environmental Health and Police with proposed conditions, The Licensing Authority would also seek model conditions to read as follows;

1. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises

2. There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after 23.00 hours

Also in support of the Westminster's approach to become a greener city the Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to use less invasive mode of transport for delivery service for example a bicycle to reduce impact and noise to the area.

The applicant will also have to provide submissions as to how the operation of the proposed delivery service with 'Off Sales' will not add to cumulative impact in the Bayswater cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy RNT2.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving further submissions from the applicant in due course.

**Further correspondence between the applicant and the Licensing Authority received on the 14 June 2019:**

I have been asked to respond to you on behalf of the applicant in respect of your email below dated 12 June 2019.

Comments below in red;

The Licensing Authority notes that the off-sale function will be for delivery service only and conditioned as such ancillary to a food order. In order that the licensing authority can determine any impact to the Cumulative Impact area the applicant is encouraged to submit further submissions regarding the operation of the off sales and what constitutes as a substantial food order. The Licensing Authority also notes that there is currently discussion with Environmental Health and Police with proposed conditions, The Licensing Authority would also seek model conditions to read as follows;

All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises

There shall be no sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises after 23.00 hours

**The above conditions are agreed**

Also in support of the Westminster's approach to become a greener city the Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to use less invasive mode of transport for delivery service for example a bicycle to reduce impact and noise to the area.

**The applicant has entered into an agreement with Deliveroo to deliver and they operate "green" deliveries that wherever operationally possible and the delivery distance isn't too far, Deliveroo will send pedal bikes as opposed to motor bikes/scooters. Where delivery is not on pedal bike, then Deliveroo will use scooter type vehicles which have lower emissions.**

The applicant will also have to provide submissions as to how the operation of the proposed delivery service with 'Off Sales' will not add to cumulative impact in the Bayswater cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy RNT2.

**The applicant will not add to Cumulative Impact as the premises is not seeking to extend what is currently permitted for on the premises and that the variation applies to a delivery service only. The applicant has offered as part of the condition that " alcohol for consumption off the premises to be by delivery only and ancillary to food order" and also "alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals, or for alcohol delivered ancillary to the purchase of substantial food". Therefore additional customers will not be attracted to the premises to take away food or drink in person and will not add to the Cumulative Impact.**

- (iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.


