1-C Layout alteration

The basement is being added to the licenced area of the premises as per the plans attached to the application and attached at **Appendix 1**.

1-D Conditions being removed

Condition

The applicant is seeking to remove the below conditions relating to the sale if alcohol if the variation application is to be granted.

Mandatory Conditions 1 to 8(iv) relating to alcohol to be removed if the application is to be granted.

Condition 11. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer of the City Council at all times whilst the premises is open.

Condition 12. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.

Condition 13. Sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall only be in sealed containers, and supplied with, and ancillary to a take away meal

Condition 14. The supply of alcohol 'on' the premises shall be ancillary to the supply of a table meal.

Condition 16. Patrons may not remove glassware or open containers from the premises or any external seating area.

Condition 17. There shall be no 'Off' sales of alcohol between 08:00 and 10:00 hours.

Condition 18. After 23:00 hours on Monday to Saturday and Sundays immediately prior to bank holidays and 22:30 hours on Sundays the sale of alcohol on the premises shall only be to persons taking a table meal there and consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.

Condition 19. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only and then only to persons who are seated.

Condition 20. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available throughout the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises.

Condition 23. No rubbish including bottles will be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours.

With reference to the above, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police, as a responsible authority, are making a representation against this application. The venue is situated within the Cumulative Impact Area. It is our belief that if granted, the application would undermine the Licensing Objectives in relation to The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Conditions and reducing the hours have been proposed by the Metropolitan Police and agreed with the applicant and can be found at Appendix 5

I write in relation to the application submitted to vary a Premises Licence for the following premises:

21/07520/LIPV: 43 Charing Cross Road, London WC2H 0AP

As a responsible authority under section 13 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 as amended under the Police and Social Responsibility Act 2011 the Licensing Authority have considered your application in full. The Licensing Authority has concerns in relation to this application and how the premises would promote the Licensing Objectives:

- Public Nuisance
- Prevention of Crime & Disorder
- · Public Safety
- Protection of Children from harm

This application seeks the following:

- 1. Removal of the licensable activity; sale by the retail of alcohol.
- 2. Removal of the conditions relating to the sale of alcohol.
- 3. Late night refreshment 23:00 to 03:00am Monday to Sunday.
- 4. Submission of new, updated premises plan.

The premises is located within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone (CIZ) and as such, a number of policy points must be considered namely Cumulative Impact Policy CIP1, Fast Food Premises FFP1 and Core Hours Policy HRS1.

Policy CIP1 states:

A. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone for: pubs and bars, fast food premises, and music and dancing and similar

entertainment, other than applications to:

- 1. Vary the hours within Core Hours under Policy HRS1, and/or
- 2. Vary the licence to reduce the overall capacity of the premises.
- C. Applications for other premises types within the West End Cumulative Impact Zones will be subject to other policies within this statement and must demonstrate that they will not add to cumulative impact.
- D. For the purposes of this policy the premises types referred to in Clause A are defined within the relevant premises use policies within this statement.

Fast Food Premises Policy FFP1

- B. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone other than:
- 1. Applications to vary the existing licence hours within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1, and/or.
- 2. Applications that seek to vary the existing licence so as to reduce the overall capacity of the premises

Currently the licence permits late night refreshment:

Monday to Saturday: 23:00 to 00:00

Sunday: 23:00 to 23:30

Sundays before Bank Holidays: 23:00 to 00:00

Non-standard Timings: From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of

permitted hours on New Year's Day

The applicant is seeking to extend these hours by 3-3.5 hours each night within the West End CIZ when it is policy to refuse such applications as per policy HRS1 and CIP1. As the applicant has not provided additional information with their application in relation to the operation of the premises or offered any conditions it is not possible to consider this application under the Councils restaurant policy.

Policy point F30 states; "Fast food premises which are open after 11pm can attract large groups of customers, many of whom have been consuming alcohol in pubs, bars, or night clubs sometimes some distance away. The congregation of people around these premises leads to additional noise and disturbance and further congestion in the area. Although premises which serve cold food and drink are not subject to licensing and may stay open all night, they are not so attractive to people who have been drinking as those providing hot food and drink. The council considers that the addition of hot fast food and hot drink adds to the attractiveness of premises to people who have been drinking and who are more likely to be involved in anti-social behaviour"

These issues are of particular concern within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone where there are high concentrations of fast food premises in addition to other licensed premises. On this basis and because the attraction and retention of people by the premises mitigates against their rapid dispersal from the cumulative impact areas, the Licensing Authority considers that the grant of variations or new licences for fast food premises in the Cumulative Impact Areas should be limited to exceptional circumstances.

Policy point F33 States "Applications within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone, where there is a presumption to refuse under this policy will be expected to demonstrate why their application should be permitted as an exception to this policy."

Furthermore policy points F35 and F36 state. "It is not possible to give a full list of examples of when the council may treat an application as an exception. However, in considering whether a particular case is exceptional, the Licensing Authority will consider the reasons underlying the West End Cumulative Impact Zone special policy (CIP1) when considering applications." "The Licensing Authority will not consider a case to be exceptional merely on the grounds that

the premises have been or will be operated within the terms of the conditions on the licence, or that are or will be generally well managed because of the reputation or good character of the licence holder or operator.

This is expected in the conduct of all licensed premises."

The Licensing Authority seek further submissions as to the proposed operation of the premises and why this application should be viewed as an exception to policy.

As the Licensing Authority's policies, in relation to the Cumulative Impact Zones (CIZ), are directed at the global and cumulative effects of licences on the area as a whole. The Licensing Authority encourages the applicant to provide further submissions in relation to the capacity of the premises during the later hours and whether the food purchased will be consumed on or off the premises? The applicant must also demonstrate how the premises will not add to cumulative impact in the cumulative impact area, as per policy CIP1 and HRS1.

It will be for Licensing Sub-Committee Members to determine this application, given its location within the West End Cumulative Impact area and the proposed hours of operation.

Further discussions will be held with the applicant prior to any scheduled hearing and any further submissions will be forwarded on for Members information.

This is an application to amend the hours and conditions of the Pizza Express premises, situated at 43 Charing Cross Road on the ground floor of the same building as the Hippodrome. The current premises licence allows the operation as a restaurant during Core Hours with on and off sales for alcohol and LNR, and the sale of alcohol being ancillary to takeaway food (off) and table meal (on).

The application seeks to extend the hours for LNR to 03:00 and to remove alcohol and all of the ancillary conditions related to it from the licence. The premises will become an LNT venue open from 07:00 to 03:00.

The premises are situated on the West side of Charing Cross Road in an area with (pre-COVID) a very high level of crime and ASB. There is also a significant amount of residential accommodation to the North of the premises. We attach a crime heat map for 2019 (pre-COVID) and residential accommodation within 100m of the premises.

The CGCA believes that this will harm the Licensing Objectives related to Public Nuisance and Crime and Disorder for the reasons set out in our detailed representation. The reasons for this are set out in Westminster's SoLP (FFP1) and are well known to the Licensing Authority and we will not repeat them here. Given the location of the premises in the heart of the West End CIZ the proposed extension of LNR hours will, in our view, give rise to harm to the Licensing Objectives both in the immediate vicinity and in the wider area.

We are also very surprised that the applicant has failed to include any additional conditions with the application, merely stating that "The current Conditions in the application are sufficient to support the licensing objectives for the changes made.". We are concerned that no risk assessment has been carried out as required by CD1 and other Policies.

We ask that the application for the extension of late-night refreshment is refused outright. We do not object to the **removal** of the Licensable Activity of the sale of alcohol and associated conditions from the licence.

We hope that this representation is clear and ask that you advise us well in advance of any meeting at which this application will be discussed.

3. Policy & Guidance

The following policies within the City Of Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy apply:

Policy HRS1 applies

- A. Applications within the core hours set out below in this policy will generally be granted for the relevant premises uses, subject to not being contrary to other policies in the Statement of Licensing Policy. B. Applications for hours outside the core hours set out in Clause C
- B. Applications for hours outside the core hours set out in Clause C will be considered on their merits, subject to other relevant policies, and with particular regard to the following:
- 1. The demonstration of compliance in the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1 associated with the likelihood of the effect of the grant of a licence for later or earlier hours on crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.
- 2. If the application is located within a Special Consideration Zone they have demonstrated that they have taken account of the issues identified in that area and provided adequate mitigation.
- 3. Whether there is residential accommodation in the proximity of the premises that would likely be adversely affected by premises being open or carrying out operations at the hours proposed.
- 4. The proposed hours of the licensable activities and when customers will be permitted to remain on the premises.
- 5. The proposed hours when any music, including incidental music, will be played.
- 6. The hours when customers will be allowed to take food or drink outside the premises or be within open areas which form part of the premises.
- 7. The existing hours of licensable activities and the past operation of the premises (if any) and hours of licensable premises in the vicinity.
- 8. Whether customers and staff have adequate access to public transport when arriving at and leaving the premises, especially at night.
- 9. The capacity of the premises.
- 10. The type of use, recognising that some venues are more likely to impact the licensing objectives than others; for example, pubs and bars are higher risk than theatres, cinemas and other cultural and sporting venues due to the nature of the operation.
- 11. The Licensing Authority will take into account the active measures proposed for a 'winding down' period including arrangements for people to be collected from the premises to travel home safely.
- 12. Conditions on hours may be attached that require that the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises ceases a suitable period of time before customers are required to leave the premises.

- 13. The council, acting as the Licensing Authority, may reduce hours if, after review, it is necessary to impose conditions specifying shorter hours in order to promote the licensing objectives.
- 14. Specific days for non-standard hours should be identified and justified as part of the application to allow responsible authorities and interested parties to evaluate the impact that these licensable activities may have, and to plan accordingly. The consideration of applications for later hours for Bank Holiday Mondays will take into account that later hours are generally granted for preceding Sundays and that the next day is a working day. Non-specific days are expected to be covered by Temporary Event Notices or variation applications.

Policy FFP1 applies

- A. Applications outside the West End Cumulative Zones will generally be granted subject to:
- 1. The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.
- 2. The hours for licensable activities are within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1.
- 3. The operation of any delivery services for alcohol and/or latenight refreshment meeting the council's Ancillary Delivery of Alcohol and/or Late-Night Refreshment Policy DEL1.
- 4. The applicant has taken account of the Special Consideration Zones Policy SCZ1 if the premises are located within a designated zone.
- 5. The application and operation of the venue meet the definition of a fast food premises in Clause D.
- B. It is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications within the West End Cumulative Impact Zone other than:
- 1. Applications to vary the existing licence hours within the council's Core Hours Policy HRS1, and/or,
- 2. Applications that seek to vary the existing licence so as to reduce the overall capacity of the premises.
- C. The applications referred to in Clause B1 and B2 will generally be granted subject to:
- 1. The application meeting the requirements of policies CD1, PS1, PN1 and CH1.
- 2. The operation of any delivery services for alcohol and/or latenight refreshment meeting the council's Ancillary Delivery of Alcohol and/or Late-Night Refreshment Policy DEL1.
- 3. The application and operation of the venue continuing to meet the definition of a Fast Food Premises in Clause D.
- D. For the purposes of this policy a Fast Food Premises is defined as:
- 1. A premises that provides late night refreshment, either by way of fast food over a counter, via a self-seating basis or take away for immediate consumption.
- 2. Food and drink are:
- a. Available on the premises for self-selection.
- b. Prepared on the premises.
- c. Cooked or produced off the premises but brought to that premises in advance of its sale to customers.
- 3. The food and drink are provided in pre-sealed or open disposable packaging which is intended for immediate consumption.
- 4. A fast-food premises can provide a delivery service as part of its operation, however that service must be ancillary to the main function of the premises as defined within sub-clauses D,1 to D,3 above.

4. Equality Implications

The Council in its capacity as Licensing Authority has a duty to have regard to its public sector equality duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010. In summary, section 149 provides that a Public Authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to:

- (a) eliminate discrimination harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it; and
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristics and persons who do not share it.

Section 149 (7) of the Equality Act 2010 defines the relevant protected characteristics as age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation.





Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. - 8(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.




