Premises licence history:	The premises has had the benefit of a premises licence since April 2013. The current premises licence reference is 19/02861/LIPCH, and a copy of the premises licence appears at appendix 1. The full licence history for the premises appears at appendix 3. The premises also hold a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence (licence number 20/03492/LISEVR) which is valid until 23 rd April 2021, a copy of which appears at appendix 2		
Applicant submissions:	<p>This variation is sought due to the current business and social circumstances around Covid 19; this single condition prohibits the venue from opening as the premises cannot provide adult entertainment and there is no indication as to when the venue could re-open as a SEV venue. Without trading the venue will need to make 40 plus staff redundant with other financial repercussions.</p> <p>The venue has sufficient conditions to trade responsibly in accordance with licensing objectives and has previously successfully traded on TEN's for specific events without SEV licence in effect.</p> <p>Following consultation with the Police and Environmental Health Service, the applicant has amended the application so as to vary condition 11 as set out below and that the terminal hour would be reduced to 03:00 during the time limited aspect of the variation:</p> <p>"11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment. Further to application 20/06983/LIPV this condition is suspended until 1st February 2022"</p>

<p>With reference to the above application, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a Responsible Authority, is objecting to this application as it is our belief that if granted this application would undermine the Licensing Objectives.</p> <p>The venue is located in the West End Cumulative Impact Area, a locality where there is traditionally high levels of crime and disorder. We have concerns that this application will cause further policing problems in an already demanding area.</p> <p>Following agreement of amended conditions, the Metropolitan Police Service representation was withdrawn on 20 October 2020</p>

<p>I write in relation to the application submitted for a variation of the premises licence for Basement, Victory House, 14 Leicester Square, London, WC2H 7NG.</p> <p>As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011, the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the four Licensing Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public Nuisance • Prevention of Crime & Disorder • Public Safety • Protection of children from harm <p>The application seeks the following variations:</p> <p>This variation is to remove condition 11 of the premises licence which reads <i>"The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment"</i></p> <p>The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Area and as such various policy points must be considered, namely CIP1, HRS1, MD2 and PB2.</p> <p>The Licensing Authority has concerns with the removal of condition 11 from the licence which removes any ancillary nature to the Sale of Alcohol and the premises being a Sexual Entertainment Venue. The removal of this condition plus the no ancillary nature proposes the premises will become alcohol-led subsequently changing the character of the premises into a nightclub.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment</i></p>	

The application as it currently stands falls within Westminster's MD2 and PB2 Policy. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas other than applications to vary hours within Core Hours under Policy HRS1. Paragraphs 2.5.23 and 2.5.48 states that the Licensing Authority considers that new applications for pubs and bars plus premises offering facilities for music and dancing in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be refused save where an applicant can demonstrate exceptional circumstances.

The Licensing Authority note that when the licence was first granted by Licensing Sub-Committee on the 24th April 2013 it was due to the application was an exception to policy as the operation of the premises is exclusively a sexual entertainment venue and conditioned appropriately to reflect this. The decision reads below;

The Members of the Sub-Committee gave careful consideration to the application and granted the application as an exception to policy in the West End Stress Area, subject to conditions as set out below. Members considered that exceptional circumstances had been provided to warrant granting the application given the nature of the operation exclusively as a sexual entertainment venue and that the conditions offered by the Applicant would promote the licensing objectives at the premises. These included a condition restricting the sale of alcohol to be ancillary to striptease entertainment, and with the venue only intended to operate as an SEV and the sale of alcohol only being permissible at the time it is operating as an SEV.

A variation to this licence was submitted back in 2017 to extend the hours for Licensable Activities from Sale of Alcohol 20:00 to 03:00 Monday to Saturday and Sunday 20:00 to 00:30 and other licensable activities Sunday to Wednesday 20:00 to 03:00 to the below.

Sale of Alcohol

Monday to Saturday 17:00 to 06:00

Sundays 17:00 to 03:00

Other Licensable Activities

Monday to Sunday 17:00 to 06:00

This was granted at Licensing Sub-Committee in 18th May 2017 with the reason again being an exception to policy as the premises is exclusively a sexual entertainment venue. The decision reads below;

The Sub-Committee carefully considered the application and recognised that the applicant had accepted that for the application to be granted it had to be demonstrated it was an exception to policy. The Sub-Committee acknowledged that the premises was professionally run and the applicant had significant experience in managing such an operation. The discrete nature of the venue was recognised and it was felt this made it appropriate for the local area especially bearing in mind that the previous operation had been a nightclub which had created significant disturbance to Leicester Square. In considering the application the Sub-Committee acknowledged that sexual entertainment venues generally caused fewer problems than other types of premises. The condition restricting the sale of alcohol to be ancillary to striptease entertainment, and with the venue only intended to operate as a sexual entertainment venue provided reassurance that the premises would not become alcohol-led.

As the operation of the premises is changing from a performance venue that has an ancillary nature to the Sale of Alcohol to an alcohol-led premises with music and dancing paragraph 2.5.48 of the Licensing Policy states 'There is particular concern in the Cumulative Impact Areas where there has been a growth in the number of entertainment premises and other licensed premises. On this basis the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of variations for premises offering facilities for music and dancing in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances.'

Therefore, it is a decision for the Licensing Sub-Committee to determine whether the applicant has demonstrated any exceptional circumstances that would allow to depart from policy.

Policy NS1 applies	(i) Applications involving nudity or striptease or sex related entertainment will only be granted in exceptional circumstances and if the proposal meets the relevant criteria specified in Policies CD1, PS1, PN1, CH1 and HRS1. (ii) Applications will be subject to appropriate conditions which promote the licensing objectives. (iii) Applications will not be granted in proximity to: (a) residential accommodation (b) schools (c) places of worship (d) community facilities or public buildings. (iv) The Licensing Authority will have regard to the cumulative effect of the number of such premises, and sexual entertainment venues, in proximity to each other and in the vicinity.
Policy PB2 applies	It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in the Cumulative Impact Areas other than applications to vary hours within the Core Hours under Policy HRS1.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that –

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- (i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
Where -
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.
10. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment.
12. Any person permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
13. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
14. The premises are not be used by any outside promoters save those that give the Metropolitan Police 14 days' notice and the Police to have absolute veto.
15. Alcohol shall not be sold for consumption off the premises.
16. The supply of alcohol at tables shall be by waiter/waitress service only.
17. There shall be no draught beers sold at the premises.
18. All seating shall consist of tables and chairs arrangement and there shall be no cinema style seating.
19. Door staff shall be employed at all times when the premises are open for licensable activity. There shall be a minimum of two door supervisors to be employed at the entrance of the premises from 8pm. All door supervisors at the entrance to wear high visibility jackets.
20. All public areas of the premises shall be sufficiently illuminated to afford SIA registered supervisors a clear view of the dancers.
21. The premises management will become members and actively participate in a pub watch scheme (or similar) if one is operating in the area of the premises.
22. There shall be no dancing by customers.
23. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer of the City Council throughout the preceding 31 day period.
24. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
25. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not

be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.

26. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.

 - o firearms
 - o lasers
 - o explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - o real flame.
 - o strobe lighting.

36. The licence holder shall enter into an agreement with a hackney carriage and/or private hire firm to provide transport for customers, with contact numbers made readily available to customers who will be encouraged to use such services.
37. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
38. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
39. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.

44. Performers/Dancers permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to two (2) persons at any one time.
45. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.
46. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed the following:
 - a) Capacity of 200 (customers) until 2.00am
 - b) Capacity of 150 (customers) from 2.00am to 3.30am
 - c) Capacity of 100 (customers) from 3.30am to 4.30am
 - d) Capacity of 50 (customers) from 4.30am until closing time
47. There shall be no new admittance or re-admittance to the premises after i) 02:30 on Monday, ii) 04:00 on Bank Holiday Monday iii) 04:00 Tuesday to Sunday save for persons temporarily leaving to smoke.
48. After 21.00 hours a log shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded hourly and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.
49. A challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
50. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
51. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.

52. All external doors shall be kept closed after 21.00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
53. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.

58. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
59. No person on behalf of the premises or on behalf of a person carrying or attempting to carry on a licensable activity at the premises shall cause, permit, employ or allow, directly or indirectly through a third party, whether on payment or otherwise, any person(s) to importune, solicit or tout members of the public on any public highway within the specified area outlined below for the purpose of bringing customers to the premises.


For the purposes of this condition, 'Specified Area' means the area encompassed within Shaftesbury Avenue, Piccadilly Circus, Regent Street up to the junction with Pall Mall, Cockspur Street, Trafalgar Square, Strand up to the junction with Bedford Street, Garrick Street, Great Newport Street and Charing Cross Road to the junction of Shaftesbury Avenue.

60. Tea and coffee to be provided without charge for patrons (on request) between 03:00 and closing time.
61. SIA security shall monitor/supervise all areas of the premises where striptease/table/lap dancing is taking place.
62. In addition to condition 43 above, patrons will have a designated smoking area, which shall be supervised by a SIA door supervisor.



Standard Conditions:

1. Whilst Relevant Entertainment is taking place no person under the age of 18 shall be on the licensed premises and a clear notice to that effect shall be displayed at the entrance in a prominent position so that it can be easily read by persons entering the premises.
2. Whenever persons under the age of 18 are admitted to the premises there will be no promotional or other material on display within the premises which depicts nudity or partial nudity.

20/06983/LIPV – Platinum Lace Gentlemans Club, 14 Leicester Square, London**Application for Variation**

This premises has in the past operated as a SEV venue, with the venue (still) holding a SEV licence.

Covid Regulations/restrictions prevent SEV's from operating. Due to condition 11 which reads "11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment" are unable to even trade just under their premises licence.

The premises have been closed since March 2020.

This variation is to allow a time limit relaxation of condition 11 to allow the premises to at least open and trade in accordance with Covid social distancing requirements.

There is one representation against the application- by the Licensing Authority.

A number of conditions were agreed with Police and EH during consultation, and these are:

- (a) Amend condition 11 to read: "11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment. Further to application 20/06983/LIPV this condition is suspended until 1st February 2022".
- (b) Add a new condition "There shall be no striptease or nudity, and all persons shall be decently attired at all times, except when the premises are operating under the authority of a Sexual Entertainment Venue licence."
- (c) Existing Condition 23 shall be replaced by "The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period"
- (d) Existing Condition 24 shall be replaced by "A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested."
- (e) Agreed a reduction in hours for licensable activities to 3am whilst the suspension of condition 11 is in force. This could be agreed as a condition that reads: "Licensable activities shall cease at 3am whilst the suspension in condition 11 is in force"

The applicant would submit that

- I. This application has been made due to Regulations introduced as a result of Covid 19 pandemic
- II. The premises have been closed since 23 March 2020.
- III. SEV venues have been kept closed despite other hospitality venues being allowed to open
- IV. This application allows premises to trade, with the suspension of condition 11

- V. There is one rep by LA
- VI. Additional conditions have been proposed by RA's and agreed by applicant
- VII. EH and Police concerns have been addressed- no representations maintained by Police; EH never lodged a representation, and so any operational concerns are satisfied in terms of policy
- VIII. No additional impact by this application- large number of premises closed temporarily and permanently due to Covid in CI area, and capacities of all venues trading have been decreased significantly
- IX. This is temporary relaxation with a reduction in hours agreed (dependent of course on Regulations in any event)
- X. Without relaxation the premises may close as business will not be viable. Premises need a lifeline to trade.
- XI. There are easy transport links -taxis; night buses; tube; parking;
- XII. Dispersal policy in place for end of evening
- XIII. No residential objections or issues reported
- XIV. The venue has sufficient conditions to trade responsibly in accordance with licensing objectives
- XV. The premises has previously successfully traded on TEN's for specific events without SEV licence in effect, so the venue has history of trading responsibly as a non-SEV venue
- XVI. Seating layout will remain at the venue, although will be Covid secure and compliant with relevant Regulations

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

Conditions: On Current Licence -

Mandatory:

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor.

For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8(i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

8(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

8(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

10. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment.

Condition proposed by Environmental Health to replace condition 11 and agreed with the applicant:

- 11. The sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor shall be ancillary to the provision of striptease entertainment. Further to application 20/06983/LIPV this condition is suspended until 1st February 2022”**
12. Any person permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them.
13. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
14. The premises are not be used by any outside promoters save those that give the Metropolitan Police 14 days' notice and the Police to have absolute veto.
15. Alcohol shall not be sold for consumption off the premises.
16. The supply of alcohol at tables shall be by waiter/waitress service only.
17. There shall be no draught beers sold at the premises.
18. All seating shall consist of tables and chairs arrangement and there shall be no cinema style seating.
19. Door staff shall be employed at all times when the premises are open for licensable activity. There shall be a minimum of two door supervisors to be employed at the entrance of the premises from 8pm. All door supervisors at the entrance to wear high visibility jackets.
20. All public areas of the premises shall be sufficiently illuminated to afford SIA registered supervisors a clear view of the dancers.
21. The premises management will become members and actively participate in a pub watch scheme (or similar) if one is operating in the area of the premises.
22. There shall be no dancing by customers.
23. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any

light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer of the City Council throughout the preceding 31 day period.

Amended condition proposed by the Metropolitan Police Service and agreed with the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule:

- 23. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.**
24. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Amended condition proposed by the Metropolitan Police Service and agreed with the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule:

- 24. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.**
25. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
26. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
27. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
28. All external doors shall be kept closed after (21:00) hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
29. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

30. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
31. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between (23.00) hours and (08.00) hours.
32. The highway and public spaces in the vicinity of the premises shall be kept free of litter from the premises at all material times to the satisfaction of the Council. All litter and sweepings shall be collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
33. A log shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The log shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises is open.
34. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
35. Any special effects or mechanical installations shall be arranged and stored so as to minimise any risk to the safety of those using the premises. The following special effects will only be used on 10 days prior notice being given to the Licensing Authority where consent has not previously been given.
 - o dry ice and cryogenic fog
 - o smoke machines and fog generators
 - o pyrotechnics including fire works
 - o firearms
 - o lasers
 - o explosives and highly flammable substances.
 - o real flame.
 - o strobe lighting.
36. The licence holder shall enter into an agreement with a hackney carriage and/or private hire firm to provide transport for customers, with contact numbers made readily available to customers who will be encouraged to use such services.
37. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
38. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
39. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
40. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.

41. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
42. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
43. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to five (5) persons at any one time.
44. Performers/Dancers permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall be limited to two (2) persons at any one time.
45. An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.
46. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed the following:
 - a) Capacity of 200 (customers) until 2.00am
 - b) Capacity of 150 (customers) from 2.00am to 3.30am
 - c) Capacity of 100 (customers) from 3.30am to 4.30am
 - d) Capacity of 50 (customers) from 4.30am until closing time
47. There shall be no new admittance or re-admittance to the premises after i) 02:30 on Monday, ii) 04:00 on Bank Holiday Monday iii) 04:00 Tuesday to Sunday save for persons temporarily leaving to smoke.
48. After 21.00 hours a log shall be maintained to ensure that the capacity limit set for the premises is recorded hourly and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.
49. A challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
50. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicants are provided.
51. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
52. All external doors shall be kept closed after 21.00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access and egress of persons.
53. The certificates listed below shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - a) Any emergency lighting battery or system
 - b) Any electrical installation
 - c) Any emergency warning system
54. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).

55. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.
 - a. NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.
56. All staff engaged outside the entrance to the premises, or supervising or controlling queues, shall wear high visibility yellow jackets or vests.
57. No advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services shall be inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or be distributed to the public.
58. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licence holder to any person for bringing customers to the premises.
59. No person on behalf of the premises or on behalf of a person carrying or attempting to carry on a licensable activity at the premises shall cause, permit, employ or allow, directly or indirectly through a third party, whether on payment or otherwise, any person(s) to importune, solicit or tout members of the public on any public highway within the specified area outlined below for the purpose of bringing customers to the premises.

For the purposes of this condition, 'Specified Area' means the area encompassed within Shaftesbury Avenue, Piccadilly Circus, Regent Street up to the junction with Pall Mall, Cockspur Street, Trafalgar Square, Strand up to the junction with Bedford Street, Garrick Street, Great Newport Street and Charing Cross Road to the junction of Shaftesbury Avenue.

60. Tea and coffee to be provided without charge for patrons (on request) between 03:00 and closing time.
61. SIA security shall monitor/supervise all areas of the premises where striptease/table/lap dancing is taking place.
62. In addition to condition 43 above, patrons will have a designated smoking area, which shall be supervised by a SIA door supervisor.
63. The premises shall become members of and participate in the Safer West End Business Crime Reduction Partnership/ radio scheme, or such similar scheme that may be operating at any time.
64. Door supervisors shall remain on duty to supervise the area immediately outside the premises until at least 15 minutes after the last patron has left the premises.
65. When the hours authorised by this licence extends beyond 1am, then in relation to the morning on which British Summer Time begins, the hours shall be extended by 1 hour after the authorised hour on the licence.
66. After 03:00 hours alcohol shall only be served to and consumed by customers who are seated.

67. The premises shall employ a taxi marshal from 03:00 until closing to escort customers wanting taxis to their pickup spot.
