Summary 1.

- 1.1 This report seeks approval for the expenditure of £20,070.00 from the Lancaster Gate Ward Budget in order to commission:
 - (a) The planters from Windowflowers in Bishops Bridge Road.

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1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007.
- 1.2 The programme enables ward members to fund projects in the local area which benefit residents of that area and/or meet local priorities.
- 1.3 £46,000 is provided to each ward in each financial year of a 4-year electoral cycle. Monies not spent in year roll-over to the next until the end of the cycle.
- 1.4 Budget provision for the financial years 2018 to 2022 equates to £184,000 per ward
- 1.5 All decisions on projects to be funded are made by the ward members from the wards concerned, to support their local priorities.

2. Proposed Projects

2. 1 £20,070.00 will fund Bishop's Bridge Road Planters To completely strip out of all planting under the plane trees except for large *Cornus* and Ivy from one approx.50m long by 2.7m deep bed before installing forty-one 600mm and 700mm diameter terracotta finish pots filled with fresh Windowflowers compost and planted with a selection of evergreen and seasonal flowering plants including *Camelia*, Lavender, *Agapanthus*, Gold *Euonymus* and *Heuchera* and plunge them halfway into the ground and cover all of remaining exposed soil with decorative bark mulch.

3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Lancaster Gate budget to date total £69,323.19 leaving £114,676.81 to be allocated.
- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £20,070.00 and leaves £94,606.81 available for future allocation.
- 3.3 This report approves the release of the above funding from the ward budget(s) as listed above. The individual decisions taken on the projects being funded are made by the ward members for the ward(s) involved.

4. Legal Implications

4.1 Section 1 of the Localism Act, aka "the general power of competence" enables authorities "to do anything that individuals generally may do". The proposals within this report are consistent with the Council exercising this power.

5. Consultation

5.1 The proposals have been approved by all Councillors, or a majority of Councillors from all wards involved

5.2 The proposal for Bishop's Bridge Road Planters has been drawn up by the Councillor and Governance Support Officer with WindowFlowers, the financial and legal aspects of the funding have been verified by the Council's Finance and Legal Services Departments.
