Summary 1.

- This report seeks approval for the total expenditure of £42,120.00 from the Bayswater and Knightsbridge and Belgravia Ward Budgets in order to commission:
 - Deep Cleansing Bayswater £16,250.00 (a)
 - (b) Deep Cleansing - Knightsbridge and Belgravia - £25,870.00

That the Cabinet Member for Communities and Regeneration approves the release of funds in the amount of £42,120.00 in respect of the above proposal, from the ward members of Bayswater and Knightsbridge and Belgravia wards, as detailed in the report.

The proposed expenditure of £16,250 from the Bayswater Ward Budget leaves £8,177.19 remaining for allocation in the current financial year.

The proposed expenditure of £25,870.00 from the Knightsbridge and Belgravia Ward Budget leaves £13,266.83 remaining for allocation in the current financial year.

1. Background Information

- 1.1 Ward budgets were established under the City Council's Neighbourhood Programme agreed by the Cabinet in November 2007.
- 1.2 The programme enables ward members to fund projects in the local area which benefit residents of that area and/or meet local priorities.
- 1.3 £46,000 is provided to each ward in each financial year of a 4-year electoral cycle. Monies not spent in year roll-over to the next until the end of the cycle.
- 1.4 Budget provision for the financial years 2018 to 2022 equates to £184,000 per ward
- 1.5 All decisions on projects to be funded are made by the ward members from the wards concerned, to support their local priorities.

2. Proposed Projects

- 2.1 £16,250.00 will fund deep cleansing carried out by Veolia in Bayswater ward in the following areas:
 - Bishops Bridge Road (one side)
 - Westbourne Grove (Queensway to Garway Road)
 - Westbourne Grove (Garway Road to Chepstow Road)
 - Westbourne Grove (Chepstow to ledbury Road)
 - Porchester Road (Entire, both sides)
 - Hereford Road (from 1-15 commercial section)
- 2.2 £25,870.00 will fund deep cleansing carried out by Veolia in Knightsbridge and Belgravia ward in the following areas:
 - Montpelier Street
 - Exhibition Road (the Westminster end only)
 - Brompton Road
 - Elizabeth Street
 - Motcomb Street
 - Ebury Street
 - Pimlico Road
 - Kensington Gore (the side roads around the Royal Albert Hall)
 - Montpelier Square
 - Trevor Street
 - Trevor Square

3. Financial Implications

3.1 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Bayswater budget to date total £159,572.81 leaving £24,427.19 to be allocated.

- 3.2 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £16,250.00 and leaves £8,177.19 available for future allocation.
- 3.3 Expenditure and approvals in process from the Knightsbridge and Belgravia budget to date total £144,863.17 leaving £39,136.83 to be allocated.
- 3.4 The proposals for expenditure in this report amount to £25,870.00 and leaves £13,266.83 available for future allocation.
- 3.5 This report approves the release of the above funding from the ward budget(s) as listed above. The individual decisions taken on the projects being funded are made by the ward members for the ward(s) involved.

4. Legal Implications

4.1 Section 1 of the Localism Act, aka "the general power of competence" enables authorities "to do anything that individuals generally may do". The proposals within this report are consistent with the Council exercising this power.

5. Consultation

- 5.1 The proposals have been approved by all Councillors, or a majority of Councillors from all wards involved.
- 5.2 The proposal for Deep Cleansing has been drawn up by the Councillor and Governance Support Officer with Cleansing Services, the financial and legal aspects of the funding have been verified by the Council's Finance and Legal Services Departments.
