Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act1979(6)
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

P = D+(DxV)

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(7)
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- 5. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
- 6. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
- 7. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who hold a personal licence.
- 8. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
 - the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 10. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 11. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 12. The responsible person shall ensure that,
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

13. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licenses have effect.

Conditions relating to Regulated Entertainment:

- 14. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
- 15. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until midnight on New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes place on New Year's Day).
- 16. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule of Management No. 6 the premises may remain open for the purposes of this licence from 23:00 on each of the days Monday to Saturday to 03:00 on the day following.
- 17. The security fastenings to the double doors in the escape corridor (opposite the staff room) shall be completely removed while the public are on the premises.
- 18. The doors to the ground floor bar area shall remain closed, except for the immediate access and egress of patrons, after 23:00.

Conditions related to the Sale of Alcohol

- 19. Substantial food and suitable non intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available throughout permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating is sold or supplied.
- 20. No striptease, no nudity and all persons to be decently attired.
- 21. No payment to be made by or on behalf of the premises for distribution of flyers or tickets within public areas in the Licensing Districts of Westminster.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments.

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

- 22. (a) Subject to the following paragraphs, the permitted hours on weekdays shall commence at 10.00 (12.00 on Christmas Day and Good Friday) and extend until 03.00 on the morning following except that,
 - (i) the permitted hours shall end at 00.00 midnight on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and

- (ii) on any day that music and dancing end between 00.00 midnight and 03.00, the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end
- (b) In relation to the morning on which summer time begins, paragraph (a) of this condition shall have effect.
 - (i) with the substitution of references to 04.00 for references to 03.00
- (c) The permitted hours on Sundays shall commence at 12.00 and extend until 22.30
- (d) The sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
- (e) The permitted hours on New Year's Eve will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day, or if there are no permitted hours on 1 January, to 00.00 on New Year's Eve.

NOTE - The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (c) the sale or supply of alcohol to or the consumption of alcohol by any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered:
- (e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or registered club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of her Majesty's naval, military or air forces:
- (g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there;
- (h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

In this condition, any reference to a person residing in the premises shall be construed as including a person not residing there but carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 23. If any entertainment is provided for children or if an entertainment is provided at which the majority of persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100, it shall be the duty of the holder of the premises licence:
 - (a) to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate,
 - (b) to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and
 - (c) to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.
- 24. No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (a) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (b) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (c) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (d) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

25. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

26. The number of persons accommodated at any time (excluding staff) shall not exceed the following:

The temple Room - 75 but the total number of persons excluding staff in the basement at any one time shall not exceed 500.

Ground floor - 75

- 27. Whilst the premises are in use under this licence the entertainment shall be limited to a type commonly known as discotheque
- 28. On any evening where the premises or part of the premises are open for the purpose of music and dance in which the sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment, intoxicating liquor shall not be sold or supplied to persons admitted to the premises after 23:00 other than to:
 - i. Persons who have paid a minimum admission fee or at least £3 Monday to Thursday and £5 Friday and Saturday for music, dancing and entertainment (not to be credited against consumables);
 - ii. Persons who have paid a minimum annual admission fee of £150 (excluding founder members) payable in advance (not to be credited against consumables);
 - iii. Any persons attending a private function at the premises, of which 24 hours notice has been given to the police, a list of whom will be held at reception for inspection by any relevant authority;
 - iv. Artistes or persons employed on the premises;
 - v. Persons taking a full table meal, a list of whom are held at reception for inspection by any relevant authority;
 - vi. Bona fide guests of the proprietor, a list of whom shall be kept for inspection by appropriate authorities;
 - vii. Members and up to three guests of member of the propriety club operated by the owners. No person shall be admitted to the membership of the premises without an interval of 24 hours between the application for membership and admission on Monday and Tuesday limited to three guests and Wednesday to Saturday limited to one guest.
- 29. Persons under 18 may only be permitted in the basement as part of a private function whilst under the supervision of an adult.
- 30. At all times when the premises is open to the public and door security is employed at the premises all bags shall be searched.
- 31. On Thursday / Friday and Saturday all persons entering the premises after 2200hrs shall be searched in accordance with reasonable Metropolitan Police Search Instructions.
- 32. A daily Security Supervisor log shall be maintained at the premises recording full details of Door Security Staff on duty, including: Full name / DOB / SIA Licence number. This log shall be made available immediately upon request of Police and shall be stored by the venue operators for at least 6 months.
- 33. A daily log is to be maintained to ensure that any capacity limit set for the basement is recorded hourly and can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity will be given to an authorised officer or Police Officer on request.


- 34. Notices shall be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 35. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 36. Off Sales of Alcohol are to be in sealed containers only and for consumption off the premises.
- 37. There shall be no consumption of alcohol purchased on the premises outside, in the immediate vicinity of the premises including any smoking area.
- 38. No authorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) is inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or is distributed to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services.
- 39. All waste to be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the schedule collection times.
- 40. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 41. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 42. All door security personnel engaged outside the entrance to the premises, or supervising or controlling queues, shall wear high visibility yellow jackets or vests.
- 43. A manager shall be responsible for ensuring that all door security staff on duty have in their possession and are clearly displaying a valid SIA licence or have in their possession a SIA personal licence dispensation notice (LDN).
- 44. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 45. Save for when private corporate events are taking place, when the premises are open, save for when a Biometric Scanning System is in place (when fingerprint scanning will be required for all customers who have previously shown identification at the premises) all customers entering the premises will have their ID scanned on entry save for a maximum number of 25 guests per night who may be admitted at the manager's discretion without ID being scanned and recorded, and that a legible record of these people's names shall be retained on the premises for inspection by the licensing authority and police for a period of 31 days. The name of the manager authorising the entrance without scanning will also be recorded.

- 46. a. All drinking vessels used in the venue shall be polycarbonate. All drinks in glass bottles are to be decanted into polycarbonate containers or polycarbonate carafes prior to being served, with the exception of champagne or bottles of spirits with a minimum size of 70cl supplied by waiter/waitress service to tables. Staff shall clear all empty champagne and spirit bottles promptly from the tables. Customers shall not be permitted to leave their table carrying any such glass bottles or drink directly from the bottle.
 - b. Notwithstanding a) above, with the written agreement of the Westminster Licensing Police, a copy of which will be held at the premises reception, glass drinking vessels may be used for private or pre-booked events within the areas agreed by the Police.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 47. Provided that in any calendar year, there have been no applications for a temporary event notice, on no more than 15 occasions in that calendar year, the terminal hour on Sundays to be 03:00 for the purposes of private pre-booked functions to which the general public are not admitted, following 10 working days notice to the Police and the Licensing Authority and subject to the written consent of the Police.
- 48. Where condition 40 applies for less than a whole calendar year, the maximum number of such functions allowed in that calendar year shall be calculated pro rata.
- 49. When a customer chooses to pay by credit card, he/she will be presented with an itemised bill upon final payment, showing details of all drinks and food purchased.

APPENDIX D

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICES

1. TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE PROCEDURE

- 1.1 Under s.100 (1) of the Licensing Act 2003 certain temporary events, which include licensable activities, are permitted under the Act if they are notified to the Council and the Police/Environmental Health by giving a Temporary Event Notice. The notice must be given by the 'premises user' (usually the event organiser responsible for all aspects of the event).
- 1.2 Permitted temporary events are events that take place in any premises, open space or temporary structure. The event must consist of one or more licensable activities; and the premises must be used over a period of no longer than 168 hours, with no more than 499 people in attendance.
- 1.3 Licensable activities include the sale by retail of alcohol; the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment (hot food or drink supplied between 11pm and 5am).
- 1.4 The premises user must send two copies of the temporary event notice to the Council, one copy to the environmental health department and one copy to the police leaving at least 10 clear working days before the event is due to begin. The Council must acknowledge receipt of the temporary event notice by the next working day.

2. NOTICE OF OBJECTION BY POLICE/ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

2.1 If the Police/ Environmental Health are satisfied that the event would undermine one or more of the licensing objectives, they must give a notice of objection stating their reasons as to why an objective would be undermined to the Council and premises user within 3 working days of receipt of the notice.

3. HEARING PROCEDURE FOLLOWING NOTICE OF OBJECTION BY POLICE/ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

- 3.1 The Sub-Committee is being asked to consider the notice of objection and hear any oral evidence given by or on behalf of the premises user and the Police/Environmental Health.
- 3.2 The Sub-Committee must consider whether to give a counter notice to the temporary event notice given by the premises user if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 3.3 The Council must convene a hearing to consider the notice of objection and give at least two day's notice to the premises user and the police.
- 3.4 The Sub-Committee must either reject the notice of objection to allow the event to take place, or issue a counter notice to prevent the event from taking place, or where or, after hearing the objections, allow the notice but attach relevant conditions from the premises licence. Please note not all premises will hold a premises licence.

- 3.5 The Council must, where it decides not to give a counter notice, give the premises user and the Police/Environmental Health a notice of the decision at least 24 hours before the beginning of the event period specified in the temporary event notice.
- 3.6 Where the Council decides to give a counter notice, it must give the premises user the counter notice and the reasons for its decision; and a copy of the counter notice and the reason for its decision to the police, at least 24 hours before the beginning of the event period specified in the temporary event notice.

4. APPEAL

- 4.1 Schedule 5, Part 3 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides a right of appeal to the premises user against the giving of a counter notice, and a right of appeal to the chief officer of Police/Environmental Health where the Council decides not to give a counter notice. Such an appeal must be commenced within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the Licensing Authority of the decision appealed against.
- 4.2 No appeal may be brought later than five working days before the day on which the event period specified in the temporary event notice begins.

5. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

5.1 The Westminster Statement of Licensing Policy for applications relating to premises and personal licences and temporary event notices made under the Licensing Act 2003 was determined for a three-year period commencing 7 January 2011. This contains no specific policy for Temporary Event Notices but urges longer periods of notice to be given for events which involve the use of the streets or necessitate the special management of traffic and services.
