With reference to the above, I am writing to inform you that the Metropolitan Police Service as a Responsible Authority are **objecting** to this application on the basis that if granted, it would undermine the Licensing Objectives, namely The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

The hours sought are well beyond those of Westminster Council's Core Hours policy and there is insufficient information within the operating schedule to address how the Four Licensing Objectives will be promoted.

Fast food premises that open beyond 11pm can attract large crowds of people, some of whom may be intoxicated. The Police have concerns that the hours sought for Late Night Refreshment will generate crime and anti-social behaviour in an already demanding area.

To move forward, I require more information as to why these hours are necessary and how the venue will operate beyond 11pm in a way that will not add to the cumulative impact in the area.

I refer to the application for a Premises Licence for the above premises.

The applicant has submitted plans of the premises showing the ground floor, Drawing ref 52701/SUR/01, dated Nov 2021.

The following licensable activity is being sought:

1. Provision of Late-Night Refreshment 'Outdoors' between 23:00 and 05:00 Monday to Sunday.

I wish to make the following representations based on the plans submitted and the supporting operating schedule:

1. The Provision of Late-Night Refreshment and for the hours requested may have the effect of increasing Public Nuisance in the area and impact on Public Safety

Environmental Health also makes the following further comments and representations:

• A list of undertakings have been offered with the application. These will need to be converted into enforceable condition and also considered as to whether they are sufficient to allay Environmental Health concerns.

• Clarification is requested on the proposed longer use into the early hours of the plant and machinery and if this been assessed with regards to noise impact from its use.

• The Council revised its Statement of Licensing Policy last year – see on the Council's website. One of the new requirements under the Policy is that greater emphasis has been

placed on licensed premises demonstrating compliance with policy CH1, Protection of Children from Harm, (see page 36 of policy). Free advice on complying with this can be found at:

- Hygiene : has become a garbage landfill over the past 24 months. People collect take- aways and throw half consumed food and packaging on Bickenhall Street. It goes from food packaging (Wok to Walk, MacDonald's, Nando's, Shawarma & more, KFC, Starbucks and Costa coffee mainly) to broken bottles. They are deposited on the sidewalks, on the mansions doorsteps.

We have seen increasing occurrences of people urinating at night in our street as well. The problem is mainly happening in evenings and at night when the street is quieter.

- Unsocial behaviour : people eat in the evening on our doorsteps and make noise. We have too many Deliveroo drivers meeting and parking on the corner of

days and night waiting for orders to be picked up. Some of the behaviour is sometimes very 'gang' styles and feels unsafe for residents.

- Dangerous driving : the Delivery drivers speed up in our street without respecting traffic signs.

The problem is very accute on as well.

This is an actual residential area and we feel that Westminster has failed at regulating the area. Why do we have so many junk food restaurants all packed together on that particular section of Baker Street ? This does not bring the best of social behaviour and we, the residents, now pay the price of it. 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I can instantly reel off more than 10 fast food places (I'm sure there are more) at the end of my street and it already causes problems.

Litter - something I've written to Westminster about several times - is a persistent problem. Sure, Baker St gets cleaned 7 days a week, but not the side streets. People sit on my steps, eating their take-away and take it as an affront if I dare ask them to get out of the way, or heaven forbid, not to leave any food rubbish. And of course they do.

Delivery drivers are everywhere. I now regularly walk past banks of 10-plus men hanging out near their bikes. Those drivers aren't generally badly-behaved, but they are no respecters of driving laws, and to them our street is not one-way only. That can be dangerous. Lights is something else many consider optional.

For these reasons - and the bigger point that it was not always thus - I object to the application. You are continuing to feed the beast and setting a dangerously low precedent.

What has been allowed to happen to my neighbourhood, my street, is bad enough but so far we haven't had alcohol and late night crowds to contend with. That changes the instant you open the door to night-time food and socialising.

We object in the strongest terms.				
we are already very negatively affected by the density of fast food shops here. For the last year we have been in constant dialogue with Veolia/Westminster Council about the fast food litter here. We often return home in the day to find patrons of McDonalds, KFC eating on the steps of our home where they also leave a slimy mess of food and packaging. Allowing a take away kebab shop to open 24 hours a day would encourage this behaviour through the night. I would not feel safe returning home in the dark to find people sat on my door step. This would also be very disturbing for those living in the lower ground, ground and first floor flats in particular who would be affected by noise of those congregating outside their windows. Unfortunately takeaway establishments open through night often attract anti- social drunken behavior. We do not want this. The constant stream of Uber/Deliveroo drivers that already serve the fast food shops here in the day cause problems and now this could continue all night. They congregate in large groups and flagrantly disregard the fact that our residential street is one way and use our street as a short cut, travelling in the wrong direction. They would be likely to do so even more during the night when there is less traffic around. We do not want any further takeaway provision that encourages deliveries via Uber/Deliveroo etc - our street and surrounding streets are becomingly increasingly dangerous for pedestrians due to vast numbers of motorbike drivers. I strongly object to granting a licence for late night refreshment for the Shawarma kebab shop 123 Baker Street as this will have serious consequences. This area is already saturated with fastfood shops and this shop will mean my area will become increasingly noisy and dirty due to litter being thrown on the street and road. This shop will cause increased traffic congestion especially by delivery drivers who are already overcrowding the area late into the night. There will undoubtedly be much more litter disposed onto street and road during the night especially with shawarma paper wraps and other items purchased. There is the serious concern of congregation and late night anti-social behaviour doorstee to the peaceful enjoyment of my property and my sleep. The congregation of motorbike delivery vehicles is of great concern as there is already saturation of this problem. Granting this late licence will mean that there will be increased traffic during the night but more people drive tired or in the darkness might miss something.



# CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a new premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed

#### **Mandatory Conditions**

1. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

#### Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

# Conditions proposed by the Metropolitan Police Service and agreed with the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule.

- 2. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Westminster Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises and will include the external area immediately outside the premises entrance. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31-day period.
- 3. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 4. A minimum of one (1) SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises from 2200 to 0200 hours every Thursday, Friday and Saturday and they must correctly display their SIA licence(s) when on duty so as to be visible.

- 5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and will record the following:
  - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
  - (b) all ejections of patrons
  - (c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
  - (d) any incidents of disorder
  - (e) all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (f) any faults in the CCTV system, searching equipment or scanning equipment
  - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

# Conditions proposed by the Environmental Health Service and agreed with the applicant so as to form part of the operating schedule.

- 6. Takeaways of food and drink by use of a courier service shall only be with a courier service who have agreed that their delivery drivers have been given clear, written instructions to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally outside the licenced premises; not to leave engines running when the vehicles are parked; not to obstruct the highway. In addition the courier service will positively encourage delivery drivers to use quieter vehicles that are less likely to cause a nuisance such as bicycles or electric vehicles.
- 7. All outside tables and chairs shall be removed or rendered unusable by 23.00 each day.
- 8. The licence holder shall ensure that any queue to enter the premises which forms outside the premises is orderly and supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.
- 9. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 10. A direct telephone number for the manager at the premises shall be publicly available at all times the premises are open. This telephone number and/or is to be made available to residents and businesses in the vicinity.
- 11. No noise generated on the premises, or by its associated plant or equipment, shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 12. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 13. All waste is to be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 14. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 23.00 and 07.00 hours on the following day unless collections are arranged during the times for the Council's own commercial waste collection service for the street.

- 16. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.
- 17. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23:00 and 0:70 hours on the following day.
