Summary 1.

- 1.1 This report seeks approval for the expenditure of £81,562.95 from the Bryanston and Dorset Square Ward Budget in order to commission:
 - x10 planters in ward
 - (b) Air Filter System
 - (c) Air Quality Monitoring
 - (d) Forest Area in Playground

Recommendation

That the Cabinet Member for Communities and Regeneration approves the release of funds in the amount of £81,562.95 in respect of the above proposal, from the ward members of Bryanston and Dorset Square ward, as detailed in the report.

The proposed expenditure of £81,562.95 from the Bryanston and Dorset Square Ward Budget leaves £41,291.73 remaining for allocation in the current financial year.

1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007.
- 1.2 The programme enables ward members to fund projects in the local area which benefit residents of that area and/or meet local priorities.
- 1.3 £46,000 is provided to each ward in each financial year of a 4-year electoral cycle. Monies not spent in year roll-over to the next until the end of the cycle.
- 1.4 Budget provision for the financial years 2018 to 2022 equates to £184,000 per ward
- 1.5 All decisions on projects to be funded are made by the ward members from the wards concerned, to support their local priorities.

2. Proposed Projects

- 2.1 £25,602.50 will fund x10 planters in the following locations across the Bryanston and Dorset Square ward. The planters will be installed, planted and maintained by Continental Landscapes.
 - York Street / Seymour Place in front of lamp column, avoiding service cover (1 planter)
 - Bryanston Square where recycling bins were previously located (2 planters)
 - George Street in line with existing street furniture (2 planters)
 - Rossmore Road at top of the stairs leading down to Boston and Taunton Place (2 planters)
 - Glentworth Street / Melcombe Street on 3 of 4 corners, where the buildouts are located (3 planters)
- 2.2 £24,589.45 will fund the installation of IQAir CleanZone Air Filtration systems in three rooms within the Fourth Feathers' Youth centre used on a daily basis on average by 100 young people and adults. Current monitoring at Marylebone Station shows that nitrogen dioxide levels are 7x higher than those recommended by WHO, with each of the rooms they propose to install an air filtration system backing directly onto the train station which operates diesel trains who account for 70% of the immediate pollution.
- 2.3 £11,520.00 will fund the installation of Breathe London air quality monitors at St Edward's Primary School, St Mary's Bryanston Square, Four Feathers Youth and Hampden Gurney Club, St Vincent's Catholic Primary and St Marylebone CE School to give the local communities real time data on local air quality, specifically to measure the air quality impact of trains at Marylebone Station and Marylebone Road. Any accumulated data from the monitor will be tracked by Westminster City Council's Policy and Projects team and be publicly available.

2.4 £19,851.00 will fund the creation of a forest area in St Mary's Primary School playground. The work will take place from 21 February 2022 and will be completed on 11 March 2022. Children from the school and clubs/ organisations who use the school's space will benefit from: a mud kitchen, reading area and nature observation spot.

3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Bryanston and Dorset Square budget to date total £61,145.32 leaving £122,854.68 to be allocated.
- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £81,562.95 and leaves £41,291.73 available for future allocation.
- 3.3 This report approves the release of the above funding from the ward budget(s) as listed above. The individual decisions taken on the projects being funded are made by the ward members for the ward(s) involved.

4. Legal Implications

4.1 Section 1 of the Localism Act, aka "the general power of competence" enables authorities "to do anything that individuals generally may do". The proposals within this report are consistent with the Council exercising this power.

5. Consultation

- 5.1 The proposals have been approved by all Councillors, or a majority of Councillors from all wards involved
- 5.2 The proposal for all projects have been drawn up by the Committee and Councillor Coordinator with the Project Managers, the financial and legal aspects of the funding have been verified by the Council's Finance and Legal Services Departments.
