I refer to the application for a new Premises Licence for the above premises.

The premises are situated in the West End Cumulative Impact Area as stated in City of Westminster's Statement of Licensing Policy.

This representation is based on the Operating Schedule and the submitted plans, for the ground floor and basement. The drawing number and date is illegible.

The applicant is seeking the following on the **ground floor and basement**:

- 1. To allow the Supply of Alcohol 'on' the premises Monday to Sunday 12:00-23:30 hours.
- 2. To allow the provision of recorded music indoors Monday to Sunday 12:00-23:30 hours.

I wish to make the following representation in relation to the above application:

- 1. The provision of the Supply of Alcohol may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area, it may also impact on Public Safety.
- 2. The provision of recorded music may cause an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area.

The applicant has proposed conditions within the Operating Schedule which are being considered. Further conditions may be proposed by Environmental Health in order to help prevent Public Nuisance and protect Public Safety.

The granting of the new Premises Licence as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance in the cumulative impact area and may impact on Public Safety.

With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, is objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted this application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.

The venue is located in the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where there is traditionally high levels of crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.

Dear Sirs

I write in relation to the application submitted for a new premises licence for Basement & Ground Floor, 47 Greek Street, London.

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- Public Safety
- Protection of children from harm

The application seeks the following:

Recorded Music – Indoors

Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 23:30

• Supply of Alcohol On Premises

Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 23:30

• Opening Hours to Public

Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 23:30

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1, PB2 and RNT2 (if certain proposals are agreed).

At present, the operating hours applied for licensable activities currently fall outside of Westminster's core hours. For premises for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, we request that the applicant reduce the terminal hour on Sunday's to be in line with Westminster's Core hours:

• Supply of Alcohol On Premises

Sunday 12:00 to 22:30

In your operating schedule you have stated that you intend to allow a 60 minute drinking up time after the end of the sale of alcohol. Please could you advise me of how you intend this to work when the opening times of the premises are exactly the same as the hours for licensable activities.

The current hours of operation do not include the provision for Late Night Refreshment which permits hot food and drink after 23:00. Could you therefore clarify whether you intend to operate the premises by selling alcohol with no hot food or hot drink after 23:00. Please note that if you were to add late night refreshment a new application would have to be submitted. Alternatively you could reduce the hours for licensable activities to 23:00.

You have described the operation of the premises as a café in your application, however you applied for the Sale of Retail of Alcohol on the premises with no ancillary nature to the way in which alcohol is served at the premises. As such the application must be considered under the Council's Policy PB2 which states that it is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1.

Paragraph 2.5.23 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy states that it is of particular concern in Cumulative Impact Area where there had been a growth in the number of premises that primarily serve alcohol, resulting in or adding to cumulative impact. On the basis, the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of variations or new licences for pubs and bars in the cumulative impact area should be limited to exceptional circumstances.

Your operating schedule does not provide any specific restrictions to the way in which alcohol is sold or consumed at the premises. The Licensing Authority would encourage the applicant to provide information as to the proposed operation specifically with how the alcohol will be served (i.e. by waiter/waitress service) on the premises.

To mitigate some of the concerns raised in this representation you are encouraged to add the following Model Conditions which will go some way to help to reduce the impact in the cumulative impact area.

MC 38 – The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

MC 39 - The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.

MC 66 - The premises shall only operate as a restaurant

- (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
- (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
- (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
- (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
- (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
- (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

MC 86- The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of Y&s Foods Ltd (Gaza Café), Basement and Ground Floor, 47 Greek Street, London, W1D 4EE as a Café.

For clarity the Licensing Authority would like confirmation whether you would like to reduce the hours of operation for licensable activities to 23:00 or whether you would like to add late night refreshment by submitting a new application.

If you were to agree the conditions and the proposals above your application would fall more in line with the Councils restaurant policy RNT2 rather than the bar policy PB2.

I look forward to receiving your submissions.

Further correspondence with the Licensing Authority following a site visit on 27 June 2019

Thank you for meeting Angela and myself on Tuesday. After viewing the premises and discussing the proposed operation of the premises, the Licensing Authority are of the understanding that the premises will operate as a Café style operation, rather than a restaurant. You advised the Licensing Authority that the premises intend to sell alcoholic slushies and bottled beers to be purchased with food. You also advised that there will be no waiter/waitress service, but that alcohol will only be consumed in a seated capacity.

Considering all the points discussed at the site visit, the Licensing Authority are satisfied that policies PB2 and RNT2 are no longer relevant to the application.

As your premises will be operating as a Café, paragraph 2.4.17 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 states that "the council receives applications for a range of premises wishing to sell alcohol which are neither pub, bars or restaurants. These premises may be cafes with a significant food offer but without a requirement that alcohol is ancillary to food."

Paragraph 2.4.18 of the policy also states that "Café premises are subject to other policies and must demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact area".

At the site visit it was also discussed that the operation of the premises would mean that the applicant would not be able to comply with the provisions of model condition 66 (the Council's full restaurant condition) as there is no intention to show customers to their tables and there will be no waiter/waitress service.

As a result, the Licensing Authority would like to encourage the applicant to consider the below model condition as an alternative to MC66:

MC 38 – The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

As discussed it would be beneficial if the terminal hour be reduced to 20:00hrs as you are currently operating as Cafe. As stated above the premises must demonstrate it will not add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact area. The Licensing Authority encourage this reduction in the terminal hour, which will bring your application in line with paragraph 2.4.21 of the policy which states;

The council therefore considers that where applications for licenses to sell alcohol for consumption on the premises are made and (i) are appropriately conditioned so that the consumption of alcohol is not, and cannot become, a significant part of the operation of the premises and is regulated to promote responsible drinking; (ii) where the character of the premises is such that its customers are not likely to be involved in sustained or heavy drinking at later hours; and (iii) when the sale of alcohol is not permitted beyond 20.00 hours; then permitting the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises is unlikely to add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact area.

- Recorded Music Indoors Non-Regulated Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 20:00
- Supply of Alcohol On Premises

Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 20:00

Opening Hours to Public

Monday to Sunday 12:00 to 20:00

As mentioned at our meeting the Licensing Authority endeavour to support local businesses and encourage the below model condition be considered so the operating of your premises is bespoke to your business model.

MC 86- The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of Y&s Foods Ltd (Gaza Café), Basement and Ground Floor, 47 Greek Street, London, W1D 4EE as a Café/Restaurant.

As previously stated, the Licensing Authority are content that this application does not fall under policies RNT2 and PB2. However, there are still the various policy considerations mentioned previously in paragraphs 2.4.17-2.4.18 and policy CIP1 which requires the applicant to demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact area.

Please discuss this further with your manager and advise on how you will be going forward.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.



CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or

less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

CCTV system will operate at the premise and recorded images will be kept for 28days.
 Data will be made available upon reasonable request to police and other responsible authorities.

- 10. Persons who are already drunk or disorderly will not be allowed to remain or stay within the premise.
- 11. ID system will be strictly implemented to confirm the age of anyone who appears to be under the age of 18.
- 12. To set a 60 minute drink up after the end sale of alcohol so last drink will be consumed less quickly.
- 13. Risk assessment including fire risk assessment shall be carried out. Thus an action will be prepared and any additional action required will be implemented. This will be reviewed annually.
- 14. Recorder music is played within volume that will not emanate from the premise.
- 15. No adult entertainment.
- 16. Non-smoking premise.

Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health

- 17. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant
 - (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals.

Notwithstanding this condition customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

- 18. There shall be no self service of alcohol.
- 19. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.
- 20. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 21. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 22. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.

- 23. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 24. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23.00 hours and 07.00 hours on the following day.
- 25. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day.
- 26. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day.
- 27. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 28. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- 29. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them unless seated in an authorised external area.
- 30. The number of seated persons (excluding staff) shall not exceed 45 persons on both the ground floor and basement of the premises.
- 31. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where there are minor changes to the premises layout during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.
- 32. No licensable activities shall take place at the premises until the premises has been assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team at which time this condition shall be removed from the Licence by the licensing authority.

Conditions proposed by the Police


33. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.

Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.

- 34. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 35. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them
- 36. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 37. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognized photographic identification cards such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram. The sale of alcohol will be ancillary to the provision of Training and Teambuilding events.
- 38. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
 - i. all crimes reported to the venue
 - ii. all ejections of patrons
 - iii. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - iv. any incidents of disorder
 - v. any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment.
 - vi. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - vii. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Conditions proposed by the Licensing Authority

- 39. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal
- 40. The licensable activities authorised by this licence and provided at the premises shall be ancillary to the main function of Y&S Foods Ltd (Gaza Cafe, Basement and Ground Floor, 47 Greek Street, London, W1D 4EE as a Cafe/Restaurant
