2. To remove conditions:-

12. *The entertainment in the basement shall be suitable to a light, sophisticated lounge bar environment. It shall not operate as a "disco" or night club with high noise levels.*
22. *The basement currently shown cross hatched on the plan shall not be used by any customer until the licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the District Surveyor s Association Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Westminster Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition will be removed from the Licence.*
23. *Before the basement opens to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by the Environmental Health Consultation Team to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.*
24. *Whilst the toilets in the basement are not available, The temporary capacity for the ground floor of the premises shall be reduced to 120 (excluding staff) and condition 16 shall not apply until the works condition set out in 22 above is removed.*
26. *In the basement, between 07:00 - 10:00 and 02:00 - 03:00, alcohol will only be sold and supplied to persons attending pre-booked private events and shall be ancillary to the provision of music and dancing and substantial refreshment.*
27. *A booking sheet for each function will be made available to the police or an authorised officer of the council upon request at the premises. The booking sheet shall record the following information as a minimum - the name of the individual who has hired the premises together with contact details, date of hiring, and purpose of the event. A guest list for each event shall be made available for inspection.*
28. *No unauthorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) is inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or is distributed to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services.*

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
7.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

8. The responsible person shall ensure that

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect.

Conditions relating to Regulated Entertainment:

10. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
11. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until midnight on New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes place on New Year's Day).
12. The entertainment in the basement shall be suitable to a light, sophisticated lounge bar environment. It shall not operate as a "disco" or night club with high noise levels.
13. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used at the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
14. No doors giving access/egress to the premises shall be fixed open after 11pm.
15. The licensee shall use his best endeavours to discourage patrons from using unlicensed minicabs.
16. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed: Ground Floor: 180, Basement: 100

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

17. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
18. A closed circuit television system shall be installed, maintained and operated correctly as specified by the Metropolitan Police Crime prevention Officer.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments.

19. The permitted hours on New Year's Eve for the sale of alcohol will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day.
20. If any entertainment is provided for children or if an entertainment is provided at which the majority of persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100, it shall be the duty of the holder of this premises licence/club certificate:
 - a) to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate,
 - b) to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and
 - c) to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.
21. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

22. The basement currently shown cross hatched on the plan shall not be used by any customer until the licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the District Surveyor s Association Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Westminster Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition will be removed from the Licence.
23. Before the basement opens to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.
24. Whilst the toilets in the basement are not available, The temporary capacity for the ground floor of the premises shall be reduced to 120 (excluding staff) and condition 16 shall not apply until the works condition set out in 22 above is removed.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Ground floor

25. Between 07:00 - 10:00 and 01:00 - 02:00 the sale and supply of alcohol shall be ancillary to persons taking a table meal.

Basement

26. In the basement, between 07:00 - 10:00 and 02:00 - 03:00, alcohol will only be sold and supplied to persons attending pre-booked private events and shall be ancillary to the provision of music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
27. A booking sheet for each function will be made available to the police or an authorised officer of the council upon request at the premises. The booking sheet shall record the following information as a minimum - the name of the individual who has hired the premises together with contact details, date of hiring, and purpose of the event. A guest list for each event shall be made available for inspection.
28. No unauthorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) is inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or is distributed to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services.

Both floors

29. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
30. No person under 14 shall be admitted to the premises save in the company of an adult.
31. An itemised bill shall be provided to all customers paying by credit card.
32. The SIA registered door supervisor shall at all times monitor the activity of customers who are outside the premises eg to smoke, and encourage them to return inside.
33. The SIA registered door supervisor shall at all times monitor the activity of persons leaving the premises and when appropriate remind them to respect the needs of local residents and not to loiter outside the premises.
34. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23:00 hours and 07:15 hours except bread between 06:30 and 07:15.
35. No refuse collections shall take place before 07:30.
36. No noise nuisance shall be caused to local residents from the operation of any plant associated with the kitchen duct/extract fan system.
37. Notices shall be clearly and prominently displayed at all exits informing customers that this is a residential area and requiring customers to leave the premises quietly and not to loiter outside the premises.
38. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department in conjunction with local residents to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The

operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.

39. After 9pm on each day when the premises is open, at least 1 clearly identified SIA registered door supervisors shall be on duty at each entrance in use at the premises whilst the premises are open to the public.
40. There shall be no entry/re-entry to the premises after 01:00am when no Regulated Entertainment and after 2am when Regulated Entertainment is taking place.
41. All windows on all floors and external doors shall be kept closed after 9pm, or at all times when regulated entertainment is provided, except for the immediate access and egress of customers.
42. The licence holder shall enter into an agreement with a hackney carriage and/or private carriage firm to provide transport for customers, with contact numbers made readily available to customers, who will be encouraged to use such services and required to remain inside the premises while waiting for the vehicle to arrive at the premises.
43. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and re-enter the premises eg to smoke shall be limited to a maximum of 7 persons at any one time.
44. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 07:30 hours.
45. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and re-enter the premises eg to smoke shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them
46. Notices shall be prominently displayed in any area used for smoking requesting patrons respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
47. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection time.
48. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and/or washed daily, and litter and sweepings collected.
49. Rubber or Felt pads shall be attached to the legs / feet of all furniture in the ground floor restaurant.
50. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
51. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises or in the immediate vicinity.
52. The Premises Licence Holder shall employ the services of a competent acoustic consultant to carry out a survey of the premises to determine:
 - o Transmission of structure borne noise
 - o Noise breakout
 - o Noise transmission through building services into adjoining commercial and residential property

- o A noise report of the findings of the survey shall be produced identifying sound insulation and sound reduction measures, conclusions, recommendations and time scales.
- o A copy of the noise report shall be submitted to the Environmental Health Service Consultation team for comment prior to any major work being carried out.

Conditions a) and b) listed below will apply until any recommended attenuation work has been carried out and this condition has been removed from the licence.

- a) General routine cleaning of the ground floor restaurant shall only take place between the hours of 06:00 and 23:00 hours (this does not include cleaning in response to spillages and non-routine functions); no cleaning machinery to be used before 07:00.
 - b) Regulated entertainment shall not take place in the ground floor of the premises.
53. Arrangements be made by the licensee to invite local residents to meetings, not less than quarterly, to discuss issues related to the premises.

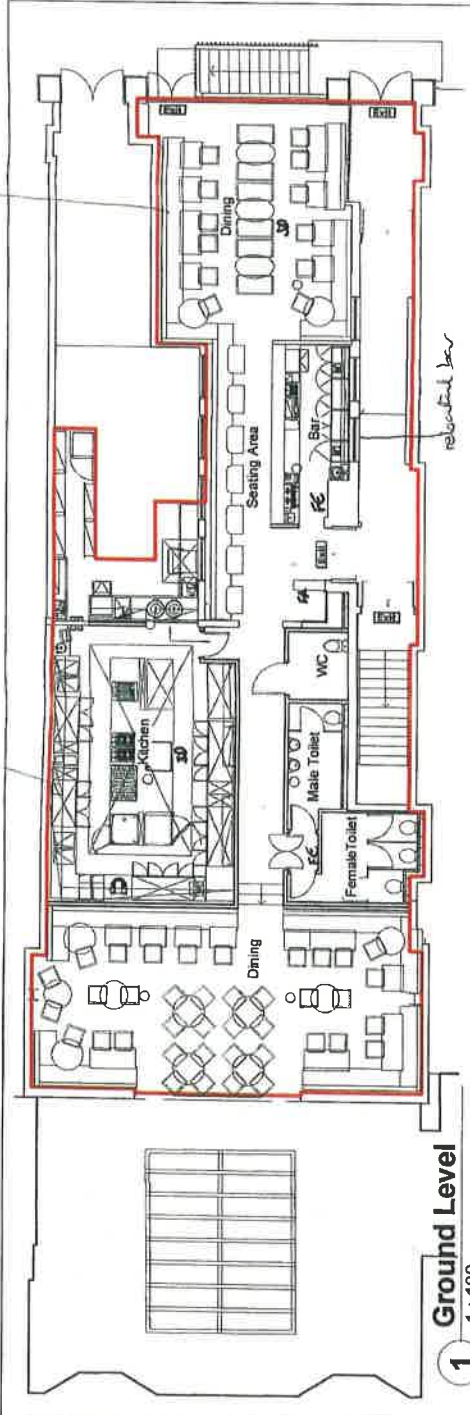

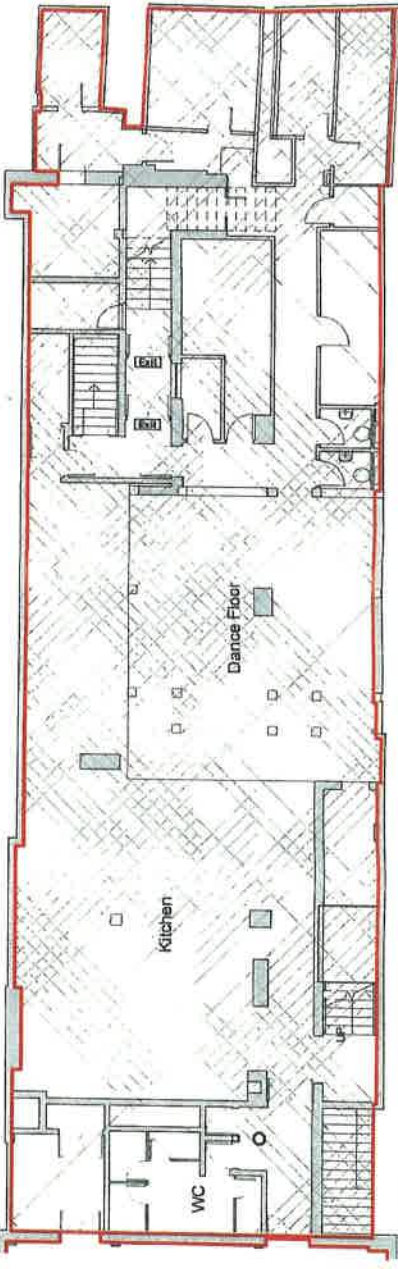
Removal of bar

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4.— (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

8. The responsible person shall ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

9. Admission of children to the premises must be restricted in accordance with the film classification recommended by the British Board of Film Classification or recommended by this licensing authority as appropriate.

15. No striptease, no nudity and all persons on the premises to be decently attired.
16. No gaming otherwise than by machines authorised under part III, Gaming Act, 1968.
17. There shall be no payment made by or on behalf of the licensees to any person for bringing customers to the premises off the street.
18. Noise and vibration will not be allowed to emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
19. There shall be no speakers, amplification or live entertainment to take place within the front lobby of the premises.
20. The door from the entrance lobby to the remainder of the premises shall not be fixed open after 23:00.
21. A sound limiting device must be fitted to the musical amplification system set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department so as to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officers from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the applicant only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
22. No alteration or modification to any existing sound system(s) should be effected without prior knowledge of an authorised Officer of the Environmental Health Services.
23. Any additional sound generating equipment shall not be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
24. Notices will be prominently displayed at exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

25. The number of persons accommodated (excluding staff) at the premises shall not exceed Basement - 356, and Ground Floor - 117.
26. Arrangements will be made to ensure that any capacity limit set for the premises can be properly monitored. Information regarding the capacity should be given to an authorised officer on request.
27. After 23:00 hours the supply of alcohol shall be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment.
28. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.

NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.

29. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, fire warning and fire fighting equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
30. The certificates listed below shall be made available to the Licensing Authority upon written request.
 - Any emergency lighting battery or system certificate
 - Any electrical installation certificate
 - Any fire alarm system certificate
31. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
32. No changes shall be made to the approved layout of the premises without the consent of the Licensing Authority.
33. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
34. All fire doors shall be maintained effectively self closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
35. Fire resisting doors to ducts, service shafts and cupboards shall be kept locked shut.

44. Children shall only be admitted for private events and table meals if accompanied by an adult.
45. Flashing or particularly bright lights on or outside the premises will not be permitted to cause a nuisance to nearby properties (save insofar as they are necessary for the prevention of crime).
46. All waste is to be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
47. The Licence will have no effect until the premises is assessed as satisfactory by the Environmental Health Consultation Team.
48. Before the premises open to the public, the plans as deposited should be checked to ensure they are an accurate reflection of the premises constructed. Where the premises layout changes during the course of construction, new plans shall be provided to the Licensing Authority.

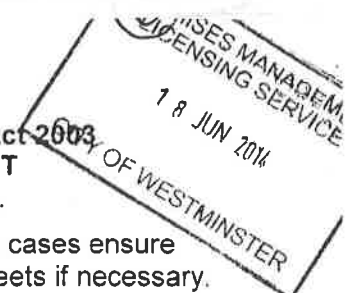

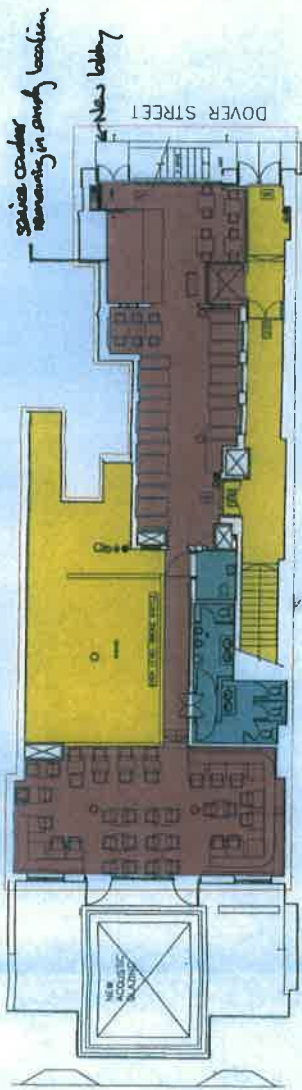

I refer to the application for a variation of the Premises Licence 13/05974/LIPVM.

The applicant has submitted floor plans of the premises ref 1303.DB.04.01 dated 5/11/13.

This representation is based on the plans and operating schedule submitted.

The applicant is seeking the following

1. To remove the basement and associated licensable activities from the licence by amending the plans.
2. To reduce the capacity figure for the ground floor from 180 persons to 120 persons.
3. To vary the ground floor with regard to reconfiguration of the seating, new acoustic entrance lobby and other changes as set out on the plan.
4. To remove conditions 12.22.23.24.26.27 and 28 from the licence
5. To amend condition 16 to read,
 - The number of customers accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed Ground Floor 120 customers.

I wish to make the following representation

1. The amendments to the plans, changes to the premises and capacities, removal of conditions and amendment of conditions will have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance within the area and impact on Public Safety.

The granting of the application as presented would have the likely effect of causing an increase in Public Nuisance and impact on Public Safety within the area.

The applicant has stated that the variation will only take effect on surrender of licence number 13/05090/LIPDPS.

The applicant has provided additional information along with proposed conditions with the application which is being considered but do not fully address the concerns of Environmental Health.

Appeal History

33 Dover Street, W1 (Automat) / 17 Berkeley Street, W1

2005 Application for conversion and variation

On 4th August 2005, application was received for the conversion and variation of a premises licence for premises known as Automat, at 33 Dover Street W1. As there were no Police objections to the conversion application the premises licence was converted as applied for.

The variation application sought:

- The removal of all embedded restrictions,

Basement

- Extension of hours for Licensable Activities
Monday – Friday 0700 – 0400
Saturday 0800 – 0400
Sunday 0900 – 0400

Ground Floor

- Monday – Friday 0700 – 0200
Saturday 0800 – 0200
Sunday – 0900 - 0100

The application received five objections. The Police lodged an objection on the basis that the variations sought would undermine the licensing objectives. The Environmental Health Consultation Team raised an objection contending that the increase in hours would have the likely effect of increasing public nuisance. Three local residents also objected to the application. Their objections were based on public nuisance in the context of noise and anti-social behaviour upon patrons leaving the premises.

On 28 September 2005, the Licensing Sub-Committee considered the application and refused it.

The decision of the Sub-Committee was duly appealed to the Magistrates' Court by the applicant, Carlos Almada. Prior to any full hearing the matter was settled on the conditions set out in the attached consent order.

2005 application for a new premises licence

On 26 September 2005 application was made for a new premises licence for 17 Berkeley Street, seeking the sale of alcohol Monday to Sunday 7am to 5am; regulated entertainment (films, live and recorded music, performance of dance, facilities for making music and facilities for dancing) 7am to 5am on each day; late night refreshment, 11pm to 5am on each day; seasonal variations to 7am on New Years Day.

The premises comprised the ground floor of 17 Berkeley Street, the basement of 17 Berkeley Street and what is in effect the basement area of 33 Dover Street. Berkeley Street runs parallel to Dover Street. However Dover Street and Berkeley Street are on different levels, so the ground floor of 17 Berkeley Street backs on to the basement of 33 Dover Street (where the applicant also operates Automat), and the basement of 17 Berkeley Street runs through into the sub-basement area of 33 Dover Street. The application received objections from Environmental Health and 8 local residents.

On 10 January 2006, the Licensing Sub-Committee considered the application granting it in part to all the activities sought, but to restrict the hours to Core Hours. The Sub-Committee also imposed a number of conditions on the licence including a restriction on the capacity so as not to exceed 356 in the Basement and 117 in the Ground Floor. The Licensing Sub-Committee heard that the applicant was undertaking substantial works on the premises and that those works were far from complete.

On 18 January 2006 Carlos Almada appealed against the decision of the Sub-Committee.

The full appeal hearing was heard before District Judge Snow at City of Westminster Magistrates' Court on Wednesday 10 and Friday 12 December 2008.

The District Judge decided that the relevant criteria set out in paragraph 2.3.2 of the City Council's 2008 policy (the Appellant having conceded for the purposes of this appeal only that this was the relevant policy to be applied) for extending hours beyond core hours had not been met. He determined that the licensing objectives would not be promoted by granting the revised application either in full, or in part. District Judge Snow therefore dismissed the appeal. Costs were later awarded in full to the City Council.

2011 application for Review

On 21 September 2011, five local residents submitted a Review of the premises licence for Automat, 33 Dover Street, W1 on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance.

The review sought to impose a number of additional conditions on the premises licence to address issues of noise escape and disturbance.

Representations in support of the application for Review were received from the Environmental Health Consultation Team and one additional local resident. A submission was also received from the administrators of 17 Berkeley Street Limited, who were operating the premises at the time.

The application was considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee on 24 November 2011. Having heard from all parties and considered the report and submissions before them, the Sub-Committee decided to impose additional conditions on the licence.

Notice of appeal was lodged on behalf of the administrators of 17 Berkeley Street. Prior to the full hearing in the Magistrates' Court the Appellant's withdrew their appeal and paid the City Council's costs in full.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE AND CONDITIONS PROPOSED BY A PARTY TO THE HEARING

When determining an application for a premises licence under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing authority must, unless it decides to reject the application, grant the licence subject to the conditions which are indicated as mandatory in this schedule.

At a hearing the licensing authority may, in addition, and having regard to any representations received, grant the licence subject to such conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule submitted by the applicant as part of their application, or alter or omit these conditions, or add any new condition to such extent as the licensing authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

This schedule lists those conditions which are consistent with the operating schedule, or proposed as appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives by a responsible authority or an interested party as indicated. These conditions have not been submitted by the licensing service but reflect the positions of the applicant, responsible authority or interested party and have not necessarily been agreed.

Conditions:**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence.
2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4.
 - (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children ;
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to ;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on ;
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
5. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
7. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
8. The responsible person shall ensure that,
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.
9. All persons guarding premises against unauthorised access or occupation or against outbreaks of disorder or against damage (door supervisors) must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions reproducing the effect of conditions subject to which the relevant existing licences have effect.

Conditions relating to Regulated Entertainment:

10. This licence is subject to all the former Rules of Management for Places of Public Entertainment licensed by Westminster City Council, in force from 4 September 1998 and incorporating amendments agreed by the Council on 25 October 1999, 30 June 2000, 16 January 2001 and 1 October 2001.
11. On New Year's Eve the premises can remain open for the purpose of providing regulated entertainment from the time when the provision of regulated entertainment must otherwise cease on New Year's Eve to the time when regulated entertainment can commence on New Year's Day (or until midnight on New Year's Eve where no regulated entertainment takes place on New Year's Day).

****Condition 12 requested to be removed by applicant****

12. The entertainment in the basement shall be suitable to a light, sophisticated lounge bar environment. It shall not operate as a "disco" or night club with high noise levels.
13. No additional sound generating equipment shall be used at the premises without being routed through the sound limiter device.
14. No doors giving access/egress to the premises shall be fixed open after 11pm.
15. The licensee shall use his best endeavours to discourage patrons from using unlicensed minicabs.
16. The number of persons accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed:
Ground Floor: 180, Basement: 100

****Condition 16 requested to be amended by applicant, to read as follows:-****

- 16a. *The number of customers accommodated at any one time (excluding staff) shall not exceed:
Ground Floor: 120.*

Conditions for Sale of Alcohol

17. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
18. A closed circuit television system shall be installed, maintained and operated correctly as specified by the Metropolitan Police Crime prevention Officer.

Conditions which reproduce the effect of any restriction imposed on the use of the premises by specified enactments.

19. The permitted hours on New Year's Eve for the sale of alcohol will extend to the start of permitted hours on the following day.
20. If any entertainment is provided for children or if an entertainment is provided at which the majority of persons attending are children, then, if the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100, it shall be the duty of the holder of this premises licence/club certificate:

- a) to station and keep stationed wherever necessary a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the building, or to any part thereof, than the building or part can properly accommodate,
 - b) to control the movement of the children and other persons admitted while entering and leaving the building or any part thereof, and
 - c) to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.
21. The terminal hour for late night refreshment on New Year's Eve is extended to 05:00 on New Year's Day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

****Condition 22 requested to be removed by applicant****

22. The basement currently shown cross hatched on the plan shall not be used by any customer until the licensing authority are satisfied that the premises is constructed or altered in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the District Surveyor s Association Technical Standards for Places of Entertainment and the reasonable requirements of Westminster Environmental Health Consultation Team, at which time this condition will be removed from the Licence.

****Condition 23 requested to be removed by applicant****

23. Before the basement opens to the public, the plans as deposited will be checked by premises constructed. Where the premises layout has changed during the course of construction new plans shall be provided to the Environmental Health Consultation Team and the Licensing Authority.

****Condition 24 requested to be removed by applicant****

24. Whilst the toilets in the basement are not available, the temporary capacity for the ground floor of the premises shall be reduced to 120 (excluding staff) and condition 16 shall not apply until the works condition set out in 22 above is removed.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

Ground floor

25. Between 07:00 - 10:00 and 01:00 - 02:00 the sale and supply of alcohol shall be ancillary to persons taking a table meal.

Basement

****Condition 26 requested to be removed by applicant****

26. In the basement, between 07:00 - 10:00 and 02:00 - 03:00, alcohol will only be sold and supplied to persons attending pre-booked private events and shall be ancillary to the provision of music and dancing and substantial refreshment.

****Condition 27 requested to be removed by applicant****

27. A booking sheet for each function will be made available to the police or an authorised officer of the council upon request at the premises. The booking sheet shall record the following information as a minimum - the name of the individual who has hired the premises together with contact details, date of hiring, and purpose of the event. A guest list for each event shall be made available for inspection.

****Condition 28 requested to be removed by applicant****

28. No unauthorised advertisements of any kind (including placard, poster, sticker, flyer, picture, letter, sign or other mark) is inscribed or affixed upon the surface of the highway, or upon any building, structure, works, street furniture, tree, or any other property, or is distributed to the public, that advertises or promotes the establishment, its premises, or any of its events, facilities, goods or services.

Both floors

29. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
30. No person under 14 shall be admitted to the premises save in the company of an adult.
31. An itemised bill shall be provided to all customers paying by credit card.
32. The SIA registered door supervisor shall at all times monitor the activity of customers who are outside the premises eg to smoke, and encourage them to return inside.
33. The SIA registered door supervisor shall at all times monitor the activity of persons leaving the premises and when appropriate remind them to respect the needs of local residents and not to loiter outside the premises.
34. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 23:00 hours and 07:15 hours except bread between 06:30 and 07:15.
35. No refuse collections shall take place before 07:30.
36. No noise nuisance shall be caused to local residents from the operation of any plant associated with the kitchen duct/extract fan system.
37. Notices shall be clearly and prominently displayed at all exits informing customers that this is a residential area and requiring customers to leave the premises quietly and not to loiter outside the premises.
38. A sound limiting device located in a separate and remote lockable cabinet from the volume control shall be fitted to any musical amplification system and set at a level determined by and to the satisfaction of an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Service's Community Protection Department in conjunction with local residents to ensure that no noise nuisance is caused to local residents. The operational panel of the noise limiter shall then be secured to the satisfaction of officer from the Environmental Health Service. The keys securing the noise limiter cabinet shall be held by the licence holder or authorised manager only, and shall not be accessed by any other person. The limiter shall not be altered without prior agreement with the Environmental Health Service.
39. After 9pm on each day when the premises is open, at least 1 clearly identified SIA registered door supervisors shall be on duty at each entrance in use at the premises whilst the premises are open to the public.
40. There shall be no entry/re-entry to the premises after 01:00am when no Regulated Entertainment and after 2am when Regulated Entertainment is taking place.
41. All windows on all floors and external doors shall be kept closed after 9pm, or at all times when regulated entertainment is provided, except for the immediate access and egress of customers.

42. The licence holder shall enter into an agreement with a hackney carriage and/or private carriage firm to provide transport for customers, with contact numbers made readily available to customers, who will be encouraged to use such services and required to remain inside the premises while waiting for the vehicle to arrive at the premises.
43. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and re-enter the premises eg to smoke shall be limited to a maximum of 7 persons at any one time.
44. No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between 23:00 hours and 07:30 hours.
45. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and re-enter the premises eg to smoke shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them
46. Notices shall be prominently displayed in any area used for smoking requesting patrons respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly.
47. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection time.
48. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and/or washed daily, and litter and sweepings collected.
49. Rubber or Felt pads shall be attached to the legs / feet of all furniture in the ground floor restaurant.
50. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premises building.
51. All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be in sealed containers only, and shall not be consumed on the premises or in the immediate vicinity.
52. The Premises Licence Holder shall employ the services of a competent acoustic consultant to carry out a survey of the premises to determine:
 - o Transmission of structure borne noise
 - o Noise breakout
 - o Noise transmission through building services into adjoining commercial and residential property
 - o A noise report of the findings of the survey shall be produced identifying sound insulation and sound reduction measures, conclusions, recommendations and time scales.
 - o A copy of the noise report shall be submitted to the Environmental Health Service Consultation team for comment prior to any major work being carried out.

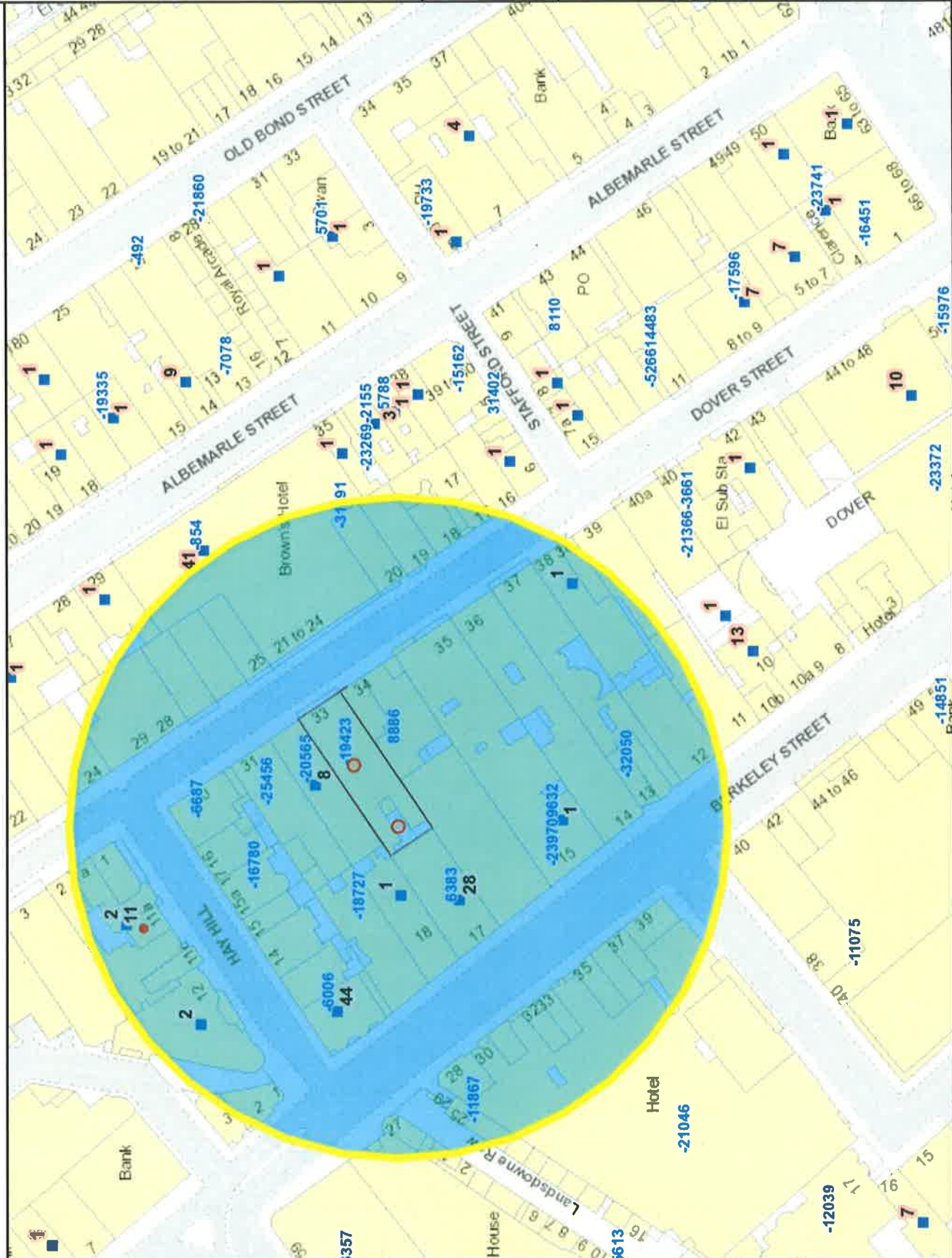
