<p>I write in relation to the application submitted for a new premises licence for 39-45 Shaftesbury Avenue, London.</p> <p>As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1 and PB2.

At present, the operating hours applied for licensable activities currently fall outside of Westminster's core hours. The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to reduce the commencement hour for Supply of Alcohol to 10:00hrs for Monday to Saturday and 12:00hrs for Sunday and for Recorded Music to reduce the commencement and terminal hour so the application is in line with Westminster's Core Hours.

Monday to Saturday 10:00 to 23:30
Friday to Saturday 10:00 to 00:00
Sunday 12:00 to 22:30

• **Recorded Music**

Monday to Thursday 09:00 to 23:30

The Licensing Authority notes that the application benefits from premises licence 18/12307/LIPDPS which currently has a holding bar within this licence. As part of the proposed conditions the applicant will surrender this licence.

The applicant has stated that, as part of this application the current holding bar will be replaced by an ancillary bar function, meaning that there is no requirement for those seated at the bar to consume any food. This has been marked as an area edged blue on the ground floor plan. As part of the application, the applicant proposed the following conditions:

Save for the area edged blue on the plan:

- a) *The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption as ancillary to their meal; and*
- b) *The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.*

In the area edged blue alcohol will only be sold:

- a) *To persons who are seated; and*
- b) *Where the number of the persons in that area at any time (excl staff) does not exceed 25.*

The area edged blue of the application currently falls within Westminster's PB2 Policy. In paragraph 2.5.3 of the policy states 'The Council is particularly concerned that restaurant premises in the cumulative impact areas do not, even in part, come to operate as bars. The council however, is not minded to relax conditions for restaurants where alcohol may only be consumed by persons as an ancillary to their substantial table meal.'

The Licensing Authority would like the applicant to provide further submissions as to how the area edged blue is to be operated and controlled, i.e. will the proposed area operate by way of waiter/waitress service?

In paragraph 2.5.23 the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of new licences for pubs and bars in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances.

Paragraph 2.4.5 states, The Licensing Authority's policies, in relation to the Cumulative Impact Areas, are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole. The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to provide further submissions as to how the premises will not add to cumulative impact in the West End cumulative impact area, in accordance with policy CIP1.

The Licensing Authority looks forward to receiving further submissions from the applicant in due course.

On the 10th September the applicant agreed to reduce the hours for all licensable activities to Westminster City Council's Core Hours.

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

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their

photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula - $P = D + (D \times V)$

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph)

not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

9. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 06:00 hours on the following day.
10. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23:00 and 06:00 hours on the following day.
11. With the exception of bakery, newspapers, dairy and fruit and vegetable deliveries which can be delivered from 06:00, no deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours on the following day.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

12. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant
- (i) in which customers are shown to their table,
 - (ii) where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only,
 - (iii) which provide food in the form of substantial table meals that are prepared on the premises and are served and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery,
 - (iv) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink for immediate consumption,
 - (v) which do not provide any take away service of food or drink after 23.00, and
 - (vi) where alcohol shall not be sold or supplied, otherwise than for consumption by persons who are seated in the premises and bona fide taking substantial table meals there, and provided always that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals

Notwithstanding this condition, customers are permitted to take from the premises part consumed and resealed bottles of wine supplied ancillary to their meal.

13. Notwithstanding condition 12, prior to midnight alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to their meal in the ground floor bar area (designated on the plan in blue), by up to a maximum at any one time, of 25 persons dining at the premises.
14. The sale and supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be restricted to alcohol consumed by persons who are seated in an area appropriately authorised for the use of tables and chairs on the highway and bona fide taking a substantial table meal there, and where the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such a meal, and where the supply of alcohol is by waiter or waitress service only.
15. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. 




